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# J-C-01 CREDENTIALS

## Standard

The facility's qualified health care professionals are legally eligible to perform their clinical duties.

### **Compliance Indicators**

- 1. All qualified health care professionals have credentials and provide services consistent with the licensure, certification, and registration requirements of the jurisdiction.
- 2. The responsible health authority (RHA) ensures that new hires undergo a credential verification process that confirms current licensure, certification, or registration.
- 3. The credential verification process includes inquiry regarding sanctions or disciplinary actions of state boards and, for *prescribers*, the National Practitioner Data Bank (NPDB).
- 4. Qualified health care professionals do not perform tasks beyond those permitted by their credentials.
- 5. The RHA maintains verification of current credentials for all qualified health care professionals at a readily accessible location.
- 6. A license that limits practice to only correctional health care is not in compliance with this standard.
- 7. Specialists providing on-site or telehealth care services have appropriate licenses and certifications on file.
- 8. All aspects of the standard are addressed by written policy and defined procedures.

#### Definitions

A provider is defined as a nurse practitioner, physician assistant, or physician.

A *prescriber* is defined as a nurse practitioner, physician assistant, physician, dentist, or optometrist.

#### Discussion

It is the responsibility of qualified health care professionals to maintain their license, certification, or registration. It is helpful for the RHA to keep copies of these documents on-site and readily accessible.
