GIVE BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF WHAT HAPPENED:

On Monday, June 24, 2013, at approximately, 1:25 am, an officer of the District of Columbia Housing Authority Police Department was on duty and working the security booth located inside 700 12th Street SE, Washington, D.C., when she heard multiple gunshots. Moments later, the officer heard someone banging on the rear door of 700 12th Street SE, yelling for help. The officer responded to the rear entry door and observed Tywayne Thompson suffering from multiple gunshot wounds. The District of Columbia Fire Department was summoned to the scene and provided emergency care for Mr. Thompson.

Mr. Thompson was transported to Howard University Hospital but ultimately succumbed to his injuries and was pronounced dead. A canvass of the crime scene, on the night of the shooting, revealed two (2) different caliber shell casings – four (4) 9mm caliber shell casings and two (2) .45 caliber shell casings -- and one (1) expended projectile.

On Tuesday, June 25, 2013, an autopsy was performed on the decedent's remains. The manner of death was ruled a homicide and the cause of death determined to be multiple gunshot wounds to the body; specifically, the decedent was found to have suffered wounds to the back, groin and left leg, with the bullet that caused the back wound exiting through the decedent's abdomen.

A witness was located and interviewed. This witness hereinafter will be referred to as W-1. W-1 related that it spoke with the decedent about an hour or so before this shooting. W-1 advised that the decedent stated he was on his way back to 700 12th Street SE. W-1 advised that the decedent had purchased a motor scooter a short time before that night and was utilizing that scooter to get back to 700 12th Street SE. W-1 described this scooter as black and gray in color. It should be noted that at the time the decedent was shot, a motor scooter was not observed or located on the scene.

On Wednesday, June 26, 2013, about two days after the shooting of the decedent, a motor scooter was located behind a white shed in the rear parking lot of 700 12th Street SE by uniformed members of the First District. Observed on the wall of the white shed, behind which the decedent's motor scooter was parked, was what appeared to be dried blood. The blood- like substance was photographed and a sample was recovered. The scooter was also recovered and further investigation revealed that it had belonged to the decedent.

An additional witness was located and interviewed. This witness hereinafter will be referred to as W-2. According to W-2, on two separate occasions shortly after the murder, it heard a subject by the name of CARLOS aka "LOS" bragging about shooting the decedent. On both occasions, W-2 reports that LOS stated that prior to the shooting he and another individual named "SHINE" agreed on a plan to rob the decedent of his scooter; according to LOS, SHINE was going to pretend to buy the scooter from the decedent and then rob the

decendent of it. LOS then stated he watched SHINE approach the decendent and then walk away with him, under the pretense of buying the scooter. Shortly thereafter, LOS advised that he walked in the direction where he observed SHINE and the decendent go to check on SHINE. LOS advised that SHINE shot the decendent in his legs. LOS stated that he told SHINE to finish the decendent off but SHINE wouldn't. LOS advised that he did not want the decendent to identify him or SHINE to the police so he shot the decendent, to "finish him off."

LOS's admissions, as related by W-2, are consistent with the autopsy findings as to the location of one of the decendent's gunshot wounds and with the ballistics evidence indicating the use of two different firearms, recovered on the scene.

It bears noting here that W-2, when asked during the course of the investigation why it came forward with the above-described account, related that part of its motivation was the reward money that it knew the police were offering in exchange for information resulting in the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for killing the decendent. It also bears noting here that with the exception of a statutorily mandated witness appearance fee or fees, W-2 has received no remuneration of any kind in connection with this case.

W-2 stated that it has known LOS for a period of time exceeding a year. W-2 was shown a 9 picture photo array with one of those photos depicting the defendant Carlos Parks with the PDID 624-596. W-2 viewed that array and positively identified Carlos Parks as "LOS," the person it heard bragging about killing the decendent on two separate occasions.

A third witness was located and interviewed. This witness hereinafter will be referred to as W-3. According to W-3, it overheard an argument between two subjects known to it as "LOS" and "SHINE" several days after the murder. W-3 stated that LOS and SHINE were arguing over who had shot the decendent in what part of the body. W-3 stated each subject admitted to shooting the decendent in the legs but both denied shooting the decendent in the abdomen. To wit, W-3 advised that LOS stated to SHINE words to the effect of, "I shot him in the legs and you shot him in the stomach," and SHINE replied to LOS with words to the effect of, "I shot him in the legs and you shot him in the stomach."

It bears noting here that when W-3 was initially interviewed in the course of this investigation it provided the above information but advised that it had been told this information and did not hear the argument itself. W-3 was subsequently interviewed and admitted hearing the above argument but advised that it was afraid of being labeled a "snitch" and said that if it got out that it was cooperating with the police it could be retaliated against by LOS or SHINE.

Regarding the references in the statements of LOS and SHINE to the decendent being shot in the abdomen or stomach area, while the decendent suffered no entrance wound to that part of the body, the bullet that entered his back exited from his abdomen and in fact a witness who observed the decendent in the immediate aftermath of the shooting described blood spurting profusely from his abdomen.

W-3 stated it has known both subjects, LOS and SHINE, for a period of time exceeding a year and would see them on a regular basis. W-3 was shown a single confirmatory photograph of Carlos Parks with the PDID 624-596 and positively identified him as one person it overheard admitting to shooting the decendent. W-3 was shown a single confirmatory photograph of Troy Robinson with the PDID 621-129 and positively identified him as SHINE, the other person it heard admitting to shooting the decendent.

A fourth witness was located and interviewed. This witness from hereinafter will be referred to as W-4. W-4 reports on the night of this homicide it heard several gunshots and looked outside of its window. W-4 stated that it observed several subjects running from the area of 700 12th Street, Southeast, with two of the subjects being persons known to it as "SHINE" and "CARLOS."

It bears noting here that at the time of its observations as recounted above, W-4 was a regular user of heroin, though it does not recall whether it used heroin on that particular day. Also, when W-4 was initially interviewed it reported seeing individuals running from 700 12th Street SE moments after the gunshots but claimed that it did

not see the faces of any of those individuals. In a subsequent interview W-4 provided names for some of the subjects IT observed running from 700 12th Street SE moments after hearing gunshots. It provided the name SHINE but not CARLOS. In a third and final interview W-4 provided the same names as it had in its second interview but stated that CARLOS was one of the individuals that was running from 700 12th Street SE along with SHINE moments after the sound of gunshots. W-4 advised that it resides in Potomac Gardens, the housing complex where this shooting occurred and a neighborhood notoriously plagued by violent crime, and had feared violent retaliation for its fully truthful cooperation in this investigation.

W-4 stated that it has known both subjects for a period of time exceeding a year and would see them on a regular basis. W-4 was shown a single confirmatory photograph of Carlos Parks with the PDID 624-596 and of Troy Robinson with the PDID 621-129. W-4 positively identified Troy Robinson as SHINE and Carlos Parks as CARLOS as two of the individuals it observed running from the area of 700 12th Street SE moments after the it heard gunshots.

Based on the aforementioned facts and circumstances your affiant requests that a warrant be issued for the arrest of Defendant Troy Robinson aka "SHINE."
