i agree that oakwood in various languages, healy's suggestion, is an interesting notion; now while i'm no dendrologist, even though i've admired my share of specimens from the arboreal world, i'm thinking that this might be a bit forced since oaks may not be native to the original localities of many languages. i'm wondering, as a variant, whether down the line we might consider not "oakwood" in various languages but "community," as i would wager that most if not all cultures and language groups have a word for community, and their variety (on a poster, or on a shirt) might raise lots of interesting questions about how community is envisioned and given written/cultural form in different cultures.

here's something to think about: if we go ahead with madeline's idea of a survey, out of that survey could come some pretty interesting information about what cultural groups/language groups actually do live in oakwood, so such a shirt/poster on the theme different spellings or variants on community could be along the lines of this is literally who we are in oakwood, this diverse range of folks from all over the world

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
