MOTION FOR FORENSIC EVALUATION

NOW COMES the State of Maine, by and through its undersigned attorney, and requests that this Court order the defendant to be examined pursuant to 15 M.R.S. §101-D to determine her mental condition with reference to issues of competency, criminal responsibility, abnormal condition of mind, and any other issue involving her mental or emotional condition. In support of this motion the State says that:

- The defendant in this matter has been charged by complaint with one count of Intentional or Knowing Murder for an alleged offense that occurred on August 19, 2015 in Saco, Maine, York County.
- 2. At the scene of the alleged murder the defendant was asked by witnesses who responded to the scene why she had attacked the victim. The defendant responded to those witnesses that she was off her medications and that the victim had looked at her funny.
- 3. The State anticipates, based upon the defendant's assertions at the scene, that one of the likely issues in this case will be whether at the time of the offense the defendant was engaging in either intentional or knowing conduct as defined by the Maine Criminal Code, or the extent to which she had a serious mental condition that caused her to be unable to appreciate the wrongfulness of her conduct.

- 4. An evaluation pursuant to 15 M.R.S. §101-D to include competency, criminal responsibility and abnormal condition of mind is appropriate.
- The opinion of the examiner as related to criminal responsible and abnormal condition of the mind may be impounded until released by the Court.
- 6. In light of the foregoing there is cause for the Court to Order that the defendant be examined by the State Forensic Service pursuant to 15 M.R.S. §101-D.

WHEREFORE, for the foregoing reasons of law and fact the State asks that this

Honorable Court may grant its motion for an evaluation of the defendant's state of mind in

accordance with 15 M.R.S. §101-D and that the opinion of the examiner be impounded until

released by the Court. The State further prays that it may be granted such other and further relief

as may be just and proper.
