conference. The Joint Status Report must contain the following information by
 corresponding paragraph numbers:

- 3 1. A concise statement of the positions of the parties concerning the relief
 4 requested in the complaint.
- 5 2. A summary of the procedural posture of the case and/or the status of the
 6 FOIA requests at issue and any responses thereto.
 - 3. A proposed deadline for filing any administrative record.
 - 4. A proposed deadline for filing dispositive motions.
- 9 5. An indication whether trial will be required in this matter and, if so, an
 10 indication (i) when the matter will be ready for trial; (ii) whether such trial will be jury or
 11 non-jury; and (iii) how long such trial is anticipated to take.
- 6. An indication whether the parties agree that a full-time Magistrate Judge
 may conduct all proceedings, including trial and the entry of judgment, under 28 U.S.C.
 § 636(c) and Local Rule MJR 13. The Magistrate Judge who will be assigned the case is
 the Honorable Brian A. Tsuchida. Agreement in the Joint Status Report will constitute
 the parties' consent to referral of the case to the assigned Magistrate Judge.
- 7. An indication whether any party wishes a scheduling conference before a
 scheduling order is entered in this case. If the parties are unable to agree on any part of
 the Joint Status Report, they may answer in separate paragraphs. No separate reports are
 to be filed.
- The time for filing the Joint Status Report may be extended only by the Court.
