## Mowbray Park Vision – stage 1 Community Engagement Summary

The project team successfully engaged with over 560 locals through both online and in person engagement activities.


- Online engagement was via Council's Engagement HQ, with the project pages open from 4 December 2020 to 12 February 2021.
- Council received 501 survey responses, feedback on the park map and several stories uploaded.
- At three on-site information kiosks in December and January, over 60 local residents also attended and provided their views.
- Council held meetings with the park's three community lessees Anglican Church Grammar School (Churchie) Rowing, Backbone Youth Arts and East Brisbane Croquet Club to seek their input into the park's vision and improvement opportunities.


## What people value:


- love the park the way it is, don't change it

- upgrade pathways
- · more native vegetation, and more shrubs with colour
- upgrade the Bowls Club site for community use underutilised and unattractive
- upgrade toilet facilities
- better safety at night improve lighting
- slow down commuter cyclists within park
- upgrade playground to include features for older kids
- reinstate bandstand/rotunda
- review existing car parking numbers, location, hours
- allow pontoon access for fishing.
