On December 6, 2012, at approximately 8:12 p.m., Fifth District Metropolitan Police (MPD) Officers responded to Maryland Avenue, NE, apartment Washington, D.C., to investigate a call for trouble. Upon entering the aforementioned apartment, responding officers discovered the decedent, later identified as Shirley Irene Tucker, suffering from apparent multiple gunshot wounds. The decedent was unconscious and unresponsive. The decedent was transported to MedStar by Medic #27 of the District of Columbia Fire Department and subsequently taken into surgery. The decedent was pronounced deceased by Dr. Jeng of MedStar at 9:41 p.m. on December 6, 2012.						
The decedent's remains were transported to the District of Columbia Medical Examiner's Office whereupon an autopsy was performed by Dr. Angelee Chen, Deputy Medical Examiner for the District of Columbia, on December 7, 2012. The autopsy revealed that the decedent suffered five (5) gunshot wounds to the left arm pit, upper right back, left side and left arm. One .22 caliber projectile was recovered from the decedent's right chest cavity. The cause of death was determined to be multiple gunshot wounds to the body. The manner of death was ruled a homicide.						
Inside apartment of Maryland Avenue, NE, responding MPD/Fifth District officers encountered the defendant who spontaneously uttered that he had just shot and killed the decedent and that he deserved to die. The defendant was transported to the MPD/Homicide Branch where he was advised of his rights and processed.						
The events and acts described above occurred primarily in the District of Columbia and were committed as described by defendant(s) listed in the case caption.
