OIC Funds Disbursement Protocol

The OIC shall maintain an approved vendor listing. New vendors shall be approved at OIC Leadership Team meetings. All expenditures shall be approved in advance by the Leadership Team, ideally at formal meetings. Expenditures arising between meetings may be approved by the Leadership Team through unanimous vote via email communication; the e-mail approval shall be noted in the meeting minutes at the next formal meeting.

Upon receipt of vendor invoices, the Treasurer shall execute a payment to the vendor. If the Treasurer is unavailable, payment may be issued by the OIC Chairperson. Payments in excess of \$1,000 must have the signatures of the Treasurer and the Chairperson. If either one is unavailable, the Vice Chairperson may provide the second signature.

The Treasurer and Chairperson shall have access to the bank account and related statements. The Secretary and City Liaison shall have deposit privileges and the Treasurer and Chairperson shall be limited to issuing payments.
