Dear Ms. Khan,

We received your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request on 6 December 2019 seeking copies of United States Central Command (USCENTCOM) records from 2 June 2015 to 6 December 2019 for any credibility assessments, closure reports, and Army Regulation 15-6 Commander-Directed Investigations into the allegation of civilian casualties resulting from the Combined Joint Task Force-Operation INHERENT RESOLVE airstrikes in Hawija, Iraq on 2-3 June 2015. Your request is being processed in accordance with Title 5 U.S.C. § 552 Freedom of Information Act and Privacy Act, and Executive Order 13526. The actual processing time for these documents will depend upon consultation with other DoD components, both stateside and overseas, or other agencies.

In your request, you asked for expedited processing. In order to qualify for expedited processing, the requester must demonstrate a compelling need for that information. Under the FOIA, compelling need means that: (1) failure to obtain records on an expedited basis could reasonably be expected to pose an imminent threat to the life or physical safety of an individual; or, (2) the information is currently newsworthy, such as information urgently needed by an individual primarily engaged in disseminating information in order to inform the public concerning federal government involvement; or, (3) failure to obtain records on an expedited basis would create an imminent loss of due process rights. Your request does not satisfy the requirement for compelling need. Therefore, I cannot approve your request for expedited processing. Additionally, your request for a fee waiver is granted.

Your appeal must be postmarked or submitted electronically within 90 calendar days from the date of this letter, cite USCENTCOM's case #20-0183, and clearly mark "Freedom of Information Act Appeal" in your correspondence.

The USCENTCOM FOIA Requester Service Center receives numerous FOIA requests and has a substantial number of pending FOIA cases; therefore, we process requests in a multi-track processing system based on the date of receipt and complexity of the request. The FOIA does not require agencies to respond to questions, to do research, compile or analyze data, summarize, or conduct surveys for members of the public. You should be aware that the FOIA only provides the means by which the public can request specific documents from USCENTCOM.
