DALLAS POLICE ASSOCIATION PROPOSES 10-POINT PLAN TO REFORM THE DALLAS POLICE DEPARTMENT

"Our Goal Is To Have The Best Police Department In America" - DPA President

DALLAS, TX – SEPTEMBER 16, 2014 – This morning, the Dallas Police Association (DPA) provided to Chief David Brown a proposed 10-point reform plan to improve the Dallas Police Department (DPD).

The comprehensive reforms include changes that strengthen ethics within the department, increase transparency, clarify the department's use-of-force policy, improve chase procedures, and improve internal affairs investigations. A full listing of the proposed 10-point reforms is attached.

"Our goal is to have the best police department in America and we believe our proposed 10-point reform plan is a good start toward achieving that," said **DPA President Ron Pinkston**. "We are committed to working closely with Chief David Brown on these smart, forward-thinking reforms that will strengthen the public's trust in our police department, improve the morale of our officers, and continue to protect Dallas families from crime."
