GIVE BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF WHAT HAPPENED:													

POLICE REPORT:

On Thursday, June 6, 2013, at approximately 0345 hours, officers of the Metropolitan Police Department's First District heard several gunshots in the area of First and M Streets Northwest, Washington, D.C. Upon responding to the scene they observed a male subject who was limping in the area of First Street and Pierce Place Northwest. Officers stopped this person, identified as Ahmad Robertson-Bey, DOB 12/17/1990, PDID 586-840 (hereafter referred to as the defendant). The defendant informed the officers that he had been shot somewhere in the vicinity of First and M Streets Northwest. He was observed to have been shot in the left foot and transported to Howard University Hospital where he was admitted, treated, and released. Following up on the defendant's report, additional units of the First District responded to the area of the 1100 block of First Place Northwest and located the decedent, who was suffering from multiple gunshot wounds. D.C. Fire and EMS personnel arrived on the scene, started lifesaving procedures and transported the decedent to Washington Hospital Center's MEDSTAR unit for advanced care. The decedent was pronounced dead at 0457 hours after lifesaving attempts failed. The decedent's remains were transported to the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner for the District of Columbia for autopsy, after which it was determined that the cause of the decedent's death was multiple gunshot wounds and the manner of death was homicide.

On June 6, 2013, your affiant viewed video footage of a Metropolitan Police Department Crime Camera located at the corner of First Place and M Streets, Northwest. A portion of the video shows what appears to be a group of male subjects together, when one male subject begins shooting in the vicinity of the front of 1165 First Place Northwest. Moments after the shooting the video shows several subjects running in various directions. The identity of the shooter cannot be determined from a viewing of the video.

While processing the homicide scene, officers of the Metropolitan Police Department's Crime Scene Investigation Section recovered several latent finger prints from various items, including some that were in close proximity to where the decedent's body was found.

On Friday, June 7, 2013, the defendant was interviewed by your affiant after his release from the hospital. During the interview, he stated that on the morning of the above-described incident he was shot in the foot while out walking on First Street Northwest and that he was not in the 1100 block of First Place Northwest at any time prior to being shot in the foot.

On July 24, 2013, a witness, hereinafter referred to as W1, was interviewed at the Metropolitan Police Department's Homicide Branch in reference to this homicide. W1 stated that it knew the decedent by his birth name and the nickname of "Bo-Bo." W1 stated that it was in the area of the 1100 block of First Place Northwest prior to the shooting and that it had observed the decedent in the vicinity. W1 stated there were other persons outside during the same time period, but would not provide any other details related to this homicide.

On July 29, 2013, a Fingerprint Examiner for the Consolidated Forensic Laboratory advised that known fingerprints of the defendant matched latent fingerprints recovered from a liquor bottle that had been observed by police in close proximity to the body of the decedent and seized as potential evidence, thereby contradicting the defendant's claim that he had not been in the 1100 block of First Place Northwest at any time relevant to this shooting.

After being arrested for a criminal offense unrelated to this incident, W1 was re-interviewed by police in reference to this homicide. During this interview it stated that it had witnessed the shooting of decedent Andre Wilson. W1 stated that prior to the shooting taking place, it observed subjects engaged in a game of craps; the subjects included the decedent and a male whom W1 was heard to identify by the nickname "Jabar." W1 stated that seconds before the shooting took place, the decedent had snatched money from the hand of "Jabar," and "Jabar" made a statement to the effect of, "Oh, it's like that?" At this time, according to W1, "Jabar" pulled out a handgun and fired it at the decedent's chest, then took flight towards the other side of the street as another male subject fired several rounds in the direction of "Jabar." W1 stated that it did not see in which direction "Jabar" fled the scene because it took cover.

Wl's account of events surrounding the shooting of decedent Andre Wilson, specifically that two different guns were fired in the course of the incident, is corroborated by 1) ballistics evidence recovered from the scene (9mm shell casings were found within close proximity to the decedent's body, and .40 S&W shell casings were recovered in different locations from where the 9mm casings were), and 2) the fact that police identified two separate shooting victims in this incident (the decedent and the defendant).

W1 stated that it knew "Jabar" from the neighborhood and has seen him on more than one occasion. W1 stated it could identify "Jabar" if it observed a picture of him, and described him as a black male with light complexion and a short haircut, approximately six feet tall. This description generally matches the appearance of the defendant.

In a subsequent interview, detectives from the Metropolitan Police Department Homicide Branch met with W1 for the purpose of showing it a nine-person photo array that included one photograph of the defendant. Upon viewing the photo array, W1 positively identified the photograph of the defendant, stating "That's him." A detective continued with follow-up questions, asking if W1 knew the person in the photograph. W1 answered, "Yes." and the detective asked if W1 knew the person by name or nickname. W1 answered, "Jamar." The detective asked, "What did you see Jamar do?" W1 answered, "Shot Bo-Bo." W1 further acknowledged the identification by signing the photograph of the defendant.

On October 2, 2013, W1 was interviewed by detectives again and was asked to clarify the name that it used for the person that it observed shoot the decedent and whose photograph it 5

identified in the photo array. W1 stated that the person it identified in the photo array is known to him as "Jamar," and further spelled the name JAMAR.

Based upon the aforementioned facts, your affiant believes that probable cause exists, and respectfully requests that an arrest warrant be issued for Ahmad Robertson-Bey; PDID# 586-840, DOB: 12/17/1990 for the homicide shooting of Andre Wilson.
