

Hale Center Native Leaves Air Force Active Duty

NEW YORK, March 5 (Spl).— Lt. Col. James L. Monroe, prisoner officer of the Department of Defense and chief of the psychological operations section of the directorate of plans at headquarters of the U. S. Air Force, has returned to inactive duty in the Air Force Reserve and joined

the Society for the Investigation of Human Ecology here as its executive secretary and treasurer.

He was born in Hale Center, Texas.

Colonel Monroe invented the "Monroe Bomb," a device used by the allied air forces in Europe during World War II to

drop millions of leaflets to captive populations.

After World War II he was in the insurance business in West Texas and served on the postwar rural health committee appointed by the governor of Texas.
