I appreciate your contacting my attorney Avv. Dario Bolognesi, regarding the US Embassy's planned action for clemency for those remaining convicted US officers associated with the Milan Rendition case. I also appreciate SecState John Kerry's courage and integrity in requesting Ambassador John Phillips assistance in resolving this issue, by retaining your firm to file a clemency action on behalf of all 25 of the remaining convicted officers.

I was a little taken by surprise on receiving your message via Avv. Bolognesi. I would have expected to be contacted in the US, by representatives of the Department of State or the Central Intelligence Agency advising me of this welcome action.


At any rate, in response to your query on the issue of clemency, I would like to be included in the US Embassy's request for clemency along with the other convicted officers.

Could you also please clarify whether the US Embassy requested that you contact each of the 25 officers *directly*, to obtain their approval to proceed on their behalf? Regarding payment, I assume that the US Embassy (United States Government) will be reimbursing you, vice each individual defendant.

As you may aware, Avv. Bolognesi is no longer retained by the US Department of Justice. He has however generously agreed to assist me in any way he can going forward. As the US Embassy is officially charged with this action, I request that you contact me directly and copy Avv. Bolognesi.
