REQUEST FOR PRODUCTION MOTION TO MODIFY STANDARD DISCOVERY  
PROCEDURES, MOTION TO INSPECT ELECTION RECORDS OF THE CITY OF  
DALLAS, MOTION TO INSPECT THE ELECTIONS RECORDS OF DALLAS COUNTY,  
REQUEST FOR EXPEDITED HEARING ON PENDING MOTIONS, AND REQUEST FOR  
INJUNCTIVE RELIEF REGARDING DUE PROCESS CLAIM.**

## ELECTION CONTEST

1. This original petition initiating an election contest is filed pursuant to Section 232.002 of the Election Code.
2. Under Section 232.009 (a) of the Election Code, the Dallas County District Clerk must "promptly deliver written notice of the filing to the presiding officer of the final canvassing authority for the contest election." As required by Section 232.009 (d), Brenham and Williams, provides the following name and address of the person to whom that notice must be delivered: The City Of Dallas, 1500 Marilla, Dallas Texas 75201 and Toni Pippins-Poole, Director of Dallas County Election Administrator, 2377 N. Stemmon Freeway, Suite 820 Dallas, Texas 75207. *Dianne Gibson

Dallas Tx 75241*
3. As required by Section 232.008 (d) of the Election Code, Petitioners delivered a copy of this original petition to the Texas Secretary of State on or before the filing deadline.
4. In the City of Dallas Municipal Election, May 9, 2015, Subrina Lynn Brenham, Eric LeMonte Williams, Erik Wilson and Dianne Gibson sought for the office their Dallas City Council District 8 seat.
5. Brenham and Williams generally contends that "illegal votes" (as defined by Section 221.003 (b) of the Election Code: "illegal vote" means a vote that is not legally countable") were counted for Dianne Gibson, Eric Wilson, and/or that persons officially involved in the administration of the contest election failed to count legal votes for Brenham and Williams and/or engaged in other fraud and/or illegal conduct and or made mistakes.

6. The final canvass does not include legal votes cast for Brenham and Williams in all of the precincts.
7. The final canvass includes illegal votes for Gibson, Wilson, in the City of Dallas City Council May 9, 2015 Election and does not include the legal votes of Brenham and Williams in the City of Dallas City Council May 9, 2015 Election due to their names not appearing on the electronic ballot at Beckley Sub-Courthouse. As observed at multiple polling places there were several ballot box drives available to the election judges to use throughout early voting and the general election. Obviously, whether due to mistake or fraud the votes totals reported for the election in the contested are incorrect.
8. Brenham and Williams reserves the right to timely amend this original petition if additional evidence or petitioners concerning the counting of votes, campaign finance, fraud, illegal conduct, or mistakes related to the contested election is discovered.

#### **DISCOVERY REQUESTS**

9. Pursuant to Texas Rule of Civil Procedure 194, Brenham and Williams request that the City of Dallas and County of Dallas Elections Department, within nine days of the service of this document, disclose and serve by hand-delivery and information and material described in Rule 194.2.
10. Pursuant to Texas Rule of Civil Procedure 196, Brenham and Williams request the City of Dallas and Dallas County Election Department produce for inspection and copying:

- (a) All documents that established or otherwise support the claim that the outcome of the contested election, as shown by the final canvass, is the true outcome;
- (b) All documents that established or otherwise support the claim that the outcome of the contested election, as shown by the final canvass, is the true outcome; and
- (c) All documents that discuss, concern, or otherwise relate to whether the outcome of the contested election, as shown by the final canvass, is or is not the true outcome.

11. Brenham and Williams request that the City of Dallas and Dallas County Elections Department to produce the documents described in paragraph 10 at the following date, time, and place: nine days after the service of this document: 10:00a.m; Eric Lemonte Williams 7315 Wilcox Drive, Dallas, Texas 75232 and Subrina Brenham 6621 LaGrange Drive Dallas, Texas 75241.

#### **MOTION TO MODIFY STANDARD DISCOVERY PROCEDURES**

12. Pursuant to Texas Rule of Civil Procedure 191.1, Brenham and Williams request that the Court sign and order shortening the time allowed for the City of Dallas and Dallas County Elections Department to comply with the discovery requests set forth above.
13. Brenham and Williams further requests that the Court sign and order requiring that the City of Dallas and Dallas County Elections Department response to the request for disclosure be hand-delivered.
14. The foregoing modifications to standard discovery procedures are necessary because of the accelerated procedures that apply to this City of Dallas City Council election contest. For example, the trial would be over before disclosures and documents were due if the standard discovery deadlines remain applicable. The foregoing reasons constitute good cause for the requested relief.

**MOTION TO INSPECT ELECTION RECORDS OF THE CITY OF DALLAS**

15. Brenham and Williams request that the Court sign an order allowing Brenham and Williams to review the following election records and other documents in the possession, custody, or control of the Dallas County Elections Department and the City of Dallas:
- (a) The final canvass issued May 9, 2015, and all supporting and related documents;
  - (b) Any amended" final canvass," and all supporting and related documents;
  - (c) Any canvasses that were reported after the final canvass issued May 9, 2015 was completed, and all supporting the related and relating documents;
  - (d) All documents that established or otherwise support the claim that the outcome of the contested election, as shown by the final canvass, is the true outcome;
  - (e) All documents that establish or otherwise support the claim that the outcome of the contested election, as shown by the final canvass, is not the true outcome; and
  - (f) All documents that discuss, concern, or otherwise relate to whether the outcome of the contested election, as shown by the final canvass, is or is not the true outcome.

**MOTION TO INSPECT ELECTION RECORDS OF DALLAS COUNTY**

16. Brenham and Williams desires to perform a partial pretrial audit of election records (including "secured" items) in the possession, custody, or control of the Dallas County Elections Administrator which relate to the contested election.
17. Brenham and Williams desires access to all election records related to absentee voting and the central counting station.

18. Brenham and Williams further desires access to all election records related to all of the early voting by personal appearance and all of the Election Day polling places.

19. Section 221.008 of the Texas Election Code provides:

A tribunal hearing an election contest may cause secured ballot boxes, voting machines, or other equipment used in the election to be unsecured to determine the correct vote count or any other fact that the tribunal considers pertinent to a fair and just disposition of the contest.

**REQUEST FOR EXPEDITED HEARING ON PENDING MOTIONS**

20. An expedited hearing on the foregoing motions is necessary because of the accelerated procedures that apply to this primary election contest.

21. Brenham and Williams requests that the Court set a hearing on the motions contained in this document at the earliest possible time.

**REQUEST FOR INJUNCTIVE RELIEF REGARDING DUE PROCESS CLAIM**

22. The accelerated procedures required by the Election Code, as applied to this general election contest, violate Article I, Section 13 and 19 of the Texas Constitution.

23. The accelerated procedures are manifestly inadequate to allow discovery of mistakes or fraud affecting the true outcome of contested election. Under the accelerated procedures, only the most open and obvious mistakes and/or fraud are discoverable.

24. Brenham and Williams request that that the Court enjoin the application of any Election Code provision that, as applied to this election contest violates the Texas Constitution.

**CONDITIONS PRECEDENT**

25. All conditions precedent have been performed or have occurred.

**REQUEST FOR RELIEF**

26. Based on the foregoing, Brenham and Williams request that the Court ascertain the true outcome of the contested election and declare the outcome or, in the alternative, declare the contested election avoid and order a new election.


27. Brenham and Williams also seek cost of suite and all other relief, in law and in equity, to which they may be entitled.

# An Election Day Message

## Murky results but clear support for Rawlings

The morning after Election Day is an exercise in reading tea leaves.

What exactly are voters telling us?

The answers aren't always clear. If campaigns love stark contrasts, voters often deliver murky results.

But we can discern a few things.

The first is that much remains to be decided. Four council districts, including three in southern Dallas, were thrown into runoffs. The outcomes of those races will shape the balance of power on the City Council — largely around questions of how the city should develop.

But certain things are clearer this morning than they were on Election Day.

First, people in Dallas want Mike Rawlings to continue as mayor.

Some opponents of the Trinity toll road and some people who will never trust City Hall or the establishment thought Rawlings might be vulnerable because he has supported the road and because he is the face of the city's business and civic leadership.

Voters looked at the fuller picture. They saw Rawlings' leadership on southern Dallas. They saw his support of school reform. They saw his optimism for a better city, and they overwhelmingly returned him to office. The margin of his victory — with three-quarters of the vote — over lawyer Marcos Ronquillo should chasten those who would dismiss Rawlings as a figurehead of the city's power elite. He is the person Dallas residents want leading them. That deserves respect.

The other race that should get our attention was in council District 9, in Lakewood and neighborhoods east of White Rock Lake.

Mark Clayton, an insurance agency owner, handily won in a field of five candidates. Two of his challengers were well-funded and well-known. That Clayton avoided a runoff indicates his message of walkable urbanism resonated in this district. This newspaper recommended one of Clayton's challengers, Darren Boruff. But Clayton was always an impressive candidate. He ran a strong campaign that reflected his optimistic personality.

In Dallas ISD, meanwhile, voters sent a message of support for Superintendent Mike Miles with the election of Edwin Flores in District 1. This race was really a referendum

on whether the city wants to move forward with Miles' reforms or find someone new to run the district. It is true that Miles' staunchest opponent, District 9 trustee Bernadette Nutall, was re-elected. But Nutall's opponent, Damarcus Offord, was so deficient this race was hardly a litmus test.

All trustees now need to come together to stop the squabbling over Miles and work with the administration to implement reforms.

Change also was afoot in the three big-suburb races. In Arlington and Mesquite, voters wisely chose fresh visions, ousting incumbents. Stan Pickett has the better plan to revitalize Mesquite and has pledged to bring the transparency lacking under longtime incumbent John Monaco. In Arlington, the time had come for someone to succeed Robert Cluck after years of good service. Jeff Williams has the energy and ideas to boost the city.

And in Lewisville, voters were right to pick veteran council member Rudy Durham as mayor. His focus on municipal issues vs. his opponent's primary interest in patriotism and Christian conservatism is what that city needs.

Election Day is over. Election season isn't. But the picture that is emerging should encourage us all.

Dear Mr. Williams,

Thank you for your letter dated April 22, 2015, informing us of your concerns regarding certain areas that you have described involving the existence of potential voter fraud and election related activities. Your letter lists very broad areas but fails to provide specific issues with the mail ballot process, the type of poll worker activity, and electioneering concerns. If you could provide specific details, I could properly address your concerns.

With regard to your concerns related to the calibrating process that we have in place, and addressing electioneering concerns, below are procedures currently in place:

1. iVotronics during early voting are checked on a daily bases, before, during and at the close of the day. Any machine that is unable to calibrate, as with any electronic device, is removed from service and noted. All iVotronics are tested before programming and after programming during a State mandate Logic and Accuracy Testing. Successful hardware diagnostic testing is completed before delivery and during set up at the polling locations.
2. Elections officers are required to post a distance marker 100 feet from the entrance of the polling place. The distance marker posts information that no electioneering or loitering are allowed between the marker and the polling place. The election officers are instructed and trained to monitor the activity, both during early voting and Election Day.
3. Election technicians monitor the activity on Election Day. Judges have access to sheriff deputies to assist in maintaining control over any issues. However, election officials do not have any authority to monitor activities beyond the distance marker. Any issue outside the distance marker is the responsibilities of the property owner or management.

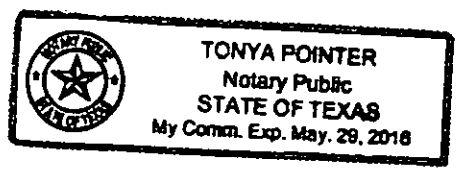
