# I. INTRODUCTION

- 1. Plaintiff Alliance for the Wild Rockies (Alliance) brings this action under the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552 et seq. (FOIA) for declaratory, injunctive and other appropriate relief to enjoin Defendant from withholding requested documents and require that Defendant produce those documents.
- 2. Defendant violated the FOIA by failing to respond to Plaintiff's FOIA request with a determination within the deadline established by the FOIA, as well as by failing to produce requested documents. This action seeks the following:
  (1) an order declaring that Defendant acted illegally by failing to respond with a determination to Plaintiff's FOIA request; (2) an order declaring that Defendant acted illegally by failing to produce the requested documents; (3) an order enjoining Defendant from withholding the requested documents and requiring Defendant to produce the requested documents; and (4) an order requiring Defendant to pay the expenses of this action, including Plaintiff's costs and reasonable attorney fees.

# II. JURISDICTION AND VENUE

3. This Court has both subject matter jurisdiction over this action and personal jurisdiction over the parties pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(B). This Court

- also has jurisdiction over this action pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1331(a) (federal question).
- 4. Venue in this District is proper under 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(B) because "the complainant resides" in this District.
- 5. Declaratory relief is appropriate under 28 U.S.C. § 2201. Injunctive relief is appropriate under 28 U.S.C. § 2202 and 5 U.S.C. 552(a)(4)(B).
- 6. This Court has the authority to award costs and attorneys' fees under 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(E).

# III. PARTIES

7. Plaintiff ALLIANCE FOR THE WILD ROCKIES (Alliance) is a tax-exempt, non-profit public interest organization dedicated to the protection and preservation of the native biodiversity of the Northern Rockies Bioregion, its native plant, fish, and animal life, and its naturally functioning ecosystems. Its registered office is located in Missoula, Montana. Members of the Alliance observe, enjoy, and appreciate Montana's native wildlife, water quality, and terrestrial habitat quality, and expect to continue to do so in the future. Alliance's members' interests are directly affected by Defendant's failure to respond to requests for, and disclose, information regarding wildlife and natural resource management.

8. Defendant UNITED STATES FISH & WILDLIFE SERVICE (FWS or Defendant) is an agency of the United States Department of Interior. FWS is the agency in possession and control of the records sought by Plaintiff, and as such, is subject to FOIA pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(e). FWS has a statutory duty to respond to Plaintiff's information requests, and disclose the requested records. 5 U.S.C. § 552 (a)(6)(A).

#### IV. FACTUAL AND LEGAL BACKGROUND

9. As set forth in Attachment 1 to this Complaint, on January 10, 2014, Plaintiff's Executive Director sent an email to the following address:

- 10. The subject line of the email states: "Freedom of Information Act Request."
- 11. The FOIA request states:

We submit this FOIA request for the entire underlying project file for your ESA consultations regarding the Cabin Gulch project on the Helena National Forest and Helena National Forest species list, which resulted in a species list dated July 2, 2013, a biological assessment dated November 13, 2013, and a letter of concurrence dated December 4, 2013.

We anticipate that the project file will include, at least, the following:

- (1) the three analysis documents (7/02/2013 species list, 11/13/2013 biological assessment, and 12/04/2013 letter of concurrence);
- (2) all documents cited in, and/or reviewed for, the documents listed in (1), including but not limited to all items cited in the references cited and/or literature cited sections of the documents;
- (3) all draft versions of the documents cited in (1), and all agency comments/discussions regarding those drafts or final documents;
- (4) all correspondence regarding the documents cited in (1) and/or the analysis therein, including emails, letters, and records of phone calls,
- (5) all notes/minutes from meetings discussing the documents cited in (1) and/or the analysis therein, and
- (6) all documentation regarding discussions regarding whether to allow public participation in the promulgation of any of the documents listed in (1).
- 12. Montana is within FWS Region 6.
- 13. FWS's FOIA website states that for FOIA requests in Region 6 the requests should be addressed to the following individual:

- 14. As set forth in Attachment 2 to this Complaint, the FWS Region 6 coordinator acknowledged that she received Plaintiff's FOIA request on January 10, 2014.
- 15. FOIA requires that an agency determine whether to comply with a request for documents within 20 business days of receipt of the request. If the agency determines not to disclose documents to a requester, it must inform the requester of its decision and inform the requester, at that time, how to appeal the agency's decision. 5 U.S.C. § 552((a)(6)(A)(i).
- 16. The statutory deadline for Defendant to respond with a determination for Plaintiff's FOIA request was 20 business days from receipt of the request on January 10, 2014, which was February 10, 2014.
- 17. Defendant did not respond with a determination by February 10, 2014.
- 18. The FOIA allows 10 additional business days for a determination if the component of the agency that receives the FOIA request is not "the appropriate component of the agency," and must forward the request to the appropriate component of the agency.
- 19. If that exception applies, the deadline for Defendant's determination to Plaintiff's FOIA request was February 25, 2014.
- 20. Defendant did not respond with a determination by February 25, 2014.

- 21. As of the date of the filing of this Complaint on March 4, 2014, Plaintiff has still not received a determination on its FOIA request or any of the requested documents from FWS.
- 22. Time is of the essence in this matter, as Plaintiff currently has a response brief due regarding the subject matter of the underlying FOIA request on April 1, 2014. *See Alliance for the Wild Rockies v. Krueger*, CV-12-150-M-DLC, Order (February 4, 2014).
- 23. This is the third time in less than a year that Plaintiff has been forced to file a lawsuit against FWS to compel compliance with FOIA. *See Alliance for the Wild Rockies v. FWS*, CV-13-105-M-DWM, Complaint (May 28, 2013); *Alliance for the Wild Rockies v. FWS*, CV-13-176-M-DWM, Complaint (August 20, 2013).
- 24. Plaintiff is directly and adversely affected by Defendant's failure to respond and provide all responsive records and documents for its FOIA request.
- 25. Plaintiff is "deemed to have exhausted [its] administrative remedies" because Defendants "fail[ed] to comply with the applicable time limit provisions" of the FOIA. 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(6)(C)(I).
- 26. Plaintiff has been required to expend costs and retain legal representation to prosecute this action.

# V. CLAIMS FOR RELIEF

#### FIRST CLAIM FOR RELIEF

Defendant violated FOIA by failing to issue a determination for Plaintiff's FOIA Request by the statutory deadline.

- 27. Plaintiff incorporates all previous paragraphs by reference.
- 28. Defendant violated FOIA's requirement that an administrative agency must respond to a FOIA request within 20 business days with a substantive determination that notifies the requester whether the agency will comply with the request, the scope of the documents the agency will produce, whether any exemptions are being claimed to deny any part of the request, and how to appeal an adverse determination. 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(6)(A)(I).
- 29. Alternatively, if the 10 day extension for mis-directed requests applies,

  Defendants have also violated that deadline.
- 30. Plaintiff is entitled to reasonable costs of litigation, including attorney fees pursuant to FOIA. 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(E).

# **SECOND CLAIM FOR RELIEF**

Defendant violated FOIA by failing to make requested records promptly available to Plaintiff.

31. Plaintiff incorporates all previous paragraphs by reference.

- 32. Defendant violated FOIA because its failure to provide the documents requested by Plaintiff violated the FOIA requirement that every administrative agency "make the records promptly available to any person" who requests records from an administrative agency. 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(3)(A).
- 33. Unless enjoined by this Court, Defendant will continue to violate Plaintiff's legal rights to access the records that it has requested.
- 34. Plaintiff is entitled to reasonable costs of litigation, including attorney fees pursuant to FOIA. 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(E).

# VI. REQUEST FOR RELIEF

THEREFORE, Plaintiff requests that this Court enter judgment providing the following relief:

- A. Declare that Defendant violated FOIA by failing to issue a determination for Plaintiff's FOIA request in accordance with the statutory deadline;
- B. Declare that Defendant violated FOIA by failing to promptly produce the documents requested in Plaintiff's FOIA request;
- C. Enjoin Defendant from withholding the requested records, and order
   Defendant to immediately provide the requested records to Plaintiff;

- D. Award Plaintiff its reasonable costs, litigation expenses and attorneys' fees as provided by 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(E); and
- E. Grant such other and further relief as the Court may deem just and proper.

I hereby request a fee waiver for all search and duplication fees under the FOIA regulations [5 U.S.C. Sec. 552 (a) (4) (A) and 36 CFR 2.19(c) (1)]. The information requested will benefit the citizens of the United States and is for the purpose of public education and to encourage public debate on important policy issues. The requested information will be made available to the public through the Alliance for the Wild Rockies' central office and our website. Information available through the Alliance's office and website is used in press conferences and releases, television and radio interviews, and regional and national publications, and reaches a significant number of individuals nationwide.

The language of the FOIA clearly indicates that Congress intended fees not to be a barrier to private individuals or public interest organizations seeking access to government records. In addition, the legislative history of the FOIA fee waiver language indicates that Congress intended a liberal interpretation of the phrase "Primarily benefiting the public." This suggests that all fees are to be waived whenever the release of information contributes to public debate on important policy issues. This has recently been affirmed by the US Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia, in Better Government Association v. Department of State, 780 F. 2d 86 (D.C. Cir., 1986). In that case, the Court found that under the FOIA, Congress had explicitly recognized the need for non-profit organizations to have free access to government documents and those government agencies cannot impair this free access by charging duplication or search for FOIA information requests (Id. at 89).
