please bear with me as there are 2 different chemicals involved in the Benchmark proposal.

A chemical is used to treat sea lice, usually in a wellboat in which the fish are held for treatment. Then the fish are removed, leaving waste chemicals; and Benchmark proposes that a second chemical is added to those residues to neutralise the first chemical. The aim is that ultimately the neutralised residues can be discharged to the water environment with minimal impact. (This would be a breakthrough for both the industry and SEPA as it would remove many of the environmental concerns about such chemicals).

This final discharge of the residues must meet an appropriate Environmental Quality Standard (EQS) which must be derived in accordance with EU procedures (which is now enshrined in Scots law), subject to an appropriate mixing zone (ie not simply at the point of the discharge from the hose/pipe). It is a matter for the company to demonstrate to SEPA that the system is capable of consistently achieving that EQS. (Just to be clear, even in a trial the discharge must aim to meet the EQS).
