Dear Mr. Stevens:

The 482 members of the faculty of UNC-Chapel Hill who have signed this letter object in the most strenuous terms to the withholding of tenure from Nikole Hannah-Jones in conjunction with her proposed appointment to a tenured full professorship as a Knight Chair in Race and Investigative Journalism in the Hussman School of Journalism and Media. We urge the Board to correct this situation by voting this week to approve her appointment as full professor *with tenure* to the Knight Chair.

As is clear from the broad criticism they have received and continue to receive as well as the future consequences they will provoke, the Board's actions to date are unacceptable in an institution that has been and strives to remain an internationally distinguished university and source of benefit to its state.

The history of this case is well known. Following enthusiastic endorsement by faculty in the School and review by a standing, university-wide committee on such matters, the Provost reviewed the appointment and forwarded it to the Board, thereby formally proposing it to the Board for approval. Rather than describe grounds for denying the proposed tenure, the Board has, so far, not acted on the proposal, effectively rejecting it.

The Board's denial by inaction constitutes a reversal of a proper, extensively documented and considered proposed appointment by the University and its Faculty, a reversal without offered justification and without apparent grounds. This intrusion of the Board into decisions properly the purview of the Faculty puts at risk the bedrock assumptions of academic freedom and free intellectual inquiry and integrity. These assumptions are the base for the long, superb reputation of UNC-Chapel Hill and of the pre-eminence of US colleges and universities worldwide. It cannot stand.

A defense of the Board's action has included some criticisms by other historians of Ms. Hannah-Jones' 1619 Project, in spite of the Pulitzer Prize it received. Criticism of colleagues' work is at the heart of scholarly discourse and a crucial feature of progress, not legitimate grounds for rejection or dismissal. As the University's Department of History wrote in a letter of June 22:

There is a legitimate and ongoing professional debate about the merits of some details of the 1619 Project document, but even the professional historians who have been most critical of some of Ms. Hannah-Jones's assertions in The 1619 Project have affirmed its rigor and academic integrity and supported her qualification for tenure. Debates over the interpretation of evidence and the relative significance of various historical phenomena are intrinsic to the historical profession ... [and] a sweeping reinterpretation of a large subject may generate argumentation and critique, but at the same time, this forces an entire field to question its standard assumptions and to engage in productive debate.

In addition to the intrusion into the affairs of the University Faculty, additional features of the Board's actions call for critical attention and review:

• The Board's denial of Hannah-Jones exemplifies a cultural, political and racial climate that questions the scholarship, accomplishments, and personhood of Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC). BIPOC faculty and staff are now even more concerned about the university's ability to address racial equity. Indeed, several prominent BIPOC women faculty and administrators have accepted positions at other institutions. Their consideration

- of these positions may have predated the Board's actions but their decisions to leave did not. Reports from the Carolina Black Faculty and Staff Caucus indicate many more are seeking positions elsewhere. This climate that is averse to BIPOC groups also discourages other faculty, staff, and students from coming to the University or remaining.
- The Board of Governors contemporaneously rejected the <u>reappointment of Eric Muller</u> to chair the board of UNC Press even though he was unanimously re-elected by that board. Muller had spoken out on campus issues, including the 2018 removal of the confederate monument and the current actions concerning Ms. Hannah-Jones. The actions of both Boards along with the recent history around the confederate monument and the secretly arranged \$2.5 million gift to the Sons of the Confederacy cast a shadow over all academic processes and activities at UNC-Chapel Hill, including the imminent search for a Provost.
- The Board's actions threaten the value of the University, its students' degrees and faculty and staff appointments. As an example of the wide criticism received, 23 Knight Chairs in Journalism at other universities wrote the following in a May 20 statement to the Board: Hannah-Jones ... has equivalent academic credentials to the prior two chairs at the school. Both received tenure upon appointment. The unequal treatment is clear in this case... The trustees of the University of North Carolina should be ashamed of their decision and should move quickly to accept the recommendation of the school's faculty, Dean and Provost and approve Hannah-Jones' application for tenure.

The President of the Student Body, Lamar Richards, put it well: "...a dynamic, forward-facing strategic plan one day, a new Chief Diversity Officer the next, and maybe the changing of a few building names the day after ... do not and will not ultimately make a difference if racial oppression continues to flow through our university. To pursue or hope for 'reform' from this university is akin to requesting a bandage for a racial wound that is far too deep."

UNC-Chapel Hill has tried for years to cooperate with the Board of Governors and Board of Trustees in hopes of compromises that would preserve campus values and resources. The case of Nikole Hannah-Jones and the refusal to approve the reappointment of Eric Muller to chair the board of the UNC Press indicate the stance of reason and compromise has not been reciprocated.

The Board now has the opportunity to reverse these patterns that have damaged UNC-Chapel Hill.

The Board of Trustees must take immediate action to approve the highly deserved and duly proposed appointment as full professor with tenure of Nikole Hannah-Jones as Knight Chair in Race and Investigative Journalism in the Hussman School of Journalism and Media.
