We received your request for information relating to Anthonia Nwagwu on December 19, 2020.

We respond to requests on a first-in, first-out basis and on a multi-track system. Your request has been placed in the complex track (Track 2). You may wish to narrow your request to a specific document in order to be eligible for the faster track. To do so, please send a written request, identifying the specific document sought, to the address above. We will notify you if your request is placed in the simple track.

Consistent with 6 C.F R. § 5.5(a) of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) FOIA regulations, USCIS processes FOIA requests according to their order of receipt. Although USCIS' goal is to respond within 20 business days of receipt of your request, FOIA does permit a 10-day extension of this time period in certain circumstances. Due to the increasing number of FOIA requests received by this office, we may encounter some delay in processing your request. Additionally, due to the scope and nature of your request, USCIS will need to locate, compile, and review responsive records from multiple offices, both at headquarters and in the field. USCIS may also need to consult with another agency or other component of the Department of Homeland Security that have a substantial interest in the responsive information. Due to these unusual circumstances, USCIS will invoke a 10-day extension for your request pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(6)(B). Please contact our office if you would like to limit the scope of your request or to agree on a different timetable for the processing of your request. We will make every effort to comply with your request in a timely manner.

In accordance with Department of Homeland Security Regulations (6 C.F.R. § 5.3(c)), your request is deemed to constitute an agreement to pay any fees that may be chargeable up to \$25.00. Dear Abril Siewert:

This is in response to your Freedom of Information Act/Privacy Act (FOIA/PA) request received in this office on December 19, 2020 regarding Anthonia Nwagwu.

We have completed the review of all documents and have identified 2730 pages that are responsive to your request. Enclosed are 2066 pages released in their entirety and 282 pages released in part. We are witholding 382 pages in full. In our review of these pages, we have determined they contain no reasonably segregable portion(s) of non-exempt information. We have reviewed and have determined to release all information except those portions that are exempt pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(3), (b)(5), (b)(6), (b)(7)(c), and (b)(7)(e) of the FOIA.

The following exemptions are applicable:

Exemption (b)(3) permits withholding of records or information if a law specifically exempts the material from disclosure, including the disclosure of which would be detrimental to security of transportation. The statute allows us to withhold this information pursuant to 49 U.S.C. 114(r) of the Aviation and Transportation Security Act.

Exemption (b)(7)(E) of the FOIA provides protection for records or information for law enforcement purposes which would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law. The types of documents and/or information we have withheld could consist of law enforcement systems checks, manuals, checkpoint locations, surveillance techniques, and various other documents.

Exemption (b)(7)(C) provides protection for personal information in law enforcement records, which could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. We have withheld information relating to third-party individuals. The types of documents and/or information that we have withheld could consist of names, addresses, identification numbers, telephone numbers, fax numbers, or various other documents that are considered personal.

Exemption (b)(6) permits the government to withhold all information about individuals in personnel, medical and similar files where the disclosure of such information would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. The types of documents and/or information that we have withheld may consist of birth certificates, naturalization certificates, drivers' licenses, social security numbers, home addresses, dates of birth, or various other documents and/or information belonging to a third party that are considered personal.

Exemption (b)(5) provides protection for inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters, which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency. The types of documents and/or information that we have withheld under this exemption may consist of documents

containing pre-decisional information, documents or other memoranda prepared in contemplation of litigation, or confidential communications between attorney and client.

Exemption (b)(3) provides protection for information specifically exempted from disclosure by statute, provided that such statute establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matter to be withheld. The statute which allows us to withhold this information pursuant to (b)(3) is 8 U.S.C. 1202(f) of the Immigration and Nationality Act.

As a result of discussion between agency personnel and a member of our staff, as a matter of administrative discretion, we are releasing computer codes found on system screen prints previously withheld under exemption b(2). There may be additional documents that contain discretionary releases of exempt information. If made, these releases are specifically identified in the responsive record. These discretionary releases do not waive our ability to invoke applicable FOIA exemptions for similar or related information in the future.



This letter is the final response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) appeal submitted to U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS), where you appealed the adverse determination of your request dated March 25, 2021. You have requested appeal the withholdings of records pertaining to Anthonia Nwagwu.

A search of USCIS for records responsive to your request produced two hundred and nine (209) pages that originated within U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE). USCIS referred these records and your subsequent appeal to ICE for processing and review under the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552.

ICE has applied Exemption 5 to protect from disclosure intra-agency documents that contain the recommendations, opinions, and conclusions of agency employees in this case attorney's notes. The disclosure of these communications would discourage the expression of candid opinions and inhibit the free and frank exchange of information and opinions among agency personnel on important agency decision-making by having a chilling effect on the agency's deliberative process.

ICE has applied FOIA Exemptions (b)(6) and (b)(7)(C) to protect from disclosure the names, addresses and signatures of DHS employees, as well as the names, addresses, telephone numbers and other identifying information of other third parties to prevent an unwarranted invasion of privacy. The privacy interests of the individuals in the records you have requested outweigh any minimal public interest in the disclosure of the information.

ICE applied FOIA Exemption (b)(7)(E) to protect from disclosure information compiled for law enforcement purposes, the release of which would disclose investigative techniques and procedures, such as internal agency law enforcement encounter identification numbers and secure URLs, which are not well known to the public. Disclosure of internal investigative case

numbers and identification numbers, should they be released could be reasonably expected to risk circumvention of the law.

Upon a complete review of the information withheld by ICE in the initial determination on your FOIA request, the withholding of this information was proper in all respects, and the information is exempt from disclosure under the applicable provisions of 5 U.S.C. § 552 cited above.

This decision is the final action of ICE concerning the withholding component of your request. Inasmuch as you consider this to be a denial of your appeal, you may obtain judicial review of this decision pursuant to the provisions of 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(B) in the United States District Court in the district in which you reside or have a principal place of business, or in which the agency records are situated, or in the District of Columbia.
