National and Regional Projects Proposed for ACP Eastern Africa Countries

Overview

ACP Fish II is a collaborative programme between the European Union and the ACP States for €30 million and will be implemented over 4 years to 2013. Programme implementation is conducted through Programme Estimates signed between the Coordination Unit (CU), the ACP Secretariat and the European Commission in Brussels. The coordination of this demand-driven programme is achieved through six Regional Facilitation Units (RFUs) across the ACP States. This document is compiled by the RFU − EA and provides an outline of interventions to be supported by the programme. This Regional Action Plan (RAP) will be reviewed, amended and validated by the ACP Fish II (CU) in Brussels and national and regional stakeholders.

The ACP Fish II Programme aims to strengthen fisheries sectoral policy development and implementation. The Programme has five components:

- 1. Improved fisheries policy and management plans at regional and national levels;
- 2. Reinforced control and enforcement capabilities;
- 3. Reinforced national and regional research strategies and initiatives;
- 4. Developed business supportive regulatory framework and private sector investment; and
- 5. Knowledge exchange for improved fisheries management.

The Programme is 'demand-driven' responding to prioritised needs of each country and to selected regional groups. The objectives of this report are to gather information on needs assessed through consultation with partners and then compile the proposed interventions into a Regional Action Plan for Eastern Africa, for further validation by stakeholders.

Identification and assessment of needs

Countries and regional bodies making up the key partners in the EA region are vastly different in their levels of development and sophistication as far as fisheries management is concerned. There is a wide variety of situations reflected and even within countries there are differences in fisheries and fisheries management regimes (for example between marine and inland). Given this diversity, it is essential that the needs identification phase involves guided assessment by direct stakeholders, of the current situation alongside what the ACP Fish II could offer to address identified problems. It is most likely that the ACP Fish II Programme can support or complement measures already being taken by the fisheries administration or the RFB or REB. Clear, complementary and iterative input is required at this stage by both stakeholder and the Programme.

The initial identification of priority areas where support was required from ACP Fish II was made by representatives of fisheries administrations in a workshop held in Kampala in December 2009. A number of proposed interventions were also raised at this workshop and during subsequent discussions. An outline Regional Work Plan was prepared and sent by the RFU to the CU in December 2009 for inclusion in the global PE prepared in Brussels. Through January to March 2010 these priority areas and proposed projects were further developed by the beneficiary States and the RFU through electronic communication and a limited number of country visits made by the RFU Manager to the beneficiary partners. In April these proposed interventions were developed to Project Profiles and Terms of Reference for implementation following review and validation in the CU and by national and regional partners.

Tabular content of this Regional Action Plan

The bulk of this Regional Action Plan (RAP) is made up of tables and the content of each is outlined below.

Table 1 Country Needs for Components 1 & 2

The focus of the ACP Fish II Programme is components 1 and 2, dealing with fisheries policy and legislation and IUU fishing respectively. This table shows the national situation with regard to the key areas and the information has been taken from national fisheries profiles (see website) and comprehensive national fisheries profiles developed in the RFU.

Table 2 Country Needs for Components 3 & 4

Components 3 and 4 deal with enhancing research capacities and frameworks for business and private sector involvement in fisheries, respectively. Table 2 provides a snapshot of the national situation with regard to the key areas and the information has been taken from national fisheries profiles (see website) and comprehensive profiles developed in the RFU.

In order to strengthen the national and regional organisations involvement in the implementation of ACP Fish II, each fisheries administration and regional body closely involved with the Programme, was asked to identify a contact point. Eastern Africa approach to ACP Fish II Programme

The Eastern Africa region for the purposes of the implementation of the ACP Fish II, operating through the Regional Facilitation Unit in Kampala, is made up of fisheries administrations in Djibouti, Eritrea, Sudan, Somalia, Kenya, Uganda, Ethiopia, Tanzania, Rwanda and Burundi. Management of fisheries in these areas is supported by key Regional Fisheries Bodies (RFBs) including the Indian Ocean Tuna Commission (IOTC), Lake Victoria Fisheries Organisation (LVFO), and the South West Indian Ocean Fisheries Commission (SWIOFC), and these organisations are supported by Regional Economic Bodies (REBs) such as East African Community (EAC), Southern African Development Community (SADC), and the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA).

a) Relevant regional background in fishery sector

Fisheries in Eastern Africa provide a microcosm of the continental fisheries sector. Characteristics range from the established, export-orientated Nile perch fishery on shared Lake Victoria, to traditional fisheries on large and small water bodies, through tuna fisheries in the EEZ across the Indian Ocean, to fish production in small-scale fishponds in Sudan to the relatively young fish export industries of the Red Sea coast. The common themes to all these fisheries is their importance to the economic development of the region, their potential to provide critical livelihood and food security for increasing populations and in some cases may provide current and future sources of foreign exchange income. Fisheries management in these countries is also an area which has traditionally been starved of financial support from national administrations increasingly required to allocate funds to direct, more demonstrable means of poverty alleviation.

b) Current state of affairs in the relevant sector in the region

Almost 91% of the fish produced in the Eastern Africa region originates from freshwater sources with only the remaining 9% from the vast marine areas controlled by the region. It is therefore not surprising to learn that most of the inland fisheries now show many signs of being overfished whereas offshore, EEZ resources are widely believed to still have room for expansion under sustainable management systems.

The region has a combined population (2008) of around 270 million ranging from Djibouti with less than 1 million to Ethiopia with over 80 million. Population growth rates suggest concern for the future with the average being 2.7% but masking rates of 3.3% in Uganda and 3.1% in Eritrea whilst average life expectancy remains around 54 years for all countries. Average GNI (per capita) is US\$557 across the region but huge disparities exist between Burundi with US\$140 and Kenya at US\$1,550. Poverty is still widespread in the region and 5 of the 10 states are ranked in the lowest 10% globally according to the Human Development Index (HDI).

The key areas for support identified in the Regional Needs Assessment Workshop in December 2009 ¹ were:

- 1. Capacity building in most areas of fisheries management but especially MCS (marine and inland/lake) and inland fisheries (co-) management;
- 2. Support in legal review to update or improve the legislation being used to prosecute illegal fishers:
- 3. Support in the policy process and in updating policies that show the importance of the sector in national growth; and
- 4. Research and institutional development to ensure that regional, continental and international trade in fish and fishery products works in favour of the fishers and the countries and that the regulatory framework for fisheries and aquaculture is supportive of fisheries-induced growth and investment.

The portfolio of interventions proposed for funding in this RAP includes actions at national, bilateral, multilateral and regional levels.

The portfolio addresses the most pressing concerns in the region bearing in mind the restrictions imposed on the use of the funds allocated to the RFU and to be spent following the EDF procedures. The proposed projects follow the outline programmes in the Regional Work Plan prepared following the Regional Needs Assessment Workshop in December 2009².

Regional contribution to global objectives under PE1 and PE2

Using the logframe headings and indicators, the following Purpose Level objectives (with targets) are set for the Eastern Africa region as a contribution to the global monitoring in PE1 and PE2. Indicators are taken from the Programme Estimate Annex 3 Operational Targets.
