This is to acknowledge receipt of your Freedom of Information Act request (expedited processing) dated January 11, 2021 and received in the Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) of the United States Department of Justice (DOJ) on January 11, 2021 in which you requested records regarding:

- 1. All records, such as emails, text messages, memos, letters, directives, intelligence bulletins and intelligence assessments, threat assessments, situation report, mentioning or referring to the protests in Washington, DC on January 6, 2021 by supporters of President Donald Trump referred to as SAVE AMERICA RALLY and STOP THE STEAL and MARCH FOR TRUMP and First Amendment demonstrations and OPERATION FIRST AMENDMENT. Please be sure this search includes any correspondence sent and received by fusion centers, data centers and joint terrorism task forces; FBI, the White House, Office of the President and Vice President and the Executive Office of the President; Washington, DC Mayor's Office and Metropolitan Police Department; Department of Interior; Department of Defense and National Guard Bureau in DC; any individual Senator and Congressman/Congresswoman and any House and Senate committee; the US Capitol Police. The timeframe for this part of my request is December 1, 2020 through the date the search for responsive records is located.
- 2. All records, such as emails, text messages, memos, letters, reports, after action reports, intelligence assessments and bulletins, intelligence memoranda, social media postings, mentioning or referring to the January 6, 2021 speech by President Donald Trump at the Washington, DC protest and the subsequent insurrection and siege and STORM THE CAPITOL, that took place at the Capitol building in Washington, DC on that date. The timeframe for this part of my request is January 6, 2021 through the date the search for responsive records is conducted

For your information, this Office assigns incoming requests to one of three tracks: simple, complex, or expedited. Each request is then handled on a first-in, first-out basis in relation to other requests in the same track. Simple requests usually receive a response in approximately 20 business days, whereas complex requests necessarily take longer. At this time, your request has been assigned to the simple track. You may wish to narrow the scope of your request to limit the number of potentially responsive records or agree to an alternative time frame for processing, should records be located; or you may wish to await the completion of our records search to discuss either of these options.

- 3. Photographs of these January 6, 2021 protests and the siege/insurrection that took place at the Capitol building.
- 4. All records mentioning or referring to tweets by Donald Trump that contain the words PROTESTS, RALLY, RALLIES ELECTION FRAUD, FRAUD, JANUARY SIXTH.
- 5. The call logs and briefing books for the directors of each Department of Justice component this request is addressed. Please limit this search to January 6, 2021.

This is to acknowledge your email dated January 11, 2021 for information pertaining to 1. All records, such as emails, text messages, memos, letters, directives, intelligence bulletins and intelligence assessments, threat assessments, situation report, mentioning or referring to the protests in Washington, DC on January 6, 2021 by supporters of President Donald Trump referred to as SAVE AMERICA RALLY and STOP THE STEAL and MARCH FOR TRUMP and First Amendment demonstrations and OPERATION FIRST AMENDMENT. Our FOIA office received your Freedom of Information Act request on January 11, 2021.

In response to the COVID-19 public health emergency, the NSD FOIA staff is teleworking full time. Our FOIA operations have been diminished while we are teleworking and our FOIA intake and FOIA processing will be slower than normal.

Our policy is to process FOIA requests on a first-in, first-out basis. Consistent with this policy, every effort will be made to respond to your request as quickly as possible. The actual processing time will depend upon the complexity of the request, whether it involves sensitive or voluminous records, and whether consultations with other agencies or agency components are appropriate. Also, the National Security Division does not handle Delegation of Authority.

You have requested expedited processing of your request under the Department of Justice standards permitting expedition when a requester demonstrates a "compelling need." A compelling need is defined as follows:

- 1. Failure to obtain requested records on an expedited basis could reasonably he expected to pose an imminent threat to the life or physical safety of an individual; or
- 2. With respect to a request made by a person primarily engaged in disseminating information, urgency to inform the public concerning actual or alleged Federal Government activity.

You have demonstrated that there is a particular urgency to inform the public about an actual or alleged federal government activity. Therefore, we have determined that your request for expedited processing is granted.



Please be advised that "unusual circumstances" apply to the processing of your request. <u>See</u> 5 U.S.C. § 552 (a)(6)(B)(iii). "Unusual circumstances" include one or more of the following scenarios:

Good morning,

Thank you for your inquiry regarding the status of your Freedom of Information Act/Privacy (FOIPA) request. A review of your request has determined the following:

The request is presently in Initial Processing, where the assigned analyst is searching for, retrieving and reviewing potentially responsive records.

Requests are processed in the order in which they are received through our multi-track processing system. Requests are divided into two primary tracks—simple (under 50 pages of potentially responsive documents) and complex (over 50 pages of potentially responsive documents). Complex requests are further divided into medium, large, and extra-large sub-tracks based upon request size. Simple track requests typically require the least amount of time to process. Currently, simple track cases average approximately 106 days from the date of receipt for processing. Our complex requests in the medium processing track are currently averaging 785 days, large processing track are currently averaging 2,088 days for processing.

The search for responsive records is ongoing for your request, so we do not yet know into which track it will fall. The estimated date of completion is therefore based on the average processing time of complex requests in the large processing track. Accordingly, the estimated date on which the FBI will complete action on your request is 1,695 days from the date the FBI opened your request. As senior investigative reporter at BuzzFeed News, I am a full-time member of the news media. I therefore quality as a person primarily engaged in disseminating information.

A potential crisis is brewing as is the peaceful transfer of power. The president of the United States incited a mob to attack the US capitol building. Four people are dead. The president has been parroting conspiracy theories and now faces the very real possibility of being removed from office. At the same time, this grave breach of the Capitol raises questions about why law enforcement was not prepared, what it knew and when it knew it and the records I seek will provide insight into these matters.

It is crucial that my request be granted expedited treatment and records produced to me on an expedited basis so that I may inform the public about these matters.

These records are not being requested for commercial purposes. I intend to use these records to write news stories and inform the public about actual government activity, concerning the novel coronavirus global pandemic.
