ILLEGAL PLAYERS – NEW ZEALAND U23 TEAM (VS VANUATU U23) – 10 JULY 2015

In the semi-final match between New Zealand U23 and Vanuatu U23 played on 10th July 2015, we believe New Zealand has fielded an illegal player in the match.

I think New Zealand has is fielded an illegal player in this match against Vanuatu U23 and during the tournament. The players in question is:

1. No. 3 DECKLAN WYNN
2. No. 18 SAM BURFOOT

Deklan Terrence Wynne (born 20 March, 1995) in Cape Town South Africa, is a South African born, New Zealand naturalized footballer who plays for Wanderers SC in the ASB Premiership, and the New Zealand national football team.

Sam BURFOOT (born 10 April 1994), in Bromley, England, now a naturalised New Zealander who plays for Auckland City FC.

Art 7 of the Regulations governing the FIFA Statutes states:

7 Acquisition of a new nationality

Any Player who refers to art. 5 par.1 to assume a new nationality and who has not played international football in accordance with art. 5 par. 2 shall be eligible to play for the new representative team only if he fulfils one of the following conditions:

- a) He was born on the territory of the relevant Association;
- b) His biological mother or biological father was born on the territory of the relevant Association;
- c) His grandmother or grandfather was born on the territory of the relevant Association;
- d) He has lived continuously for at least five years after reaching the age of 18 on the territory of the relevant Association.

We wish to submit as follows:

1. That the players in question were not born in New Zealand
2. That the players in question does not have a parent or grandparent born in the New Zealand
3. That the players in question have become naturalised citizens of New Zealand based on residency.

As a result the players in question must comply with Art. 7.(d) of the regulations governing the application of FIFA Statutes. That is since they were not born in the New Zealand and they don't have a parent or grandparent born in New Zealand.

The players in question are required to 5 years residency in New Zealand after reaching 18 years. As these players are 20 and 21 years they can't have spent 5 years residency after they turn 18 years and therefore are not illegible to play for New Zealand.

In accordance with Art. 10.3 of the Olympic Regulations we lodged a protest within 2 hours after the match and we followed up with this written report.

In accordance with Art. 55 of the FIFA Disciplinary Code, if New Zealand is found to field an illegible player than New Zealand must forfeit the match and pay a fine of CHF6000.

Re: **OFC Qualifying Format for Olympic Football Tournament 2016**

Men's Qualifying Tournament

2015 Pacific Games – Men's Football Tournament

Dates: 3 – 18 July 2015
Venue: Port Moresby, Papua New Guinea

Participating Teams: 8 teams consisting of:

- (a) 5 IOC Member Associations - Fiji, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands and Vanuatu
- (b) 3 non-IOC Member Associations - New Caledonia, Tahiti and Federated States of Micronesia

Proposed Format

- 8 teams are to be drawn into 2 groups of 4 teams
- The top 2 ranked IOC members from each group will qualify for the semi-finals.
- The winner the semi-final will contest the final.
- The winner of the final will represent OFC at the Men's Football Tournament – Brazil 2016.

Notes

- This tournament is played during the 2015 Pacific Games involving 22 countries and 25 sports played in Papua New Guinea from 4-18 July 2015.
- This tournament will be played in accordance with the FIFA Olympic Football Tournament – Brazil 2016 regulations.
- It is noted some participating teams are non IOC (Tahiti and New Caledonia) and non FIFA (Federated States of Micronesia, Kiribati and Tuvalu) and non OFC member association (Federated States of Micronesia) but all are members of the Pacific Games Council and have a right to enter this tournament. (we seek FIFA dispensation for the participation of non FIFA and non OFC members in this qualifying tournament)

Women's Qualifying Tournament**2015 Pacific Games – Women's Football Tournament****Stage 1**

Dates: 3 – 18 July 2015
Venue: Port Moresby, Papua New Guinea

Participating Teams: 7 teams consisting of:

(a) 6 IOC Member Associations - Cook Islands, Fiji, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Solomon Islands and Tonga

(b) 1 non-IOC Member Associations - New Caledonia

Format:

- Two groups of 4 teams and 3 teams played round robin on a league basis.
- The winner and runner of each group qualify for the semi-finals
- The winners of each semi-final will contest the final. The losers of each semi-final will contest 3rd/4th playoff.
- The highest ranked IOC member association will qualify for Stage 2.

Stage 2

Proposed Dates: 19 - 27 October 2015
Participating Teams: New Zealand and the Stage 1 Winner

Format:

- Teams will play each other home and away
- The winner of the playoff series on aggregate score will represent OFC at the Women's Football Tournament – Brazil 2016.

OFC qualifying formats for the 2018 FIFA World Cup Russia™ and for the Olympic Football Tournaments Rio 2016

Dear Mr Nicholas,

We duly and thankfully acknowledge receipt of your communications dated 21st April 2015 with regards to the above-mentioned qualifying competitions.

While we have taken note that the final OFC decision for the mentioned "third" qualifying stage in your letter which counts purely for the 2018 FIFA World Cup Russia™ will only be taken later, we acknowledge that the "second" stage referred to is yet entirely dedicated to the continental qualifiers for the 2016 OFC Cup of Nations. FIFA's administration will thus take over as of the last stage in 2016, which will actually correspond to the second stage of the 2018 FIFA World Cup Russia™ Qualifiers once we have accounted for the need to know the winner qualifying from the initial stage.

We take this opportunity to therefore ask you to please send OFC's additional details regarding the last stage, which will solely be dedicated to the 2018 FIFA World Cup Russia™ qualifiers, whichever your eventually chosen format for that last stage.

In effect, we would like to proceed with the draw preparations of that last stage on the occasion of the Preliminary Draw to be held in St. Petersburg on 25th July 2015 and, as you can appreciate, this information will be key to prepare the consequent draw.

In addition, we take note that the 2015 Pacific Games will be used by the OFC as the qualifying men's tournament for the Olympic Football Tournaments Rio 2016 as well as the first round in the women's qualifiers for the same tournaments. With respect to your request to be granted a derogation for the participation of non-IOC (Tahiti and New Caledonia) and non-FIFA teams (Federated States of Micronesia, Kiribati and Tuvalu), we are pleased to provide you with FIFA's approval. As stressed by yourself, it is relevant to reemphasize that none of such latter teams would be entitled to progressing to the Olympic Football Tournaments Rio 2016.
