Probable Cause:

Suspect Vehicle turned into Citgo Gas Station at Briggs and Washington without using Turn signal.
Stop made in Citgo lot and upon speaking with driver R/O smelled a Strong odor of burnt Cannabls.

Driver identified as Kinney by Illinois ID Card and unable to produce proof of insurance.

Kinney ran and it was determined that his Illinois Drivers License was Suspended.

Baggie containing 3 small baggies of white rock like substance consistent with crack cocaine and 1 baggie of Brown rock like substance consistent with Heroin recovered in drivers door.

Once at station another baggie containing 10 baggies of white rock like substance and 7 Brown rock like substance fell out of Kinney's crotch area when he went to use bathroom.

The 13 Baggies of white rock like substance weighed 7.90 grams and field tested positive for traces of cocaine.

The 8 Baggies of Brown rock like substance weighed 5.31 grams and field tested positive for traces of Heroin.

NARRATIVE

I, Officer Hunt # 163 interviewed Kinney, Keenan in regards to this case. Officer Shaughnessy # 164 was present for this interview also. I read Kinney his Miranda Rights at 1731 hours. Kinney waived his rights to counsel and stated the following. Kinney stated that he picked up Lurry, Eric from an apartment complex in Preston Heights near the corner of Pheasant Run & Chicago Street. Kinney stated that Lurry was standing outside waiting for him when he arrived today around 1500 hours. Kinney stated that Lurry asked him to go to the Speedway at 80 and Briggs to sell crack cocaine to a unknown male. Kinney stated that when they arrived at the Speedway he went inside the gas station to get something to drink while Lurry remained inside the car. Kinney stated that the unknown male that Lurry was selling crack cocaine to was driving a red car. Kinney stated that once Lurry sold the crack cocaine to the unknown male they left the area n/b on Briggs.

Kinney stated that then they were stopped by the Joliet Police Department. Kinney stated that the crack cocaine found inside the car in the front driver side door was his. Kinney stated that he bought a "zip" street term for ounce of crack cocaine from a male who he knows by "Doggie" 2 days ago for \$1200.00. Kinney stated that the drugs that was found under his genitals in the booking area was Heroin.

Kinney stated that Lurry swallowed crack cocaine which is why he became ill and was transported to the hospital during this incident.

NARRATIVE

Arrested and placed on a prisoner hold slip at Provina St. Joes hospital is Lurry, Eric D for 570/401 Delivery of a controlled substance, 5/31-1 Resisting/Obstructing a P.O.

I did hear Officer Wietting #245 effect a traffic stop with 2 occupants in the area of Briggs and Washington. I, along with my partner OFC. McCue #118, arrived on scene of Ofc. Wietting's stop.

While on scene myself and Officer McCue #118 did have contact with a subject later identified as Eric Lurry. Lurry was a passenger

on the traffic stop that Officer Wietting had effected. I did hear Officer Wietting advise that he had the driver in custody for driving while license suspended and Possession of a controlled substance.

Lurry was on scene and had been initially "patted" down by Officer McCue and did have a large quantity of money in both front pockets. Lurry was checked via LEADS for a valid ID to confirm his identity since he did not have one on his person. Dispatch did advise that Lurry was clear and Officer Wietting advised me that Lurry could leave the scene. Lurry did proceed to ask for a cell phone in the car which he described as a red iPhone. Lurry was given this phone and left the scene W/B on Washington from the traffic stop.

Officer Wietting did advise me that the subject which he had in custody was complaining that Lurry had taken his phone. Myself and Officer McCue proceeded to where Lurry was walking as he was still in eyesight of our location walking on the south side of the street just east of Hebbard St. Once we made contact with Lurry we did inform him that the driver of the vehicle advised us that the red phone taken from the vehicle belonged to the driver.

Lurry did produce the red iPhone and stated that it did not belong to him and agreed that it belonged to the driver of the vehicle and gave me the phone. I was then informed by Officer Wietting that we were to confiscate the money that Lurry had in his front pockets. I did advise Lurry that I was going to confiscate the money on his person and advised him that I was going to pat him down to which he complied and placed his hands on my squad.

I did remove a large amount of USC in different denominations from both of Lurry's front pant pockets. I then began a "pat down" of Lurry and did place my hand over his left inner thigh and did feel what was immediately apparent based on my experience as a plastic baggie containing a soft pliable substance. As I continued to feel the substance I did simultaneously hear Officer McCue say "hey don't go reaching" "get your hands out of your pants" and Lurry buried his right hand into his crotch area. Lurry was told to get his hands out of his pants and proceeded to turn around and dove towards the ground with now both of hands placed underneath his torso.

Myself and Officer McCue did advise Lurry several times to comply by placing his hands behind his back but continued to struggle with Officers. I did observe Lurry bury his face towards his hands while on the ground. Myself and Officer McCue were eventually able to get Lurry's hands behind his back and did place him into custody for obstructing a P.O. Lurry was placed into the rear of my police squad and the video/audio was turned on.

Officer McCue did drive the vehicle to the police station and we did advise that we had a subject in custody for obstructing. While driving to the police station I did check the monitor which shows the rear camera where Lurry was seated and did observe Lurry to be making chewing motions with his mouth but would stop when he observed me looking at him. Once at Joliet Police station Lurry refused to exit the vehicle and additional officers did assist in attempting to remove him from the back of the squad. I did advise officers on scene that I believed that Lurry had placed/had contraband in his mouth. While officers were attempting to remove Lurry from the squad we did recover various plastic baggies from his mouth containing a wet, white residue.

Lurry began to show the effects of the suspected contraband that he had placed in his mouth and became unresponsive. Officers on scene did immediately call for an ambulance to respond to the scene. Immediately after Officers were able to remove Lurry from the back of the squad first aid procedures were initiated. (see their follow ups for further).

Shortly afterwards JFD paramedics arrived on scene and Lurry was transported to Provena St, Joes Hospital for treatment. Officers did follow the ambulance to the hospital where it was later learned that staff had stabilized Lurry.

Once at the police station I did have the opportunity to review the in squad video which shows Lurry making several chewing motions time and time again prior to arriving at the police station.

Felony charges were approved by LT. Harrison. All evidence was turned over to Officer Hernandez #135 (see his follow up for further).

Narrative:

On 01/28/20, R/O responded to the area of Heberd and Washington St in reference to Ofc Tellez #311 and Ofc. McCue #118 requesting more units as a subject was actively resisting. When R/O arrived on scene, Ofc. Tellez #311 and Ofc. McCue #118 had advised that they had A/Lurry in the back of there squad and in custody and was en route to JPD for processing. R/O followed behind Ofc. Tellez #311 in case A/Lurry would start to resist/attempt to escape in the vehicle.

Upon arrival at JPD, Ofc. McCue #118 and Sgt May #56 attempted to have A/Lurry exit the vehicle in which A/Lurry was unresponsive. It was then when R/O grabbed the feet of A/Lurry and lifted him out of the vehicle onto the ground. At this time R/O could not feel a pulse checking the carotid artery on the left side of A/Lurry's neck. At this time R/O unhandcuffed A/Lurry and began CPR - chest compressions. A/Lurry would gasp for air. Ofc. Darcy #221 arrived on scene and checked for a pulse in which he stated he could feel a faint pulse. JFD then arrived on scene and the scene was turned over to JFD.

R/O then checked the rear of Ofc. Tellez #311 backseat which appeared to have two small clear plastic baggies chewed up. It appeared that A/Lurry attempted to swallow these items but was unsuccessful. These items were then given to Sgt May #56 as R/O rode in the ambulance with JFD to further assist with chest compressions.

NARRATIVE

*Reference associated Joliet Police Department Case #20-0001295 and 20-0001298 for further details.

On 01/28/2020, R/O Soustek received information from Confidential Source (C/S) 19-18 that A/ Ivan Davis was driving a red Buick to the Speedway located at 436 S. Briggs Street from 1119 New Lenox Road to purchase cocaine from an unknown suspect. R/O met with Lieutenant Harrison #39, Sergeant May #56, and Officers Campos #191, Hunt #163, Shaughnessy #164, Holman #330, and Steurer #295 to discuss tentative plans relative to the above information and the undercover surveillance / interdiction of any involved narcotics. After tentative plans were formulated, surveillance personnel relocated to the area of 1119 New Lenox Road.

At approximately 15:10 hrs., surveillance agents observed Davis leave the driveway of 1119 New Lenox Road driving a red Buick Lacrosse (IL "Z810235") driving northbound Briggs from New Lenox Road, and ultimately pull into the Speedway gas station and park at a gas pump. Surveillance Agents maintained constant, uninterrupted surveillance on Davis in the red Buick as Davis left 1119 New Lenox Road and drove to the Speedway. Davis was the only occupant of the Buick. Davis did not pump gas or otherwise conduct legitimate business at the gas station, only sitting in his vehicle at the gas pump. A short time later, a blue Mazda (IL "BQ48986") pulled into the Speedway parking lot and parked at a gas pump near Davis's red Buick. A male / black, later identified as A/ Kinney, Kenan (12/08/1987) exit the Mazda and walk into the Speedway gas station. Davis exited the Buick and approached the Mazda, completing a hand to hand transaction with the only other passenger of the Mazda, later identified as A/ Lurry, Eric (08/07/1982). Davis then returned to the red Buick, leaving the area southbound Briggs from the Speedway parking lot. Surveillance officers maintained constant, uninterrupted surveillance on Davis in the red Buick and Officers Holman and Steurer initiated a traffic stop on Davis in the red Buick. Davis fled in the vehicle back to 1119 New Lenox Road, refusing to stop for Officers Holman and Steurer. Davis then fled the vehicle on foot and threw an object, which was recovered on-scene and field tested positive as cocaine. Davis was subsequently taken into custody and transported to JPD Headquarters.

Meanwhile, R/O, and Officers Shaughnessy and Campos maintained constant, uninterrupted surveillance on A/ Lurry and A/ Kinney in the blue Mazda at the Speedway gas station. Kinney exited the Speedway and entered the driver's seat of the Mazda with Lurry in the front passenger seat. R/O, Campos, and Shaughnessy followed the blue Mazda containing Lurry and Kinney northbound Briggs from Speedway. The blue Mazda did not meet with any other persons or make any stops. Officer Weitting effected a traffic stop on the blue Mazda for failure to signal at the Citgo - 1600 E. Washington. Surveillance agents continued to maintain surveillance of the traffic stop. Officer Weitting identified the driver, Kinney and the front seat passenger, Lurry, who were still the only two occupants. With the observations of surveillance agents, along with the odor of cannabis emanating from the blue Mazda, Officer Weitting searched the vehicle and located crack cocaine in the driver's door, subsequently placing Kinney in custody. Lurry initially walked away from the traffic stop westbound Washington. Kinney advised Officer Weitting that Lurry had his phone and Kinney wanted it back. Meanwhile, R/O learned that Lurry had been allowed to walk away from the scene of the traffic stop and requested Officer Weitting to ask Officers Tellez and Mccue, who were on their way to retrieve the phone, to also re-approach Lurry about any

evidence of the drug transaction he may have on his person, i.e. drug proceeds in the form of United States Currency. When Officers Tellez and Mccue re-approached Lurry, a struggle ensued and Lurry was subsequently taken into custody. Please reference Officer Tellez and Mccue's reports for further. Located on Lurry's person was \$1,380.00 United States Currency, which was collected for seizure and entered into evidence. R/O completed the Preliminary Determination paperwork for seizure and Officer Sanchez #250 delivered Lurry his copy of the paperwork at St. Joseph Hospital. Also on Lurry's person were three cellular telephones, which R/O placed into evidence at JPD Headquarters. R/O also placed bloody plastic recovered from Lurry's mouth and the blue latex gloves used to handle it into evidence at JPD Headquarters. R/O also placed the AED pad wrapper that officers opened to use on Lurry into evidence at JPD Headquarters.

R/O and Officer Campos interviewed Davis at JPD Headquarters at approximately 17:55 hrs. after R/O advised Davis of his constitutional rights pursuant to Miranda in the presence of Officer Campos. Davis subsequently stated he arranged to meet "BJ", a male / black with the last name of Lurry at the Speedway. Davis stated he met with Lurry outside the blue Mazda and that the other occupant of the Mazda had gone into the Speedway. Davis stated he does not know the other male who went into the Speedway. Davis refused to speak further to R/O, answer any more questions, or make any more statements.

I overheard on the radio other units indicating that an arrestee was not breathing. At the same moment, SGT Collins came into the jail indicating he needed the AED. I made my way to the parking lot and found other officers rendering aid to the arrestee, identified as Eric D. Lurry. Lurry was laying on the ground and appeared unresponsive; Officer Ranstead was doing chest compressions on Lurry. I had Ranstead stop in order to assess Lurry's pulse. Lurry had a strong carotid pulse and had agonal breathing. Lurry's pupils were normal size, equal size, and were slow to react. I used my stethoscope to assess Lurry's breath sounds; I could hear clear lung sounds from Lurry. Lurry stayed unresponsive and appeared to have a seizure. JFD medics arrived on scene and took over care of Lurry.

NARRATIVE

On 01/28, I supervised Officers from the Narcotics Unit and Patrol with the surveillance and eventual arrests of 4 subjects through the course of a drug transaction that took place at the Speedway Gas Station at 436 S. Briggs St. I was riding with Sgt. May and observed a hand to hand drug transaction occur between the driver of a red Buick LaCrosse and the passenger of a blueish/purple colored Mazda. After the transaction occurred, we followed the red Buick s/b on Briggs until Officers Steurer and Holman were able to observe it. I then assisted with the scene of the traffic stop at 1119 New Lenox Rd. (20-001295, 20-001298).

While leaving the scene at New Lenox Rd., I overheard sector 14 (Officers Tellez and McCue) asking for assistance in the 1500 block of Washington St. I previously knew that Officer Wietting had stopped the Mazda at Briggs and Washington St. and had a subject in custody for Possession of a Controlled Substance and Driving While License Suspended. Based on that, I thought that sector 14 was struggling with Wietting's arrestee. Sgt. May and I arrived at JPD and we waited for sector 14 to arrive to gather the particulars of the arrest and as to why they needed assistance. When sector 14 arrived, I stood off to the north and observed and overheard Officer McCue trying to get the arrestee, Lurry, out of the squad car. I could see the arrestee and immediately recognized him as Lurry from numerous prior contacts. I spoke out to Lurry, called him by his first name (Eric) and told him to get out of the car. I could see Lurry blinking oddly and his mouth opening and shutting almost as if he was trying to swallow.

It was apparent that Lurry was not going to exit the squad car. At that time, I could not tell if Lurry was feigning illness or suffering from a medical emergency so I told Sgt. May to go to the other side and try and assist getting Lurry out of the car. I started to walk around the squad car to assist Sgt. May and could hear him say that he could see a bag in Lurry's mouth. At that time, I felt that it was a medical emergency to get the bag out of Lurry's mouth as it, based on my experience, had contained narcotics and was also a potential breathing obstruction. Lurry's mouth was partially open and I requested that someone (meaning any Officer with access) get something to prop his mouth open and pull the bag out. I advised to use an asp baton or flash light, if necessary, just in case Lurry regained consciousness and bit down so as not to injure the Officer trying to retrieve the bag.

Officers were able to remove portions of a plastic bag from Lurry's mouth and during this time, Sgt. May advised that Lurry was not breathing. I immediately got on the radio requesting an ambulance for a arrested subject that had injected narcotics and did not appear to be breathing. I also requested that Sgt. Collins retrieve an AED. Lurry was immediately removed from the squad car, unhandcuffed and CPR was being administered by Officer Ranstead. Quickly after, Lurry began breathing and had a pulse. As JFD arrived, I could observe Lurry having what I would describe as a violent seizure on the ground. JFD began administering aid and transported Lurry to St. Joe's Hospital.

I advised Deputy Chief Reid of the situation and went to check on the status of Lurry. I was advised by hospital staff that Lurry was breathing and had a good blood pressure. I was advised that he was going to have a CT scan and then transferred to the ICU.

I left St. Joe's and returned to JPD where I took custody of evidence that Officer Hernandez #135 had secured from Lurry. I brought the evidence to the JNU office where I visually inspected the large portion of the plastic bag to see if I could retrieve any narcotics. I observed smear marks on the bag as well as small brownish remnants of a substance but did not test it as I did not want to waste any potential evidence during the field test process. I observed that the currency recovered was in 3 stacks and counted them as \$1000, \$120 and \$260. There were also 3 cellular phones recovered as well. I had the case agent, Officer Soustek, take custody of the items to later place into evidence.

On 01/28/20, this officer met with OFC Wietting in the evidence lab in reference to a chemical field test of various small baggies containing a white rock like substance and also a brown rock like substance. One total bag weighed 1.76 grams. The other bag weighed 10.10 grams that was a mixed variance. Upon separating the bags, there were a total of 13 small white baggies containing a rock like substance, and eight small baggies containing a brown rock like substance.

This officer then did test each one of the bags. They tested positive for the presence of cocaine and the presence of heroin. Testing was performed with a VOLTOX testing kit to test for cocaine, which tested positive. Also a Sirchie NIK kit was used to test for the presence of heroin on the brown like substance, which tested positive.

All items were given back to OFC Wietting, to be placed into evidence and forwarded to the Illinois State Police crime lab.

NARRATIVE:

Myself, along with other Joliet Narcotic Unit officers, were conducting narcotics operations in the area of Briggs Street, north of I-80, reference CR #20-0001295. It should be noted that Lurry was a passenger in a vehicle that was stopped by OFC Wietting #245 in reference to this investigation. It should be noted that I was not on the scene at Washington and Briggs, that I was at 1119 New Lenox Road. I was riding with LT Harrison #39, and we did overhear some type of radio traffic that sounded like a subject from the traffic stop that OFC Weitting stopped had attempted to escape or was fighting with police officers at that location.

Myself and LT Harrison returned to the Joliet Police Department, at which time we learned that OFC Tellez and his recruit OFC McCue #118 had transported A/Lurry. Myself and LT Harrison were at the JPD when OFC Tellez pulled up. OFC McCue attempted to ask Lurry to step out of the vehicle, at which time it appeared that he was being very uncooperative, with OFC McCue advising Lurry to get out of the squad car or he would be pulled out. It should be noted he was doing this on the passenger side of the vehicle.

I went to the driver's side rear in an attempt to assist OFC McCue at extracting Lurry out of the vehicle. It appeared that he was being uncooperative, and in my mind was attempting to feign being unresponsive. It should be noted that I used vulgar language due to Lurry not responding to us. I attempted to stun Lurry in his shoulder area in an attempt to get him to be responsive and comply. I ultimately ended up striking Lurry with an open hand about the head. I put my hand up on Lurry's neck and jaw, and it appeared Lurry was attempting to conceal what I believed to be narcotics in his mouth, at which time I pinched Lurry's nose in an attempt to get him to open his mouth. It should be noted, at the time that I pinched Lurry's nose, my hand was not on or near Lurry's throat. In my experience this has been very successful in getting arrestees who are attempting to conceal narcotics in their mouth to open their mouth, due to having a hard time breathing.

Ultimately Lurry did open his mouth and McCue was able to extract several plastic bags from his mouth. It should be noted, upon Lurry opening his mouth I smelled what I know to be the smell of cocaine coming from his mouth area. This is due to my training experience in the field of narcotics.

While in the back of the squad car while attempting to extract Lurry, Lurry became what I believed to be unresponsive. Once it was determined that he was having a medical emergency, I immediately asked other officers on the scene to extract Lurry. It should be noted that Lurry was handcuffed behind his back and is a very big man. Myself, OFC McCue, and OFC Ranstead assisted Lurry in getting him out of the back of the car. He appeared to be having a medical emergency. It should be noted that I was worried about Lurry having a choking hazard in his mouth, which is another reason why we wanted to extract the items from his oral cavity.

Officers got Lurry on his back, unhandcuffed him, and OFC Ranstead immediately began giving Lurry CPR, and began giving him chest compressions. I told SGT Collins to go get the AED and advised LT Harrison to call for an ambulance due to me believing that Lurry was in medical distress.

OFC Darcy arrived on the scene, who has additional first aid experience. OFC Darcy told me he felt a pulse, at which time OFC Ranstead paused chest compressions. It was shortly after that JFD arrived and began giving medical attention to

This officer was notified by Joliet Narcotic Unit(JNU) OFC Soustek reference to a narcotics transaction that was being perpetrated at the Speedway at Briggs and Washington Streets. This officer was asked to go to the area in reference to getting probable cause to stop a vehicle that would be leaving the area. OFC Soustek did advise this officer that he wished this officer to follow a blue Mazda, IL registration #BQ48986, and possibly develop probable cause to pull same over to identify the occupants of said vehicle.

R/O did follow the vehicle southbound on Briggs Street. When the vehicle came to the Citgo gas station on Briggs and Washington Street, it did turn into the parking lot without signaling. The vehicle then proceeded out towards Washington Street and then turned back northbound towards the building, at which time this officer activated his overhead lights and conducted a stop on the same.

On approach to the vehicle, the driver did roll down the window, at which time this R/O could smell a very strong odor of burnt cannabis coming from inside the vehicle. At this time the driver was asked for his driver's license and proof of insurance. He did produce an Illinois temporary identification card and an expired insurance card.

R/O then asked the front seat passenger if he had identification, to which he replied he did not. He did tell this officer that his last name was Lurry, Eric D., male black DOB 08/07/82, and that he lived at 202 Luanna, Joliet.

At this time, R/O did return to his squad car and run both subjects. R/O did determine that Kenan Kinney, the driver, had a suspended license. Lurry did come back with a valid Illinois license. At this time, R/O returned to the car and asked Kinney why he was driving if his license was suspended, to which he replied "I just left". R/O also asked him if he had any more cannabis in the vehicle, as R/O could smell it, at which time he related no. Kinney was asked to step from the vehicle, at which time he was searched by R/O and told to stand behind the vehicle. It should be noted, other officers on the scene were asked to get Lurry out of the vehicle.

At this time, R/O did conduct a search of the vehicle, at which time he did locate in the driver's door a space made by the manufacturer. On top of other items in there was a baggie directly on top. Inside this baggie were three white rock like substances that were individually bagged in plastic baggies consistent with crack cocaine, and a small baggie containing a brown rock like substance consistent with heroin. These items were recovered. At this time R/O did go back, handcuff Kinney, and had OFC Struna place him in the rear of R/O's squad car.

At this time, R/O asked the other officer to search the other subject, as R/O had located narcotics in the vehicle. R/O did return to the vehicle and continue searching same, which met with negative results for further contraband. In speaking with JNU OFC Soustek, R/O asked if they had anything on the subject. At the time he replied not yet. R/O then asked OFC Tellez if they had searched the subject, to which he replied yes. At this time the subject was allowed to go.

R/O was then being called by Kinney, who was in his back seat, who informed R/O that Lurry had walked off with his cell phone, and asked R/O to retrieve it from him. R/O asked OFC Tellez and his partner to retrieve my driver's cell phone from Lurry, who was now walking westbound on Washington Street, west of Briggs. See OFC Tellez's follow up for further information.

While still on the scene, R/O was asked by JNU OFC Soustek if Lurry had cash on him, to which R/O replied he didn't know because he didn't search the subject. He then replied that if those officers were going to stop him, if the subject did have any cash on him, if the officers could confiscate same for seizure. R/O did call OFC Tellez over the radio and ask him to give R/O a phone call, at which time he did relay the information to OFC Tellez. OFC Struna did complete a tow sheet on the vehicle and a hold was placed on same for subsequent seizure pursuant to the cannabis controlled substance act.

R/O did proceed to JPD with Kinney. Kinney was issued citations for driving while license suspended, no insurance, and failure to signal a turn. It should be noted that while in the car, Kinney kept responding that he had to take a crap. Kinney was told he would have to hold it until we got to the station. Once at the station, Kinney was brought into the JPD and again searched. Kinney kept demanding to use the bathroom. R/O told him due to the fact that officers had recovered drugs and that his passenger Lurry had apparently attempted to swallow some drugs while in OFC Tellez's squad car, that R/O could not let him go in the bathroom alone. R/O did grab OFC Holman and asked him to come to the door of the jail cell.

R/O did proceed inside of the jail cell with Kinney. Kinney was told that if he had to go to the bathroom, he could feel free to drop his pants and go. He asked if R/O was going to watch. R/O informed him he was going to stay in the room while he went to the bathroom. At this time, R/O told him if he had to go to the bathroom, go ahead and drop your pants, at which time Kinney dropped his pants and a plastic baggie containing several small individual baggies fell out of his underwear as he pulled them down on to the floor. R/O did kick the item out of the cell and Kinney related "you can't blame me for trying to flush it". Kinney was asked if he needed to go to the bathroom, at which time he said no. He was told to pull up his pants. At this time he was taken out of the jail cell and sat on the bench in the booking area.

JNU officers did come down and get Kinney. Upon recovering the baggie that Kinney had dropped, inside same there were ten individual plastic baggies containing a white rock like substance consistent with crack cocaine, and also seven brown individually wrapped baggies containing a brown rock like substance consistent with heroin.

R/O did proceed to the JPD Evidence Section, where he did meet with Evidence Tech Austin. Evidence Tech Austin did weigh the first baggie that R/O had recovered in the door which contained three white baggies and one brown baggie. This item did weigh 1.76 grams. The larger baggie containing the 17 individually wrapped baggies weighed in at 10.08 grams. The items were separated and tested. The 13 white rock like substances did test positive for traces of cocaine and did weigh in at 7.90 grams. The brown individually wrapped baggies did test positive for traces of heroin and did weight 5.31 grams. The 13 rock like substances were placed in an envelope and sealed as Item #1. The brown individual baggies were placed in an envelope as Item #2. \$157 US Currency, which was recovered from Kinney, was placed into evidence as Item #3 under this CR, and placed into evidence locker #9 at the Joliet Police Evidence section.

It should be noted, on returning the jail, R/O did speak with LT Harrison of the JNU, who did advise this officer to also put Kinney's cell phone into evidence. R/O was in the jail under CR#200128001295 and was looking for Sgt. May who was last thought to be in the jail.

I spoke with Officer Holman and asked him if he saw Sgt. May. He told me Sgt. May was not in the jail but was believed to be outside the jail. R/O went through the jail, through the Sally Port, to locate Sgt. May to discuss the charges under Officer 295 and Officer 330 arrest. While I exited the Sally Port from the jail my attention was turned to a Joliet Police Department vehicle that was right outside the Sally Port facing the Sally Port parked in a booking spot.

I heard Sgt. May who was located at the driver side rear door telling the officers, who were located on the passenger side rear door, to get him out of the squad. At that point, R/O started to walk towards the squad when I overheard Lt. Harrison ask on the radio for an ambulance to be dispatched to the jail. As I approached the vehicle Sgt. May came around to the passenger side of the vehicle, looked at me, and told me to go get an AED.

At that point, R/O went back into the jail via the Sally Port and I retrieved the AED that was in the jail. R/O then exited the jail through the Sally Port.

When I exited the Sally Port and brought the AED, I observed Officer Ranstead #176 giving CPR doing compressions on a subject that was laying next to the squad. I also observed Officer D'Arcy helping rendering aid, checking for a pulse and breathing. I advised Officer D'Arcy and Officer Ranstead that I had the AED and that it was available if needed.

I also noticed a larger bag laying next to the subject that was on the ground that we were rendering aid to. This bag was the bag that was coughed up and retrieved from the subject's mouth. While on the scene one of the officers did retrieve that item for evidentiary purposes. I did observe the subject that we were rendering aid to cough a couple of times and overheard Officer D'Arcy said that he did have a slight pulse, right prior to JFD arriving, also I did observe the subject going into what I would describe as some type of seizure. Shortly after this seizure, JFD arrived and the subject was then transferred onto a COT and into JFD ambulance.

 Narrative: R/O was in the jail under CR#200128001295 and was looking for Sgt. May who was last thought to be in the jail.

I spoke with Officer Holman and asked him if he saw Sgt. May. He told me Sgt. May was not in the jail but was believed to be outside the jail. R/O went through the jail, through the Sally Port, to locate Sgt. May to discuss the charges under Officer 295 and Officer 330 arrest. While I exited the Sally Port from the jail my attention was turned to a Joliet Police Department vehicle that was right outside the Sally Port facing the Sally Port parked in a booking spot.

I heard Sgt. May who was located at the driver side rear door telling the officers, who were located on the passenger side rear door, to get him out of the squad. At that point, R/O started to walk towards



the squad when I overheard Lt. Harrison ask on the radio for a ambulance to be dispatched to the jail. As I approached the vehicle Sgt. May came around to the passenger side of the vehicle, looked at me, and told me to go get a AED.

At that point, R/O went back into the jail via the Sally Port and I retrieved the AED that was in the jail. R/O then exited the jail through the Sally Port.

When I exited the Sally Port and brought the AED, I observed Officer Ranstead #176 giving CPR doing compressions on a subject that was laying next to the squad. I also observed Officer D'Arcy helping rendering aid, checking for a pulse and breathing. I advised Officer D'Arcy and Officer Ranstead that I had the AED and that it was available if needed.

I also noticed a larger bag laying next to the subject that was on the ground that we were rendering aid to. This bag was the bag that was coughed up and retrieved from the subjects mouth. While on the scene one of the officers did retrieve that item for evidentiary purposes. I did observe the subject that we were rendering aid to cough a couple of times and overheard Officer D'Acry said that he did have a slight pulse, right prior to JFD arriving, also I did observe the subject going into what I would describe as some type of seizure. Shortly after this seizure, JFD arrived and the subject was then transferred onto a COT and into JFD ambulance.

Upon arrival, this officer was met with one of the family members identified as the victim's mother which she did not identify herself by name. She repeatedly asked me why I was there to take pictures of her son. I then stated that I was there to assist the coroner, to take photographs for crime scene procedure. I told the family member this, she then turned to Sergeant Sepulveda and said you have a white shirt on I'll talk to you and proceeded to ask Sergeant Sepulveda the same question.

Upon arrival of Deputy Coroner Rachel O'Neill, this officer then did assist her with entering the room and taking photographs with a Nikon D500 digital camera of the deceased victim. This officer took minimal pictures due to the fact that the family member identified as the mother was upset with this officer. She did request all three of the officer's on scene names and badge numbers which we did provide on a written piece of paper which was provided by her. Upon completion of taking the photographs, this officer then did exit the hospital and report back to the Joliet Police Department and placed the photographs into Evidence.

Narrative: This officer was notified by Joliet Narcotic Unit (JNU) OFC Soustek in reference to a narcotics transaction that was being perpetrated at the Speedway at Briggs and Washington Streets. This officer was asked to go to the area in reference to getting probable cause to stop a vehicle that would be leaving the area. OFC Soustek did advise this officer that he wished this officer to follow a blue Mazda, IL registration #BQ48986, and possibly develop probable cause to pull same over to identify the occupants of said vehicle.

R/O was notified by Soustek that the vehicle was leaving N/B on Briggs and R/O pulled out behind same at Fourth Ave.

R/O did follow the vehicle Northbound on Briggs Street.

When the vehicle came to the Citgo gas station on Briggs and Washington Street, it did turn into the parking lot without signaling.

The vehicle then proceeded out towards Washington Street and then turned back northbound towards the building, at which time this officer pulled in behind same activated his overhead lights and conducted a stop on the same.

On approach to the vehicle, the driver did roll down the window, at which time this R/O could smell a very strong odor of burnt cannabis coming from inside the vehicle. At this time the driver was asked for his driver's license and proof of insurance. He did produce an Illinois temporary identification card identifying him as Kinney and an expired insurance card.

R/O then asked the front seat passenger if he had identification, to which he replied he did not. He did tell this officer that his last name was Lurry, Eric D., DOB 08/07/82, and that he lived at 202 Luanna, Joliet.

At this time, R/O did return to his squad car and run both subjects. R/O did determine that Kenan Kinney, the driver, had a suspended license.

His License was Suspended on 05/10/12 for T3-707(c)1.



Lurry did come back with a valid Illinois license.

At this time, R/O returned to the car and asked Kinney why he was driving if his license was suspended, to which he replied "I just left".

R/O also asked him if he had any more cannabis in the vehicle, as R/O could smell it, at which time he related no.

Kinney was asked to step from the vehicle, at which time he was pat searched by R/O and told to stand behind the vehicle.

Ofc. Mitchell and Tellez were asked to get Lurry the passenger out of the vehicle.

R/O did conduct a search of the vehicle, and did locate in the driver's door a space made by the manufacturer. On top of other items in there was a baggie directly on top. Inside this baggie were three white rock like substances that were individually bagged in plastic baggies consistent with crack cocaine, and a small baggie containing a brown rock like substance consistent with heroin.

These items were secured by R/O.

R/O did go back, handcuff Kinney, and searched him and had OFC Struna place him in the rear of R/O's squad car.

R/O asked the other officer's to search the other subject (Lurry), as R/O had located drugs in the vehicle.

R/O did return to the vehicle and continue searching same, which met with negative results for further contraband.

In speaking with JNU OFC Soustek, R/O asked if they had anything on the Lurry and he replied not yet.

R/O then asked OFC Tellez if they had searched the subject, to which they replied yes.

Lurry was allowed to leave the scene walking westbound.

R/O was then being called by Kinney, who was in his back seat of R/O's squad, who informed R/O that Lurry had walked off with his cell phone, and asked R/O to retrieve it from him.

R/O asked OFC Tellez and his partner to retrieve my driver's cell phone a red I-Phone from Lurry, who was now walking westbound on Washington Street, west of Briggs. See OFC Tellez's follow up for further information.

While still on the scene, R/O was asked by JNU OFC Soustek if Lurry had cash on him, to which R/O replied he didn't know because he didn't search the subject.

Ofc Soustek asked R/O that if those officers were going to stop him, if the subject did have any cash on him, if the officers could confiscate same for seizure. R/O did call OFC Tellez over the radio and ask him to give R/O a phone call, at which time he did relay the information to OFC Tellez.

OFC Struna did complete a tow sheet on the vehicle and a hold was placed on same for subsequent seizure pursuant to the controlled substance act.

Kinney was issued citations for driving while license suspended, no insurance, and failure to signal a turn.

R/O then proceeded to JPD with Kinney.

It should be noted that while in the car, Kinney kept responding that he had to take a crap. Kinney was



told he would have to hold it until we got to the station.

On arrival at JPD R/O made contact with Sgt. May and Lt. Harrison who were outside the booking area and who informed R/O that Lurry had likely swallowed some drugs and was enroute to the hospital.

Kinney was brought into the JPD and again searched.

Kinney kept asking to use the bathroom as he had to take a shit.

R/O told him due to the fact that officers had recovered drugs in his vehicle and that his passenger Lurry had apparently attempted to swallow some drugs while in OFC Tellez's squad car, that R/O could not let him go in the bathroom alone. R/O did ask for OFC Holman to assist and asked him to come to the door of the jail cell.

R/O did proceed inside of the jail cell with Kinney.

Kinney was told that if he had to go to the bathroom, he could feel free to drop his pants and go.

He asked if R/O was going to watch. R/O informed him he was going to stay in the room while he went to the bathroom.

R/O told him if he had to go to the bathroom as bad as he claimed, go ahead and drop your pants, at which time Kinney dropped his pants and a plastic baggie containing several small individual baggies fell out of his underwear, as he pulled them down, on to the floor.

R/O did kick the item out of the cell and Kinney related "you can't blame me for trying to flush it".

Ofc, Holman did recover the baggie and turned same over to R/O once he was out of the cell and Kinney was secured on the bench.

Kinney was asked if he needed to go to the bathroom, at which time he said no.

He was told to pull up his pants and he was escorted out of the jail cell and sat on the bench in the booking area.

Upon recovering the baggie that Kinney had dropped, inside same there were ten individual plastic baggies containing a white rock like substance consistent with crack cocaine, and also seven brown individually wrapped baggies containing a brown rock like substance consistent with heroin.

Kinney was taken to be interviewed by JNU Officers.

R/O did proceed to the JPD Evidence Section, where he did meet with Evidence Tech Austin.

Evidence Tech Austin did weigh the first baggie that R/O had recovered in the door of the vehicle which contained three white baggies and one brown baggie. This item did weigh 1.76 grams.

The larger baggie containing the 17 individually wrapped baggies weighed in at 10.08 grams.

The items were separated and tested.

The 13 white rock like substances did test positive for traces of cocaine and did weigh in at 7.90 grams.

The brown individually wrapped baggies did test positive for traces of heroin and did weight 5.31 grams.

The 13 white rock like substances were placed in an envelope and sealed as Item #1.

The brown individual baggies were placed in an envelope and sealed as Item #2.

\$157 US Currency, which was recovered from Kinney pocket, was placed into evidence as Item #3 under this CR, and all items were placed into evidence locker #9 at the Joliet Police Evidence section.

On returning the jail, R/O did speak with LT Harrison of JNU, who did advise this officer to also put



Kinney's cell phone into evidence.

That item was later placed into evidence under Item #6 under this same CR.

R/O did complete Notice and Petition of Preliminary Determination Hearing for the blue 2015 Mazda which Kinney was driving, and the \$157 US Currency that he did possess at the time of his arrest. Kinney was given copies of both forms.

Kinney was returned to the jail, at which time he was booked and transported to the Will County Jail by OFC Darcy and his partner.

NARRATIVE:

Myself, along with other Joliet Narcotic Unit officers, were conducting narcotics operations in the area of Briggs Street, north of I-80, reference CR #20-0001295. It should be noted that Lurry was a passenger in a vehicle that was stopped by OFC Wietting #245 in reference to this investigation. It should be noted that I was not on the scene at Washington and Briggs, that I was at 1119 New Lenox Road. I was riding with LT Harrison #39, and we did overhear some type of radio traffic that sounded like a subject from the traffic stop that OFC Weitting stopped had attempted to escape or was fighting with police officers at that location.

Myself and LT Harrison returned to the Joliet Police Department, at which time we learned that OFC Tellez and his recruit OFC McCue #118 had transported A/Lurry. Myself and LT Harrison were at the JPD when OFC Tellez pulled up. OFC McCue attempted to ask Lurry to step out of the vehicle, at which time it appeared that he was being very uncooperative, with OFC McCue advising Lurry to get out of the squad car or he would be pulled out. It should be noted he was doing this on the passenger side of the vehicle.



I went to the driver's side rear in an attempt to assist OFC McCue at extracting Lurry out of the vehicle. It appeared that he was being uncooperative, and in my mind was attempting to feign being unresponsive. It should be noted that I used vulgar language due to Lurry not responding to us. I attempted to stun Lurry in his shoulder area in an attempt to get him to be responsive and comply. I ultimately ended up striking Lurry with an open hand about the head. I put my hand up on Lurry's neck and jaw, and it appeared Lurry was attempting to conceal what I believed to be narcotics in his mouth, at which time I pinched Lurry's nose in an attempt to get him to open his mouth. It should be noted, at the time that I pinched Lurry's nose, my hand was not on or near Lurry's throat. In my experience this has been very successful in getting arrestees who are attempting to conceal narcotics in their mouth to open their mouth, due to having a hard time breathing.

Ultimately Lurry did open his mouth and McCue was able to extract several plastic bags from his mouth. It should be noted, upon Lurry opening his mouth I smelled what I know to be the smell of cocaine coming from his mouth area. This is due to my training experience in the field of narcotics.

While in the back of the squad car while attempting to extract Lurry, Lurry became what I believed to be unresponsive. Once it was determined that he was having a medical emergency, I immediately asked other officers on the scene to extract Lurry. It should be noted that Lurry was handcuffed behind his back and is a very big man. Myself, OFC McCue, and OFC Ranstead assisted Lurry in getting him out of the back of the car. He appeared to be having a medical emergency. It should be noted that I was worried about Lurry having a choking hazard in his mouth, which is another reason why we wanted to extract the items from his oral cavity.

Officers got Lurry on his back, unhandcuffed him, and OFC Ranstead immediately began giving Lurry CPR, and began giving him chest compressions. I told SGT Collins to go get the AED and advised LT Harrison to call for an ambulance due to me believing that Lurry was in medical distress.

OFC Darcy arrived on the scene, who has additional first aid experience. OFC Darcy told me he felt a pulse, at which time OFC Ranstead paused chest compressions. It was shortly after that JFD arrived and began giving medical attention to Lurry. See OFC Wietting's original in reference to further.

Upon separating the bags, there were a total of 13 small white baggies containing a rock like substance, and eight small baggies containing a brown rock like substance.

This officer then did test each one of the bags. They tested positive for the presence of cocaine and the presence of heroin. Testing was performed with a VOLTOX testing kit to test for cocaine, which tested positive. Also a Sirchie NIK kit was used to test for the presence of heroin on the brown like substance, which tested positive. The examination is performed at the Will County Coroner's Morgue Facility, Crest Hill, Illinois, under the authority of Coroner Patrick K. O'Neil.

EXTERNAL EXAMINATION:

The body is received clothed in a hospital gown. No clothing accompanies the body.

The body is that of an adult black male weighing 316 pounds, measuring 6 feet 2 inches in length, and appearing the stated age of 37 years. The body is cold to touch. Rigor mortis is present to an equal extent in all joints. Postmortem lividity is well developed in the posterior dependent portions of the body.

The hair is brown with gray and short. On the face, there are multiple scars, measuring 0.3 inches in greatest dimension. The eyes are closed. The corneas are cloudy. The irises are brown. The earlobes are pierced once bilaterally. The skeleton of the nose is intact. The lips and frenula display no abnormalities. The teeth are natural and reveal poor dentition. There is a brown with gray beard and mustache. The neck is symmetrical.

On the right side of the chest, there is a tattoo of a multi-patterned design. On the left side of the chest, there is a tattoo of a multi-patterned design. On the chest and abdomen, there are multiple scars, measuring 0.2 inches in greatest dimension. The chest and abdomen are symmetrical. The external genitalia are normal male and circumcised.

The fingernails are long and dirty. On the anterior right forearm, there is a tattoo of a multi-patterned design. On the posterolateral right upper arm, there is a tattoo of a multi-patterned

design. On the posteromedial right upper arm, there is a tattoo of letters. About the right forearm, wrist, and hand, there are multiple scars, measuring 1.7 inches in greatest dimension. On the lateral left shoulder, there is a tattoo of a multi-patterned design. On posterior left upper arm, there is a tattoo of a "B". On the posteromedial left forearm, there is a tattoo of the name "Nicole". On the anterior left forearm, there is a tattoo of letters. About the left forearm, wrist, and hand, there are multiple scars, measuring 2.0 inches in greatest dimension. The upper extremities are symmetrical.

On the right side of the upper back, there is a tattoo of a multi-patterned design. The back and buttocks are symmetrical.

The toenails are long and dirty. About the lower legs, there are multiple scars, measuring 0.5 inches in greatest dimension. The lower extremities are symmetrical.

EXTERNAL EVIDENCE OF INJURY:

1. On the upper right sclera, there is a petechial hemorrhage.
2. On the left side of the upper lip, there is a laceration, 0.3 x 0.2 inches.
3. On the lower lip, there are multiple abrasions, measuring 0.3 inches in greatest dimension.
4. On the posterior right hand, there is a bruise, 0.5 x 0.4 inches.
5. On the posterolateral right hand, there is a bruise, 0.8 x 0.5 inches.
6. On the medial right wrist, there is a bruise, 0.4 x 0.4 inches.
7. On the medial left hand, there is an abrasion, 0.1 inches in diameter.

EVIDENCE OF MEDICAL TREATMENT:

1. In the mouth, there is an endotracheal tube.
2. On the right side of the neck, there is a catheter.
3. On the chest and abdomen, there are multiple electrocardiogram leads.
4. On the chest and back, there are multiple cardioversion pads.
5. On the anterior right elbow crease, there is an intravenous catheter.
6. On the distal anterior right forearm, there is an intravenous catheter.
7. In the urethra, there is an indwelling urinary catheter.

INTERNAL EVIDENCE OF INJURY:

1. On the anterolateral left wrist, there is subcutaneous hemorrhage, 0.6 x 0.4 inches.
2. On the anterolateral right wrist, there is subcutaneous hemorrhage, 0.7 x 0.3 inches.
3. On the distal medial left forearm, there is subcutaneous hemorrhage, 0.3 inches in diameter.
4. On the posterolateral right elbow, there is subcutaneous hemorrhage, 1.2 x 0.7 inches.
5. On the inferior portion of the right sternothyroid muscle, there is hemorrhage, 0.5 x 0.3 inches.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION:

Body Cavities: The body is entered by a Y-shaped incision. All organs are present in their usual anatomic positions and present their usual anatomic relationships. No excess fluid is present in any body cavity.

Neck Organs: The anterior muscles of the neck reveal injuries as previously noted. The cartilages of the larynx and epiglottis display no abnormalities. The hyoid bone is intact. Examination of the tongue reveals no evidence of injury. The thyroid gland is without special note.

Respiratory System: The right lung weighs 1450 grams. The left lung weighs 1120 grams. The right lung reveals pleural adhesions. The lungs are blue/gray. The trachea and bronchi display no abnormalities. No thromboemboli are present in the pulmonary artery. On cut section, the pulmonary parenchyma reveals diffuse congestion and edema.

Cardiovascular System: The heart weighs 470 grams. The coronary arteries pursue their usual anatomic course and display no evidence of atherosclerosis. The valves of the heart and great vessels are without special note. Serial sections of the myocardium reveal no focal areas of pathologic change. The interventricular septum measures 0.6 inches in thickness. The left ventricle measures 0.7 inches in thickness. The aorta is without special note.

Hepatobiliary System: The liver weighs 1840 grams. The liver is red/brown with smooth surfaces and sharp margins. On cut section, the hepatic parenchyma is congested. The gallbladder and biliary tract pursue their usual anatomic course and display no pathologic change.

Hemolymphatic System: The spleen weighs 190 grams. The spleen is blue/gray and firm. On cut section, the splenic parenchyma is congested. No prominent lymphadenopathy is noted.

Gastrointestinal System: The esophagus is without special note. The stomach contains 150 cc of partially digested food material. The small and large intestines are without special note. The appendix is present.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION: (continued)

Genitourinary System: The right kidney weighs 180 grams. The left kidney weighs 160 grams. The kidneys are red/brown and smooth. On cut section, the renal parenchyma is congested. The renal pelves, ureters, and urinary bladder are without special note.

Endocrine System: The pituitary, pancreas, and adrenal glands are without special note.

Musculoskeletal System: The ribs, long bones, and vertebral column are without special note.

Central Nervous System: The scalp displays no lacerations or hematomas. On reflecting the scalp, there is no subgaleal hemorrhage. The skull is intact. On entering the cranial cavity, there is no subdural or epidural hematoma. The leptomeninges are without special note. The brain weighs 1570 grams. The brain reveals cerebral edema as manifested by flattening of the cortical convolutions. Serial sections of the brain reveal no focal areas of pathologic change. The arteries at the base of the brain display no abnormalities. Fluid blood is present in the dural sinuses.

SPECIAL STUDIES:

1. Body fluid samples are submitted for requested analyses (see toxicology report).
2. Documentation photographs are taken by the Crime Scene Investigator from the Will County Sheriff's Police Department.
3. Right and left fingernail clippings and combed and pulled head hair are submitted to the Crime Scene Investigator from the Will County Sheriff's Police Department.

6. Fentanyl (Duragesic®; Sublimaze®) - Peripheral Blood:

Fentanyl is a DEA Schedule II synthetic morphine substitute anesthetic/analgesic. It is reported to be 80 to 200 times as potent as morphine and has a rapid onset of action as well as addictive properties.

It is reported that patients lost consciousness at mean plasma levels of fentanyl of 34 ng/mL when infused with 75 mcg/Kg over a 15 min period; peak plasma levels averaged 50 ng/mL.

After application of a fentanyl transdermal preparation (patch), serum fentanyl concentrations are reported to be in the following ranges within 24 hours:

25 mcg/hour patch: 0.3 - 1.2 ng/mL

50 mcg/hour patch: 0.6 - 1.8 ng/mL

75 mcg/hour patch: 1.1 - 2.6 ng/mL

100 mcg/hour patch: 1.9 - 3.8 ng/mL

Following removal of the patch, serum fentanyl concentrations are reported to decrease with a mean elimination half-life of 17 hours (range, 13 to 22 hours).

The mean peak plasma serum fentanyl concentration in adults given an 800 mcg oral transmucosal fentanyl preparation over 15 minutes is reported at 2.1 ng/mL (range, 1.4 - 3.0 ng/mL) at approximately 0.4 hours.

Signs associated with fentanyl toxicity include severe respiratory depression, seizures, hypotension, coma and death. In fatalities from fentanyl, blood concentrations are variable and have been reported as low as 3 ng/mL.

Substance(s) known to interfere with the identity and/or quantity of the reported result: 4-methylphenethyl acetyl fentanyl

7. Fentanyl / Metabolite - Urine:

Fentanyl is a DEA Schedule II synthetic morphine substitute anesthetic/analgesic. It is reported to be 80 to 200 times as potent as morphine and has a rapid onset of action as well as addictive properties.

This result derives from a presumptive test, which may be subject to cross-reactivity with non-fentanyl related compounds. A second test is necessary to confirm the presence of fentanyl related compounds.

8. Morphine - Free (Codeine Metabolite) - Peripheral Blood:

Morphine is a DEA Schedule II narcotic analgesic. In analgesic therapy, it is usually encountered as the parent compound, however, it is also commonly found as the metabolite of codeine and heroin. In illicit preparations from which morphine may arise, codeine may be present as a contaminant. A large portion of the morphine is bound to the blood proteins or is conjugated; that which is not bound or conjugated is termed 'free morphine'. Hydromorphone is a reported metabolite of morphine.

In general, free morphine is the active biologic agent. Morphine has diverse effects that may include analgesia, drowsiness, nausea and respiratory depression. 6-monoacetylmorphine (6-MAM) is the 6-monoacetylated form of morphine, which is pharmacologically active. It is commonly found as the result of heroin use.

Peak serum concentrations occur within 10 to 20 minutes of a 10 mg/70 kg intramuscular dose, with an average concentration of 60 ng/mL 30 minutes following administration. IV administration of the same dose resulted in an average concentration of 80 ng/mL after 30 minutes. Chronic pain patients receiving an average of 90 mg (range 20 - 1460) daily oral morphine had average serum concentrations of 73 ng/mL (range 13 - 710) morphine. In 15 cases where cause of death was attributed to opiate toxicity (heroin, morphine or both), free morphine concentrations were 0 - 3700 ng/mL (mean = 420 +/- 940). In comparison, in cases where COD was unrelated to opiates (n=20) free morphine was 0 - 850 ng/mL (mean = 90 +/- 200). The ratio of whole blood concentration to serum or plasma concentration is approximately one.


