On or about November 5, 2013, within the District of Columbia, the defendant, Anthony C. Williams, while armed with a pistol, and with the intent to kill another and to inflict serious bodily injury on another and with a conscious disregard of an extreme risk of death or serious bodily injury to another, caused the death of James Booker by shooting him with a firearm, that is a pistol, thereby causing injuries from which James Booker died on or about November 5, 2013. (Second Degree Murder While Armed, in violation of 22 D.C. Code, Sections 2103, 4502)

GIVE BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF WHAT HAPPENED: POLICE REPORT: On Tuesday, November 5, 2013, at approximately 2156hrs., members of the Seventh District received a call for a shooting in the 500 block of Alabama Avenue, Southeast. Officer Gregory Archer responded to the scene and found the complainant, known to him as "JB," on the ground in front of 515 Alabama Avenue, Southeast. The complainant, later identified as James Edward Booker, was conscious and suffering from several gunshot wounds to the body. Officer Archer asked the complainant if he knew who shot him, to which he replied, "I don't know". Medic #19 responded to the scene and transported James Edward Booker to Howard University Hospital where he was treated for his injuries. At 2248 hrs on November 5, 2013, James Edward Booker was pronounced dead by Doctor Ford, Hospital Staff. James Edward Booker's body was subsequently transported to the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner, pending autopsy. On Wednesday, November 6, 2013, Doctor Joseph Pestaner, Office of the Chief Medical Examiner, performed an autopsy on James Edward Booker's body. Doctor Pestaner determined that James Edward Booker's cause of death was multiple gunshot wounds (4) to his body, to include the right chest, left chest, right thumb and right buttock. Doctor Pestaner ruled the manner of death a Homicide. Two copper projectiles were recovered from James Edward Booker's body: one from his right chest area and one from his pelvis.								
INVESTIGATION: Video footage was recovered from surveillance cameras in the 3200 block of 6 th Street, Southeast. Homicide Detectives have viewed this footage and determined the following. At approximately 2155hrs on Tuesday, November 5, 2013, James Edward Booker (hereafter referred to as the decedent) was observed walking north, on the sidewalk, in the 3200 block of 6 th Street, Southeast, in front of Martin Luther King Jr. Elementary School. The eventual shooter and two unknown subjects approach from the south and appear to surround the decedent, halfway up the block. The decedent appears to be conversing with the shooter, who has a handgun in his right hand. The decedent then raises his right hand several times and then runs north on 6 th Street, Southeast. The shooter and the two unknown subjects are seen running south down 6 th Street, Southeast, towards Savannah Street, Southeast.

AFFIDAVIT IN SUPPORT OF AN ARREST WARRANT

On Wednesday, November 6, 2013, a witness who will hereafter be referred to as W-1 responded to the Seventh District Station and told officers that IT had information about this homicide and wished to give a statement to law enforcement. Homicide detectives responded to the Seventh District Station and interviewed W-1. W-1 stated at approximately 2155hrs on November 6, 2013, IT was in the area of 6th & Alabama Avenue, Southeast, when IT observed the decedent walking in front of Martin Luther King Jr. Elementary School. W-1 said IT then saw three subjects approach the decedent from behind and surround him. W-1 said IT saw one of the subjects point a revolver at the decedent. (Note: Mobile Crime Technicians who processed the shooting scene did not recover any ballistic evidence, which would be consistent with a revolver being used in this shooting.) W-1 said the decedent raised his arm to the shooter, in an attempt to push the gun away. W-1 said the shooter then shot the decedent and continued to shoot at him as the decedent ran up 6th Street towards Alabama Avenue, Southeast.

W-1 said that IT heard 4 or 5 shots. After the shooter shot the decedent, W-1 said the shooter and the two unknown subjects ran south down 6th Street, Southeast, in the direction of Savannah Street, Southeast. W-1 told detectives that IT only focused on the shooter, since the shooter was the only person IT saw with a firearm and the only person IT saw shooting. W-1 said IT recognized the shooter, who IT said started hanging in the area two to three years ago. W-1 further related that IT did not know the shooter's true name. However, W-1 said IT observes the shooter in the area of 6th Street, Southeast, at least 3 to 4 times a week. W-1 stated that IT was aware of one prior confrontation between the shooter and ITS stepfather and another between the shooter and ITS stepfather and mother, but neither involved physical contact or a weapon and neither was actually witnessed by W-1. W-1 said that the defendant was wearing a mask that covered a portion of his face but W-1 was absolutely positive the defendant was the person IT saw shoot the decedent. W-1 said IT has seen the defendant with and without a mask. On November 6, 2013, W-1 provided detectives with a picture of the defendant, taken earlier that day with W-1's cellphone. This picture depicts the defendant wearing a light blue windbreaker jacket with white script on the back.

On Thursday, November 7, 2013, your affiant contacted W-1 and directed W-1 to view a series of videos on youtube.com entitled "620 Long Money". W-1 later contacted your affiant and informed your affiant the defendant appeared in the video, 620 Da Squad Gutter; in the video the defendant is observed wearing the same jacket he was wearing in the photograph sent from W-1's cellphone. W-1 also stated that's him, "Antbone," using a name that was referenced in the youtube video identifying the subject wearing the light blue windbreaker jacket described above. Detectives later identified "Antbone" as Anthony Williams, B/M, DOB:12/6/1996, PDID #598271, as the person seen in the video wearing a light blue windbreaker jacket with white script on the back. On Friday, November 8, 2013, detectives showed W-1 a nine-person photographic array including a photo of the defendant and W-1 identified that photo, writing on the photo sheet, "He is the person I saw commit the act in question," referring to this shooting.
