On or about November 28, 2013, within the District of Columbia, Lillian Alvarado did torture, cruelly beat, abuse and otherwise wilfully maltreat John Doe Alvarado, a child under the age of eighteen years, that is, about 0 years of age. (Cruelty To Children, in violation of 22 D.C. Code, Section 1101 (2001 ed.))

LILLIAN ALVARADO, within the District of Columbia, with deliberate and premeditated malice, killed JOHN DOE ALVARADO by ASPHYXIA OF MULTIFACTORIAL ETIOLOGY DISMEMBREMMENT him on or about November 28, 2013, thereby causing injuries from which John Doe Alvarado died on or about November 28, 2013. (First Degree Murder, in violation of 22 D.C. Code, Section 2101 (2001 ed.))

GIVE BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF WHAT HAPPENED:

On November 28, 2013 at approximately 1147 hours Officers from the Fourth District received a radio assignment for "leaking water mixed with blood" coming through the ceiling at [REDACTED] Washington, D.C. Upon the officer's arrival on the scene, they were advised the water was coming from [REDACTED]. The officers went to Apartment #306 and subsequently found the remains of a newborn "Infant" in the bathroom tub. District of Columbia Fire and Medical Units were dispatched to the scene and checked for signs of life. Death was apparent and the decedent remained on the scene. The decedent's remains were transported to the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner for the District of Columbia pending the results of an autopsy.

On Friday, November 29, 2013 Doctor Lois Goslinoski, Deputy Medical Examiner for the District of Columbia, conducted an autopsy on the decedent's remains. She determined that the cause of death was Asphyxia of Multifactorial Etiology Dismemberment, and ruled the manner of death a Homicide. Doctor Goslinoski determined that the baby had been born alive. She based her finding on the fact that the infant's lungs had been aerated. The lungs had expanded and there was air space in the lungs. During the autopsy, bubbles were observed coming out of the lungs when they had been placed in a pan of water for testing. Evidence that the baby was alive when its legs were severed is demonstrated by the fact that blood had been circulated in the side parts of the infant's legs. There was blood circulating in the thighs after the infant's legs were severed. At the juncture on the thigh where the legs had been cut, blood cells were beginning to form a clot unlike the lower leg region. The amputated portions of the leg did not show continued blood circulation. The umbilical cord was very jagged and had an irregular end which was consistent with having been cut by scissors. The doctor was not able to rule out a component of drowning which is also a component of asphyxia. The infant's stomach was distended. The doctor found 16 ml of liquid content which would be consistent with a baby swallowing water. There is a physical finding that the infant's neck was compressed. The baby had a red purple marking on the back of his neck and one on the front of his neck. There was compression of the neck which deprives oxygen to the brain which is also a form of asphyxia. There was petichiae in his larynx, in his eyes, his neck, and some on

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his face which would be consistent with compression of the neck. There was a hematoma on the thyroid gland which is inside the neck and would indicate that the child was not injured during child birth. Doctor Goslinoski concluded that the cause of death was Asphyxia of Multifactorial Etiology Dismemberment, and ruled the manner of death a Homicide.

Members from the Metropolitan Police Department Homicide Branch, Special Victim Unit initiated an investigation into this offense. During the course of this investigation several witnesses have been interviewed. One witness, hereafter identified as W-1 was interviewed and related that IT called 911 and reported there was blood and water leaking into W-1's apartment from the upstairs roof or apartment. Members from the Fourth District responded to W-1's apartment and discovered the leak was possibly coming from [REDACTED]. The officers went to apartment #306 (a one bedroom apartment) and knocked on the door. The door was answered by Witness Two. Witness Two (hereafter referred to as W-2) was interviewed and stated IT was inside [REDACTED] when IT heard a knock at the front door. W-2 said IT opened front door and the police officers told IT to tell W-2's sister they wanted to talk to her. W-2's sister is Lillian Alvarado (hereafter referred to as D-1). W-2 said IT went to the bathroom door and told D-1 the police officers wanted to talk her and D-1 told W-2 hold on.

W-2 said IT told W-3 and W-4 that police officers wanted to talk to D-1. W-2 said W-3 attempted to forcibly open the bathroom door by pushing the door but D-1 was holding the door stopping W-3 from entering the bathroom. W-2 said W-3 was telling D-1 to come out the bathroom as W-3 was trying to enter the bathroom and D-1 was telling W-3 to wait. W-2 said D-1 eventually came out of the bathroom and went and sat on the bed. W-2 said when D-1 came out the bathroom D-1 was wearing pants and a bra. W-2 said when D-1 came out the bathroom D-1 said to W-4 forgive me. W-2 said IT did not see what was in the bath tub but was told by W-4 there was a baby in the tub. W-2 said D-1 was the bathroom a long time and was the only person IT saw go into the bathroom prior to the police officers arriving at the front door.

Witness Three (hereafter referred to W-3) was interviewed and stated IT was inside [REDACTED]. W-3 said IT woke up at 8:00 a.m. and wanted to use the restroom but was told by W-2 the bathroom was being occupied. W-3 said IT went back to sleep. W-3 said IT woke up again at 9:00 a.m. and it was getting late. W-3 said when the police officers came to the apartment they told W-3 there was blood going into the neighbor's apartment. W-3 said at that point IT got really scared and went to the bathroom and tried to push the door in because IT knew D-1 had been in the bathroom for a while. W-3 said IT started pushing the door and tried to break the door in. W-3 said after IT was able to push the door in D-1 came running out the bathroom and went to her room. W-3 said the police officers went into the bathroom when D-1 came out. W-3 said IT didn't get a chance to see what was inside the bathroom. W-3 said when D-1 came out the bathroom D-1 was wearing black work pants. W-3 said throughout the night D-1 was going in and out the bathroom. W-3 said IT didn't know D-1 was pregnant until W-4 told IT that morning. W-3 said D-1 was the only person in the bathroom.

Witness Four (hereafter referred as W-4) was interviewed and stated at 6:00 a.m. IT went to the bedroom and asked D-1 if the pain had gone away because D-1 complained the night before saying D-1 ate something that made D-1 sick to the stomach. W-4 said D-1 told IT the pain was almost gone. W-4 said IT went back into the kitchen and continued cooking breakfast. W-4 said IT then brought D-1 some coffee and asked D-1 again what D-1 was feeling and D-1 told W-4 again the pain is almost gone. W-4 said approximately thirty (30) minutes later D-1's daughter came to W-4 and told W-4 she wanted to use the restroom. W-4 said IT went to the restroom but D-1 was already inside the restroom. W-4 said IT knew that D-1 was inside the restroom because IT went to check on D-1 and D-1 wasn't in the bedroom. W-4 said IT knocked on the bathroom door and told D-1 [REDACTED] wanted to use the restroom and D-1 told IT one moment. W-4 said IT was concerned about D-1 and tried to force the door in but D-1 kept holding the door shut. W-4 said as IT was pushing the door D-1 told IT hold one second I'll be out. W-4 said IT turned the door knob and tried to push in the door and the door barely opened. W-4 said when the door barely opened D-1 pushed the door closed but W-4 could see D-1 sitting on the toilet. W-4 said D-1 then asked IT for a tampon.

W-4 said IT asked D-1 what was going on and D-1 said nothing I'm almost done. W-4 said D-1 then asked IT

for a clean pair of pants and a tampon. W-4 said when IT attempted to give D-1 the pants and tampon and IT could barely reach into the bathroom because D-1 would not open the bathroom door wide enough to give D-1 the pants and tampon. W-4 said when D-1 did open the bathroom door to get the clothes W-4 could see a towel on the floor and the plunger next to the towel. W-4 said the plunger was normally kept in the cabinet inside the bathroom. W-4 said about five (5) minutes later W-2 told IT somebody was at the front door. W-4 said W-2 told IT the police are here. W-4 said W-2 told D-1 to get out of the bathroom. W-4 said W-2 told IT the police said there's blood dripping in the apartment down stairs. W-4 said IT then woke up W-3 and told W-3 the police are here and D-1 won't come out the bathroom. W-4 said W-3 rammed the bathroom door. W-4 said when the bathroom door opened D-1 was standing by the door holding a mop. W-4 said the mop D-1 was holding was wet but not covered with blood. W-4 said IT could see the tub was filled with water and the water was red. W-4 said IT grabbed D-1 by the hand and took D-1 into the bedroom. W-4 said the night before D-1 told IT she was going through her period. W-4 said when IT saw the blood IT thought D-1 was pregnant and had the baby. W-4 said overnight IT heard D-1 going back and forth to the bathroom.

Your affiant interviewed D-1 at Washington Hospital Center, Labor and Delivery, Patient Unit 5NE. During the interview D-1 told your affiant she was lying down in the bed and it felt like she had to urinate. D-1 said she went to the bathroom and clear water was coming out of her. D-1 said she had pain in her back and stayed in the bathroom about forty-five (45) minutes. D-1 said she took three (3) Advil's for the pain in her back and went back to her bed. D-1 said the pain went away around 8:30 am. D-1 said she then had a sharp pain in her stomach and back. D-1 said she took a shower because she knew she was going to the hospital. D-1 said she was standing up in the tub holding her stomach when the baby came out. D-1 said she saw a pair of scissors in the sink and tried to cut the cord. D-1 said when grabbed the scissors one leg was in the tub and one leg was out. D-1 said she didn't hear the baby cry when it came out. D-1 further stated she didn't know if the baby had both arms and legs when it came out. D-1 said when she got out the tub she fell and hit her head on the sink. D-1 said she remembered flushing the toilet before everything went dark. D-1 said she found out she was pregnant around April or May and thought she was seven and a half to eight months pregnant.

Members from Crime Scene Investigation Division and Department of Forensic Sciences processed the crime scene. The members removed the toilet from the premises and transported the toilet to their office. The members recovered two (2) dismembered infant legs from inside the toilet.

Recovered from inside the apartment were One (1) set of scissors with 3-inch blade and suspected blood observed on the blade. One (1) "Chef's Choice Stainless Steel" knife 7-inch serrated blade and 5-inch blue and gray handle. One (1) knife with 8.25 inch blade and 5.5 inch laminate faux wood finish with an unidentified material observed on both sides of the tip of the blade.

Based on the aforementioned facts and circumstances, your affiant respectfully request that a District of Columbia Superior Court Arrest Warrant be issued for the defendant.
