Funding Sources

A primary funding source of the special services fund (commonly known as the inmate activities and recreation fund) is the inmate telephone system. This system, which is used by inmates for their personal phone calls, is a prepaid or collect-call system. The contracted long-distance telephone service provider allocates a portion of the revenues generated by these calls to the Arizona Department of Corrections. ADC deposits these revenues in the special services fund.

Fund Uses

The special services fund is used to purchase items and services for the "benefit, education and welfare of committed offenders," and to pay the costs of a telephonic victim notification system.
