

 2/26/12, at approximately 1917 hours, I was dispatch to 1111 Retreat View Cir. in reference to a complainant seeing a suspicious person in the area. While en route dispatch stated the they were receiving calls in reference to gun shots being heard in the nrea where I was responding to.

Ofc. T. Smith stated via radio that he was arriving in the area, Ofc. T. Smith later states that there was one subject shot and he had one at gun point.

Upon arrival Ofc. T. Smith had a white male, later identified as George Zimmerman, in custody. Zimmerman was also the original caller in reference to the suspicious person.

I then noticed that there was, what appeared to be a black male wearing a gray sweater, blue jeans, and white/red sneakers laying face down on the ground. The black male had his hands underneath his body. I attempted to get a response from the black male, but was met with negative results. At that time Sgt. Raimondo arrived and attempted to get a pulse on the black male but none was found. At that time, Sgt. Raimondo and I turned the black male over and began CPR. Sgt. Raimondo did breaths and I did chest compressions.

Sgt. S. McCoy arrived on scene and relieved me continuing compressions. Sanford Fire Rescue arrived on scene and attempted to revive the subject, but could not. Paramedic Brady pronounced the subject deceased at 1930 hours.

The scene was then secured with crime scene tape by Ofc. Mend and Ofc. Wagner. Ofc. Robertson began a crime scene contamination log.

Lt. Taylor arrived on scene and notified dispatch to have Major Crimes respond to the scene.

Ofc. Mead and Ofc. Wagner were able to make contact with neighbors in the area. They were able to obtain statements from all witnesses on scene.

The scone was turned over to SPD Major Crimes.

On 2/26/2012, at approximately 1917 hours, I responded to 1111 Retreat View Cir in reference to a report of a suspicious person. As I arrived on scene, dispatch advised of a report of shots fired in the same subdivision.

I was advised by dispatch that the report of shots fired was possibly coming from 1231 Twin Trees La. I was then advised, after receiving multiple calls, that there was a subject laying in the grass in between the residences of 1231 Twin Trees La. and 2821 Retreat View Cir. I responded to 2821 Retreat View Cir and exited my marked Sanford police vehicle and began to canvas the area. As I walked in between the buildings 1 observed a white male, wearing a red jacket and blue jeans. I also observed a black male, wearing a gray hooded sweat shirt, laying face down in the grass.

I asked the subject in the red jacket, later identified as George Zimmerman (who was original caller for the suspicious person complaint), if he had seen the subject. Example 2 immerman complied with all of my verbal commands and was secured in handcuffs. Located on the inside of Zimmerman's waist band, I removed a black Kel Tek 9mm PF9 semi auto handgun and holster. While I was in such close contact with Zimmerman, I could observe that his lack appeared to be wet and was covered in grass, as if he had been laying on his back on the ground. Zimmerman was also bleeding from the nose and back of his head.

Shortly after securing Zimmerman, Officer Ricardo Ayala arrived on scene. I advised Officer Ayala that I had not made contact with the black male subject laying on the ground. I observed Officer Ayala make contact with the subject and attempt to get a response, but was met with negative results. Shortly after this, other officers began to arrive on scene along with SFD Rescue 38 who began to give aid to the subject laying on the ground.

On February 26, 2012, I was notified to respond to the area of Retreat View Circle reference a shooting. I then notified Inv. Singleton to also respond. Upon my arrival and entering the crime scene, I observed a black male, later identified as, Trayvon Martin laying on the ground with his face up with his head to the west. Martin was wearing a grey sweatshirt and light colored shorts and white tennis shoes.

I was told by an officer that a George Zimmerman was the shooter and a hand gun has been recovered. The officer then told me that Zimmerman had been taken to the Sanford Police Department.

I observed a key chain lying on the grass near the T portion of the walkway, a black flashlight lying on the grass just east of the key chain.

I asked the patrol supervisors on scene if they had canvassed the area. I was told they had some statements from witness. I asked the supervisor to have some of the officers to go door to door as far as the crime scene tape in altempt to locate more witness. I asked another patrol officer to run the vehicle tags parked along the road on both sides of the incident. There was a white male standing inside the crime scene standing next to the log officer. I made contact with the subject confirmed we had documented his information and then asked him to exit the crime scene.

I noticed a black cell phone near the area of Martin. I then contacted Agent Shor from CCIB to my location and asked him to bring the celabrite device, a device that is used to down load cell phone information. Upon Agent Shor's arrival he told me that he could not down load any information because the cell phone battery was either very low or the was not operable because the cell phone had gotten wet because of the current weather condition (wet and rain).

While Martin was in the process of being transferred to the M.E's office an inventory was being conducted of Martin's person. I noticed the items collected for cvidence were a bag of skittles, an Arizona ice ten can and head phones. I also observed Sgt. Ciesia recover an empty bullet casing in the grass after Martin's was recovered from the scene.

I responded to the Sanford Police Department upon my arrival I asked Zimmerman's wife to get another set of clothing because the investigators were going to seize her husband's clothes. Zimmerman was released a short time later.

from the male. I lifted the males shirt and saw a chest wound. As I lifted the shirt, I felt a large, cold can in the center pocket. I directed by standers nearby to get me some plastic wrap and Vaseline. An Asian male returned with a plastic grocery bag and I used it to seal the chest wound. I was unable to find an exit wound on the males back.

Sgt. McCoy relieved Ofc. Ayala from chest compressions and she and I performed CPR for approximately six minutes before rescue arrived. Once

rescue took over. I stood by and watched until they pronounced the male deceased.

I supervised the establishment of the crime scene and crime scene log. I procured an emergency blanket from my vehicle and covered the male. 1 assisted with identifying witnesses.

DETAILS:

On 02/26/2012 at approximately 1940 hours, I was contacted by CST D. Smith, and she told me that there had been a homicide at Refreat at Twin Lakes. Sgt. Joseph Santiago also called me with the same information. While en route I called Captain R. O'Conner and told him what I had been told and that I was responding. I arrived at approximately 2010 hours and met with CST Smith who briefed me on the scene. It was dark and there were informittent showers.

I walked through the scene with CST Smith and she pointed out items of evidence that were already located, There was a Honda key with a small flash light on the ring, a cell phone, a larger flashlight, two plastic procery type bags, a first aid kit, and discarded medical supplies. The victim's body was covered with a yellow plastic blanket with an Arizona ice Tea can on it. I then assisted CST Smith in photographing the scene while we waited for the Volusia County Medical Examiner's Office investigator and transport services to arrive. After CST Smith completed her initial photographs of the scene I assisted her in measuring the Items on the scene for her sketch, she then collected the Items. The Volusia County Medical Examiner's Office arrived on scene and began to examine and move the victim. The victim had \$ 40,15 in US currency, a bag of skittles candy, a red 7-11 red lighter in his pockets, headphones next to him, and a photo pin on his sweatshirt. After making inquires I was told that the Arizona ice Tea can was from inside the victim's Sweatshirt pocket and had come out while first aid was being given. When the ME investigator lifted the victim's clothing I saw a single gun shot wound to the chest. The victim was then transported for the ME by livery, After a visual search of the area failed to turn up the cartridge I got the metal detector and began to scan the area where the victim had jain. I did one sweep of the area with negative results and then reset the sensitivity of the metal detector. As I started again I heard a strong tone and looked in the area, I did not see anything so I marked the area, and instructed CST Smith to check the area again visually and I moved on. Before I got to the end of the sweep CST Smith told me that she had found casing just inches from where I had placed the marker. CST Smith documented and recovered a 9mm Luger S&B cartridge case. We retrieved our equipment and returned to the Sanford Police Department.

On 02/26/2012 at approximately 2321 hours I again met with CST Smith, officers and Investigators and I observed CST Smith take photographs of the subjects' injuries, hands, collect possible gun shot residue using a GSR kit. This took place in a Sanford Police Department Interview room 2. We then had to wait for the subject's wife to respond with a change of clothes and the clothes that the subject was wearing were collected, CST Smith collected and logged all of the evidence.

On 02/27/2012 at approximately 1235 hours I responded to Retreat at Twin Lakes and assisted CST Smith In photographing the scene during daylight.

On 03/05/12 I was asked to check the round count for the recovered firearm. I examined the crime scene photos and our café report and determined that:





On 2/28/2012 at approximately 1040 hrs I was walking through the Major Crimes office area and I observed Investigator Serino at his desk playing 911 recordings for Trayvon Martin's father and a female. I decided to stop and stay in the area once I realized that the 911 recordings were being played incase I could render any assistance to the family or Investigator Serino. I was standing by the walkway and a post was separating me from directly seeing Mr. Martin's reactions. Before the 911 call of a person yelling in the background was played, investigator Serino warned them that there was disturbing content. I could not hear Mr. Martin's reply and investigator Serino proceeded to play the recording. I did hear Investigator Serino ask Mr. Martin if that was his son yelling in the background. I did not hear a reply. Mr. Martin was talking very softly when I did hear him. I do not know what order the tapes were played in as I was not directly involved with talking to Mr. Martin.

At 1916 hours, a 911 call, placed by was received where Zimmerman can be heard in the background frantically yelling for help. At 1917 hours a gunshot was heard in the background of the 911 call, and moments later Officer Tim Smith arrived on scene. The encounter between George Zimmerman and Trayvon Martin was ultimately avoidable by Zimmerman, if Zimmerman had remained in his vehicle and awaited the arrival of law enforcement, or conversely if he had identified himself to Martin as a concerned citizen and initiated dialog in an effort to dispel each party's concern. There is no indication that Trayvon Martin was involved in any criminal activity at the time of the encounter, Attempts to locate additional witnesses have consisted of multiple canvasses of the neighborhood on the evenings of 2/26/2012, 2/27/2012, and 3/1/2012. The distribution of informational flyers throughout the gated community was completed on 2/29/212 and a community meeting, which was held on March I, 2012. All digitally recorded interviews were submitted as evidence, and all forensic laboratory requests are being submitted to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement for analysis. Based upon the facts and circumstances outlined in this narrative, I believe there exists probable cause for issuance of a capias charging George Michael Zimmerman with Manslaughter, in violation of Ch. 782.07 FS. This case is being forwarded to the Office of the State's Attorney as a request for capias. 

DETAILS:

Case Synoplais:

On 2/26/2012, at the Retreat at Twin Lakes community, located on Oregon Avenue in Sanford, Seminole County, Florida, a twenty-eight year old white male, identified as George Michael Zimmerman and seventeen year old black male, identified as Trayvon Benjamin Martin, engaged in a physical confrontation in a common area behind two rows of townhomes. The incident was witnessed by several people, all of whom called 911 however the initial harmful event has no known eyewitnesses.

Preliminary investigation showed that Zimmerman, a member of his community's Neighborhood Watch Program, observed Martin walking in the community, and perceived Martin as being "suspicious". Zimmerman acted on his suspicion of Martin, and called the Sanford Police non-emergency line.



Victimology:

The decedent, positively identified by means of a postmortem photograph by his biological father as Trayvon Benjamin Martin, was a 17 year old resident of Miami Gardens, Florida, and a high school student with no criminal background. When asked as to his propensity towards violence, his father, Mr. Tracy Martin, states his son was a well-mannered, non-violent child. A local Miami Gardens Police Department background check revealed one field contact conducted in November of 2011.

ten days from his high school in Miami Gardens for possession of cannabis. He had been in Sanford for seven days prior to this event.

On 2/26/2012 at approximately 1926 hours, I was notified of a shooting with injuries event by the Seminole County Communications Center, and I was instructed to contact the duty Watch Commander, Lieutenant M. Taylor

At approximately 1930 hours I contacted Lieutenant M. Taylor, via NexTel, and I was informed of the location of the incident, and that one person (unidentified black male) was pronounced dead on scene, and that the individual who shot the decedent, identified as George Michael Zimmerman, had remained on scene, was cooperative, was in police custody. I was told that Zimmerman had been transported to the Sanford Police Department for interviewing purpose. I was also advised that the weapon used was also in police custody.

On arrival at the scene, at approximately 2000 hours, I met with SPD Officer Ricardo Ayala, who produced the preliminary report. Officer Ayala briefed me as to the known circumstances. I was informed by Officer Ayala that an apparent confrontation occurred between the then unidentified black male, later positively identified as Trayvon Benjamin Martin, age 17, and George Michael Zimmerman. Officer Ayala further informed me that during the confrontation, Zimmerman stated that he produced a 9mm semiautomatic pistol (for which he had a valid Florida concealed firearm carry permit), and fired a single round, striking Martin in the chest. Officer Ayala informed me that lifesaving efforts performed by Sgt. R. Raimondo, and Officer T. Smith, and Sanford Fire Rescue proved unsuccessful, and that Martin was pronounced dead on scene by Sanford Fire Rescue 38.

I then interviewed Officer T. Smith, who was the first officer on scene. Officer Smith Informed me that upon his arrival he came in contact with George Zimmerman, apparently moments after Zimmerman had shot Trayvon Martin. Officer Smith informed me that Zimmerman offered no resistance while he was placed into custody at gunpoint. He stated that Zimmerman's facial area was bloodied, and the posterior of his clothing was solled with wet grass, indicative of having recently been on his back on the grass. Officer Smith stated

I was also informed that statements made by Zimmerman on scene to Officer T. Smith were corroborated by several witnesses, and led to the possibility of this shooting having been in self-defense. Written statements were obtained from

Audio recorded statements from these witnesses were conducted at a later date (referred to later in this narrative).

After I learned from Lieutenant Taylor that George Zimmerman had been transported to the Sanford Police Department, I requested Inv. Doris Singleton respond to the police station in order to interview Zimmerman. I contacted inv. Singleton, informed her of the apparent nature of this matter, and advised her to remove Zimmerman's restraint devices prior to conducting her interview.

I remained on scene and coordinated crime scene processing efforts with Sgt. L. Ceisla and Crime Scene Technician D. Smith. The scene was an outdoor crime scene, in a predominately grassy area with a paved walkway between two rows of townhomes, bordered by Retreat View Circle, and Twin Tree Lane. The time of the evening when the shooting occurred was approximately 1916 hours, after sunset, on an overcast evening with sporadic rain showers. The only ambient lighting was produced by the porch lights of several residences, and overall the location can be best described as dark. The decedent lay supine directly behind

hooded pullover sweatshirt, tan pants, and tennis shoes. I observed no blunt force trauma to his head or facial area.

At approximately 2020 hours I spoke with Volusia County Medical Examiner's Office Investigator T. Clark, and requested her response.

On 2/26/2012 at approximately 2055 hours I interviewed

who was in her bedroom, stated she heard "loud voices" coming from the area behind her

residence. She stated she heard a commotion, which sounded to her like arguing. She then stated that she, from her bedroom window, observed two men on the ground, and she then heard someone yell "help, help". She then heard a 'pop" noise and then saw the decedent laying on the ground, motionless, and the other male, who she described as "larger" and "Hispanic looking", standing over the decedent. Upon inquiry, stated she did not witness how the confrontation between the decedent and the shooter occurred.

provided a written statement, and her interview was audio recorded and submitted into evidence.

On 2/26/2012 at approximately 2105 hours I Interviewed stated that while inside of his residence he heard a commotion coming from the walk way behind his residence. When he investigated, he witnessed a black male, wearing a dark colored "hoodie" on top of a white or Hispanic male who was yelling for help. He elaborated by stating the black male was mounted on the white or Hispanic male and throwing punches "MMA (mixed martial arts) style". He stated he yelled out to the two individuals that he was going to call the police. He then heard a "pop". He stated that after hearing the "pop", he observed the person he had previously observed on top of the other person (the black male wearing the "hoodie") laid out on the grass. Upon inquiry, and stated he did not witness how the confrontation started between the two individuals, and that he could not positively identify either one due to the lighting conditions. Interest stated he was in his living room at the onset of the commotion, and looked out of his sliding glass door, which placed him approximately 30 feet directly in front from where the physical altercation between Martin and Zimmerman was taking place. provided a written statement, and his interview was audio recorded and submitted into evidence. written statement reads as follows:

"I heard yelling out back in grass area of home but not sure at first but after second "help" yell I opened blinds, and saw clothing but everything dark outside. I opened door and saw a guy on the ground getting hit by another man on top of him in a strattle [sic] position hitting a guy in red sweatshirt or on the bottom getting hit was yelling help (guy getting hit on ground was wearing red calling out help). I said I was calling the cops and ran upstairs then heard a gunshot. When I got upstairs I saw the guy on top who was hitting the guy in the red laid out on the grass as if he had been shot. I also saw the guy in red standing near end of sidewalk where a guy with flashlight probably neighbor was talking to him asking what happened."

On 2/26/2012 at approximately 2130 hours, VCME Office Investigator Tara Clark arrived on scene and assumed jurisdiction over the decedent. Initial inspection on the decedent showed no significant trauma, other than a solitary gunshot wound to the chest, just left of midline. The decedent was found to not be in possession of any form of identification, and was transported to the Volusia County Medical Examiner's Office as "John Doe #3". On his person was a can of Arizona brand iced tea, a bag of Skittles candy, and \$40.15 in US currency.

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On 02/26/2012 at approximately 2345 hours I spoke with Assistant State Attorney Kelly Jo Hines and apprised her of the circumstances surrounding this case.



On 2/27/2012, at approximately 0920 hours, after learning of a missing persons' complaint in progress at **approximately** I responded along with CSO Ed Manning, and SPD Officer B. McIntosh. On arrival I met with Tracy Martin who stated his 17 year old son, Trayvon Martin, had not returned from going to the store sometime on the evening of 2/26. Mr. Martin Informed me his son was not from this area, and that his son is visiting from Miami Gardens, and that his son did not have a State of Florida Identification Card or Driver's License. While conversing with Mr. Martin, I noted several physical characteristics he had in common with the decedent, thereby establishing a reasonable factual basis to believe that the decedent was the son of Mr. Martin. Upon presenting Mr. Martin with a photograph of the facial image of the decedent, taken at the scene, positive identification was made in conjunction with Next of Kin notification. I explained the circumstances surrounding the passing of his son, and summoned for a victim's advocate to assist. Victim's Advocate Debra Wagner responded and assisted Mr. Martin and his family.

On 2/27/2012 at 1030 hours, Trayvon Martin underwent a forensic autopsy at the Volusia County Medical Examiner's Office. Preliminary autopsy findings ruled cause of death was injury stemming from a gunshot wound to the chest which perforated the heart organ, manner of death established as homicide. A single projectile was recovered from the chest cavity of the decedent, and submitted into evidence by CST D. Smith.

On 2/27/2012 I was provided with the audio recordings of six (6) 911 calls stemming from this incident, along with a recording of George Zimmerman's non-emergency call.

I reviewed Zimmerman's nonemergency call to SPD dispatch.

I reviewied the 911 calls, specifically 20120571669, placed by **section** in the background I could clearly hear a male's voice yelling either "Help" or "Help Me", fourteen (14) times in an approximately 38 second time span. This voice was determined to be that of George Zimmerman, who was apparently yelling for help as he was being battered by Trayvon Martin.

Investigator D. Singleton, using information obtained from the Seminole County Sheriff's Office Computer

Aided Dispatch (CAD), established the following timeline:

On 2/28/2012 at 1030 hours I met with Tracy Martin, and **Example 1** at the Sanford Police Department. The purpose for this meeting was to brief the decedent's next of kin as to the progress of this investigation. Mr. Martin, concerned over there being no arrest made in the shooting death of his son, was advised of the nature of this case, and ultimately assured that a proper investigation would be conducted. Mr. Martin acknowledged the complexity of this case prior to departing.

On 02/28/2012, Investigator Trekell Perkins received a telephone call from an unidentified female. This female, who refused to provide her name, call back number, or any other type of contact information, disclosed to Inv. Perkins that George Zimmerman has racist ideologies, and that he is fully capable of instigating a confrontation that could have escalated to the point of Zimmerman having to use deadly force. Inv. Perkins was able to record a portion of his conversation with this anonymous female and said recording was placed on a compact disc and submitted as evidence. No other information has been obtained to corroborate this anonymous female's information and her identity has not been established.

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Research on the prior incident referred to by Zimmerman revealed that Zimmerman, on 2/2/2012, called in a suspicious person at 1460 Retreat View Circle. Subsequent police response showed the person described by Zimmerman as staking out this residence, identified by Zimmerman as a black male, in a black leather jacket, and printed pants, had departed the area prior to police arrival, and criminal offense report was made (SPD Event 20120332595).

On 3/1/2012, at approximately 1900 hours, while conducting a re-canvass of the neighborhood, I located

Comparing could not distinguish who was chasing whom, and cannot identify either of the persons she witnessed on the evening of 2/26/2012. This interview was digitally recorded and submitted as evidence.

Based on these statements, I requested both **approximately** appear at the police department for more thorough interviewing in a controlled setting. Both **approximately** agreed to interviewing, which was scheduled for 3/2 at 1830 hours.

at the Sanford Police Department. On 3/02/2012 at 1856 hours, I re-interviewed stated she was home at the time of this incident. She stated that while inside of her kitchen, she heard someone crying, just prior to hearing a gunshot ring out. She stated the person standing over the other person did not respond to her. After repeating "What's going on out there?" the person standing over the other person stated "just call the police". states she noticed the person on the ground was face down only after police arrived on scene. could not provide any information pertaining to how the confrontation between the Zimmerman and Martin originated, and she could not articulate anything reference words spoken between the two. When asked to best describe the crying or sobbing she heard, she stated it was if coming from a young person, and the tone was that of fear, and/or complaining. When asked if she was acquainted with George Zimmerman, she replied in the affirmative, and she knows him to be an even-tempered "laid back" type of person. She stated she perceived him as being passionate about the neighborhood watch program, and stated she "could see him" confronting someone he perceived as a threat to the neighborhood. could not provide any information pertaining to how the violent episode between George Zimmerman and the decedent occurred and stated she was not familiar with the decedent. interview was digitally recorded, placed on a compact disc, and submitted into evidence.

She stated she observed a neighbor, whom she could not identify, asking the person on the ground if he was "okay" and if the person on the ground wanted him to call 911. Investigative findings show that on 2/26/2012 at approximately 1912 hrs George Michael Zimmerman initiated a nonemergency call to Sanford Police dispatch to report a suspicious person. Zimmerman reported a suspicious person, Trayvon Martin, whom he observed entering the gated community of The Reserve at Twin Lakes on foot, walking between residences from the northwest.

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Investigation reveals that on August 3, August 4, and October 6, 2011, and February 2, 2012, George Zimmerman reported suspicious persons, all young Black males, in the Retreat neighborhood to the Sanford Police Department. According to records checks, all of Zimmerman's suspicious persons calls while residing in the Retreat neighborhood have identified Black males as the subjects.

Attempts to locate additional witnesses have consisted of multiple canvasses of the neighborhood on the evenings of 2/26/2012, 2/27/2012, and 3/1/2012. The distribution of informational flyers throughout the gated community was completed on 2/29/212 and a community meeting, which was held on March 1, 2012.


All digitally recorded interviews were submitted as evidence, and all forensic laboratory requests are being submitted to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement for analysis.



Smith in reference to responding to Retreat at Twin Lakes to process a homicide scene, I arrived on scene at approximately 1955 hours and met with Officer Ayala and Officer Mead who briefed me on the scene. Currently at this time in the evening, it was dark out and we were experiencing intermittent showers.



At that time, I walked through the scene with the officer's and they pointed out items of evidence that were already located, it was still raining at this time. It was dark outside, raining off and on, and there was not much light lighting up in the courtyard. There were a set of keys containing a small flash light that was on, a cell phone, larger flashlight, two plastic bags, first aid kit, medical supplies, the victim's body that was covered by a yellow medical blanket, and an Arizona tea can. According to Officer's on the scene, the Arizona tea can was originally located in the front pocket of the victim's jacket. I then retrieved my camera and started to photograph the scene while I waited for the Volusia County Medical Examiner's Office transport services to arrive. After my photographs of the initial scene were completed, Sgt Clesla and I measured the Items on the scene and then I collected them. The Volusia County Medical Examiner's Office arrived on scene and moved the victim. The victim had \$ 40.15 in US currency, a bag of skittles, red lighter, headphones, photo pin in his pockets or on him. I also noticed and documented that there was only a single gun shot wound to the chest. After the victim was transported, Sgt. Clesia and I looked for a cartridge case while It was still raining. Sgt. Clesia utilized a metal detector as I searched in the areas the detector would detect. A short time later, a 9mm Luger S&B cartridge case was located, documented, and recovered. All evidence will be transported to the Sanford Police Department and logged into evidence.

I responded to the Sanford Police Department on 01/26/2012 at approximately 2315 hours and met with Office T. Smith. Officer T. 

The mixed DNA profile obtained from Exhibit DMS-21A demonstrated the presence of at least two individuals. A complete DNA profile for the major contributor could be determined.

The frequency of occurrence of the major DNA profile obtained from Exhibit DMS-21A for unrelated individuals in the following populations is approximately:

- 1 in 11 quadrillion Caucasians
- 1 in 1.5 quintillion African Americans (Blacks)
- 1 in 57 quadrillion Southeastern Hispanics

A DNA profile for the minor contributor(s) could not be determined.

Trayvon Benjamin Martin (ME-3) is excluded as a possible contributor to the mixed DNA obtained from Exhibit DMS-21A.

Due to the limited nature of the DNA results obtained from Exhibit DMS-21B, the data obtained is not interpretable.

The body is secured in a blue body bag with Medical Examiner seal #0000517.

The body is viewed unclothed. The body is that of a normally developed, black male appearing the stated age of 17 years with a body length of 71 inches and body weight of 158 pounds. The body presents a medium build with average nutrition, normal hydration and good preservation. Rigor mortis is complete, and lividity is well developed and fixed on the posterior surfaces of the body. The body is cold to touch post refrigeration. Short black hair covers the scalp. The face is unremarkable. There is average body hair of adult-male-pattern distribution. The eyes are closed and have clear bulbar and palpebral conjunctivae. The irides are brown with white sclerae. There are no cataracts or arcus present. The pupils are equal at 5 millimeters. The orbits appear normal. The nasal cavities are unremarkable with an intact septum. The oral cavity presents natural teeth with fair oral hygicne. The ears are unremarkable with no hemorrhage in the external auditory canals. The neck is rigid due to postmortem changes, and there are no palpable masses. The chest is symmetrical. The abdomen is scaphoid.

The upper and lower extremities are equal and symmetrical and present cyanotic nail beds without clubbing or edema. There are no fractures, deformities or amputations present. The external genitalia present descended testicles and an unremarkable penis. The back reveals dependent lividity with contact pallor. The buttocks are atraumatic, and the anus is intact. The integument is of normal color.

EVIDENCE OF INJURY

Penetrating Gunshot Wound of the Chest:

The entrance wound is located on the left chest, $17\frac{1}{2}$ inches below the top of the head, 1 inch to the left of the anterior midline, and $\frac{1}{2}$ inch below the nipple. It consists of a $\frac{3}{4}$ inch diameter round entrance defect with soot, ring abrasion, and a 2 x 2 inch area of stippling. This wound is consistent with a wound of entrance of intermediate range.

Further examination demonstrates that the wound track passes directly from front to back and enters the pleural cavity with perforations of the left anterior fifth intercostal space, pericardial sac, right ventricle of the heart, and the right lower lobe of the lung. There is no wound of exit.

Three fragments of projectile are recovered. The lead core is recovered in the pericardial sac behind the right ventricle. Two fragments of the jacket are recovered in the right pleural cavity behind the right lower lobe of the lung.

The injuries associated with the wound: The entrance wound; perforations of left anterior fifth intercostal space, pericardial sac, right ventricle of the heart, right lower lobe of the lung with approximately 1300 milliliters of blood in the right pleural cavity and 1000 in the left pleural cavity; the collapse of both lungs.

Other injuries: There is a $\frac{1}{4}$ x $\frac{1}{4}$ inch small abrasion on the left fourth finger.

EVIDENCE OF RECENT MEDICAL TREATMENT

There is a cardiac monitor pad on the left flank.

EVIDENCE OF ORGAN AND/OR TISSUE DONATION

None.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION: The following excludes any previously described injuries.

BODY CAVITIES

The peritoneum is congested, smooth, glistening and essentially dry; devoid of adhesions or effusion. There is no scoliosis, kyphosis or lordosis present. The left and right diaphragms are in their normal location and appear grossly unremarkable.

The subcutaneous fat measures 1.5 centimeters and is normally distributed, moist and bright yellow. The musculature of the chest and abdominal area is of normal color and texture.

NECK AND TONGUE

The neck presents an intact hyoid bone as well as the thyroid and cricoid cartilages. The larynx has unremarkable vocal cords and folds that appear widely patent without foreign material. The epiglottis is a characteristic plate-like structure without edema, trauma or pathological lesions. Both the musculature and the vasculature of the anterior neck are unremarkable. The trachea and spine are in the midline, and present no traumatic injuries or pathological lesions. The tongue is unremarkable.

CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM

The heart weighs 200 grams and there is no chamber hypertrophy or dilatation. The left ventricular wall is 1.1 centimeters and the right is 0.2 centimeters. The cardiac valves appear unremarkable. The coronary ostia are in the normal anatomical location leading into widely patent coronary arteries. Right dominant circulation is present. The endocardial surface is smooth without thrombi or inflammation. Sectioning of the myocardium presents no gross evidence of ischemic changes either of recent or remote origin. The aortic arch, along with the great vessels, appears grossly unremarkable.

RESPIRATORY SYSTEM

The lungs are collapsed and together weigh 410 grams. There are no gross pneumonic lesions or abnormal masses identified. The tracheobronchial tree and pulmonary arterial system are intact and grossly unremarkable. The pleural surfaces are pink and smooth with focal mild anthracosis.

HEPATOBILIARY SYSTEM

The liver weighs 1110 grams and presents a brown, smooth, glistening surface. Focal patchy yellow discoloration, due to mild fatty metamorphosis, is present. On sectioning, the hepatic parenchyma is yellow-brown, homogeneous and congested. The unremarkable gallbladder contains approximately 8 milliliters of greenish bile. There is no cholecystitis or lithiasis. The biliary tree is patent. The pancreas presents a lobulated yellow cut surface without acute or chronic pancreatitis.

HEMOLYMPHATIC SYSTEM

The spleen weighs 100 grams and presents a gray-pink intact capsule and a dark red parenchyma. There is no lymphadenopathy. The thymus gland is involuted.

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GASTROINTESTINAL, SYSTEM

The esophagus is intact with normal gastroesophageal junctions and without erosions or varices. The stomach is also normal without gastritis or ulcers, and contains 400 milliliters of gastric fluid with food particles. Loops of small and large bowel appear grossly unremarkable. The appendix is unremarkable.

UROGENITAL SYSTEM

The kidneys weigh 100 grams, and 110 grams, right and left, respectively. On sectioning, the cortex presents a normal thickness above the medulla. The renal columns of Bertin extend between the well-demarcated pyramids and appear unremarkable. The medulla presents normal renal pyramids with unremarkable papillae. The pelvis is of normal size and is lined by gray glistening mucosa. There are no calculi. The renal arteries and veins are normal. The ureters are of normal caliber lying in their course within the retroperitoneum and drain into an unremarkable urinary bladder containing approximately 75 milliliters of urine.

The external genitalia present an unremarkable penis without hypospadia, epispadias or phimosis. There are no infectious lesions or tumors noted. The descended testicles are of normal size encased within an intact and unremarkable scrotal sac. There are no abnormal masses or hernias on palpation. The prostate is of normal size and shape and sectioning presents two normal lateral lobes with a thin median lobe forming the floor of the unremarkable urethra. There are no gross pathological lesions.

ENDOCRINE SYSTEM

The thyroid gland is of normal size and shape and presents two well-defined lobes with a connecting isthmus and a beefy-brown cut surface. There are no goitrous changes or adenomas present. The adrenal glands are of normal size and shape. Sectioning presents no gross pathological lesions.

MUSCULOSKELETAL SYSTEM

The ribs, sternum, clavicles, pelvis and vertebral column have no recent fractures. The muscles are normally formed.

CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM

The scalp is intact without contusions or lacerations. The calvarium is likewise intact without bony abnormalities or fractures. The brain weighs 1400 grams and presents moderate congestion of the leptomeninges. The overlying dura is intact and unremarkable. The cerebral hemispheres reveal a normal gyral pattern with severe global edema. The brainstem and cerebelli are normal in

appearance with no evidence of cerebellar tonsillar notching. The circle of Willis is patent and presents no evidence of thrombosis or berry aneurysm. Upon coronal sectioning of the brain, the ventricular system is symmetrical and contains clear cerebrospinal fluid. There are no space-occupying lesions present. The spinal cord is not examined.



Case Summary:

ECC contacted FI Malphurs of an apparent death in Sanford in the courtyard behind 2861 Retreat View Circle. Person of contact (POC) was SPD Inv. Serino. POC advised of an unknown B/M who had been shot by a resident of the complex. POC stated the following:

At approximately 1910 hours on 02/26/2012, 911 dispatchers received a call from a resident of the complex. The resident advised of a B/M who was at the complex between the townhouses. The caller stated that the male should not have been in the area and he observed the male while walking his neighborhood watch. Shortly after the call the resident confronted the male and the two began to physically fight. Witnesses observed the two fighting in the yard and then the resident fired a handgun at the male striking him in the chest. The male fell to the ground. SPD and SFD arrived on scene. The male was pronounced at 1930 hours. The identity of the male was unknown.

FI Malphurs responded to and arrived on scene at approximately 2144 hours. FI Malphurs observed a B/M lying face up on the ground in the courtyard. The male was clothed wearing a sweatshirt, t-shirt, pants and shoes. The male did not have identification in any of his pockets. The contents of the pockets were taken into custody by SPD. One (1) defect was seen on the male's chest with a hole in each of the shirts. SPD did not request to complete a GSR kit. POC advised that the weapon used was a .9mm handgun. Fingerprint identification was attempted; however, the male was not in the database of fingerprints. The male was then named as Unidentified #3. Photographs of the scene were taken. Livery arrived on scene for assistance and placed theB/M in a blue transport pouch. The pouch was sealed with blue tag #VCME0000517. Livery removed the B/M to the MEO. POC was given a 1000 hours examination time for 02/27/2012. FI Malphurs cleared the scene at approximately 2210 hours. TSM

Addendum: On 02/28/2012 at approximately 1230 hours, FI Malphurs received a fax from Sanford Police Department confirming positive identification as: Trayvon Martin, 17yoa B/M, DOB: 02/05/1995. Also, analysis of the word following "fucking" at approximately 2 minutes and 20 seconds of file 20120571656-S13PIR.way was requested to be identified.

On March, 24th, 2012, Special Agent Majeski requested via telephone that FAVIAU conduct a voice comparison examination of the designated area of specimen Q1 (screams in the background of the 911 call of file SPD TWIN TREES S35 EVT

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20120571669.wav) and the caller's voice of file 20120571656_S13PIR.wav of specimen Q1. In addition, a signal analysis examination of specimen Q1 recordings was requested, including a chronology of the specimen Q1 audio events.

Opinions and Conclusions:

This report contains the opinions and conclusions resulting from the voice comparison and signal analyses.

Summary of Examination:

The audio on all eight files of specimen Q1 was enhanced and three FBI CD-R discs were made each containing direct and enhanced copies from specimen Q1.

The specific request to identify the word following "fucking" at approximately 2 minutes and 20 seconds of file 20120571656-S13PIR.wav could not be done due to weak signal level and poor recording quality.

Voice comparison is not possible for the designated voices due to extreme stress and unsuitable audio quality.

Details of Examination:

Specimen Q1 was electronically enhanced to optimize the intelligibility of the voices and attenuate interfering or distracting features in the recordings.

The specific request to identify the word following "fucking" at approximately 2 minutes and 20 seconds of file 20120571656-\$13PIR. way could not be done due to weak signal level and poor recording quality.

Critical listening and digital signal analyses were conducted on the first approximately 45 seconds of the 911 call on file SPD TWIN TREES S35 EVT 20120571669 way of specimen Q1. During this 45 second segment, the designated screaming voice is audible for approximately 18.82 seconds in the background while a neighbor talks to the 911 dispatcher. Of the 18.82 seconds, the screaming voice is superimposed for approximately 16.29 seconds by a simultaneous exchange between the calling female neighbor and the 911 female dispatcher. The total duration of the screaming voice without another voice overlapping is approximately 2.53 seconds long.

Critical listening and digital signal analyses further revealed that the screaming voice of the 911 call is of insufficient voice quality and duration to conduct a meaningful voice comparison with any other voice samples primarily due to the screaming voice being: (1) produced under an extreme emotional state, (2) limited in the number of

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words and phrases uttered, (3) superimposed by other voices most of the time, and (4) distant, reverberant and very low signal level.

Three FBI CD-R copies were made containing direct and enhanced audio from specimen Q1. One of the discs was designated as Derivative Evidence "DEI" and the other two are labeled "Copy".

It is recommended that a high quality set of headphones be used when listening to the direct and enhanced audio files to obtain the optimum intelligibility.

Special Agent Majeski advised telephonically on April 2, 2012, to discontinue the request for preparation of an audio event chronology of specimen Q1.

The audio enhancement and signal analyses were conducted by Kenneth Marr. The voice comparison analysis was conducted by Dr. Hirotaka Nakasone.





Expensive Sprinkler Repairs-

POLICIES

TO ALL DOG OWNERS –

We continue to receive multiple complaints about neighbors not leashing or picking up after their dogs, and even allowing their dogs to defecate on sidewalks. This is especially a problem around the pond. Both Seminole County law and RTL Community Policies require all dog owners to keep their pets on a leash and to pick up their dog's waste. There are numerous pet waste stations throughout the neighborhood for your convenience. Please report all ongoing offenders to Seminole County Animal Control at 407-665-5110 and to Kent Taylor with Leland Management so we can keep our community clean.

Trash-

Regulations require that trash containers and recycle bins are <u>put</u> <u>away the day of pickup and stored out of sight. They may NOT be</u> <u>stored outside on driveways.</u> Use a trash container with a lid or sturdy plastic bags that are completely closed and tied off. The use of a sturdy plastic garbage container can greatly reduce the amount of trash in our neighborhood. Garbage should not be placed by the curb before 6:00 PM the night before a collection day (Tuesdays & Fridays). Recycling is only picked up on Tuesdays. Thank you for helping keep our neighborhood clean!

Pool Rules-



The Hazards of Dog Poo-

Dog waste can cumulatively have a big impact if left unmanaged. Dog waste contains bacteria and parasites, as well as organic matter and nutrients. Dog waste may be infested with microscopic organisms that can be transmitted to both humans and other animals. Some of the diseases that can spread from dog waste to humans are:

<u>Salmonella</u> - the most common bacterial infection transmitted to humans from dogs. Symptoms include: fever, muscle aches, headaches, vomiting and diarrhea.







Regulations require that trash containers and recycle bins are <u>put</u> <u>away the day of pickup and stored out of sight. They may NOT be</u> <u>stored outside on driveways.</u> Use a trash container with a lid or sturdy plastic bags that are completely closed and tied off. The use of a sturdy plastic garbage container can greatly reduce the amount of trash in our neighborhood. Garbage should not be placed by the curb before 6:00 PM the night before a collection day (Tuesdays & Fridays). Recycling is only picked up on Tuesdays. Thank you for helping keep our neighborhood elean!


Hurricane Season —

Lt. McAuliffe,

I just wanted to let you know that the NW at Retreat at Twin Lakes was great! We had 25 residents attend. The major concerns were the burglaries. I did share with them the crime stats from July till present and there were 5 burglaries (2 were construction sites) and 4 out of the 5 burglaries were no force. I emphasized on preventing burglary by locking doors and windows, in addition I offered to come to their home for CPTED inspections. There are other concerns that residents have with the HOA regarding lighting, and the rentals in the community which I am going to address with the HOA president.

Sgt. Herx and Officer Buchanan from patrol were present. They answered questions and provided some tips as well. Officer Buchanan also mentioned that there was a possible arrest going to be made on one of the burglaries or that they made one. It would have been ideal to have an investigator present to address the community regarding the status of the burglaries, but they did not show. I made a request for an investigator on August 31st. Please let the Chief know that we had a great turn out at the meeting, and that all the comments from the residents about SPD were positive. The NW Coordinator will be providing me with the block captain list and telephone tree in the next week or so.

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
