THE GRAND JURY CHARGES THAT:


COUNT ONE

From on or about August 30, 2021, through and including on or about September 1, 2021, in the District of Wyoming and elsewhere, the Defendant, **BRIAN CHRISTOPHER LAUNDRIE**, knowingly and with intent to defraud, used one or more unauthorized access devices, namely a Capitol One Bank debit card ending in 8774 and a personal identification number for Capital One Bank accounts ending in 0525 and 8665, and by such conduct obtained things of value aggregating to \$1,000 or more during that period, which affected interstate commerce.

In violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1029(a)(2), (c)(1)(A)(i).

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**MOTION FOR DETENTION HEARING**

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The United States moves for pretrial detention of the Defendant, pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3142(e) and (f).

1. Eligibility of Case. This case is eligible for a detention order because the case involves the following:

**Serious risk Defendant will flee  
Serious risk obstruction of justice**

2. Reason for Detention. The court should detain the Defendant because there are no conditions of release which will reasonably assure:

**Defendant's appearance as required  
Safety of any other person and the community**

3. Rebuttable Presumption. The United States will not invoke the rebuttable presumption against the Defendant under § 3142(e).


4. Time for Detention Hearing. The United States requests the Court conduct the detention hearing:
