This letter is the response of the Civil Division, Department of Justice to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request in which you requested records concerning a case against the Royal Bank of Scotland. This Office received your request on December 14, 2018.

The Civil Division located 610 pages responsive to your request. Five hundred ninetyseven pages are being withheld in full. The Civil Division withheld certain information because it is protected from disclosure under the FOIA pursuant to:

- 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(4), which concerns trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person that is privileged or confidential;
- 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(5), which concerns certain inter- and intra-agency communications protected by the deliberative process and attorney work-product privileges;
- 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(6), which concerns material the release of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of third parties; and
- 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(7)(C), which concerns records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes the release of which could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of third parties.

Please be advised that the Civil Division referred thirteen pages to the Executive Office for United States Attorneys (EOUSA) for processing and direct response to you. See 28 C.F.R. § 16.4 (2019). You should not take it as an indication that excluded records do, or do not, exist.
