News story #2 Soldier dies at training base (1:28)

Setting the Scene

Canadian Forces Base (CFB) in Wainwright Alberta is 200 kilometres south east of Edmonton. The 583km² property was once known as Buffalo National Park. In 1940, the land was leased to the Government of Alberta, and the Department of National Defense built a training facility. CFB Wainwright is now one of 11 training bases for the Canadian Army. Soldiers will spend time in one of the training bases to learn the skills they will need before they are stationed abroad.

News story #3 Canada – U.S. trade war? (2:26)

Most wood or lumber cut in Canada comes from trees growing on government land. The government is then able to sell the wood for less money than a private company might sell the wood, because a private company would have to pay for the land and would owe taxes. Because the wood comes from government land, Canadian companies are able to sell it for less money than American companies. This, of course, means the manufacturers who need to buy wood can save money by buying Canadian wood. The American companies and government are not happy about this situation.

Story 1	Hundreds of people came to Good Shepherd Anglican Church on Tuesday to remember the life of a little boy whose body was left there. 19-month-old Anthony Raine was found covered with a blanket outside the back of the north Edmonton church. On Tuesday night, a crowd met around a memorial of flowers, toys, candles and notes to the toddler. Police have charged Anthony's father, Joseph Crier, 26, and his father's girlfriend, Tasha-Lee Mack, 25, with second-degree murder. Anthony died from head injuries. Police think that the toddler's body, which was covered in bruises, was at the church for three days before he was found. Princess Crier, Anthony's aunt, says "Both sides of the family are hurting over this. There's no words to explain what has happened. It's amazing how there's a lot of people out there who care."	0:13
Story 2	A Canadian soldier is dead after a training accident at CFB Wainwright. The accident happened Tuesday as Sergeant Robert Dynerowicz and three other soldiers were driving a light armoured vehicle through a training area at the base in east-central Alberta. Colonel Conrad Mialkowski says weather and road conditions may have been a factor in the accident. He says it was snowing at the time and the gravel road they were on was muddy and slick. The soldiers are members of the Royal Canadian Dragoons based at Canadian Forces Base Petawawa, near Ottawa. This is the fifth death at the training base since 2005.	1:28
Story 3	Canada and the U.S. may be heading for a trade war, or, at least a big battle. The U.S. is planning new tariffs on softwood lumber entering the U.S. from Canada as disagreements over trade between the two countries increase. The U.S. and Canada usually enjoy a friendly trading relationship, but things have gotten worse in recent months. President Donald Trump has been complaining about Canada's dairy policies, saying that Canada is making life "very difficult" for American dairy farmers and that the U.S. government "will not stand" for it. Lumber and dairy issues were also problems under previous U.S. presidents. In softwood lumber, the countries have had several previous disagreements. Alberta Forestry Minister Oneil Carlier says "It's very disappointing our neighbour to the south has chosen this course of action." The Alberta Forest Products Association estimates there are 18,000 jobs directly linked to forestry in the province.	2:26
