The Grand Jury charges:

FIRST COUNT:

Jamar D. George, also known as Mal, within the District of Columbia, while armed with a firearm, purposely and with deliberate and premeditated malice, killed Ronnie Speight Jr., by shooting him with a firearm, on or about May 26, 2011, thereby causing injuries from which Ronnie Speight Jr. died on or about May 26, 2011. (First Degree Murder While Armed (Premeditated), in violation of 22 D.C. Code, Sections 2101, 4502 (2001 ed.))

SECOND COUNT:

On or about May 26, 2011, within the District of Columbia, Jamar D. George, also known as Mal, did possess a firearm while committing the crime of first degree murder while armed as set forth in the first count of this indictment. (Possession Of a Firearm During Crime Of Violence Or Dangerous Offense, in violation of 22 D.C. Code, Section 4504(b) (2001 ed.))

THIRD COUNT:

On or about May 26, 2011, within the District of Columbia, Jamar D. George, also known as Mal, previously having been convicted of a felony or a violation of this section, did carry, openly and concealed on or about his person, a pistol, without license issued pursuant to law. (Carrying a Pistol Without a License, in violation of 22 D.C. Code, Section 4504(a) (2001 ed.))

FOURTH COUNT:

On or about May 26, 2011, within the District of Columbia, Jamar D. George, also known as Mal, previously having been convicted in any court of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year, owned, kept, and had within his possession and control, a firearm. (Unlawful Possession of a Firearm, in violation of 22 D.C. Code Section 4503 (a)(1) (2001 ed.))
