#### Statement from Coach Tom Lechnir

I have waited 14 months and had to file 3 appeals to have the opportunity to be heard. I have waited, now 8 days, to hear from Chancellor Wells regarding the appeal of the non-renewal of my contract. It is now that I feel compelled to release the statement below.

I have read the statement from the University of Wisconsin–Oshkosh sent on August 6, 2013, and I appreciate that you will post this statement next to the UWO statement so that the public can judge for themselves. I continue to be incredibly embarrassed by and disappointed with the very same University where I have attained my undergraduate degree, master's degree, and where I have spent the last 35 years of my life. UWO continues to use smoke and mirrors to avoid being accountable for what has transpired since the inception of Alumni Stadium. As I said at the appeal hearing last Tuesday, I have a strong love for UWO which has been built on the many wonderful relationships and positive experiences I have encountered as a student athlete and baseball coach. As I continue on this journey to expose the truth, I have relied upon the support provided to me on a daily basis from my colleagues at UWO, faculty, alumni, current players, the community of Oshkosh, my close circle of friends, and of course, Tina, Zach and Drew. Listed below are the facts that pertain to my non-renewal as the baseball coach at UWO. When you finish reading the document and attachments, feel free to contact me for further discussions.

<u>The Truth Never Changes.</u> The UWO story changes: **1st Reason** – Non-renewal due to stadium debt (*See Exhibit #1*); **2nd Reason** – Four performance concerns (*See Exhibit #2*); **3rd Reason** – Change in department policy; **4th Reason** – Do not like Tom Lechnir's attitude (appeal hearing testimony of Petra Roter). Tom Lechnir's story never changes.

#### If UWO Cannot Take Credit For It, UWO Will Not Recognize It.

Tom Lechnir is WIAC all-time winningest coach [728 wins/292 loses/1 tie/.714%]. Tom Lechnir was named Coach of the Century and honored at WIAC Banquet in August, 2012. The UWO administration sat at a table on the other side of banquet hall and never acknowledged Tom Lechnir or his family who were also at the banquet.

Tom Lechnir took the lead and organized a group that raised in excess of \$800,000.00 in cash donations and gifts-in-kind to construct Alumni Stadium and then gifted it to UWO. The baseball program moved into Alumni Stadium in 2007 and as to date, UWO has never held a public ceremony to recognize the donors' gifts. Further, UWO does not allow for a donor wall at Alumni Stadium to acknowledge the generous donors. In my 2012 evaluation concerning fundraising, I raised in excess of 1,600% above the stated goal.

Tom Lechnir's Digitally Recorded Tapes. I started to record conversations with UWO personnel because UWO administrators discouraged me from taking notes at meetings, despite the fact that the meetings were filled with falsehoods, shifting standards, and refusal to answer basic questions as to what I was being held responsible for. I knew I was in trouble 3 years ago, and recorded these conversations to protect myself when the UWO administration reached their goal of getting rid of me. The parties taped include, but are not limited to: UWO Athletic Department staff; UWO Administrative staff; UWO Human Recourses staff; various other UWO Departments and staff. Subject matter included on the tapes include, but are not limited to: Alumni Stadium financial issues; Replacement of men's basketball head coach; Replacement of men's basketball assistant coach; Replacement of women's basketball head coach; Biodigestor contract with UWO; Specific personnel matters in other UWO Departments; Titan Touchdown Club; UWO donors; Tom Lechnir contract, status and appeal. These tapes show over and over that UWO officials were intentionally making me a scapegoat by their own admission.

Personal Belief System: Values / Integrity / Leadership / Accountability. Tom Lechnir compared to Darryl Sims: Tom Lechnir – no criminal record; Darryl Sims was hired and employed at UWO as a convicted felon. Mr. Sims' criminal record includes: possession of cocaine and drug paraphernalia (See Exhibit #3); and, issuance of worthless checks and theft (See Exhibit #4) resulting in court-ordered jail time and 10 years of probation, community service and payment of restitution. Mr. Sims also filed personal bankruptcy (See Exhibit #5).

#### **Other Critical Facts:**

- 1. I believe that the CliftonLarsonAllen review was only a sampling and not an audit. Their sampling does not tell the entire store and does not address two key issues: (A) Jarrod Washburn instructed his agent, Scott Boras, to perform a specific review for teammates who reported to Jarrod that they donated to the Alumni Stadium project, but their donations did not show up on the Alumni Stadium list provided to Jarrod from the UWO Foundation; and (B) The discrepancies that exist between UWO and CR Meyer that relate to the construction costs of Alumni Stadium. CR Meyer was the only construction company that worked on Alumni Stadium and they have never been contacted by CliftonLarsonAllen. CR Meyer never did any work on the Oshkosh Sports Complex.
- 2. Petra Roter testified at the appeal hearing that the Affirmative Action Director was in favor of non-renewal of Tom Lechnir. This is a false statement (See Exhibit #6). The Affirmative Action Director only provided a cursory review without ever interviewing other student athletes involved. [It should be noted that the Affirmative Action Director has since resigned]. The Human Resources Director found the affirmative action letter ambiguous and without merit. With regard to the second student complaint, that student did not ever attend the fall organizational meeting and never completed the paperwork, thus making himself ineligible to tryout per WIAC/NCAA rule.
- 3. Tom Lechnir / Umpire Incident in 2012 (See Exhibit #7a-c) which indicates that Kevin Vincent, the Umpire involved in the incident stated "I do not believe the ejection should result in the suspension of Coach Lechnir." John Voedenlich (opposing Coach) stated "The first thing you should know is that Coach Lechnir had a legitimate right to argue the disputed call.

However, the Umpire, Kevin Vincent, didn't seem to want to have any discussion, despite the fact he ruled a ground rule double as a home run. I did not see any bodily contact. This was one of the most mild arguments that resulted in an ejection that I have ever seen in my 20 years of coaching. The whole situation might have been avoided if the umpire would have simply discussed the ruling on the field face-to-face."

- 4. Tom Lechnir's Professional Academic Staff Performance Evaluation dated January 17, 2012 was illegally altered. (*See Exhibit #8*).
- 5. UWO / Foundation corruption financial mismanagement. (A) It is believed that the UWO / Foundation actually increased the carrying costs of Alumni Stadium to its detriment by recapitalizing its line of credit rather than paying down principle; and (B) UWO / Foundation President, Art Rathjen, approved the purchase of the current residence of Chancellor Wells to provide a permanent residence for Wells and future Chancellors of UWO. The appraised fair market value of the house was \$320,000; however, the purchase price was \$450,000.

Dear Mr. Lechnir:

Per policy described in the UW Oshkosh Faculty and Academic Staff Flandbook, I am informing you of the stoppage of your rolling-horizon contract. As ACS 2.1 (3) (f) states,

"Once the employee is notified of non-extension, the appointment shall have a fixed ending date. In these instances, once a decision is made to break the automatic renewal cycle of a rolling-horizon contract, the Chancellor will provide a written statement of the reasons. This decision shall not be subject to appeal or grievance."

Reason for this action is the significant debt created in the expansion and renovation of Alumni Stadium.

This action establishes an end date to your contract of June 30, 2013, and you will be subject to contract renewal in the May 2012 renewal cycle. Your supervisor will discuss the details of contract renewal with you beginning in January 2012.

Dear Coach Lechnir:

I am in receipt of your letter requesting the reasons for the non-renewal of your contract. I have enclosed a copy of Vice Chancellor Roter's letter to you explaining the rationale for the non-renewal. I direct you to paragraphs three (3) and four (4). More specifically, reasons for your non-renewal include performance concerns in the following areas:

- Fundraising. You did not achieve three of the four fundraising goals set for you. There is still over \$250,000 of debt on the baseball stadium for which you have not made substantive progress to reduce.
- Student Athlete Retention and Academic Success. The academic performance for athletes in your program is well under the average for UWO student athletes. The graduation rate for athletes in your program is under 40 percent which is the second lowest in the department.
- Administrative Duties. You have not performed the administrative duties as listed in your job description to expectations. This includes accuracy and timeliness of paperwork, adherence to departmental and University policies and procedures and meeting attendance.
- Community Relations and Engagement. This area encompasses service on and off campus by the coach and the athletes. The departmental learning outcome rubics for students have not been developed and implemented for your program.

As an additional note, Darryl Sims, Athletic Director, clarified expectations and gave you clear goals, targets and a plan to improve performance with the understanding your progress addressing these areas would determine future contractual decisions.

The Honorable, The Legislature:

As required by Article V, Section 6 of the Wisconsin Constitution, I am submitting the annual Executive Clemency Report to the Legislature, covering those clemency cases upon which final dispositions were rendered for applicants during the 2010 calendar year. Below are the one hundred and seventy seven applicants who received a pardon in 2010:

Donald Blank (date of birth March 5, 1951), convicted on September 20, 1971, of two counts of Sale of Dangerous Drug (Marijuana), was sentenced to eighteen months in jail (stayed) and eighteen months of probation. The Governor's Pardon Advisory Board recommended granting a pardon by a vote of 6-0. Following the Board's recommendation, Mr. Ball was granted a pardon on February 11, 2010, based on his positive adjustment, extensive personal growth and development, lack of other criminal justice system contacts, the length of time since the crime, and the non-violent nature of the crime.

Angela Byrd (date of birth June 19, 1963), convicted on August 7, 1991, of Failure to Report Receipt of Income and Food Stamp Fraud, was sentenced to five years of probation, 100 hours of community service, and restitution. The Governor's Pardon Advisory Board recommended granting a pardon by a vote of 6-0. Following the Board's recommendation, Ms. Byrd was granted a pardon on February 11, 2010, based on her extensive personal growth and development, no previous or subsequent criminal justice system contacts, low risk of reoffending, the non-violent nature of the offenses, the length of time since the offenses, and her documented substantial need.

Bruce Conard (date of birth August 26, 1960), convicted on November 14, 1983, of Delivery of a Controlled Substance (THC), was sentenced to forty-five days in jail and two years of probation. The Governor's Pardon Advisory Board recommended granting a pardon by a vote of 6-0. Following the Board's

on February 11, 2010, based on her positive adjustment, valid job concerns, substantial need, and the non-violent nature of the crime.

Amanda Pennington (date of birth June 21, 1964), convicted on April 9, 1992, of Failure to Report Receipt of Income, Food Stamp Fraud, and Theft of Moveable Property, was sentenced six years in prison, six years of probation, and ordered to pay restitution. The Governor's Pardon Advisory Board recommended granting a pardon by a vote of 6-0. Following the Board's recommendation, Ms. Pennington was granted a pardon on February 11, 2010, based on her positive adjustment, extensive personal growth and development, lack of other criminal justice system contacts, and the non-violent nature of the crime.

Karen Potnek (date of birth November 17, 1969), convicted on April 23, 1993, of Theft by Fraud, was sentenced to two years of probation. The Governor's Pardon Advisory Board recommended granting a pardon by a vote of 6-0. Following the Board's recommendation, Ms. Potnek was granted a pardon on February 11, 2010, based on her positive adjustment, extensive personal growth and development, lack of prior and subsequent criminal justice system contacts, the non-violent nature of the crime, and a low risk of reoffending.

Jeffrey Schneider (date of birth December 31, 1972), convicted on October 28, 1992, of Conspire to Possess with Intent to Deliver THC, was sentenced to two months in jail with Huber privileges, thirty months of probation, and ordered to pay a fine. The Governor's Pardon Advisory Board recommended granting a pardon by a vote of 6-0. Following the Board's recommendation, Mr. Schneider was granted a pardon on February 11, 2010, based on his positive adjustment, extensive personal growth and development, valid job concerns, lack of other criminal justice system contacts, the length of time since the crime, and the non-violent nature of the crime.

Following the Board's recommendation, Mr. Vaughn was granted a pardon on February 11, 2010 based the length of time since the offense, his honesty with the Board, his young age at the time of the crime, his positive adjustment, and his extensive personal growth and development.

Complaint of Race Discrimination

On November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012, the Office of Equity and Affirmative Action received a complaint from the parents of a student alleging racist and discriminatory comments were made to their student. On November 6<sup>th</sup>, 2012, an interview was conducted with the student, in which he alleged you used racist comments in reference to his ethnicity (Native American) and abusive language in reference to his abilities as a prospective baseball player on the team.

On November 26<sup>th</sup>, 2102, you were informed of the complaint. On November 29<sup>th</sup>, 2012, we met to discuss the allegations. During that meeting, you described your interactions with You stated that he was not a dedicated student athlete who was undisciplined in his workouts and regimes. Also, you stated that this freshman student was academically struggling. You also denied any racist or discriminatory comments or statements were made to or about the student.

The allegations of this complaint are governed by UWO Faculty and Academic Staff Handbook, GEN 1.2.(4). Racist and Discriminatory Conduct. Although you deny the allegations, it is my determination that the student athlete presents a valid allegation. Since the decision of the final roster for the baseball team has not been made, the student places himself in jeopardy by coming forward with his allegations thus enhancing his credibility.

You are cautioned to be mindful of your interactions with students with regard to racist and discriminatory conduct as this conduct may violate University policy. In addition, you must be mindful to demonstrate no retaliation towards this student for raising his allegations. A copy of this document shall be placed in your Human Resources file and sent to your supervisor.



Dear Mr. Simms:

I am writing this email as a follow-up to our phone conversation this past weekend regarding the umpire incident with Coach Tom Lecnir.

The purpose of this email is to give you my perspective (from the third-base coach's box) and not to dispute any prior testimonies or comments made by other individuals.

The first thing you should know is that Coach Lecnir had a legitimate right to argue the disputed call. However, the umpire, Kevin Vincent, didn't seem to want to have ANY discussion despite the fact he ruled a ground rule double as a homerun.

During the discussion, both Tom and Kevin walked in circles near the home plate area as they discussed the call. Tom trying to plead his case, but Kevin not wanting to listen to any of it

During that time, I did not see any bodily contact! If there was contact, it must have been subtle and inadvertent.

This was one of the most mild arguments that resulted in a ejection that I have ever seen in my 20 years of coaching. This whole situation might have been avoided if the umpire would have simply discussed the ruling on the field face to face.
