The Din Alternate type family should be the only type used to represent the OIC.

The Din Alternate is the standard fonts for the OIC brand identity. Consistency within these type styles will create a cohesive personality for the brand. They should never be distorted in any way.

All caps should only be used for headlines and subheadings and sentence case should be used for body copy.

IMPROPER USAGE

This page illustrates several unacceptable uses of the branding elements.



STRETCH/SQUASH
Don't change the ratio proportion



COLORS
Don't use non-brand colors



COLOR LOCKUP
Use only color pairings of orange, green, and blue



OUTLINE
Always use solid fill for logo



COMPOSITION
Don't move pieces around



BACKGROUND
Don't use on a conflicting background color

Maintaining visual consistency of the signature is vital to preserving the integrity and recognition of the brand. Always follow the graphic guidelines presented in this guide. None of the elements should be redrawn or altered in anyway.

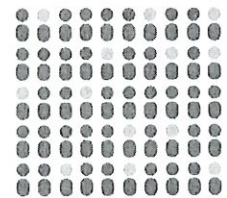
