



Prosperity blooms along Fifth Avenue north of Washington Square. Business couples like this neighborhood. There are many "shared apartments" and rooming houses close to the park. It is a market of many contrasts, with overflowing Italian tenements and the most expensive type of modern hotels and apartment houses.
