We received your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request on 4 November 2019 seeking all documents related to a friendly fire incident in Fallujah, Iraq on 12 April 2004 resulting in the deaths of two Marines, Lance Cpl Brad S. Shuder and Lance Cpl Robert Zurheide, and injuries to Marines John Smith and Brandon Costello. Specifically, you requested: (1) photographs; (2) notes; (3) reports from initial field investigation; (4) battlefield observations; (5) subsequent JAGMAN investigation; (6) lessons learned; (7) records related to suspected friendly fire findings relating to the organic 2-1st Weapons and Artillery 5th team and attached artillery components from 1st Battalion, 11th Marines; (8) records containing the dates of family notification; and (9) any other potentially relevant documents. Your request is being processed in accordance with Title 5 U.S.C. § 552 Freedom of Information Act and Privacy Act, and Executive Order 13526. The actual processing time for these documents will depend upon consultation with other DoD components, stateside, overseas, or other agencies.

In your request, you asked for a fee waiver. Your request for a fee waiver is granted.
