New CDC school opening guidelines fail to 'follow the science'

President Biden vowed to [“follow the science”](#) in an effort to get kids back to school. But that’s not what the [latest school opening guidelines](#) from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention do.

The two core pillars of the guidelines — that schools should decide whether to open based on community transmission and that students should strive to be spaced 6 feet apart — aren’t supported by science.

While there are many prudent recommendations in the document, these two demands will keep schools closed much longer than necessary, harming kids.

Should learning mode depend on community transmission levels?

The new school opening guidelines advise schools to open or close (or operate in [“hybrid” mode](#)) based on a four-tier color-coded system. Each color is tied to the number of new Covid-19 cases during the previous week. The red, or most restrictive category, is more than 100 cases a week per 100,000 people. By this metric, [more than 90%](#) of the country is currently in the most restrictive tier, ruling out full-time, in-person learning for elementary-aged students and any sort of in-person school for older children without screening tests.

Yet many schools in such communities already have in-person school — and have done so for months — without issue.

To justify this tiered approach, the CDC guidelines cite a “likely association” between community transmission levels and the risk of exposure in the schools. But the evidence for this is flimsy.

Ventilation should be part of the conversation on school reopening. Why isn’t it?

The CDC relies almost exclusively on a [U.K. study](#) that examined Covid-19 cases and outbreaks — defined as two or more linked cases — in educational settings in England during June and July. The CDC summarizes the study by noting: “For every 5 additional cases per 100,000 population in regional incidence, the risk of a school outbreak increased by 72%.”

While technically true, that increases is the *relative* risk, which obscures the study's key finding about *absolute* risk: School outbreaks were vanishingly rare in this study — just 0.02% among schools that were open daily during this period — even in areas with high rates of community transmission. And if the CDC had looked at the next figure in the article, focusing on individual infections rather than outbreaks, no association was seen between the number of single infections in school and broader rates of community spread.

The CDC's school opening guidelines also ignore the experience of at least two U.S. states. Schools in [North Carolina](#) and [Wisconsin](#) were open during periods of high community transmission (red zone), and both saw far fewer cases in schools than outside of them. The Wisconsin study was published in *Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report*, the CDC's own journal. If the state had taken the CDC's advice, it never would have done the study in the first place. Moreover, if there is less viral spread in schools than in the community, we want them open precisely during periods of high community spread, when the comparative risks outside of school are highest.

Do schools drive the spread of Covid-19 in the larger community? The CDC guidelines cites two studies. One, using national data, found [no overall increase](#) in hospitalization in counties where schools opened this fall, relative to trends during the same period in areas where schools remained closed. For counties with the highest rates of Covid-19 spread when schools reopened, some estimates showed an increase in Covid-19 hospitalizations, but these effects were quite modest, on the order of 2% to 3% above baseline levels of hospitalization. Even if this difference is real, it is quite small and unlikely to overwhelm the health care system unless it is already at the breaking point.

A [second study](#), focused on Michigan and Washington, suggested that schools can contribute to transmission when existing case counts are high. But this analysis was vulnerable to a classic research problem of reverse causality: school reopening may have led to more frequent testing and detection of infections that would have otherwise gone unrecorded.

Put together, the available evidence offers little reason to believe that in-person learning is particularly risky to students, educators, or people in the community. We believe the [benefits of school](#) far outweigh these concerns, and this is especially true as vulnerable people get vaccinated.

Is 6-foot distancing really required?

The CDC guidelines say that schools should try to keep kids 6 feet apart. This guidance, however, appears to be based on [decades-old research](#) on the travel distance of large respiratory droplets.

The insistence on 6 feet was controversial from the start. One of the early skeptics was physician Rochelle Walensky, who was recently appointed to lead the CDC. She [advised her local school district](#) last summer that "it is quite safe and much more practical to be at 3 feet" as long as everyone is masked. (Three feet of distancing is also [recommended](#) by the World Health Organization.)

When asked to explain this about-face during a [recent interview with CNN](#), Walensky argued that the larger distance in the CDC guidance was justified by new research published since last summer and the increase in case counts since then.

The newest evidence actually seems to argue *against* requiring strict adherence to a 6-foot rule, however. First, it is [increasingly clear](#) that transmission of Covid-19 is not explained by the droplet model — the idea that bigger drops of secretion fall in the first few feet around someone, as [was thought](#) when the [original social distancing guidelines](#) developed. Second, [a meta-analysis](#) on Covid-19 and other closely related coronaviruses showed that the benefits of increasing the distance from 3 to 6 feet is marginal in contexts where the risk of infection is low, as would be the case in a classroom with universal masking.

Most on point is a [recent study](#) that examined the dynamics of in-school transmission in Ohio. Working with seven school districts that offered in-person learning in late November and early December of last year, near the peak of daily recorded infections in the state, researchers identified all students and

teachers who had tested positive. They then repeatedly tested both their close contacts — other students who were exposed for more than 15 minutes at a distance of less than 6 feet — as well as a comparison set of students who kept their distance, including several hundred attending other classes within the same school. The rates of infection among close contacts and students who stayed more than 6 feet away were nearly identical in both elementary and high schools, suggesting minimal value from strict adherence to a 6-foot distancing rule as long as masks are worn consistently and correctly. Three feet versus 6 might sound trivial, but it really matters. Given the limitation of classroom size, maintaining 6 feet of distance will thwart many schools from operating at full capacity, meaning that students would be able to attend part-time at best, using a hybrid model. This requirement also complicates transportation. Although the main CDC guidance does not discuss transportation in detail, an [accompanying handout](#) advises districts to “skip a row if possible” on school buses. The busing constraint is particularly binding in large urban districts, where many students attend charter or magnet schools far away from their homes and rely on district-provided transportation.

Going backward on reopening

Rather than moving the ball forward on Biden’s goal of getting elementary and middle schools reopened as soon as possible, the new CDC guidelines will work to provide [political cover](#) for interest groups and districts that want to delay in-person school.

They also come when many states were acting to loosen their own guidelines to encourage schools to reopen. Just days before the CDC announcement, the state of Massachusetts [announced the elimination](#) of school bus capacity limits as long as bus windows remain open at least 2 inches. Nevada, which already allowed closer spacing on school buses, also [loosened its requirements](#) further. But, the new CDC guidelines would thwart these pragmatic efforts. The conflicting CDC guidance only creates confusion, putting districts in the difficult position of deciding whether to follow state or federal recommendations.

Most worrisome is that the stringent CDC criteria will likely increase pressure to reduce in-person learning in many places that have been operating at full capacity and with older students. As recent [test score data](#) from Ohio show, moving from in-person to hybrid formats will exacerbate learning losses, compounding the both the social and academic harms students have already experienced during the pandemic.

A truly science-based analysis must recognize the difficult tradeoffs involved — including the long-term of interests of children who are most directly affected — and carefully weigh modest increases in [Covid-19 infection risk to educators](#) and broader community members against the harms of school closures. By promoting slavish adherence to arbitrary benchmarks and distancing requirements, the new CDC school opening guidelines do a disservice to science and kids.

WHITE HOUSE GOES SMALL ON SCHOOL REOPENINGS — Biden has repeatedly talked about “big” and “bold” Covid relief proposals. That seemed to extend to one of the most important issues parents and schoolchildren are facing during the pandemic: reopening schools. In December, when Democrats were wooing voters in Georgia looking for relief from kids stuck at home taking classes via Zoom, Biden made an ambitious promise.

He said “a majority of our schools” would be open in his first 100 days as president.

On Tuesday, in what’s becoming something of a habit, the White House added an asterisk to that bold Biden promise. The 100-day goal has been downgraded to 50% of schools having “some teaching” in person “at least one day a week.”

It is a goal so modest and lacking in ambition as to be almost meaningless. Republicans on the Hill quickly seized on the issue, with the offices of both Senate Minority Leader **MITCH MCCONNELL** and House Minority Leader **KEVIN MCCARTHY** flagging the White House’s dramatic reversal of Biden’s promise.

Press secretary JEN PSAKI was asked today how the new goal squares with the Biden campaign pledge and she offered up this non-answer: “Certainly, we are not planning to celebrate at 100 days if we reach that goal. That is our own effort to set our own markings, set a bold and ambitious agenda for how we’re going to measure ourselves and progress. But we certainly hope to build from that, even at 100 days. And from there, our objective, the president’s objective, is for all schools to reopen, to stay open, to be open five days a week, for kids to be learning. That’s what our focus is on. This is simply a goal for 100 days.”

One other note from the briefing: Psaki said the Biden budget will be delayed.

Thank you all again for the invitation to meet and exchange ideas yesterday.

As promised we are following up with a brief summary of the priority items and questions Becky laid out on the call along with a list of a few places where labor management collaboration has helped lay an important foundation for the union and district leaders to solve problems together.

- A timeline for, and a set of clear, prescriptive guidance that includes criteria for in-person learning and other school engagements and factors in both community transmission rates and school-based transmission;
- Transparency about COVID-19 vaccine production, distribution, and timelines for availability, and a strong call to prioritize educations for vaccines as part of any plan for in-person instruction;
- Continuing to protect high-risk educators, students, and family members by encouraging the provision of reasonable accommodations and paid leave;
- Collection and public availability of information on COVID-19 cases in schools and on school-based compliance with mitigation guidelines;
- Recognition that widespread, rapid, free, and equitably distributed COVID-19 testing is a crucial component of plans for in-person instruction and that, in order to be effective and to build trust among educators, students, and parents, it must be accompanied by policies

that emphasize transparency, confidentiality, and clear procedures for responding to positive cases, clusters, and increased positivity rates in schools;

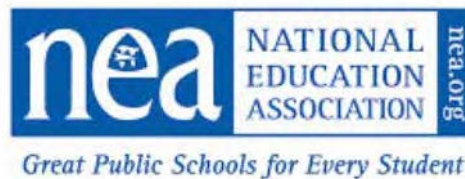
- Attention to racial and socioeconomic equity and rural/urban differences at every stage of COVID-19 policy development and action;
- In addition to detail on all necessary mitigation strategies for all routes of transmission (airborne, aerosol, droplet, and contact), more detail on ventilation-related mitigation strategies, including but not limited to specific situations like special education and high-risk areas like COVID-19 isolation rooms, nurses' offices, and bathrooms;
- As part of information on necessary mitigation strategies, clear directives for universal mask-wearing for all staff and, for those who are developmentally able to wear them, all students; clear guidance that any period of time in which students or staff are not masked poses risks of COVID-19 transmission; and clear directives that distancing of students and staff throughout the day are necessary to protect the safety of both;
- Inclusion of all educators—teachers, education support professionals, and specialized instructional support personnel, and their unions—in the planning, execution, and follow-up to COVID-19 plans, including collective bargaining when available.

We look forward to future conversations and opportunities to work together. We would welcome a staff level discussion on hot spots and we would also like to follow up on Becky's offer for Dr Walensky to do a future teletownhall with our members.

The National Labor Management Partnership (NLMP), which consists of our nation's educator unions, administrators, and school boards has been engaged around the issue of school reopening. As NEA moved towards individually articulating the WHAT of pandemic safety and student learning, we, via the NLMP, came together on the 'how'...the importance of meaningfully involving union leaders and members, community, school leaders authentically in the process.

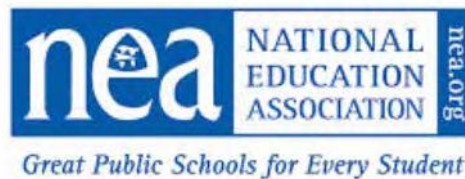
Unique capability of our union is our rich two-way communication system. It serves as an important listening vehicle in this time of crisis because it is extensive, authentic, and democratic. We can listen and amplify needs across a wide range of employees in a short period of time. And, can then work to facilitate the pulling together of people in processes for problem solving with administrators so that those needs and issues are addressed by those closest to the challenges.

1. NJ examples: New Jersey recognized the need to come together to address student-centered issues and have been building a foundation for labor-management partnerships that result in district and school level structures that address teaching and learning issues for quite some time. NJ calls them district leadership teams and school leadership teams, all working committees to address student learning issues. Based on research and practice from Rutgers & Cornell, researchers that proved what we know intuitively, when grownups work together, there are positive outcomes. More students succeed in ELA & math, and more teachers stick around, thereby increasing teacher retention rates. And the findings showed that happened particularly in high poverty schools, where teachers were typically 3.5 times more likely to leave. When there is a culture of collaboration and sustained structures for educators to meaningfully participate in problem solving, there is no difference in retention rates in high poverty and low poverty communities, and student outcomes improve.

Two particular districts in NJ to highlight:

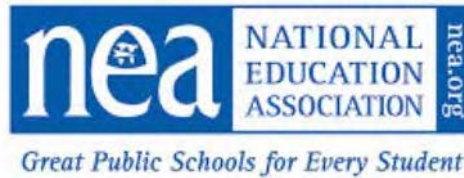
Montgomery: Established union management collaborative as the way they do business. Want to solve an issue? Do we have a committee for that? Coronavirus accelerated their processes... they needed to figure out distance learning. The union president is meaningfully involved in every meeting and worked closely with union cabinet. The union cabinet was responsible for ensuring voices were heard from rank and file members throughout process. Decisions had to be made on protocols for learning with students, training on tech and virtual teaching practices, roles and responsibilities of custodial staff and support staff with focus always on addressing whole child issues, beyond instruction, and remaining in regular, daily communication.

Delran: Coronavirus task force developed for joint presentations and planning. They addressed issues from academic and wellness lens, and were able to be proactive before state level action because they already had their collaborative teams. Teacher voice represented at the table at all times. There is a constant commitment to not let each other fail. Supervisors have much more exposure to 'teacher and support professional lens' because of their engagement.



2. The Thompson Education Association (TEA) in Loveland/Berthoud, CO, through its negotiations process, developed a Transitional Reopening Advisory Committee (TRAC) that discussed items of mutual concern related to re-opening schools over the summer of 2020. That committee met several times over the course of July and August and served as a forum where TEA could bring the questions and concerns of its members to the district for consideration, and for the district to hear the opinions of members as gathered by our Association Representatives (AR) or via surveys. Our ARs were tremendous (our structure is key to problem-solving); even over the summer, they were able to get us real-time member reaction to plans from the district as they were rolled out. Initially, the district viewed this committee as an input committee. However, as the disconnect between what the district was planning and member opinion grew, the Association was able to use survey data to force a more open conversation. For example, the district was planning to completely re-open school for in-person learning in August. We were able to show that of 490 respondents, only 45 members favored that plan, and that 81 percent of our staff believed that the district did not have a plan in place to keep us safe. In response, the district shifted, first to a hybrid model for secondary schools, then to a remote open for the first six weeks of school. As plans have shifted, we have gotten member feedback through surveys and through ARs surveying their members—in one week, our elementary ARs solicited staff feedback three times as the re-opening plan shifted! We are proud of how our member leaders have risen to the occasion in this difficult time.

3. MCEA's (Monroe County Education Association) in Bloomington, Indiana and MCCSC's (Monroe County Community School Corporation) story is one of true teamwork in action. On March 11, 2020, MCEA met with the superintendent and assistant superintendent to discuss the level of viral concerns and its potential impact. It is the starting point in an example of the union and schools working collaboratively in the best interest of teachers, children and the community. The next day, schools closed for the remainder of the school year. In June, over 50 MCEA members met weekly on multiple committees in conjunction with the school corporation administration, staff, and members of the community covering safety, curriculum, school day, busses, lunches, support staff, children of essential workers, and other issues that arose from collaborative discussions. These committees met through July to help plan for the reopening of our schools. In August, a new committee of 25, four of whom were union members, discussed the results of the smaller committees and to work through what this plan would look like for all of us. In addition to the four union members, this committee of 25 also included administrators, doctors, disease specialists, virologists, researchers from Indiana University, parents and two students. This group helped put together a workable plan and devise a locally developed metric to determine the learning status that we knew would be a moving target. The metric is color coded. Green means all students attend in person; yellow means elementary students attend in person, but secondary schools function on a hybrid schedule according to last name; and red means all schools are closed and all students and staff are online. All parents, in every learning status phase, always have the choice of moving their children online. Finally, the metrics committee has remained active monitoring percent-positive rates, state percentages, close contact tracing, and other information that affects educators, children and the community. They meet bi-monthly to provide input as the superintendent determines the phase; the union has played a very active and vital role during this pandemic. We believe this is how a community comes together under difficult circumstances and how the union is an active participant in that process.



4. Sunnyside Unified School District (SUSD) in Sunnyside, AZ, is one of the most underfunded districts in the state. SUSD's per pupil funding is \$1,800 lower than the state average. The district's working-class homeowners have repeatedly voted down local property tax override measures.

Under the leadership of president Tori Schroeder, the affiliate has a demonstrated track record of collaboration and influence.

SEA leaders met multiple times with district administrators in informal negotiations around the conditions for a return to school. 100 percent of SUSD educators' placement preferences have now been accommodated. For educators working on-site, the plan provides for safer conditions by limiting individual students to two days per week of on-site learning (with the rest of the week spent in asynchronous virtual instruction) and a cap of no more than 10 students in any classroom at a time. The 10-student cap can only be exceeded when there is enough physical space in a classroom to ensure true six-foot social distancing between all students in attendance.

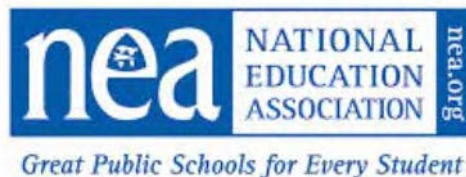
For educators working on-site, the plan provides for safer conditions by limiting individual students to two days per week of on-site learning (with the rest of the week spent in asynchronous virtual instruction) and a cap of no more than 10 students in any classroom at a time. The 10-student cap can only be exceeded when there is enough physical space in a classroom to ensure true six-foot social distancing between all students in attendance.

Building a Labor Management Partnership from a Position of Strength:

These wins came about because of the strong relationship SEA has forged with the SUSD superintendent and governing board. That relationship was strengthened over the spring and summer when SEA's outreach work to its members and potential members became the best source of information for the district on educator attitudes about the pandemic. SEA member organizers, funded by an NEA Center for Organizing MSMV grant, conducted 114 1:1 conversations over spring break 2020 and had an additional 734 engagements (848 total) with members and potential members during the rest of the spring and summer. Seeing that the local association was more deeply tied into their teaching workforce helped move the union/district partnership beyond personal relationships to a point where district leaders began to see the union as a partner that added value to their management efforts.

5. Des Moines & Iowa City: NEA local association leaders and members partnered to prioritize both student learning and educator safety. Our structures enable keeping members voices solidly in the mix.

Late last spring as Iowa's return-to-learn plan was released to school districts, ICCSD administrators asked Iowa City Education Association (ICEA) to provide teacher representatives for all seven of the return to learn committees, including a health and safety committee which is still meeting to guide the district's mitigation protocols. ICEA committee members have successfully worked through the health and safety committee to ensure that the most stringent, and safest, CDC guidance on school safety during COVID is followed even when the Iowa Department of Public Health does not require it or the CDC offers a range of options (e.g. requiring a 14-day quarantine for close contact incidents). ICEA and



ICCSD have partnered to ensure that even with the December 31, 2020 expiration of FFCRA, educators who are exposed to COVID while on the job are granted paid discretionary leave by the district. From last summer onward, ICEA President Brady Shutt has been a Zoom panelist with speaking privileges during ICCSD Board of Directors Zoom meetings and was also provided with partial release time from his teaching duties for the 2020-2021 school to serve as a return-to-learn facilitator for the district. Of course, a noteworthy aspect of this partnership was the willingness of ICCSD and its Board of Directors to vote unanimously to join the Iowa State Education Association in suing Iowa Governor Kim Reynolds and the Iowa Department of Education for their implementation of SF2310--the legislation providing some emergency powers to the Governor during the COVID pandemic.

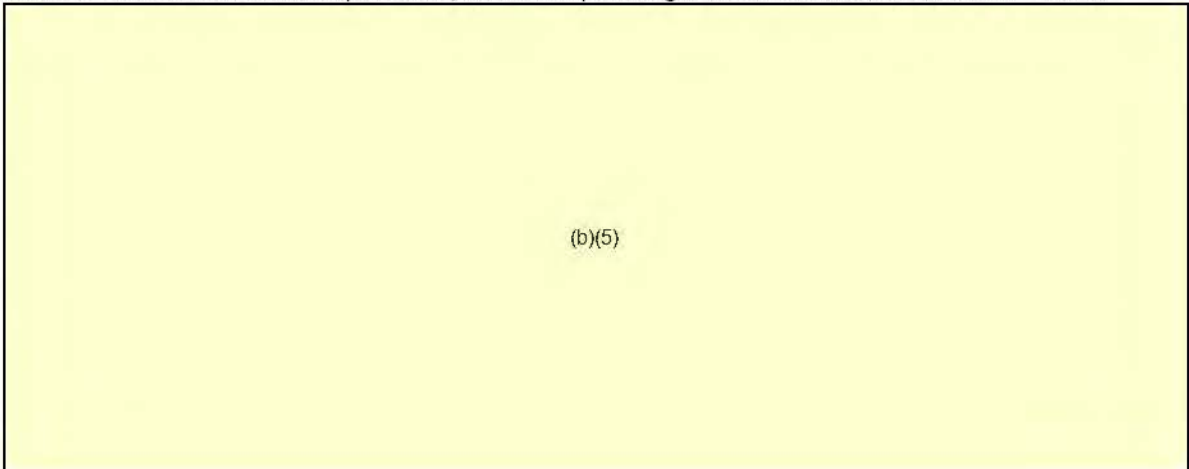

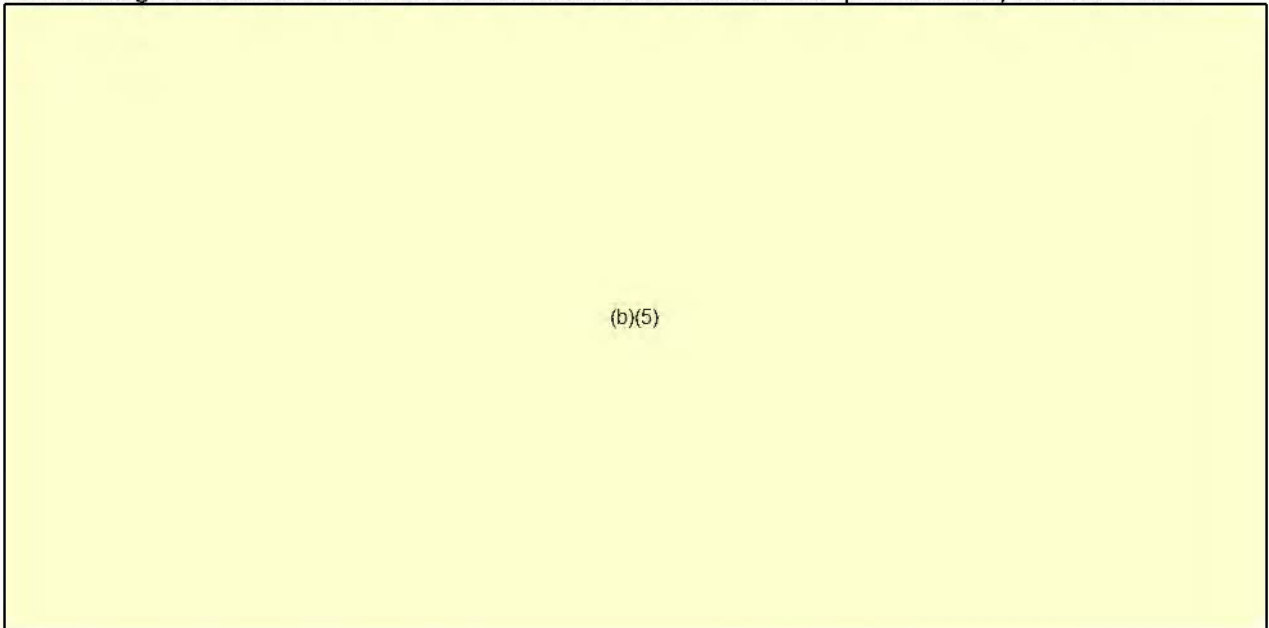

Good evening, Colleagues:

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You will recall that Randi committed to provide Dr. Walensky and the group with suggested language on the issue of accommodations for staff who are either themselves in the high-risk category, or for those who reside with a high-risk individual. We crafted the language below using a NIOSH document, as well as language in some of our agreements with school employers. Thank you for considering it.

- Employers should provide reassignment, remote work, or other options for staff who have documented high-risk conditions or who are at increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19

to limit the risk of workplace exposure. Options for reassignment include telework, virtual teaching opportunities, modified job responsibilities, environmental modifications, scheduling flexibility, or temporary reassignment to different job responsibilities. These options should likewise be extended to staff who have a household member with documentation of a high-risk condition or who are at increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19. Policies and procedures addressing issues related to teachers and other staff at higher risk of serious illness should be made in consultation with occupational medicine and human resource professionals, keeping in mind Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) concerns.

Dr. Walensky:

Thank you for your continued openness to our suggestions and input. We would like to share some thoughts regarding the paragraph below which was apparently leaked from the imminent guidance on reopening schools:

"At any level of community transmission, all schools can provide in-person instruction (either full or hybrid), through strict adherence to mitigation strategies. Recommended learning modes vary to minimize risk of SARS-CoV-2 transmission in school by emphasizing layered mitigation, including school policies requiring universal and correct mask use. The recommended learning modes (in-person, hybrid) depend on the level of community transmission and strict adherence to mitigation."

It would be great to see the insertion some variation of the following: **“In the event high-community transmission results from a new variant of SARS-CoV-2, a new update of these guidelines may be necessary.”**

We are deeply concerned about likely implications this language will have in schools where strict adherence to mitigation strategies is lacking or is impossible to implement, particularly those schools in high-density, crumbling infrastructure areas, and particularly when community transmission is high. We don't believe that any current research has demonstrated that all schools in those areas can safely reopen.

In light of the new variants of the virus, we are concerned the absence of a closure threshold might put safety of adults and kids in school settings. There is not yet conclusive research to support that keeping schools open in those countries would have been a safe decision, though the Imperial London model seems to show infections among secondary school students in the UK spiked when the new variant began to spread. And we also know that, while infection rates are beginning to drop, the B117 variant is expected to cause a sharp uptick in infections- even becoming the predominant variant by March. The UK was forced to close schools in the wake of the variant spread; Germany had to make a similar decision to close schools. When teachers and school staff see that [travel restrictions](#) are being considered in the U.S., we expect even more hesitation about in-person learning. Even a “variant closing metric” would go a long way in allaying hesitation and fears related to reopening.

We really want to lend our efforts to helping restore faith in the CDC, and we believe you are off to a great start. We must, however, urge the inclusion of clear closure triggers in the imminent guidance. Provisions providing for when schools should close, like what is in place in New York City, instill some degree of confidence for those who are hesitant about returning to school. Embedding such a threshold bolsters transparency and is a must for ensuring parents and administrators can plan for a surge like we have seen in Great Britain and in Germany.

We look forward to continued collaboration with you and your team.

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You will recall that Randi committed to provide Dr. Walensky and the group with suggested language on the issue of accommodations for staff who are either themselves in the high-risk category, or for those who reside with a high-risk individual. We crafted the language below using a NIOSH document, as well as language in some of our agreements with school employers. Thank you for considering it.

- Employers should provide reassignment, remote work, or other options for staff who have documented high-risk conditions or who are at increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19 to limit the risk of workplace exposure. Options for reassignment include telework, virtual teaching opportunities, modified job responsibilities, environmental modifications, scheduling flexibility, or temporary reassignment to different job responsibilities. These options should likewise be extended to staff who have a household member with documentation of a high-risk condition or who are at increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19. Policies and procedures addressing issues related to teachers and other staff at higher risk of serious illness should be made in consultation with occupational medicine and human resource professionals, keeping in mind Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) concerns.

Finally, we were able to review a copy of the draft guidance document over the weekend and were able to provide some initial feedback to several staff this morning about possible ways to strengthen the document. We are grateful for the agency's effort to bring some measure of organization and framework to guidance. We are likewise grateful for the inclusion of some of the mitigation efforts we have been calling for since last year. It is our hope that we can be engaged early in the process moving forward, as we believe our experiences on the ground can inform and enrich thinking around what is practicable and prudent in future guidance documents.

Washington, DC— Today, House Energy and Commerce Republican Leader Cathy McMorris Rodgers (R-WA), Republican Subcommittee Leader on Oversight and Investigations Morgan Griffith (R-VA), and Republican Subcommittee Leader on Health Brett Guthrie (R-KY) sent [this letter](#) to the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Director Rochelle P. Walensky.

In a call today with Director Walensky, Leader Rodgers expressed disappointment in the contradictory messages and shifting timelines for reopening schools coming from the Biden administration. **She asked for Director Walensky to give more certainty to parents and work to get kids back in classrooms as soon as possible.**

Griffith and Guthrie joined Rodgers in this letter urging the Biden administration to give certainty to parents and provide more information on how they prepared the CDC guidance for the Operational Strategy for Reopening Schools. **The call for more transparency on the Biden administration's decision-making process comes after reports that updated CDC guidance may lead to more school closures than openings.** This is disappointing because school closures are having devastating effects on America's children. It is time the Biden administration standup to teachers unions and say enough is enough. We need to prioritize children, not political interests.

The Biden Administration has until March 5, 2021, to respond to the letter with answers on what data, studies, and individuals were consulted to develop the CDC's updated guidance.

In the letter, these senior members of the Energy and Commerce Committee write:

*"The shifting positions and contradictory statements from the Biden administration concern us because parents need certainty. **We are also concerned that politics may be overtaking science in the Biden administration, which is leading to unnecessary, prolonged school closures.** President Biden has repeatedly pledged that 'science and truth' would be guiding principles to his administration, but your updated guidance seems to abandon those principles. As the Director of the CDC, you have an obligation to our Nation's children to follow the 'science and truth.'"*

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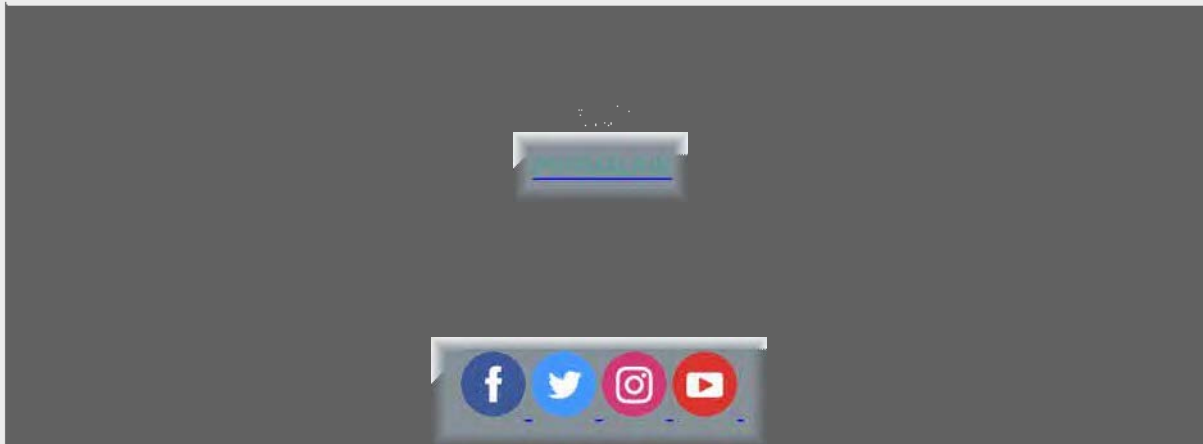

Dear Dr. Walensky,

My name is Nina Dutton and I am a staff member (GIS analyst, contractor) in ATSDR.

First of all, welcome to CDC! It has been refreshing to see CDC issue policies such as an extension of the eviction moratorium and the order for masking on public transport just within the last couple of weeks. I

also listened to some of the White House COVID-19 response team press briefing this past Wednesday, and I appreciated the clarity of your messages about current case trends and the practical preventative measures the public should be taking.

However, in the same briefing, I was concerned to hear from you a statement that the "vaccination of teachers is not a prerequisite for safe reopening of schools." I am aware of publications such as this [article written by CDC staff and published in JAMA](#), which have been cited as evidence that schools can safely reopen now.

But assuming "now" refers to our current extent of vaccination (that is to say, little to none among the general workforce as of right now), current physical conditions of schools (which vary widely), and current levels of community transmission (still high), there is reason to be concerned that fast-tracking school reopening without first creating safer conditions to do so will send more school staff to their deaths and continue to draw out this pandemic.

As stated in the aforementioned JAMA article: "Preventing transmission in school settings will require addressing and reducing levels of transmission in the surrounding communities through policies to interrupt transmission (eg, restrictions on indoor dining at restaurants). In addition, all recommended mitigation measures in schools must continue" as well. If the reopening of schools is so prioritized, then the accompanying policies to interrupt transmission in the surrounding communities must be even further prioritized ahead of reopening -- policies that include temporarily restricting activities less essential than school activities and vaccinating school staff so that they can pose less of a transmission risk to one another and the rest of their communities.

Essentially, I am concerned that placing school reopening as a separate priority ahead of other measures needed to curb community transmission represents a misordering of priorities. I understand that there is political pressure from multiple sides for the federal government to encourage reopening schools as soon as possible. But even under political pressures, I encourage you to serve in your role as the voice of science and public health expertise to which the Biden-Harris administration [intends to listen](#).

I wish you the best as you begin your directorship and am looking forward to responsible leadership from you at this agency.

Chairman Scott Statement on CDC's School Reopening Guidance

WASHINGTON – Chairman Robert C. "Bobby" Scott (VA-03) released the following statement after the Centers on Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) [published new guidance on safely reopening schools](#).

"The CDC's updated guidance on safely reopening schools makes a clear case for why Congress must swiftly enact President Biden's American Rescue Plan. Many schools across the country simply cannot afford to take the safety precautions that CDC recommends in order to protect students and school staff from COVID-19.

"Maintaining physical distancing, updating and repairing ventilation systems, purchasing personal protective equipment, and other important safety measures all cost money that schools do not have.

This is particularly true for schools in low-income areas that lacked adequate funding well before the pandemic.

“There is no question that getting students back into the classroom is critical for their education, their access to nutrition, their mental health, and the ability of school professionals to recognize and address instances of child abuse and neglect. School reopening decisions should not be based on politics – they should be based on whether schools can comply with CDC’s science-based guidelines. Congress must make the necessary investments to help schools take the steps needed to safely reopen for in-person instruction.

“On Wednesday, the Committee [passed](#) its portion of the American Rescue Plan that included a \$130 billion investment in reopening schools safely. The CDC guidance only increases the urgency of passing this COVID-19 relief package and getting schools the resources they need to safely reopen for in-person instruction and protect students and staff from this deadly virus.”

Pelosi Statement on the CDC's School Re-Opening Guidance

Washington, D.C. – Speaker Nancy Pelosi issued this statement on the new K-12 school re-opening guidance published by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC):

“The CDC’s new and welcomed school re-opening guidance accelerates the urgency for Congress to pass President Biden’s American Rescue Plan.

At the same time, the legislation secures an additional \$7 billion to close the digital divide, especially important for students and teachers in communities at high risk – which the Republicans oppose.

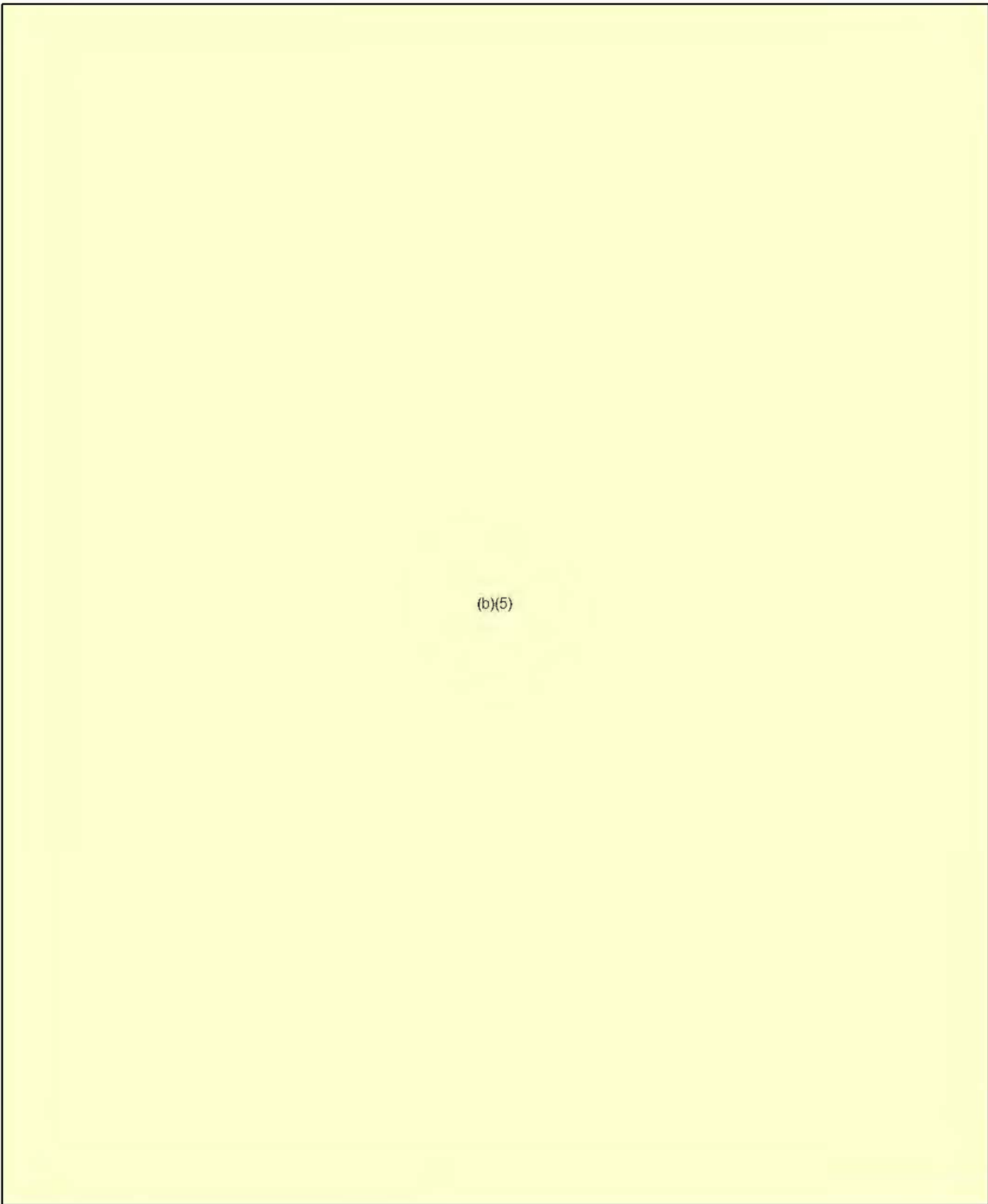

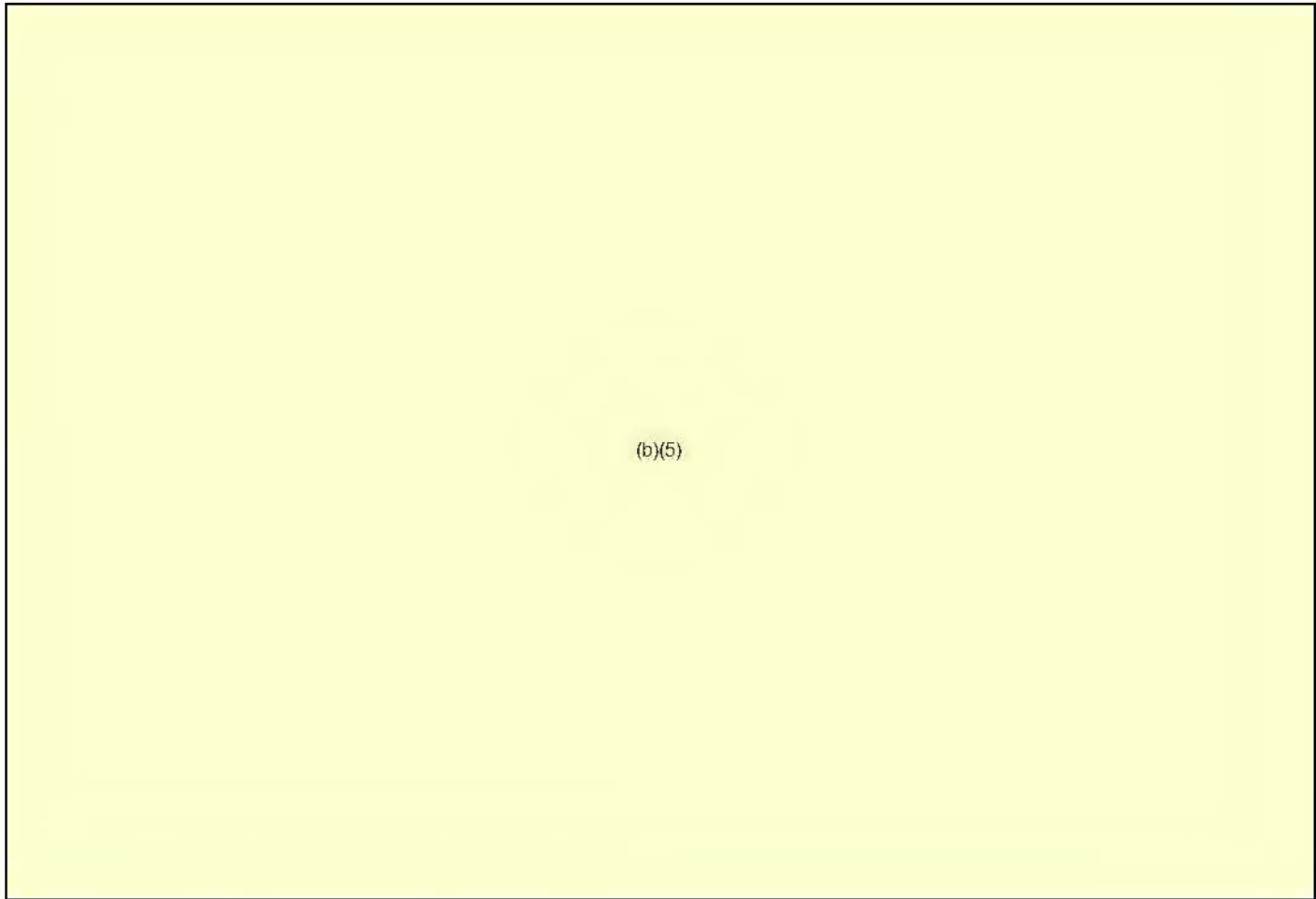

DOVER (Jan. 28, 2021) – Today, the Division of Public Health (DPH) announced an updated approach to administering second doses in response to new guidance from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC). The CDC announced Friday that an interval of 42 days between doses is acceptable, if adhering to the 21-day (Pfizer) and 28-day (Moderna) intervals is not possible.

Given extremely limited vaccine supply, DPH is recommending to vaccine partners that they schedule second doses between 28 and 35 days after the first dose is administered. This policy will enable the state to continue administering first doses to the vulnerable 65+ population at highest risk of hospitalization and death. The science shows that the first dose of COVID-19 vaccine provides 52% to 80% protection.

For context, the average flu vaccine, which is responsible for saving countless lives and hospitalizations, provides 40% to 60% protection. Delawareans who have received their first dose of COVID-19 vaccine are significantly better protected than their neighbors who haven't been vaccinated, even without the second dose. The state is committed to ensuring all Delawareans receive their second dose by Day 42, unless federal guidance recommends otherwise.

After a pause due to vaccine supply issues, the state and partners are resuming vaccinations for Phase 1A health care workers giving priority to Emergency Medical Services personnel, school nurses, and health care workers who provide patient care and are at highest risk of sustained close contact with infected individuals.

Doses are being delivered to county paramedic units by Friday and a vaccination event limited to emergency responders is being planned for Monday with appointments made through first responder agencies. DPH began working on Thursday with the County Paramedic Agencies, Delaware Fire Prevention Commission and the Police Chiefs Council to determine additional dates and locations as well. Additional Phase 1A individuals will be notified about opportunities to receive their second dose through their associations or through correspondence from the Division of Professional Regulation, once DPH has scheduled those events.

Second doses of the vaccine do not need to be administered by the same provider or at the same location as an individual's first dose, meaning as vaccines become more widely available so will options for where to get second doses. Some pharmacies and medical providers administering first dose vaccinations are scheduling second dose appointments, which they will keep as vaccine supplies allow.

However, it is important that all individuals who are vaccinated receive the same formulations of the vaccine for their second dose. In other words, those who received Moderna for the first dose should receive Moderna for their second dose. The same goes for the Pfizer vaccine. Vaccinated individuals are strongly encouraged to keep their vaccine card to ensure they know what vaccine they received and when.

DPH intends to provide second dose options for Phase 1B seniors who have been vaccinated in DPH events over the last two weekends as they reach the 28-35 day window. DPH will communicate with those individuals and schedule them for second doses using the CDC's VAMS appointment system that was used to schedule first doses, or for those who received their vaccination before the registration system went live, information will be provided on de.gov/covidvaccine or through community partners.

Teachers may play role in in-school COVID-19 transmission: U.S. CDC

(Reuters) - Teachers may play an important role in the transmission of COVID-19 within schools, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) said on Monday, citing a study conducted in elementary schools in a Georgia school district.

The report comes after researchers from the agency last month said there was little evidence that schools were spreading COVID-19 infections in the country - based in part on a study of schools in Wisconsin - easing concerns about allowing in-person learning. The Wisconsin study found significantly lower virus spread within schools compared with transmission in the surrounding communities.

An investigation involving about 2,600 students and 700 staff members of a Georgia school district's elementary schools showed nine clusters of COVID-19 cases involving 13 educators and 32 students at six elementary schools, the CDC said.

Of these, two clusters involved probable teacher-to-teacher

transmission that was followed by teacher-to-student transmission in classrooms, the agency said in its Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report.

Transmission from teachers resulted in about half of 31 school-related cases, according to the investigation.

The study was subject to some limitations including difficulty in determining whether coronavirus transmission happened in school or out in the local community, the agency noted.

Distinguishing between the two types of transmission was particularly challenging when the 7-day average number of cases per 100,000 persons exceeded 150, the agency said.

The CDC said COVID-19 vaccination of educators should be considered as an additional mitigation measure to be added when available, although not required for reopening schools.

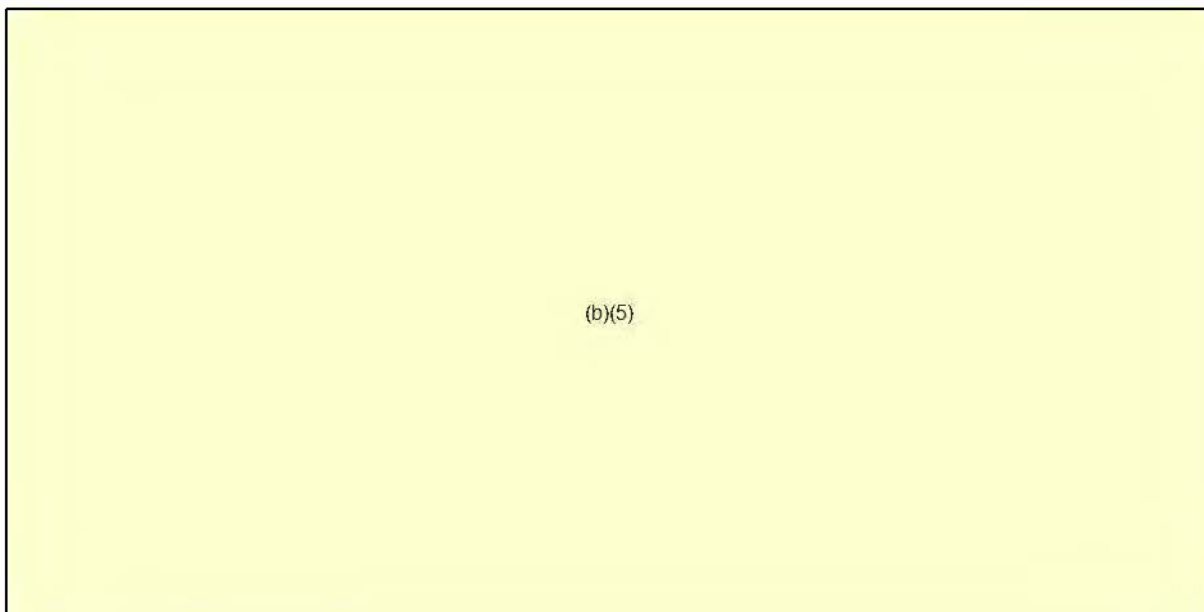

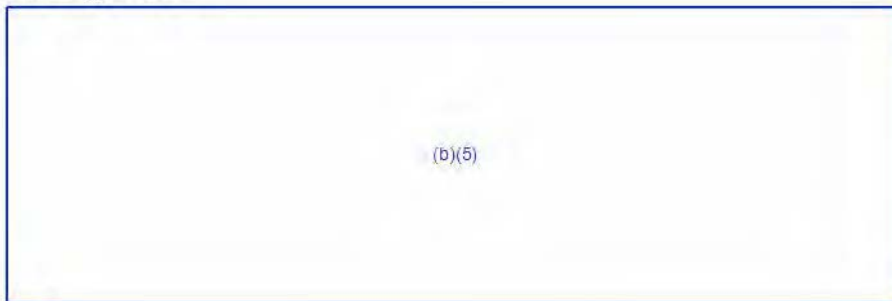

Thank you all again for the invitation to meet and exchange ideas yesterday.

As promised we are following up with a brief summary of the priority items and questions Becky laid out on the call along with a list of a few places where labor management collaboration has helped lay an important foundation for the union and district leaders to solve problems together.

- A timeline for, and a set of clear, prescriptive guidance that includes criteria for in-person learning and other school engagements and factors in both community transmission rates and school-based transmission;
- Transparency about COVID-19 vaccine production, distribution, and timelines for availability, and a strong call to prioritize educations for vaccines as part of any plan for in-person instruction;
- Continuing to protect high-risk educators, students, and family members by encouraging the provision of reasonable accommodations and paid leave;
- Collection and public availability of information on COVID-19 cases in schools and on school-based compliance with mitigation guidelines;

- Recognition that widespread, rapid, free, and equitably distributed COVID-19 testing is a crucial component of plans for in-person instruction and that, in order to be effective and to build trust among educators, students, and parents, it must be accompanied by policies that emphasize transparency, confidentiality, and clear procedures for responding to positive cases, clusters, and increased positivity rates in schools;
- Attention to racial and socioeconomic equity and rural/urban differences at every stage of COVID-19 policy development and action;
- In addition to detail on all necessary mitigation strategies for all routes of transmission (airborne, aerosol, droplet, and contact), more detail on ventilation-related mitigation strategies, including but not limited to specific situations like special education and high-risk areas like COVID-19 isolation rooms, nurses' offices, and bathrooms;
- As part of information on necessary mitigation strategies, clear directives for universal mask-wearing for all staff and, for those who are developmentally able to wear them, all students; clear guidance that any period of time in which students or staff are not masked poses risks of COVID-19 transmission; and clear directives that distancing of students and staff throughout the day are necessary to protect the safety of both;
- Inclusion of all educators—teachers, education support professionals, and specialized instructional support personnel, and their unions—in the planning, execution, and follow-up to COVID-19 plans, including collective bargaining when available.

We look forward to future conversations and opportunities to work together. We would welcome a staff level discussion on hot spots and we would also like to follow up on Becky's offer for Dr Walensky to do a future teletownhall with our members.

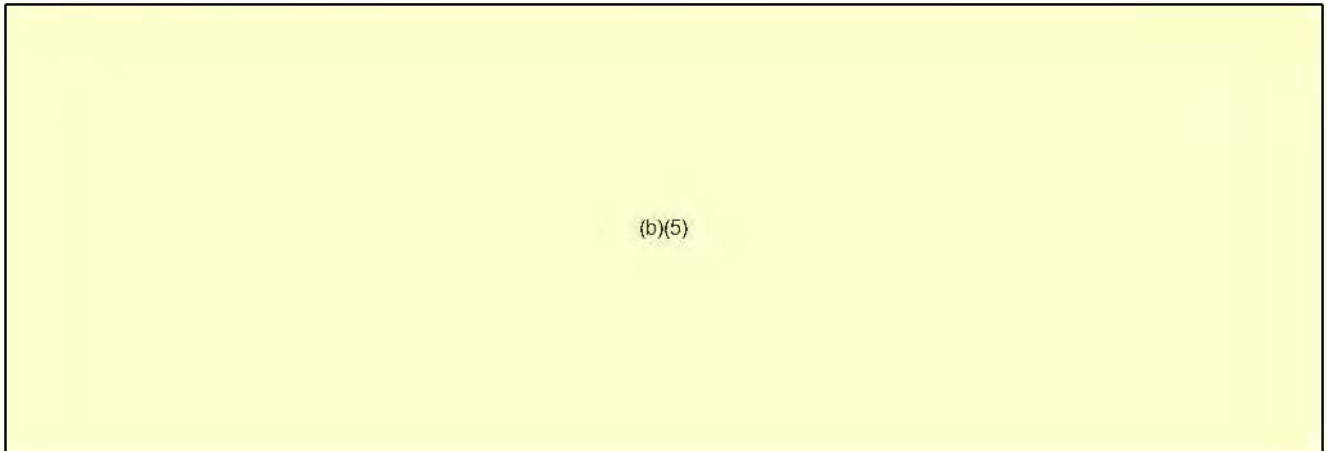

New CDC school opening guidelines fail to 'follow the science'

President Biden vowed to “[follow the science](#)” in an effort to get kids back to school. But that’s not what the [latest school opening guidelines](#) from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention do.

The two core pillars of the guidelines — that schools should decide whether to open based on community transmission and that students should strive to be spaced 6 feet apart — aren’t supported by science.

While there are many prudent recommendations in the document, these two demands will keep schools closed much longer than necessary, harming kids.

Should learning mode depend on community transmission levels?

The new school opening guidelines advise schools to open or close (or operate in “[hybrid mode](#)”) based on a four-tier color-coded system. Each color is tied to the number of new Covid-19 cases during the previous week. The red, or most restrictive category, is more than 100 cases a week per 100,000 people. By this metric, [more than 90%](#) of the country is currently in the most restrictive tier, ruling out full-time, in-person learning for elementary-aged students and any sort of in-person school for older children without screening tests.

Yet many schools in such communities already have in-person school — and have done so for months — without issue.

To justify this tiered approach, the CDC guidelines cite a “likely association” between community transmission levels and the risk of exposure in the schools. But the evidence for this is flimsy.

Ventilation should be part of the conversation on school reopening. Why isn't it?

The CDC relies almost exclusively on a [U.K. study](#) that examined Covid-19 cases and outbreaks — defined as two or more linked cases — in educational settings in England during June and July. The CDC summarizes the study by noting: “For every 5 additional cases per 100,000 population in regional incidence, the risk of a school outbreak increased by 72%.”

While technically true, that increase is the *relative* risk, which obscures the study's key finding about *absolute* risk: School outbreaks were vanishingly rare in this study — just 0.02% among schools that were open daily during this period — even in areas with high rates of community transmission. And if the CDC had looked at the next figure in the article, focusing on individual infections rather than outbreaks, no association was seen between the number of single infections in school and broader rates of community spread.

The CDC's school opening guidelines also ignore the experience of at least two U.S. states. Schools in [North Carolina](#) and [Wisconsin](#) were open during periods of high community transmission (red zone), and both saw far fewer cases in schools than outside of them. The Wisconsin study was published in *Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report*, the CDC's own journal. If the state had taken the CDC's advice, it never would have done the study in the first place. Moreover, if there is less viral spread in schools than in the community, we want them open precisely during periods of high community spread, when the comparative risks outside of school are highest.

Do schools drive the spread of Covid-19 in the larger community? The CDC guidelines cite two studies. One, using national data, found [no overall increase](#) in hospitalization in counties where schools opened this fall, relative to trends during the same period in areas where schools remained closed. For counties with the highest rates of Covid-19 spread when schools reopened, some estimates showed an increase in Covid-19 hospitalizations, but these effects were quite modest, on the order of 2% to 3% above baseline levels of hospitalization. Even if this difference is real, it is quite small and unlikely to overwhelm the health care system unless it is already at the breaking point.

A [second study](#), focused on Michigan and Washington, suggested that schools can contribute to transmission when existing case counts are high. But this analysis was vulnerable to a classic research problem of reverse causality: school reopening may have led to more frequent testing and detection of infections that would have otherwise gone unrecorded.

Put together, the available evidence offers little reason to believe that in-person learning is particularly risky to students, educators, or people in the community. We believe the [benefits of school](#) far outweigh these concerns, and this is especially true as vulnerable people get vaccinated.

Is 6-foot distancing really required?

The CDC guidelines say that schools should try to keep kids 6 feet apart. This guidance, however, appears to be based on [decades-old research](#) on the travel distance of large respiratory droplets.

The insistence on 6 feet was controversial from the start. One of the early skeptics was physician Rochelle Walensky, who was recently appointed to lead the CDC. She [advised her local school district](#) last summer that “it is quite safe and much more practical to be at 3 feet” as long as everyone is masked. (Three feet of distancing is also [recommended](#) by the World Health Organization.)

When asked to explain this about-face during a [recent interview with CNN](#), Walensky argued that the larger distance in the CDC guidance was justified by new research published since last summer and the increase in case counts since then.

The newest evidence actually seems to argue *against* requiring strict adherence to a 6-foot rule, however. First, it is [increasingly clear](#) that transmission of Covid-19 is not explained by the droplet model — the idea that bigger drops of secretion fall in the first few feet around someone, as [was thought](#) when

the [original social distancing guidelines](#) developed. Second, [a meta-analysis](#) on Covid-19 and other closely related coronaviruses showed that the benefits of increasing the distance from 3 to 6 feet is marginal in contexts where the risk of infection is low, as would be the case in a classroom with universal masking.

Most on point is a [recent study](#) that examined the dynamics of in-school transmission in Ohio. Working with seven school districts that offered in-person learning in late November and early December of last year, near the peak of daily recorded infections in the state, researchers identified all students and teachers who had tested positive. They then repeatedly tested both their close contacts — other students who were exposed for more than 15 minutes at a distance of less than 6 feet — as well as a comparison set of students who kept their distance, including several hundred attending other classes within the same school. The rates of infection among close contacts and students who stayed more than 6 feet away were nearly identical in both elementary and high schools, suggesting minimal value from strict adherence to a 6-foot distancing rule as long as masks are worn consistently and correctly. Three feet versus 6 might sound trivial, but it really matters. Given the limitation of classroom size, maintaining 6 feet of distance will thwart many schools from operating at full capacity, meaning that students would be able to attend part-time at best, using a hybrid model.

This requirement also complicates transportation. Although the main CDC guidance does not discuss transportation in detail, an [accompanying handout](#) advises districts to “skip a row if possible” on school buses. The busing constraint is particularly binding in large urban districts, where many students attend charter or magnet schools far away from their homes and rely on district-provided transportation.

Going backward on reopening

Rather than moving the ball forward on Biden’s goal of getting elementary and middle schools reopened as soon as possible, the new CDC guidelines will work to provide [political cover](#) for interest groups and districts that want to delay in-person school.

They also come when many states were acting to loosen their own guidelines to encourage schools to reopen. Just days before the CDC announcement, the state of Massachusetts [announced the elimination](#) of school bus capacity limits as long as bus windows remain open at least 2 inches. Nevada, which already allowed closer spacing on school buses, also [loosened its requirements](#) further. But, the new CDC guidelines would thwart these pragmatic efforts. The conflicting CDC guidance only creates confusion, putting districts in the difficult position of deciding whether to follow state or federal recommendations.

Most worrisome is that the stringent CDC criteria will likely increase pressure to reduce in-person learning in many places that have been operating at full capacity and with older students. As recent [test score data](#) from Ohio show, moving from in-person to hybrid formats will exacerbate learning losses, compounding the both the social and academic harms students have already experienced during the pandemic.

A truly science-based analysis must recognize the difficult tradeoffs involved — including the long-term of interests of children who are most directly affected — and carefully weigh modest increases in [Covid-19 infection risk to educators](#) and broader community members against the harms of school closures. By promoting slavish adherence to arbitrary benchmarks and distancing requirements, the new CDC school opening guidelines do a disservice to science and kids.

CDC director says schools can safely reopen without vaccinating teachers

Teachers do not need to get vaccinated against Covid-19 before schools can safely reopen, the head of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention said Wednesday.

"There is increasing data to suggest that schools can safely reopen and that safe reopening does not suggest that teachers need to be vaccinated," CDC Director Rochelle Walensky told reporters during a White House press briefing on Covid-19.

"Vaccinations of teachers is not a prerequisite for safely reopening schools," she added.

The CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices voted to put "frontline essential workers," which include teachers, next in line to receive a Covid-19 vaccine after first prioritizing health-care workers

and long-term care facility residents. However, it may take a while for most teachers to get their shots as U.S. officials work to pick up the pace of vaccinations.

Still, school systems across the U.S. have been under pressure to reopen after shifting to remote learning last year due to the coronavirus pandemic, which has infected more than 26.4 million Americans and killed at least 447,077 in a little over a year.

Some parents have been forced to stay at home to watch their children instead of going to work. Meanwhile, teachers and other faculty have expressed concerns about returning to school, potentially put their health at risk.

A study from the CDC published late last month found little evidence of the virus spreading at schools in the U.S. and abroad when precautions were taken, such as wearing masks, social distancing and ventilating rooms.

The Biden administration has released a Covid rescue plan that includes providing schools and universities \$170 billion to reopen. The money would be used in part to scale up testing. The administration has said testing is a "critical" strategy for controlling the spread of the virus, but added tests are still not widely available, and the U.S. is still not using the ones it has effectively.

Walensky has previously said that schools should be the first to open and the last to close in the pandemic.

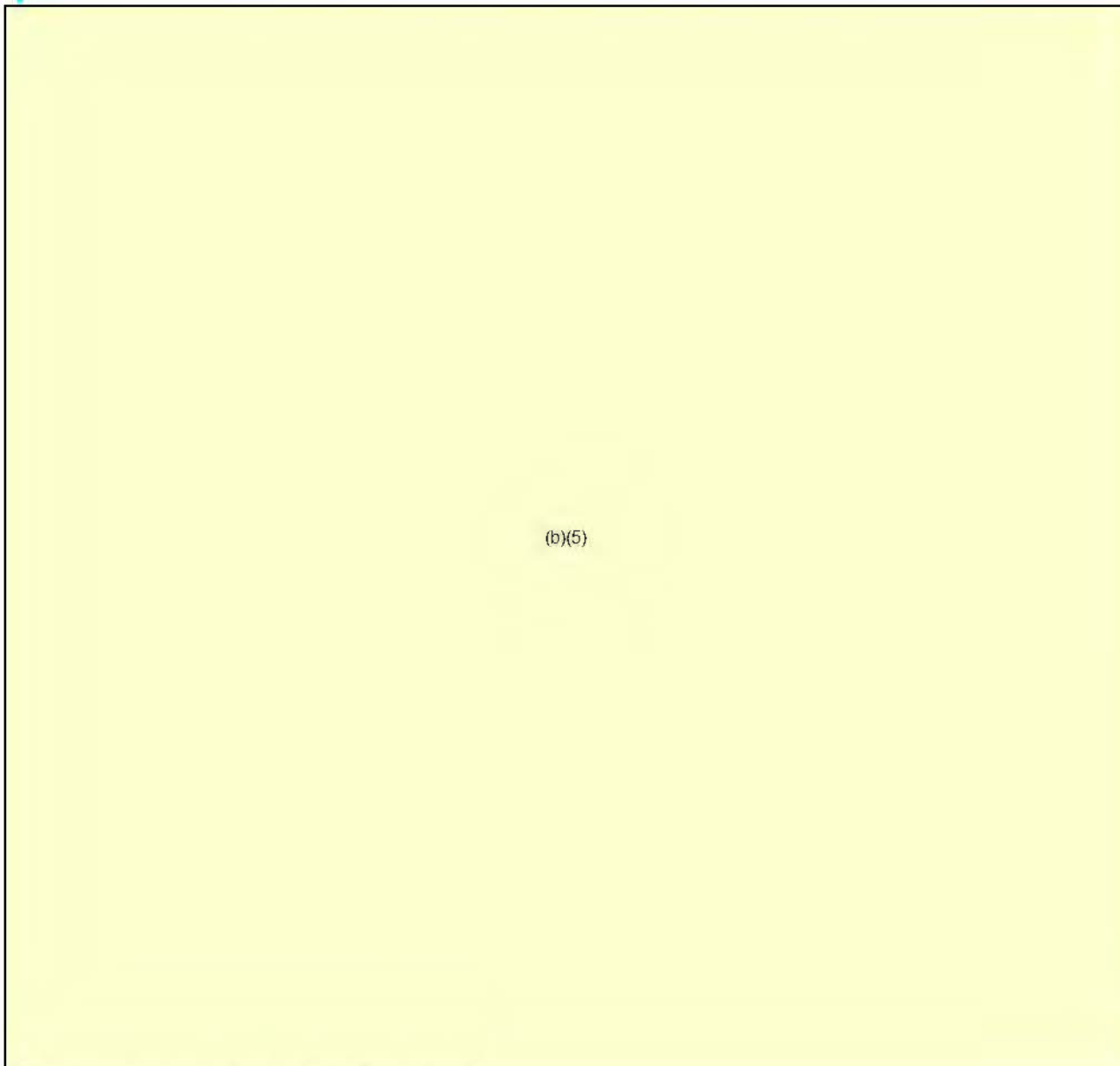
Jeff Zients, President Joe Biden's Covid-19 czar, said Wednesday that Biden has been "very clear" that he wants schools to "reopen and to stay open."

"That means every school has the equipment and the resources to open safely," he said during the press briefing, urging Congress to "do its part" by passing Biden's Covid rescue plan. "Not just private schools or schools in wealthy areas but all schools."

Who do voters trust on school reopenings? Parents and local officials.

Two-thirds of American voters say they trust parents the most when it comes to deciding whether or not to reopen schools during the Covid-19 pandemic this fall, according to a POLITICO/Morning Consult poll. Voters also highly value the opinions of local school officials and local teachers unions.

They are, however, split along party lines when it comes to trusting President Joe Biden's leadership on school reopenings. About 52 percent of registered voters said they trust Biden's decisions on bringing students back to in-person learning, with 86 percent of Democrats saying they trust the president on school reopening. But Biden's support collapses among Republican voters: A whopping 76 percent of GOP supporters said they don't trust Biden on school reopenings.

A fierce debate intensified last week after the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention issued [new guidelines on resuming face-to-face classes](#) at elementary and high schools. The push to resume face-to-face learning is laying bare the thorny [balancing act between science and politics](#),

and giving Republicans the sense they can weaponize the controversy to [turn frustrated parents against Biden and Democratic incumbents](#).

The latest polling, though, seems to reinforce the old adage that ‘all politics are local.’

The details: Sixty-six percent of voters said they have at least some trust in parent school reopening decisions, according to the online survey of close to 2,000 registered voters, while 24 percent said they don’t trust parents’ calls. Fifty-nine percent of voters said they trust school administrators, while 54 percent said they trust decisions from local school boards and teachers unions.

Sixty-eight percent of Democrats said they trust local teachers unions, compared with 41 percent of Republicans.

Mixed feelings on teacher vaccines: Overall, 35 percent of surveyed voters said states should prioritize teachers for vaccines so schools can reopen. Forty-eight percent, however, said older and at-risk Americans should get priority over teachers.

Still, 55 percent of voters suggested states should wait to reopen schools until teachers get the vaccine. Roughly a third of voters said states should instead reopen schools as soon as possible, even if teachers aren’t vaccinated.

Majorities of Democrats (74 percent) and independents (54 percent) said they wanted school reopenings to come after teacher vaccinations, while 55 percent of Republicans said states should reopen schools as soon as possible.

Other chatter: Fifty-seven percent of voters said it’s a good idea to reopen K-12 schools in the fall, while 51 percent said it was a good idea to open day care centers. When it comes to colleges and universities, 55 percent of voters said a fall return to campus was a good idea.

Close to half of voters now say virtual classes have been somewhat or very ineffective for students. Only 10 percent of polled voters said online instruction has been “very effective,” while another 32 percent said computerized courses have been “somewhat effective.”

The poll was conducted from February 12-15, and has a margin of error of plus or minus 2 percentage points.

E&C GOP Leaders to CDC Director: Parents Need Certainty. You Have an Obligation to Our Children to Follow the ‘Science and Truth.’

Washington, DC— Today, House Energy and Commerce Republican Leader Cathy McMorris Rodgers (R-WA), Republican Subcommittee Leader on Oversight and Investigations Morgan Griffith (R-VA), and Republican Subcommittee Leader on Health Brett Guthrie (R-KY) sent [this letter](#) to the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Director Rochelle P. Walensky.
