AN ACT TITLE 18, 2 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE; AMENDING CHAPTER 70, CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 18-7042, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE THE CRIME OF INTERFERENCE WITH AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION, PENALTIES, TO PROVIDE PROVIDE 5 TERMS, TO DEFINE RESTITUTION, AND TO PROVIDE SEVERABILITY. 6

 $^{\prime}8$ Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

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10 SECTION 1. That Chapter 70, Title 18, Idaho Code, be, and is 11 hereby amended by the addition thereto of a <u>NEW SECTION</u>, to be known 12 and designated as Section 18-7042, Idaho Code, be, and to read as 13 follows:

18-7042. INTERFERENCE WITH AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION.

- 16 17 (1) A person commits the crime of interference with agricultural 18 production if the person knowingly:
- 19
 20 (a) is not employed by an agricultural production facility
 21 and enters an agricultural production facility by force, threat,
 22 misrepresentation or trespass; or
- 24 (b) obtains records of an agricultural production facility 25 by force, threat, misrepresentation or trespass; or
- 27 (c) obtains employment with an agricultural production 28 facility by force, threat, or misrepresentation with the intent to 29 cause economic or other injury to the facility's operations, 30 livestock, crops, owners, personnel, equipment, buildings, premises, 31 business interests or customers; or
- 33 (d) enters an agricultural production facility and, without 34 the facility owner's express consent or pursuant to judicial process 35 or statutory authorization, makes audio or video recordings of the 36 conduct of an agricultural production facility's operations; or
- 37
 38 (e) intentionally damages or interferes with the 39 agricultural production facility's operations, livestock, crops, 40 owners, personnel, equipment, buildings, premises, business 41 interests or customers.
 - (2) For purposes of this section:
- 45 (a) "Agricultural production" means activities associated 46 with the production of agricultural products for food, fiber, fuel 47 and other lawful uses, and includes, without limitation:

- 1 (1) Construction, expansion, use, maintenance and 2 repair of an agricultural production facility;
- 3 (2) Preparing land for agricultural production;
- 4 (3) Handling or applying pesticides, herbicides or 5 other chemicals, compounds or substances labeled for insects, pests, 6 crops, weeds, water or soil;
- 7 (4) Planting, irrigating, growing, fertilizing, 8 harvesting or producing agricultural, horticultural, floricultural 9 and viticultural crops, fruits and vegetable products, field grains, 10 seeds, hay, sod and nursery stock, and other plants, plant products, 11 plant byproducts, plant waste and plant compost;
- 12 (5) Breeding, hatching, raising, producing, feeding and 13 keeping livestock, dairy animals, swine, fur-bearing animals, 14 poultry, eggs, fish and other aquatic species, and other animals, 15 animal products and animal byproducts, animal waste, animal compost, 16 and bees, bee products and bee byproducts;
- 17 (6) Processing and packaging agricultural products, 18 including the processing and packaging of agricultural products into 19 food and other agricultural commodities;
- 20 (7) Manufacturing animal feed;
- 21 (8) Transporting agricultural products to or from an 22 agricultural facility;
- 23 (9) Selling agricultural products at a farmers or 24 roadside market;
- 25 (b) "Agricultural production facility" means any structure 26 or land, whether privately or publicly owned, leased or operated, 27 that is being used for agricultural production. 28
- 29 (3) A person found guilty of committing the crime of interference 30 with agricultural production shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and 31 shall be punished by a term of imprisonment of not more than one (1) 32 year or by a fine not in excess of five thousand dollars (\$5,000), 33 or by both such fine and imprisonment.

 35 (4) In addition to any other penalty imposed for a violation of 36 this section, the court shall require any person convicted, found 37 guilty or who pleads guilty to a violation of this section to make 38 restitution to the victim of the offense in accordance with the 39 terms of section 19-5304, Idaho Code; provided, that such award 40 shall be in an amount equal to twice the value of the damage 41 resulting from the violation of this section.

 43 SECTION 2. Severability. If any one or more provision,
 44 section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this act or
 45 the application thereof to any person or circumstance, or
 46 application to any other section of Idaho Code is found to be
 47 unconstitutional, the same is hereby declared to be severable and

1 the balance of this act shall remain effective notwithstanding such 2 unconstitutionality. The Legislature hereby declares that it would 3 have passed this act, and each provision, section, subsection, 4 sentence, clause, phrase or word thereof, irrespective of the fact 5 that any one or more provision, section, subsection, sentence, 6 clause, phrase or word be declared unconstitutional.

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STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

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The purpose of this legislation is to protect agricultural liproduction facilities from interference by wrongful conduct by 12 providing penalties for such conduct and restitution to an injured 13 agricultural producer.
