

# SMALL DIVERSE BUSINESS PARTICIPATION SURVEY

#### Introduction

The Pennsylvania Department of General Services (DGS) is required under Section 2316 of Act 13 of 2012 to send all unconventional natural gas producers a survey to collect data for the purposes of preparing a report to the General Assembly to measure the producer's efforts in providing maximum practicable contracting opportunities to Small Diverse Businesses (SDBs).

SDBs include minority, woman, veteran and service-disabled veteran owned business enterprises.

On March 1, 2013, DGS forwarded a survey to 77 companies identified by member organizations and/or the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) as a "Producer" involved in unconventional natural gas extraction. A copy of the survey is attached hereto and marked Exhibit "A."

The reporting period for purposes of this survey was April 1, 2012 through March 31, 2013. Pursuant to the Act, Producers were required to respond to the survey within 90 days or on or before May 30, 2013. DGS is required to submit an annual report to the respective State Government Committees in the General Assembly. This report is intended to meet the mandates of the Act.

#### Producer Responsiveness

DGS is reporting on responses regarding the opportunities available to those companies which are certified/verified diverse small businesses with the Commonwealth of PA as defined by the Act.

Twenty one (21) producers responded to the survey which corresponds to a survey response rate of 27%. Two of the 21 producers reported that they were no longer operating in PA and therefore would not be submitting. A total of 19 producers submitted a completed survey. One producer submitted a survey past the due date which was received on June 26, 2013.

#### Use of the DGS Database

Of the 19 producers that submitted a completed survey, 13 producers responded "NO" when asked if their company utilized the DGS database to identify diverse small businesses (Survey Question #9). Of the 13 providing a negative response, the top three most selected reasons for producers not utilizing the DGS database were as follows:

- (1) "Already had their subcontractors/suppliers" selected eight times;
- (2) "Geographical limitations" selected four times; and
- (3) "Other" selected six times.

#### **Small Diverse Business Participation**

Of the 19 producers that submitted a completed survey, 10 producers reported no utilization of SDBs for this reporting period. Eight (8) of the producers provided a listing of utilized SDBs totaling 124 contractors and subcontractors. The following is a breakdown of the responses:

#### Type of Services Utilized

Of the 124 contractors and subcontractors listed, 62 were DGS verified/certified SDBs. Below are the DGS certified/verified SDBs listed by class and their specific service industries.

#### **Outreach Efforts**

Of the 19 producers that submitted a survey, 12 responded "NO" when asked "did you participate in, or provide networking events, outreach efforts or job fairs for SDBs?"

For those producers that answered "YES", the type of outreach effort was classified as follows:

- (1) "Networking events" selected seven times;
- (2) "Job fairs" selected four times;
- (3) "Internet information on bidding opportunities" selected two times;
- (4) "Pre-bid/post-bid meetings for subcontractors and suppliers" selected four times; and
- (5) "Other" selected four times.

#### **Conclusion**

The Department of General Services intends to perform outreach efforts with unconventional producers of natural gas and the Marcellus shale industry aimed at increasing opportunities for small diverse businesses. The department is available to answer any questions from members of the respective State Government Committees.
