

Intercom Guidelines

Intercom shall have the following purpose: to serve as an advisory group to Student Affairs for the purpose of improving student life, and as a think-tank for student leaders. Intercom shall be a place of listening, discussion, and collaboration rather than a policy-making and representative group.

A Convener, selected by majority vote of Intercom members each year, shall work with Student Affairs to establish a meeting schedule. In the absence of a Convener, or in periods of transition, Student Affairs shall call for meetings. The Convener shall be a current Intercom member and shall work with other members to establish agenda items and facilitate discussion.

Intercom membership shall include the following “seats:”

- 2 SGA (Student Body President & 1 member of Cabinet)

The following University Departments will have student seats on the council:

- 3 Fraternity and Sorority Life (At least 1 Male and 1 Female)
- 1 Inclusiveness & Intercultural Services
- 1 Housing & Residence Life
- 1 Honors College
- 1 Alumni Relations
- 1 Community Involvement & Service-Learning
- 1 International Student Services
- 1 Student Development Services
- 1 Religious & Spiritual Life
- 1 Transfer Student Services
- 1 Veterans Student Services
- 1 Council of Student Athletes

Staff Advisors for the aforementioned departments will select a student representative based upon their own selection criteria.

The addition or removal of Intercom seats shall be determined only by a two-thirds vote of total Intercom membership.

Visitors, such as subject-matter experts, may attend Intercom meetings for the purpose of contributing to particular discussion topics. All visitors must be pre-approved by the Convener.

Intercom meetings shall be only for Intercom members, Student Affairs officials, and aforementioned visitors.
