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Introduction

On April 9, 2013, the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) will consider a request by SK Baseball (SKB) that Washoe County help keep Reno Aces baseball in our community by providing assistance in restructuring the long-term debt for the construction of the Reno Aces' baseball stadium.

In January, the City of Reno approved a new agreement that would provide \$30 million over 30 years to replace an original commitment based on property tax revenues that did not meet expectations due to the economic downturn. SKB's request is that Washoe County assist in completing the restructuring of the debt by providing up to \$500,000 for 30 years, subject to annual appropriation.

Aces baseball provides a family entertainment venue that creates an annual economic impact of \$21 million. While the County has no legal obligation to participate, SKB is asking for the County's support which would be combined with the City of Reno's funding and additional funding from SKB.

The City's acceptance of the 30 year bonded indebtedness deal at best evinced poor judgment and at worst indicated acquiesces to dishonorable tactics by the baseball league that owns the Aces. The league threatened to pull the team from Reno if the council refused their demands. The current council, in trying to save its predecessor from its folly of approving the new ball park in the first place, caved in to the coercion. The initial idea to construct the new park was born in the desperation of the City's grasping for anything to revitalize its downtown core. As with its Bowling facility, the baseball park idea did not live up to expectations. Both have cost the Reno taxpayers without delivering any sustained increase in economic vitality to the city's core.

Approval of the ball park to accommodate having the team was a poor decision in the first place. Even the old Reno Silver Sox did not attract enough local attention to sustain itself.

Certainly it did not last 30 years and certainly it was not born in a scheme to aid the business interests of the red lined areas of the City of Reno. It is wishful thinking to posit the Aces team will be able to sustain itself for 30 years and, given the feeling of suffocation amongst the canyons created by the buildings in the City of Reno's red line areas, the team and stadium will not attract customers to the City's core businesses (mostly gambling interests).

It is inconceivable to me that the current Reno City Council and County Commission cannot see the folly of indebting the citizens for 30 years given the empirical evidence showing the failure of trying to sustain a semi-pro baseball team in Washoe County. The City should have cut its losses and said no to the league. It should now find some other uses for the park.

As a resident of Sparks who moved from Reno as fast as I could after the decision to indebt the city by lowering the railroad tracks, again to benefit the city's downtown core and gambling interests at the expense of the taxpayers, I was not given the right to vote for the construction of the ballpark in the first place. If I had been given the option I would have voted no. Therefore, I would like the County Commission to give its residents, excluding the ones in Reno, the right to vote on indebting ourselves for the benefit of the City of Reno or more precisely, the baseball league.

With respect to the baseball team's league owners, I consider the lot untrustworthy. 30 years is a very long time and they have demonstrated that they are not above using any heavy handed tactic necessary to insure that they never have to take a loss during the short time they have had a team in Reno. That alone is enough reason to say no to any 30 year subsidy. There is absolutely nothing preventing them from coming back again and again, like any other blackmailer, and demanding more concessions.

an effort to foster future cooperative relations in other endeavors. However, I also know that trying to buy friendship seldom yields the hoped for results. If the City of Reno needs an additional 500 thousand per year for the next 30 years to keep the team, let it add that amount to the 1 million it is already committed itself to in order to pay the blackmail. Don't drag in the rest of the county to pay for the boondoggle.

The County Commission must realize that there are better uses for the 500 thousand. I emphasize the rough economic times it has experienced over the past several years and the resultant reduction in services and layoffs it has had to implement. The rough times are not over. For example, the unforeseen consequences of the Affordable Care Act will likely cost the County a lot more to provide health care benefits to its employees. And, the City of Reno will continue its efforts to annex the lucrative business areas of the County in order to enrich itself at the expense of the County.

It is impossible to plan for the next 30 years but it is probable that the County will find itself in need of that 500 thousand a year for many other things during that time that might provide a benefit to its larger population. If the money is available it should not be wasted on a non-utilitarian item such as the City of Reno's baseball park (a non-regional facility). Put the money into a "Rainy Day" fund or at least attempt to use it for regional purposes.
