ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).

(b) Each dealer or exhibitor shall establish and maintain programs of adequate veterinary care that include:

(2) The use of appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases and injuries, and the availability of emergency, weekend, and holiday care.

The following animals are in need of veterinary care:

* One black and white male Poodle that the licensee estimated was at least 8 years old (Microchip number 0A01477551) had a heavy coating of dark brown matter on the cheek teeth on both sides of his mouth extending up into the gum line. The abnormal buildup of material on teeth can cause damage to the gum tissue and tooth structures, be painful, impact the ability of the dog to eat normally, and harm the health of the animal. These signs are consistent with the presence of dental disease. The licensee must have this animal examined by a veterinarian and appropriate treatment plan administrated. The outcome of this examination must be documented and provided to the inspector upon request. The licensee must ensure that all animals receive adequate veterinary care at all times.

* One white adult female Bichon Frise / Poodle cross (microchip number 053 769 097) was placing little to no weight on its back left leg. There was a slightly reddened area located on the bottom of one of the pads. Foot problems can be painful causing discomfort when the dog has to place weight on the affected foot. It can affect the mobility and daily activity of the dog. The licensee must have this animal examined by a veterinarian and appropriate treatment plan administrated. The outcome of this examination must be documented and provided to the inspector upon request. The licensee must ensure that all animals receive adequate veterinary care at all times.

* One cinnamon colored adult female Chihuahua (microchip number 103 011 020) had a heavy

On the right side, a cream to gray colored creamy material was present at the gum line. The abnormal buildup of material on teeth can cause damage to the gum tissue and tooth structures, be painful, impact the ability of the dog to eat normally, and harm the health of the animal. These signs are consistent with the presence of dental disease. The licensee must have this animal examined by a veterinarian and appropriate treatment plan administered. The outcome of this examination must be documented and provided to the inspector upon request. The licensee must ensure that all animals receive adequate veterinary care at all times.

3.1 (a) DIRECT NCI

HOUSING FACILITIES, GENERAL.

(a) Structure; construction. Housing facilities for dogs and cats must be designed and constructed so that they are structurally sound. They must be kept in good repair, and they must protect the animals from injury, contain the animals securely, and restrict other animals from entering.

* The top of two indoors enclosures has not been adequately secured to the enclosures housing five dogs. The top is constructed of two layers of metal mesh panels. There was a gap between the top and the front of the enclosure that was between 1 and 1.5 inches at the front edge creating a space large enough to entrap or injure a dog. At the time of the inspection, a Yorkshire terrier's head was entrapped in this area. The licensee must ensure that all enclosures are designed and constructed so they protect the animals from injury and contain all animals securely at all times. Correct by 5/1/12.

HOUSING FACILITIES, GENERAL.

All open supplies of food and bedding must be kept in leak proof containers with tightly fitting lids to prevent contamination and spoilage.

* There was one open sack of dog feed located in the whelping building housing eight dogs. All feed supplies must be stored in a manner that protects it from spoilage, contamination or vermin infestation. The nutritive value of the feed could be affected if it becomes spoiled or contaminated. The licensee must keep all feed supplies in leak proof containers with tightly fitting lids at all times. Correct by 5/7/12.

3.9 (b) REPEAT

FEEDING.

(b) Food receptacles must be used for dogs and cats, must be readily accessible to all dogs and cats, and must be located so as to minimize contamination by excreta and pests, and be protected from rain and snow. Feeding pans must either be made of a durable material that can be easily cleaned and sanitized or be disposable. If the food receptacles are not disposable, they must be kept clean and must be sanitized in accordance with Sec. 3.11(b) of this subpart. Sanitization is achieved by using one of the methods described in Sec. 3.11(b)(3) of this subpart. If the food receptacles are disposable, they must be discarded after one use. Self-feeders may be used for the feeding of dry food. If self-feeders are used, they must be kept clean and must be sanitized in accordance with Sec. 3.11(b) of this subpart. Measures must be taken

to ensure that there is no molding, deterioration, and caking of feed.

* At least three PVC self feeders used by six dogs had an accumulation of black to brown colored thick material along the inside area where the dogs have access to feed. The inspector was able to scrape the material off with a gloved finger. The self feeders are located in indoor housing. It can harbor bacteria and other disease causing agents that can affect the health and well being of the dogs. The licensee must ensure that all food receptacles are kept clean and sanitized at all times.

* The entire top of one plastic food receptacle used by one dog has a roughened, chewed surface. An accumulation of hair, dirt, and grime was present on the roughened surface. The receptacle is located in the whelp building. The licensee did replace the receptacle with a new one during the inspection. It can harbor bacteria and other disease causing agents that can affect the health and well being of the dog. The licensee must ensure that all food receptacles are kept clean and sanitized at all times.

* This was a focused inspection limited to the animals and animal housing. The exit briefing was done with the licensee, Dr. Kate Ziegerer VMO and Robert Bacon ACI.
