This letter responds to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Act (FOI/PA) requests dated July 23, 2016 and August 9, 2016, addressed to the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), Freedom of Information/Privacy Act Unit (SARF), seeking "copies of any and all records pertaining to NADDIS file #4960155; and DEA investigative C9-00-0083 etc., and copies of any and all records and documents pertaining to a letter from DEA mailed to James Kendrick at the Monroe County Jail informing him that the DEA was seizing the money taken from him at the time of his arrest, etc."

To fulfill your request, our office forwarded a copy of your request letters to the New York Field Division and the Asset Forfeiture Unit (OMA). Based upon all available information, we have determined that the New York Field Division and OMA are the DEA components that may have records responsive to you. As a result of the New York Field Divisions search, it has been determined that DEA investigative case file C9-00-0083 has been destroyed. Thus, the hard copy file does not exist. However, four (4) pages were obtained through the Electronic File Room at DEA Headquarters. As a result of OMA's search, 10 pages were located.

The processing of your request identified certain materials that will be released to you. Portions not released are being withheld pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552, and/or the Privacy Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552a. Please refer to the list enclosed with this letter that identifies the authority for withholding the deleted material, which is indicated by a mark appearing in the block next to the exemption. An additional enclosure with this letter explains these exemptions in more detail. The documents are being forwarded to you with this letter.


