AGENCY PROCUREMENT: **NOACA'S - POTENTIAL BUILD BACK BETTER REGIONAL CHALLENGE GRANT Finance and Audit Committee** November 12, 2021



INTRODUCTION

- \$1 billion is allocated to the Build Back Better Regional Challenge (BBBRC).
- NOACA assembled a coalition and identified additional partners to submit a Phase I project application:
- The Greater Cleveland Careers and Accessibility to Realize Equity and Sustainability (CARES)
- Goal to improve economic opportunities and ultimately health outcomes for residents across the five-county region by capitalizing on its worldclass health care providers, research institutions, and education providers.



ACTION REQUESTED


Possible future action. Contingent upon successful award of USEDA BBBRC Phase one funding

A recommendation of selection of a consultant to assist staff with potential (BBBRC) grant tasks will be presented for action to the Board of Directors at its December 10, 2021 meeting.

PREVIOUS ACTION

No previous action







- From a transportation perspective, NOACA would support health care by better moving people to jobs and job training.
- Connect educational institutions that have healthcare programs to hospitals and medical facilities.
- "Connections" in both the literal sense of infrastructure and figuratively to increase the capacity and partnerships of these institutions



The program is being implemented in two phases:

• **Phase 1:** 50-60 regional coalitions of partnering entities will be awarded \$500,000 in technical assistance funds to develop and support three to eight projects to grow a regional growth cluster. Application was due October 19th, 2021.

• **Phase 2:** Of the Phase I selections, EDA will award 20-30 regional coalitions \$25 million to \$75 million, and up to \$100 million, to implement those projects. Application due March 15th, 2022.



In the Phase I application, NOACA committed to utilizing the \$500,000 technical assistance award toward to achieve the following deliverables:

- **1. Staffing of a Regional Economic Competitiveness officer**
- 2. Development of conceptual studies
- 3. Development of a robust public participation plan



4. Development of a US EDA BBBRC Phase II application to compete for the \$25-\$75 million toward implementation of the submitted coalition projects, prior to the March 15th deadline.



NOACA proposed in the application that tasks 2-4 be performed utilizing the services off a qualified consultant.

In order to meet the compressed timeframe between the Phase I award announcement in December 2021 and the March 15th Phase II application deadline:

 Staff are recommending an expedited process for Board of Directors approval.





Staff recommends:



Following NOACA's procurement policy,
NOACA will issue a RFP the week of
November 8th, 2021, with proposals due
the week of November 29th, 2021.

The recommended consultant selection and a not to exceed contract amount will be presented to the full Board of Directors for approval at its December 10, 2021 meeting.



FINANCIAL IMPACTS

Should NOACA receive a Phase I award it would allocate \$500,000 for staff and consultant activities proposed under this item.





NEXT STEPS

Pending successful BBBRC Phase I funding award and Board approval, NOACA will enter into a contract with the selected consultant to assist with staff with the Greater Cleveland CARES project.
