



What is the most effective way to link Cleveland's youth to jobs and career opportunities?



What will best attract and retain young professionals to the Greater Cleveland area?





How would you assess the current state of the Cleveland Metropolitan School District compared to 5 years ago?





How would you propose to re-use vacant land/buildings within the city of Cleveland? (Rank by order of importance with "1" being the top choice)




In order to make our region more accessible, what is the most important transportation infrastructure to invest in?





What part of the city of Cleveland should the community invest in?



If you currently volunteer or are considering a volunteer role in your "second half of life," where do you most want to focus your efforts?






What arts & culture activity would be the most likely to bring you downtown?

What is the biggest priority for Greater Cleveland for the next 100 years?




