**Situational Awareness: December 12, 2011, Occupy Wall Street Protest Scheduled – West Coast Seaport shut down planned – Seattle, San Francisco, Los Angeles, San Diego and Houston – CBP coordination ongoing with stakeholders**

**Summary:**

Occupy Wall Street (OWS) movement began in New York September 2011. The OWS movement has spread to over 100 cities in the U.S. with the intent on fighting back against the role of Wall Street creating an economic collapse. The OWS protesters have a diverse set of demands ranging from equal distribution of income, bank reform, the need for expanded job opportunities to a reduction of corporate influence on politics.

OWS also aims to fight back against the richest 1% of the population they claim are writing the rules of an unfair global economy that is foreclosing on our future. OWS is a non-binding consensus based assembly with no official group of leaders. OWS has also spawned multiple sub affiliated groups calling upon union members, youth and artists to actively participate. This collaboration with organizations and unions has supported the increased number of protests across the country. The ILWU (International Longshoreman and Warehouse Union) does not publicly support the Port blockades, considers the blockade a third party strike and will not actively participate however,

On Monday, December 12, 2011 a West Coast wide OWS protest has been scheduled as part of its attempt to shutdown West Coast seaports. These demonstrations are planned in the following locations:

- Anchorage, Alaska
- Los Angeles, California

Partners include the Los Angeles PD, Los Angeles Port Police, Long Beach PD, USCG, TSA FAMS, Union Pacific Police, and LA Fire Department.
- The LA/LB OWS protest plans are to assemble at Harry Bridges Park in Long Beach located near the Queen Mary and cruise ship processing terminal and then to march to the nearest terminal with the intent of shutting down terminal operations.

Protesters have blocked entrances to two terminals at the Port of Portland this morning, preventing trucks from entering.

Several hundred demonstrators reportedly marched from North Portland's Kelly Point Park to the marine terminals, then split into two groups and rallied at the entrances to terminals 5 and 6. The gates to the terminals are currently closed and blocked by police wearing riot gear.

According to Forbes, Terminal 5 is dedicated to grain and commodities exports, while Terminal 6 is a hub for the state's Asian imports.

A port spokesman said workers at both terminals were told to stay home today. He declined to say how many workers were affected by the closure.

**Situational Awareness: December 12, 2011, Occupy Wall Street Protest Scheduled – West Coast Seaport shut down planned – Seattle, San Francisco, Los Angeles, San Diego and Houston – CBP coordination ongoing with stakeholders**

**Summary:**

Occupy Wall Street (OWS) movement began in New York September 2011. The OWS movement has spread to over 100 cities in the U.S. with the intent on fighting back against the role of Wall Street creating an economic collapse. The OWS protesters have a diverse set of demands ranging from equal distribution of income, bank reform, the need for expanded job opportunities to a reduction of corporate influence on politics.

OWS also aims to fight back against the richest 1% of the population they claim are writing the rules of an unfair global economy that is foreclosing on our future. OWS is a non-binding consensus based assembly with no official group of leaders. OWS has also spawned multiple sub affiliated groups calling upon union members, youth and artists to actively participate. This collaboration with organizations and unions has supported the increased number of protests across the country. The ILWU (International Longshoreman and Warehouse Union) does not publicly support the Port blockades, considers the blockade a third party strike and will not actively participate however,

On Monday, December 12, 2011 a West Coast wide OWS protest has been scheduled as part of its attempt to shutdown West Coast seaports. These demonstrations are planned in the following locations:

- Anchorage, Alaska
- Los Angeles, California
- San Diego, California
- Oakland, California
- Portland, Oregon
- Houston, Texas
- Seattle, Washington
- Tacoma, Washington

In preparation for these protests, the Field Offices of Houston, Los Angeles, San Diego, San Francisco and Seattle are actively engaged with local law enforcement and trade partners to establish contingency plans in the event these protests impact any CBP location.

**Details:**

**Houston Field Office:**

- The OWS protest will begin at the Turning Basin Terminal (City Docks) in Houston, Texas.
- The Port of Houston Authority (POHA) is coordinating with the Houston Police Department to allow the protesters to protest outside of the terminal grounds.
- A CBP (b)(7)(E) is located near the protest location.
- POHA has requested that CBP divert (b)(7)(E) traffic to an alternate gate in the event the exit is shut down or adversely impacted.
- The Houston Field Office (b)(7)(E) is currently being refined in the event Operators are needed to support the security of CBP personnel.
- Houston Seaport employees have been mustered to direct any media inquiries to the Houston Field Office, Public Affairs Officer.

Los Angeles Field Office:

- CBP Los Angeles is participating with coordination/communication meetings with local law enforcement and public safety partners to discuss the potential "OWS" activity. Partners include the Los Angeles PD, Los Angeles Port Police, Long Beach PD, USCG, TSA FAMS, Union Pacific Police, and LA Fire Department.
- The LA/LB OWS protest plans are to assemble at Harry Bridges Park in Long Beach located near the Queen Mary and cruise ship processing terminal and then to march to the nearest terminal with the intent of shutting down terminal operations.
- A LE Command Post will be activated at the Long Beach Coordination Center. The initiation date and time has not yet been determined. CBP Los Angeles will have a (b)(7)(E) in the Command Post.

San Diego:

- The CBP Port of San Diego has coordinated with USCG, TSA, San Diego Harbor Police, San Diego Police Department and Port Authority regarding the potential shutdown.
- Protesters are scheduled to assemble at 0600 at a local city park then march a few blocks to the 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue seaport terminal.
- OWS protesters will be protest along the 10th Ave seaport terminal gates that lead to the docks. Their objective is to prevent longshoreman and port support staff from accessing their worksites, therefore halting work in the terminal.
- CBP San Diego mustered all CBP staff and advised them of the pending situation. Additionally, (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E) for CBP personnel have been identified.
- All CBP personnel have been advised not to engage with the OWS movement supporters.

San Francisco Field Office:

Anchorage:

- CBP does not have an office located at the Anchorage seaport.
- Should any disruption of operations occur the CBP Anchorage Area Port Offices, (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E)
- All CBP personnel have been mustered regarding this event.

Oakland:

- CBP Oakland continues ongoing coordination with the USCG, Oakland Police Department, Alameda County Sheriffs, Union Pacific Railroad Police, US Marshals, US Attorneys Office, and the Port of Oakland Security Office and Attorneys. The Oakland Police Department will be the lead agency on all possible criminal matters with other agencies providing support as required.
- Multiple emergency operations centers will be stood up and CBP Oakland will have (b)(7)(E) assigned to each location for communication and coordination efforts.
- OWS protesters will assemble near the West Oakland Bart Station and march down 7<sup>th</sup> and Maritime Streets. (15-20 minute march from the BART Station to the Port of Oakland near the CBP Office.) This march will occur prior to regularly scheduled CBP operations.
- CBP Oakland staff will be onsite to assess developing situation.

- All CBP personnel have been mustered regarding this event in addition all personnel have updated their (b)(7)(E) and advised not to engage with the OWS movement supporters.
- (b)(7)(E) have also been defined.

Portland:

- The Portland Port Authority held a meeting with stakeholders from Portland Port Police, Portland Metro Police Bureau, and Port of Portland PAO to discuss possible OWS Portland Protest on Monday, December 12, 2011.
- Coordination efforts continue with the Port Authority, Terminal operator, and with Law Enforcement entities.
- The Portland Port Police stated the protest will be held at Pier Park and proceed to Terminal 4, with objective of blocking access to the Terminal. Portland Metro Police will not have a final a response plan until Friday, December 9, 2011.
- Within CBP Portland, personnel have been informed (b)(7)(E)
- Tentatively, Port of Portland will serve as the primary location for media and terminal operators.

Seattle Field Office:

- The Area Port of Seattle has actively engaged Tacoma and Seattle, WA seaport container terminal operators and law enforcement/security officials for coordination (b)(7)(E)
- The OWS protest will be through downtown Seattle and proceed to a port terminal.

## Synopsis: (cont.):

On November 1, 2011 at 06:30 am CBP was notified by SSA terminal security that it will be closed to all traffic. CBP has reached out to all other terminal management for status updates and currently all terminals are operational with the exception of SSA and Trapac which remain closed.

CBP is being advised that this closure is a combination of Longshoremen dissatisfaction of working conditions due to the Vietnamese exploding container issue and to show support for the Occupy Oakland Protest. Currently Occupy Oakland Protest movement plans on marching the Oakland Seaport on November 2, 2011 at 17:00 hrs. Several news stations have posted broadcast vehicles in the port to cover this situation.

\*\*UPDATE 11/2/11\*\*

On November 2, 2011 at 15:30 CBP Management reached out to the Port of Oakland Emergency Operations Center located at (b)(7)(E) to access the situation regarding the potential protest at the Port of Oakland. Information was received that protesters were possibly going to be shuttled by buses to the port around 16:00. (b)(7)(E)

At 16:30 Protesters from the Occupy Oakland Movement entered the Port of Oakland by buses and bicycles blocked all intersections and exits of the marine terminals. (b)(7)(E)

At 17:45 the seven officers exited the APL Terminal via Oakland Police Department Marine Unit and were taken to Oakland berth 7 where CBP units were waiting to escort officers back to the East Bay Station. At 18:13 all CBP personnel were accounted for and departed the East Bay Station. The Oakland East Bay Station was secured and the on duty officers

relocated to the Oakland airport to complete shift.

### Synopsis: (cont.):

On the afternoon of Thursday, October 27, 2011, approximately 100 subjects from (but not limited to) "Occupy Detroit" held a peaceful protest in the vicinity of the exit area of the Fort Street Cargo Facility in Detroit, Michigan. The focus of the protest appeared to be the failed plan for The New International Trade Crossing in the Michigan legislature. No entry by the group was made onto CBP property, and commercial truck traffic flow was temporarily delayed as the protest group shifted location. Detroit Police Department and Border Patrol were on site for officer presence. Local news channels were also present for coverage. The protest ended after about one hour without any adverse impacts to CBP operations.

### Details:

? On the afternoon of Thursday, October 27, 2011, approximately 100 protestors gathered on the intersection of St. Anne Street and 18th Street, located about one block from the Fort Street Cargo Facility in Detroit, Michigan.

? Protesters were holding signs saying, "Create jobs now", "Stop", and "Manny is a 1%", and shouting, "What do we want - justice, When do we want it ? now".

? There was a temporary delay of commercial truck traffic flow leaving the facility as the protest group shifted location.

? No entry of the group was made onto CBP property.

? Detroit Police Department (DPD) and Border Patrol were on site for officer presence.

? Local news channels were also present for coverage.

? The protest ended after about one hour without any adverse impacts to CBP operations.
