SUSPENSION OF ENTRY AS IMMIGRANTS AND NONIMMIGRANTS OF

CERTAIN ADDITIONAL PERSONS WHO POSE A RISK OF

TRANSMITTING 2019 NOVEL CORONAVIRUS

BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

A PROCLAMATION

On January 31, 2020, I issued Proclamation 9984 (Suspension of Entry as Immigrants and Nonimmigrants of Persons Who Pose a Risk of Transmitting 2019 Novel Coronavirus and Other Appropriate Measures To Address This Risk). I found that the potential for widespread transmission of a novel (new) coronavirus (which has since been renamed "SARS-CoV-2" and causes the disease COVID-19) ("SARS-CoV-2" or "the virus") by infected individuals seeking to enter the United States threatens the security of our transportation system and infrastructure and the national security. Because the outbreak of the virus was at the time centered in the People's Republic of China, I suspended and limited the entry of all aliens who were physically present within the People's Republic of China, excluding the Special Administrative Regions of Hong Kong and Macau, during the 14-day period preceding their entry or attempted entry into the United States, subject to certain exceptions. On February 29, 2020, in recognition of the sustained person-to-person transmission of SARS-CoV-2 in the Islamic Republic of Iran, I issued Proclamation 9992 (Suspension of Entry as Immigrants and Nonimmigrants of Certain Additional Persons Who Pose a Risk of Transmitting 2019 Novel Coronavirus), suspending and limiting the entry of all aliens who were physically present within the Islamic Republic of Iran during the 14-day period preceding their entry or attempted

entry into the United States, subject to certain exceptions.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), a component of the Department of Health and Human Services, has determined that the virus presents a serious public health threat, and CDC continues to take steps to prevent its spread. But CDC, along with State and local health departments, has limited resources, and the public health system could be overwhelmed if sustained human-to-human transmission of the virus occurred in the United States on a large scale. Sustained human-to-human transmission has the potential to cause cascading public health, economic, national security, and societal consequences.

The World Health Organization has determined that multiple countries within the Schengen Area are experiencing sustained person-to-person transmission of SARS-CoV-2. For purposes of this proclamation, the Schengen Area comprises 26 European states: Austria, Belgium, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, and Switzerland. The Schengen Area currently has the largest number of confirmed COVID-19 cases outside of the People's Republic of China. As of March 11, 2020, the number of cases in the 26 Schengen Area countries is 17,442, with 711 deaths, and shows high continuous growth in infection rates. In total, as of March 9, 2020, the Schengen Area has exported 201 COVID-19 cases to 53 countries. Moreover, the free flow of people between the Schengen Area countries makes the task of managing the spread of the virus difficult.

The United States Government is unable to effectively evaluate

and monitor all of the travelers continuing to arrive from the Schengen Area. The potential for undetected transmission of the virus by infected individuals seeking to enter the United States from the Schengen Area threatens the security of our transportation system and infrastructure and the national security. Given the importance of protecting persons within the United States from the threat of this harmful communicable disease, I have determined that it is in the interests of the United States to take action to restrict and suspend the entry into the United States, as immigrants or nonimmigrants, of all aliens who were physically present within the Schengen Area during the 14-day period preceding their entry or attempted entry into the United States. The free flow of commerce between the United States and the Schengen Area countries remains an economic priority for the United States, and I remain committed to facilitating trade between our nations.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, DONALD J. TRUMP, President of the United States, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of the United States of America, including sections 212(f) and 215(a) of the Immigration and Nationality Act, 8 U.S.C. 1182(f) and 1185(a), and section 301 of title 3, United States Code, hereby find that the unrestricted entry into the United States of persons described in section 1 of this proclamation would, except as provided for in section 2 of this proclamation, be detrimental to the interests of the United States, and that their entry should be subject to certain restrictions, limitations, and exceptions. I therefore hereby proclaim the following:

Section 1. Suspension and Limitation on Entry. The entry into the United States, as immigrants or nonimmigrants, of all aliens

who were physically present within the Schengen Area during the 14-day period preceding their entry or attempted entry into the United States is hereby suspended and limited subject to section 2 of this proclamation.

Sec. 2. Scope of Suspension and Limitation on Entry.

- (a) Section 1 of this proclamation shall not apply to:
 - (i) any lawful permanent resident of the United States;
- (ii) any alien who is the spouse of a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident;
- (iii) any alien who is the parent or legal guardian of a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident, provided that the U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident is unmarried and under the age of 21;
- (iv) any alien who is the sibling of a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident, provided that both are unmarried and under the age of 21;
- (v) any alien who is the child, foster child, or ward of a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident, or who is a prospective adoptee seeking to enter the United States pursuant to the IR-4 or IH-4 visa classifications;
- (vi) any alien traveling at the invitation of the United States Government for a purpose related to containment or mitigation of the virus;

(vii) any alien traveling as a nonimmigrant pursuant to a C-1, D, or C-1/D nonimmigrant visa as a crewmember or any alien otherwise traveling to the United States as air or sea crew;

(viii) any alien

- (A) seeking entry into or transiting the United States pursuant to one of the following visas: A-1, A-2, C-2, C-3 (as a foreign government official or immediate family member of an official), E-1 (as an employee of TECRO or TECO or the employee's immediate family members), G-1, G-2, G-3, G-4, NATO-1 through NATO-4, or NATO-6 (or seeking to enter as a nonimmigrant in one of those NATO categories); or
- (B) whose travel falls within the scope of section 11 of the United Nations Headquarters Agreement;
- (ix) any alien whose entry would not pose a significant risk of introducing, transmitting, or spreading the virus, as determined by the Secretary of Health and Human Services, through the CDC Director or his designee;
- (x) any alien whose entry would further important United States law enforcement objectives, as determined by the Secretary of State, the Secretary of Homeland Security, or their respective designees, based on a recommendation of the Attorney General or his designee;
- (xi) any alien whose entry would be in the national interest, as determined by the Secretary of State, the Secretary of Homeland Security, or their designees; or

- (xii) members of the U.S. Armed Forces and spouses and children of members of the U.S. Armed Forces.
- (b) Nothing in this proclamation shall be construed to affect any individual's eligibility for asylum, withholding of removal, or protection under the regulations issued pursuant to the legislation implementing the Convention Against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment, consistent with the laws and regulations of the United States.
- Sec. 3. Implementation and Enforcement. (a) The Secretary of State shall implement this proclamation as it applies to visas pursuant to such procedures as the Secretary of State, in consultation with the Secretary of Homeland Security, may establish. The Secretary of Homeland Security shall implement this proclamation as it applies to the entry of aliens pursuant to such procedures as the Secretary of Homeland Security, in consultation with the Secretary of State, may establish.
- (b) Consistent with applicable law, the Secretary of State, the Secretary of Transportation, and the Secretary of Homeland Security shall ensure that any alien subject to this proclamation does not board an aircraft traveling to the United States.
- (c) The Secretary of Homeland Security may establish standards and procedures to ensure the application of this proclamation at and between all United States ports of entry.
- (d) An alien who circumvents the application of this proclamation through fraud, willful misrepresentation of a material fact, or illegal entry shall be a priority for removal by

the Department of Homeland Security.

- Sec. 4. Termination. This proclamation shall remain in effect until terminated by the President. The Secretary of Health and Human Services shall recommend that the President continue, modify, or terminate this proclamation as described in section 5 of Proclamation 9984, as amended.
- Sec. 5. Effective Date. This proclamation is effective at 11:59 p.m. eastern daylight time on March 13, 2020. This proclamation does not apply to persons aboard a flight scheduled to arrive in the United States that departed prior to 11:59 p.m. eastern daylight time on March 13, 2020.
- <u>Sec. 6.</u> <u>Severability</u>. It is the policy of the United States to enforce this proclamation to the maximum extent possible to advance the national security, public safety, and foreign policy interests of the United States. Accordingly:
- (a) if any provision of this proclamation, or the application of any provision to any person or circumstance, is held to be invalid, the remainder of this proclamation and the application of its provisions to any other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby; and
- (b) if any provision of this proclamation, or the application of any provision to any person or circumstance, is held to be invalid because of the lack of certain procedural requirements, the relevant executive branch officials shall implement those procedural requirements to conform with existing law and with any applicable court orders.

- <u>Sec. 7. General Provisions</u>. (a) Nothing in this proclamation shall be construed to impair or otherwise affect:
- (i) the authority granted by law to an executive department or agency, or the head thereof; or
- (ii) the functions of the Director of the Office of Management and Budget relating to budgetary, administrative, or legislative proposals.
- (b) This proclamation shall be implemented consistent with applicable law and subject to the availability of appropriations.
- (c) This proclamation is not intended to, and does not, create any right or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or in equity by any party against the United States, its departments, agencies, or entities, its officers, employees, or agents, or any other person.



Mexico to start reopening border region, other areas as coronavirus lockdown eases

May 13 at 5:10 PM

MEXICO CITY — Mexico's government says it will lift a quarantine for hundreds of counties starting May 18 and will begin to gradually reopen the rest of the nation on June 1 as it seeks to emerge from the coronavirus epidemic.

The country has been on a nationwide lockdown for more than seven weeks, and businesses are eager to reopen. Analysts are predicting that the <u>economy could shrink up to 10 percent</u> this year — one of the most significant recessions in Latin America.

"We've begun a new stage. There's a light at the end of the tunnel," President Andrés Manuel López Obrador said at a news conference on Wednesday. But he cautioned that Mexico was

headed for a "new normality" that would require safety measures to prevent major outbreaks of disease.

Under the plan, the government would allow 269 municipalities scattered over 15 states to resume most activities on Monday. These are places that have had no confirmed <u>coronavirus</u> cases and whose neighboring counties also have no sign of covid-19, the disease caused by the virus. They represent just over 10 percent of all municipalities in Mexico.

Other municipalities and states will be assigned a color each week, starting June 1, that indicates the extent to which businesses, schools and public gathering places can function. In addition, three major industries will be included on the list of "essential" sectors that can resume operations nationwide next week — construction, mining and auto manufacturing.

Mexico has had significant outbreaks in five cities, including <u>Mexico City</u>, the epicenter. As of Tuesday, the government had logged nearly 4,000 confirmed deaths from covid-19. Authorities have said the actual number is certainly higher.

The restrictions in Mexico have been less severe than in many other Latin American countries, relying on persuasion rather than police to keep people home. Schools and most businesses and government offices have had to close, however. Authorities say the restrictions have prevented a nationwide spike in cases, although the virus continues to spread.

Some governors expressed concern that Mexico was reopening too early. "Everything is going to collapse, all the measures we have taken to keep people at home," <u>said Gov. Miguel Barbosa</u> of Puebla, which is home to major Volkswagen and Audi plants.

Officials indicated that Mexico City will remain "red" — the highest level of lockdown. Mayor Claudia Sheinbaum said restaurants, department stores and cinemas would reopen in mid-June, at one-third capacity.

Three big states on the U.S. border, in contrast, are considered "green" — Chihuahua, Coahuila and Nuevo Leon. If they remain in that category, they will be able to resume manufacturing and other business activities in June, and schools in those states will reopen.

The Trump administration has been urging Mexico to restart assembly plants that provide inputs for critical U.S. industries such as defense contractors. López Obrador, too, has been eager for a resumption of economic activity. Some Mexican officials have been wary, however, because dozens of workers have become sick at border factories that remained open. Several have died.

Baja California is considered "red" because of a coronavirus outbreak in the city of Tijuana, south of San Diego.

The two other border states — Sonora and Tamaulipas — are "yellow," meaning that businesses can reopen but schools will remain closed and restrictions on gathering places, including churches and parks, will continue.

Many of <u>Mexico's popular beach destinations</u> — Acapulco, Cancun, Playa del Carmen — are in "red" states, meaning hotels and restaurants will probably not reopen for weeks. Tourism accounts for about 8 percent of the Mexican economy.


While authorities issued a detailed plan on easing lockdowns, López Obrador said states would not be punished if they decided to establish their own rules.


And officials cautioned that shutdowns could be reintroduced in states or municipalities if cases flare up again. They estimate that Mexico City and Cancun recently passed their peaks of new cases.


Hugo López-Gatell, the Health Ministry official who has designed Mexico's strategy, acknowledged that much was still unknown about the path of the virus.


"In every moment, there is uncertainty," he said. "Every country in the world faces the question of whether you can head into the new normality, and at what speed."







Subject: COVID-19 State Reopen Plans & Slow Burn States' Key Metrics

Date: April 23, 2020

BACKGROUND

Governors across the country are beginning to release gating critieria and plans on how to reopen their respective States. The most frequently discussed criteria are:

- track decline in positive case;
- increase in testing capabilities;
- enhance contact tracing programs;
- ensure adequate hospital capacity;
- boost certainty in PPE supply; and
- establish industry specific guidance.

Additional factors incorporated in State plans include: priority of protecting vulnerable populations; regional tailoring, based on community or county information; and preparedness plans for if/when a resurgence occurs, and the inter-connectivity of different metrics.

Governors in slow burn States are primarily tracking locally-driven factors that impact decision making that includes positivity rate, hospitalization rate, and testing capacity. Governors are also focused on preparedness for an outbreak, phased guidance communication, and addressing mitigation fatigue particularly for individuals on the margins. As many slow burn States never dealt with a widespread outbreak, governors are also tracking preparedness metrics (e.g., established plans, hospitalization rates, surveillance data, PPE supply, testing capacity) for dealing with an outbreak. Many governors seem very focused on their county-specific data and how that can inform and tailor decisions, including regional decisions.


SUMMARY STATISTICS

- 16 States (AK, CA, CO, MO, MT, ND, NM, NV, OK, OR, PA, RI, UT, VT, WA, and WI) have released formal reopening plans and/or criteria. 13 of the 16 plans were released in the last week following the announcement of the *Guidelines for Reopening America Again*.
- 34 States and D.C. have announced that plans and/or criteria to reopen are forthcoming.
- There are currently five regional compacts totaling 26 States that are coordinating policies, priorities, and challenges for reopening. Thus far, these groups have focused on sharing data and best practices rather than tightly coordinated regional reopen efforts.
- FL, GA, and TX have not released formal plans to date (TX is expected on April 27), but have taken action to loosen restrictions with social distancing/sanitation guidelines and developed a mechanisms for further recommendations.



Appendix I: State Formal Reopening Plans Released & Additional Reopening Actions & Announcements

April 14 (1 Governor)

 Gov. Gavin Newsom (D, CA) <u>outlined</u> six indicators the State will consider before modifying the Stat-at-Home Order and other COVID-19 interventions. On April 21: Gov. Newsom <u>urged</u> Californians to continue following stay-at-home.

April 15 (2 Governors)

- O Gov. Jared Polis (D, CO) outlined key indicators that will be considered in modifying Colorado's social distancing guidance. On April 22, Gov. Polis announced that Colorado's previously issued "stay-at-home" order is being updated to a "safer-at-home" order with select businesses reopening on April 27, with a limited number of in-store customers on May 1, and permitting 50% of a company's workforce turning to work on May 4 with as much telecommuting as possible.
- Gov. Doug Burgum (R, ND) <u>outlined</u> a path for businesses to reopen gradually past April 30 with robust widespread testing, contact tracing, targeted quarantine, and other measures. The North Dakota Department of Commerce will lead the reopening planning efforts, which Burgum dubbed "ND Smart Restart."

April 17 (4 Governors)

- Gov. Mike Parson (R, MO) <u>announced</u> the "Show Me Strong" Recovery Plan to safely and gradually reopen the state's economy. The plan has two initial phases intended to protect those most at risk of exposure to COVID-19 while returning Missouri to a new normal.
- O Gov. Tom Wolf (D, PA) released a Plan for Pennsylvania focused on relief, reopening, and recovery that will keep Pennsylvanians alive and repair the damage this virus has caused across Pennsylvania. Gov. Wolf on April 22 announced beginning May 8 he will end the stay-at-home order for northcentral and northwestern and many retail stores in those areas should be able to reopen. The plan requires a region or county will need to average fewer than 50 new positive cases of the virus per 100,000 residents for 14 days in order to begin moving out from under his statewide lockdown. Many counties in rural Pennsylvania have reported fewer than 20 cases total. The plan lays out a phased, color-coded reopening roadmap.
- Gov. Phil Scott (R, VT) <u>released</u> principles and safety precautions for a phased restart of the State's economy direct guidance to be issued based on data, healthcare readiness, increase testing and tracing, work smarter and work safety guidance, and play smarter and play safer guidance.
- O Gov. Gary Herbert (R, UT) released the Utah Leads Together 2.0 plan that is a comprehensive task force plan to mitigate economic consequences of COVID-19 and outlines a path to recovery that includes an economic playbook and recommendations from business and industry.

April 20 (3 Governors)

- Gov. Kate Brown (D, OR) <u>updated</u> framework for reopening that would happen county by count in three phrases (restaurants could return to sit-down dining while following strict social distancing guidelines gyms could open in phase two).
- o Gov. Gina Raimondo (D, RI) <u>outlined</u> six "key indicators for reopening" the economy including rate of spread, capacity to identify spread, necessary support for vulnerable population, healthcare capacity, social distancing planes, and plans to re-close parts of the economy.
- Gov. Tony Evers (D, WI) <u>announced</u> the Badger Bounceback Plan that outlines criteria (test, trace, and track) for Wisconsin to be able to reopen its economy in phases and includes steps to make sure

workers and businesses are prepared to reopen as soon as it is safe to do so. Wisconsin's Stay-at-Home order expires May 26. Governor Tony Evers has closed K-12 schools for the rest of the year.

April 21 (2 Governors)

- o Gov. Mike Dunleavy (R, AK) <u>announced</u> a plan to reopen the economy and an economic stabilization team to help the state's economy weather the impacts of the coronavirus.
- O Gov. Steve Sisolak (D, NV) released a plan to reopen the State for business while not placing a specific date on lifting his stay-at-home order indicating he needed to see a downward trajectory of cases and hospitalizations over a 14-day period. Gov. Sisolak indicated the Gaming Control Board would signing off on any casino reopening plan.

April 22 (4 Governors)

- o **Gov. Steve Bullock (D, MT)** <u>released</u> a plan allowing some businesses to re-open on April 27, restaurants/bars/casinos reopening on May 4 with reduced capacity, schools having the option to return to school on May 7 all while maintaining stay at home restrictions for people over 65.
- O Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham (D, NM) said her stay-at-home order would remain in place through May 15, but the State was planning a phased reopening plan starting in mid-May. The reopening plan would include meeting the following metrics: new case rate trends, adequate testing to achieve containment or about 100,000 tests a day, contact tracing, PPE supply, hospital capacity, healthcare worker health and well-being, and an outbreak containment plan. NM currently has 64 testing sites in all 33 counties.
- O Gov. Kevin Stitt (R, OK) announced the Open Up and Recovery Safely plan to beginning reopening the State's economy on April 24 with social distancing guidelines with some businesses opening on April 24 (hair salons, barber shops, nail salons, and pet grooming services) and other businesses on May 1 (and restaurants, churches, gyms, and movie theaters). The guidelines under high risk individuals to remain at home. The plan excludes bars which are contingent on hospitals not being overwhelmed.
- Gov. Jay Inslee (D, WA) <u>announced</u> the COVID-19 recovery plan that includes modifying the May 4 "stay home, stay healthy" order and loosening the restrictions contingent on a steady decrease of the spread of COVDI-19.

Additional Reopening Actions & Announcements

April 13 (10 Governors)

- Seven northeast governors <u>joined</u> a multi-state northeast regional effort (CT, DE, MA, NJ, NY, PA, and RI) to plan and coordinate reopening efforts in the northeast region and address healthcare capacity challenges.
- Three governors on the west coast (CA, OR, and WA) joined a multi-state effort to share vision for reopening their economies and controlling COVID-19.

April 14 (1 Governor)

Gov. Tate Reeves (R, MS) <u>established</u> the "Restart Mississippi" commission by developing a series of recommendations and goals for a path forward on the State's economy. He also announced plans to assist small business owners and unemployed workers in Mississippi.

April 16 (3 Governors)

o Gov. Janet Mills (D, ME), Gov. Chris Sununu (R, NH), and Gov. Phil Scott (R, VT) announced they are coordinating reopening actions as a northeast New England region.

April 17 (1 Governor)

Gov. Greg Abbott (R, TX) <u>held</u> a press conference where he issued three new Executive Orders to begin the process of reopening the state of Texas while revising hospital capacity and certain social distancing guidelines. Gov. Abbott established the "Strike Force to Open Texas" of medical experts, private and public sector leaders to advise the Governor.

April 18 (7 Governors)

- Gov. Asa Hutchinson (R, AR) <u>announced</u> an Economic Recovery Task Force to develop an industry-specific strategy and make recommendations.
- 6 southeastern governors including Governor Kay Ivey (R, AL), Governor Ron DeSantis (R, FL), Governor Brian Kemp (R, GA), Governor Tate Reeves (R, MS), Governor Henry McMaster (R, SC), and Governor Bill Lee (R, TN) announced they are coordinating as southeastern governors to safely open up their States and bring people back to work.

April 20 (5 Governors)

- O Gov. Henry McMaster (R, SC) <u>created</u> accelerateSC, a coordinated economic revitalization plan coordinating a revitalization plan involving small and large business leaders, healthcare professionals, local government officials, and education professionals. Gov. McMaster also <u>issued</u> plans to re-open beaches and some retail stores with some restrictions beginning April 20. A school decision is planned to be released soon.
- O Gov. Bill Lee (R, TN) announced Tennesseans to remain at home will expire April 30, with the vast majority of businesses in 89 counties allowed to re-open on May 1. The Lee Administration will work with Shelby, Madison, Davidson, Hamilton, Knox and Sullivan counties and their health departments as they plan their own re-open strategies.
- Gov. Tony Evers (D, WI) <u>released</u> Badger Bounce Back plan that provides guidelines to re-open the economy, increase testing (goal of testing 85,000 per week), and expand healthcare capacity and supplies. The safer-at-home order is in effect until May 26.
- o Gov. Mark Gordon (R, WY) <u>indicated</u> changing the prohibition on gatherings of 10 or more won't be "date-driven" but rather "data-drive."
- o Gov. Brian Kemp (R, GA) announced re-opening plans saying, "Given the favorable data, enhanced testing, and approval of our healthcare professionals, we will allow gyms, fitness centers,

bowling alleys, body art studios, barbers, cosmetologists, hair designers, nail care artists, estheticians, their respective schools, and massage therapists to reopen their doors this Friday, April 24."

April 21 (3 Governors)

- Gov. Ron DeSantis' (R, FL) Re-Open Florida Task Force is <u>recommending</u> Florida's tourism and hospital industry should re-open slowly focusing first on getting residents to take in-state vacations before branching out to domestic and international travelers.
- Gov. Eric Holcomb (R, IN) <u>extended</u> the State's stay-at-home order through May 1 but is allowing elective clinical procedures to begin on April 21 and may be allowing elective procedures to begin for other practices.
- Gov. Andrew Cuomo (D, NY) commits to reopen New York on a regional basis based on facts and circumstances and announced allowing elective outpatient treatment soon in non-hotspot counties.


April 22 (5 Governors)

- o Gov. Doug Ducey (R, AZ) issued an executive order removing restrictions on conducting
- elective surgeries beginning May 1 for hospitals, health care facilities and providers that meet certain preparedness criteria (demonstrating greater than a 14 day supply of PPE, ensuring adequate staffing and beds, testing patients prior to surgery and all at-risk health care workers, ensuring appropriate discharge plans for patients being transferred to nursing care facilities; including diagnostic testing for COVID-19; implementing a universal symptom screening process for staff, patients, and visitors; establishing an enhanced cleaning process for waiting areas; and prioritizing the restart of elective surgeries based on urgency.
- o Gov. JB Pritzker (D, IL) <u>said</u> testing, tracing, treating, and PPE are things the State needs before reopening.
- O Gov. Laura Kelly (D, KS) announced the state is on track to reopen on May 3 for business hoping to see a steady 14-day decline in new cases, but indicated she's identifying other metrics to open. Gov. Kelly indicated on April 18 she is working to tailor guidance to get people back to work safely and said the Federal guidelines were helpful saying, "I do appreciate the guidelines that were given to us. It gives you sort of a road map."
- O Gov. Larry Hogan (R, MD) plans to release a Maryland Strong: Roadmap to Recovery plan on April 24 to reopen the state focused on four key objectives: increased testing capacity, comprehensive tracing system, greater supply of personal protective equipment (PPE), and an expanded hospital surge capacity. Gov. Hogan has contracted with the National Opinion Research Center to a projecting tracing capacity of 1,000 cases per day.
- o **Gov. Mike DeWine (R, OH)** <u>announced</u> an order that directs healthcare providers in hospitals and outpatient surgery centers to reassess procedures and surgeries that were postponed, and announced a new mental health COVID CareLine for Ohioans. April 20: Gov. DeWine <u>indicated</u> he is working on a phased re-opening plan that will begin May 1.

<u>Leading Practices for & from Governors:</u> <u>Leveraging Enhanced Testing, Improving Community Monitoring & Contact Tracing</u>

- Gov. Asa Hutchinson (R, AR) <u>created</u> the Governor's COVID-19 Testing Working Group to make recommendations to expand the capacity and performance of COVID-19 testing in the State including maintaining testing capabilities and conduct surveillance testing across the State.
- Gov. Doug Ducey (AZ) <u>announced</u> antibody testing for 250,000 health professionals and first responders through a partnership between the state of Arizona and the University of Arizona following Federal approval.
- o **Gov. Gavin Newsom (CA)** announced a new testing task force creating 5-7 high-capacity testing "hubs" through a partnership with U.C. San Diego and U.C. Davis to reduce a testing backlog by counties and increase high-capacity testing.
- Gov. Ron DeSantis (FL) <u>announced</u> major expansions to statewide testing with the goal of opening
 up additional testing sites and expanding spot testing by enlisting members of the Florida National
 Guard to test in Florida nursing homes and long-term care facilities.
- O Gov. Kim Reynolds (R, IA) <u>launched</u> the Test Iowa Initiative to triple its testing capacity by partnering with Nomi Health and DOMO (DOMO has already launched a similar initiative in the state of Utah). The model is state managed, but DOMO provides the supplies, testing equipment, and resources. Other State are exploring similar models. Gov. Reynolds also <u>worked</u> with the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics to leverage further laboratory capacity.
- o Gov. Eric Holcomb (R, IN) announced free additional drive-thru testing clinics.
- Gov. Andy Beshear (D, KY) <u>announced</u> plans to increase testing including additional drug-thru
 testing locations in partnership with Kroger in the four new cities (Louisville, Lexington, Ownesboro,
 and Bowling Green) with the goal of testing 20,000 per week statewide.
- O Gov. Gretchen Whitmer (D, MI) announced a partnership with CVS Health to provide to provide drive-through Rapid COVID-19 Testing in Dearborn, MI. Gov. Whitmer also announced 13 new or expanded COVID-19 drive-thru testing sites in partnership with Michigan Primary Care Association, 11 health centers, and NxGen MDX Laboratory. Additionally, Michigan is partnering with Walmart to expand drive-thru testing sites.
- O Gov. Tim Walz (D, MN) announced the State's health care delivery systems, the Mayo Clinic, and the University of Minnesota a breakthrough for rapid, widespread testing (as many as 20,000 molecular tests per day and 15,000 serology tests per day) with the goal to test all symptomatic people, isolate confirmed cases, and expand public health contact tracing tools.
- o **Gov. Pete Ricketts (NE)** worked with the Nebraska State Health Lab in maximizing reagent by pooling multiple people's COVID-19 samples together, saving resources and time.
- O Gov. Doug Burgum (R, ND) outlined a plan to significantly increase testing capacity for COVID-19, a critical component for protecting vulnerable populations and reopening businesses in the State by adding 9 lab professionals to help meet a goal of expanding to 1,800 tests per day by April 30 and 3,000 tests in May with additional equipment.
- O Gov. Andrew Cuomo (D, NY) announced he's developing a COVID-19 test and trace program being developed by Mike Bloomberg. Gov. Cuomo also signed an executive order to expand antibody testing that will expand the number of people who are eligible to conduct the coronavirus antibody test.
- Of Cov. Mike DeWine (R, OH) announced Ohio's testing has "greatly expanded" after FDA approved Thermo Fischer Scientific's of new extraction reagent saying the action "probably double, maybe even triple testing in Ohio virtually overnight." Gov. DeWine has formed Testing Strike Team led by two former governors (Richard Celeste and Bob Taft along with business, academia, and public health leaders). Gov. Mike DeWine (R, OH) worked with the Ohio State University Wexler Medical Center to expand and accelerate testing creating a sterile solution to transport testing swaps (called viral transport media) that stabilizes the virus, and has worked with university engineering and dentistry departments to 3D print more than 50,000 swabs for tests.

- o Gov. Gina Raimondo (RI) and Gov. Brian Kemp (GA) announced that Rapid COVID-19 tests partnership with CVS Health.
- Gov. Greg Abbott (R, TX) mobilized more than 1,200 National Guard personnel and 45 teams providing greater access to medical testing with the capacity to test 150 people per day at each mobile testing team location. Gov. Abbott also announced there are 500,000 job openings available in the State.
- o **Gov. Gary Herbert (R, UT)** <u>released</u> the "health together" beta app that checks symptoms, connects users with testing, and helps augment current contact tracing efforts.
- o Gov. Jim Justice (R, WV) <u>announced</u> the West Virginia National Guard became the first National Guard in the country to be approved by DOD to provide mobile testing for COVID-19. Gov. Jim Justice (R, WV) <u>ordered</u> all nursing home residents and staff statewide to be tested for COVID-19.



Adverse Effect Wage Rate - Options Memo

Background

The H-2A seasonal agricultural visa program was enacted in 1986 to allow farmers and other agricultural employers to recruit foreign workers to meet temporary agricultural labor needs. Under the statute, an H-2A worker is admissible only if the Secretary of Labor determines that his employment will not adversely affect the wages of workers in the United States similarly employed.

To meet this requirement, DOL's current regulations require employers to pay the highest of: (1) the adverse effect wage rate (AEWR), calculated based on an annual USDA farm labor survey; (2) the agreed-upon collective bargaining wage; (3) the prevailing hourly wage or piece rate; or (4) the Federal or State minimum wage.


The cost of employing a legal workforce in the agricultural sector remains a major obstacle to the competitiveness of United States farmers. However, usage of the H-2A program has boomed since 2010 from 79,011 certified worker positions to 257,667 certified worker positions in 2019. In view of these facts, on May 9, 2018, Principals agreed to propose new regulations to streamline and improve the H-2A program, including more accurate AEWR determinations. On July 26, 2019, the Department of Labor issued an NPRM. No further regulatory steps have been taken to date.

Subject: COVID-19 Slow Burn States' Reopen Plans & Key Metrics

Date: April 22, 2020

BACKGROUND

Governors across the country are beginning to release plans on how to reopen their respective States. This memo highlights the top "gating criteria", or benchmarks that governors have discussed in their plans or have announced will be influential in their plans forthcoming.

Governors in slow burn States are primarily tracking locally-driven factors that impact decision making that includes positivity rate, hospitalization rate, and testing capacity. Governors are also focused on preparedness for an outbreak and confidence in phased guidance communication.

FACTS & STATISTICS

- 9 States (AK, CO, MO, ND, NV, OR, RI, UT, & WA) have released formal reopening plans.
- 27 additional States have announced that plans are forthcoming.
- There are currently five regional compacts (4 formal and 1 informal) totaling 26 States that are coordinating policies, priorities, and challenges for reopening. Thus far, these groups have focused on sharing data and best practices rather than tightly coordinated regional reopen efforts.
- FL, GA, and TX have not released formal plans, but have taken action to loosen restrictions with social distancing/sanitation guidelines and develop a mechanism for further recommendations.

GATING CRITERA

While not comprehensive, these are the most frequently discussed criteria:

- Track decline in positive cases
- Increase in testing capabilities
- Enhance contact tracing programs
- Ensure adequate hospital capacity
- Boost certainty in PPE supply
- Establish industry specific guidance

Additional factors incorporated in State plans include:

- Priority of protecting vulnerable populations
- Regional tailoring, based on community or county information
- Preparedness plans for if/when a resurgence in cases occurs

INSIGHTS & OBSERVATIONS FROM SLOW BURN STATES

Intergovernmental Affairs spoke with more than governors' offices to gain insight in key metrics and decision-making factors on reopening plans. Key observations:

- Governors are primarily tracking key metrics to reopen (positivity rate, hospitalization rate, testing capacity) on county- or community-specific data with a focus to reopen based on regions within a State and/or specific industries within a State.
- Many governors are also tracking preparedness level metrics (e.g., established plans, PPE supply, testing capacity) for dealing with an outbreak as many States never dealt with a widespread outbreak before.
- Preparedness levels for specific counties are also dependent on an ability to communicate guidance effectively from trusted sources.


Intergovernmental Affairs and the Domestic Policy Council also analyzed State reopen plans to understand how slow burn States are using data to drive their decisions on reopening. Key observations:


- These States focus on the context of the data and are making transition decisions based off
 potential impacts on certain populations. They realized that one metric by itself cannot tell the
 whole story and they must examine how various measures interact. Examples:
 - o In Utah, if there is an increase in cases in a population that have moderate symptoms and a low burden on the hospital capacity, it will not have to strengthen policies. However, if there are vulnerable groups that have been infected and there is added strain to the hospital system then they would have to readdress their policies in that region.
 - o In Alaska, they have not had any additional hospitalizations in the past week so any person admitted to the hospital will be an immediate warning sign. As a result, they will focus on the burden of the disease on the hospital capacity as a whole and the number of active vs. recovered cases in the State to guide their decisions.
- Some States will phase their reopening slowly by region rather than moving statewide all at once. This reflects how some States closed, county by county, based on number of cases.
 - New York has said that they will reopen their State in regional phases, as upstate is different than New York City.
 - Oregon has released a draft plan that would allow counties to reopen if they meet certain criteria and requirements, including: letters from hospital leaders promising to report daily PPE supply to State leaders and a recommendation from the County's public health officer.
 - These considerations include discussions on how travel would be affected and coordination is needed to prevent potential spread.

MESSAGING CONSIDERATIONS

- · Confidence of citizens as a factor in reopening.
- Many leaders are concerned about "mitigation fatigue" and the toll isolation is having on historically marginalized individuals.
- Normal cultural communication channels have been restricted (e.g. churches, schools, etc.).
- Language- and cultural-specific information is important in some communities.
- Some state leaders are thinking through natural movements within their state and across state
 lines and the need for corresponding discussion guidance (e.g. commute movements, vacation
 patterns, recreational/leisure locations, etc.).




Wanted to make you aware of some work the DHS Science &Tech (S&T) is doing in support of COVID-19. Given the unique capabilities of S&T's National Biodefense Analysis and Countermeasures Center (NBACC) in Maryland, we have significant experience and well-established capabilities to determine how well the virus survives on surfaces and while suspended in air. In addition, NBACC has conducted decontamination research that will inform our operational response. Results from S&T NBACC's efforts are preliminary but wanted to make sure you were aware due to their operational relevance.



Key findings from Bill's team includes:

- Surface Stability: When deposited on a nonporous surface like stainless steel, the SARS-CoV-2 virus appears most stable at lower humidity and temperature and is less stable as temperature and humidity increase. DHS S&T is incorporating these findings into operational recommendations such as: if a location needs to be remediated due to a COVID-19 (+) individual having occupied the area and the area is going to be left dormant for a period, raising the indoor heat and humidity appears to reduce the overall hazard. Moreover, solar radiation seems to rapidly inactivate the virus. Taken together this suggests that outdoor surfaces exposed to direct sunlight are lower risk for virus transmission. We have also seen that the size of the particle impacts its stability on a surface, with smaller droplets (5μL) being more stable than larger (50μL) droplets. Going forward with the data from these studies, NBACC is developing a model that will be able to predict how quickly the virus will inactivate as a function of temperature, humidity, and solar intensity.
- Disinfectant Testing: Results have verified the usefulness of two commercially available and EPA recommended disinfectants on at least one key surface type, stainless steel. Use of common disinfectants such as Clorox®, Germicidal Bleach, and 70% Isopropyl alcohol are effective when used to manufacturers' specifications for both dried (residual virus) and wet (recent cough or sneeze) virus deposits in saliva. NBACC will be testing several other commercially available disinfectants to verify that they are effective against the virus in complex matrices.
- Aerosol Stability: Artificial sunlight rapidly kills the virus in aerosolized droplets, as would be created in a sneeze. This suggests that outdoor environments during daylight hours are lower risk for transmission.

Guatemala] Guatemala: US deportations driving up COVID-19 cases (AP) AP [4/14/2020 8:44 PM, Sonia Pérez D., 1670K]

Guatemala's health minister said Tuesday that deportees from the United States were driving up the country's COVID-19 caseload, adding that on one flight some 75% of the deportees tested positive for the virus.

Health Minister Hugo Monroy's comments were dramatically out of line with what the government had previously said about infected deportees. Later, presidential spokesman Carlos Sandoval told reporters that Monroy was referring to a March flight on which "between 50% and 75% (of the passengers) during all their time in isolation and quarantine have come back positive."

Before Tuesday, Guatemala had only reported three positive infections among deportees flown back by the United States.

Joaquín Samayoa, spokesman for the foreign affairs ministry, confirmed a fourth positive case for a migrant who arrived on a flight Monday. At least three of the migrants who arrived Monday were taken directly to a hospital for COVID-19 testing.

President Alejandro Giammattei addressed the nation later, but made no mention of the deportees. It remained unclear why before Tuesday the government had only reported three deportees who tested positive and how many more would have been among the high percentage who tested positive aboard that March flight. Giammattei said Tuesday there were a total of 175 people who had tested positive in Guatemala and five who had died.

"There are really flights where the deportees arrive ... citizens who come with fever, and they get on the planes that way," Monroy said. "We automatically evaluate them here and test them and many of them have come back positive."

He added that the United States had practically become the Wuhan of the region, referring to the Chinese province where the pandemic began.

Guatemala again began receiving deportation flights from the United States Monday after a one-week pause prompted by three deportees testing positive for COVID-19.

The Guatemalan government had asked the United States to not send more than 25 deportees per flight, to give them health exams before departure and to certify that they were not infected.

However, the flights resumed Monday with 76 migrants aboard the first and 106 on the

second. Guatemala's foreign ministry did not immediately clarify why the U.S. had not complied with its requirements, but the flights came on the same day that the U.S. State Department announced that aid would continue to Guatemala and the other Northern Triangle countries.

One of Monday's flights also included 16 unaccompanied minors, according to the Guatemalan Immigration Institute.

Since January, the U.S. has deported nearly 12,000 Guatemalans, including more than 1,200 children.

Citing the epidemic, the U.S. has started swiftly deporting unaccompanied minors rather than holding them in protective settings as specified by law.

Also on Monday, U.S. Secretary of State Mike Pompeosaid in a statement that he had informed Congress that the U.S. government would continue assistance for Guatemala, El Salvador and Honduras in order to continue to lower illegal immigration and accomplish other policy objectives.

Pompeo said that since illegal immigration from those three countries peaked in May 2019, "encounters" with migrants from those countries had fallen by 76%. The U.S. government has effectively ended any possibility of seeking asylum at the southern border with emergency restrictions applied in the face of the epidemic.

Before the epidemic, the U.S. had also started sending Hondurans and Salvadorans to Guatemala and similarly had agreements in place to begin doing so in Honduras and El Salvador.

Deportations from the U.S. have continued despite the outbreak. The United States holds about 34,000 people in immigration detention, down from about 37,000 last month.

U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement says 77 detainees have tested positive for the coronavirus.

Acting Deputy Homeland Security Director Ken Cuccinelli told reporters Tuesday that U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement has released nearly 700 people from immigration detention around the country because their age or health conditions made them vulnerable to the virus. He also said authorities were taking steps to ensure that people who may have been exposed in custody are kept separate from other detainees.


"ICE is certainly committed to ensuring that comprehensive medical care is provided for all of their detainees from the moment they arrive in ICE custody through the entirety of their stay," Cuccinelli said.

The administration on Friday issued a memo authorizing the use of visa sanctions to punish any nation that "denies or unreasonably delays" taking its citizens as they are deported from the U.S. amid tightened border enforcement imposed last month as a result of the COVID-19 outbreak. Officials have declined to identify any countries that may have prompted the announcement.

For most people, the new coronavirus causes mild or moderate symptoms, such as fever and cough that clear up in two to three weeks. For some, especially older adults and people with existing health problems, it can cause more severe illness, including pneumonia and death.

- 1. With respect to the "catch-up flights", Guatemala agreed to the standard 5 flights the week after next, as well as 3 additional flights. 8 total to help make up for those not flown this week.
- However, Guatemala has again changed its agreement regarding flights tomorrow and this
 week. The GOG is now indicating that they are closing all roads this week out of Guatemala City
 due to
 - COVID-related health issues. Accordingly, they state they no longer will be able to bus anyone this week from the flights to other parts of Guatemala.
- 3. While State continues to press, there is a possible partial work through. Given the ever-shifting discussion, I asked Marlen this afternoon to request receiving the 75 nationals (14 UACs) who live in either



(The complete chain, including Hugo's commentary, is below the signature block). Valerie and the team will connect with ICE on the feasibility of the proposal and logistics.

Summary By WHA (Amb. Kozak):

"Very useful call with the Ecuadorian FM. On removals he confirmed:

• 100 every 14 days. Per the WH call today I said DHS would want to bring people back in smaller groups like 15-20 at a time, not in blocks of 100. He said fine as long as the total does not exceed 100 over 14 day period. (At the end of the call I said if the numbers here increased

we might in the future have to come back and ask for a few more than 100 and he said sure they would be open to that discussion if it proved necessary. So that was just a marker to keep the quantity issue open if we need it.)

- On transits from other countries like Brazil he said fine. As long as they did not get off the







I wanted to highlight a few issues for announcement that the TF should consider in the days ahead. In no particular order

- Real ID announcement this is ready to go anytime. Primary reason to delay is the
 inability of folks to get into DMVs to apply for and receive their Real ID. We would
 delay for 12 months. DHS Secretary has the authority but POTUS/VPOTUS may want to
 announce.
- • H2A announcement this will be ready to announce mid-week. We have a number of measures that will ensure that agriculture workers will be available during this period.
- • FEMA Grants this will be ready to announce mid-week. We will likely allow states to use larger amounts of their grant funding for COVID related activities.
- DOD Troops to the Border this will be ready to announce Sunday/Monday (or whenever DOD approves). DHS sent DOD an RFA for 1,500 troops for both the northern and southern border. They will be providing support to CBP agents.

NBACC's Emerging Results: Surface Stability *Indoor Conditions*

 What is being tested: how long does the virus survive (remain infectious) in a wet droplet of saliva (e.g., from cough/sneeze) and a dried droplet of saliva on stainless steel at different temperatures, humidity, and with or without sunlight

Results

- The virus is more stable at low humidity and inactivates faster at higher humidity
- The virus is more stable at low temperatures and inactivates faster as temperature increases
- Sunlight destroys the virus very quickly

Operational Relevance


- Overall risk of transmission from surfaces outdoors is lower during daylight hours
- Increasing temperature and humidity of indoor environments will reduce viral contamination on surfaces
- Surfaces in low humidity environments (e.g., airplane cabins) may require additional care to minimize risk of transmission

Why stainless steel?

- NBACC had already established methods for recovery off of this surface (generate data quickly)
- Generally, in our experience, nonporous surfaces are more conducive to biological stability than porous surfaces (like cloth or cardboard)
 - Thus, data generated on this surface will likely be a conservative, or worst-case, estimate of decay
- Methods for recovery off of porous surfaces are not well developed and hard to make repeatable/reproducible
- NBACC plans to validate findings on other surface types and on nonporous surfaces in future tests



NBACC's Emerging Results: SARS-CoV-2 Stability on *Indoor Surfaces*



Summary:

- Virus is most stable at low RH (20%) and decays faster at RH >40%
- Virus is less stable at higher temperatures

Operational Relevance:

If a location has a COVID-19 (+) individual and is going to be vacated, turn up indoor heat & humidity if possible.

Ongoing and planned work:

Development of an equation to predict virus decay at any intermediate temperature & humidity combination (next week)



NBACC's Emerging Results: SARS-CoV-2 Stability on Indoor Surfaces



Results:

Simulated sunlight greatly increases inactivation rate of virus dried on surfaces (relative to darkness)

Solar Intensity	Half-Live (Min)
Full Intensity	~2 min
Hall Intensity	3 min
Quarter Intensity	4 min
No Light (Dark	No decay > 60 min

Frame of Reference:

Full intensity ~ NYC/DC during clear day on summer solstice

Quarter Intensity ~ NYC/ DC clear day end of February

Sunlight reduced infectious virus to undetectable levels after just 3 minutes of exposure to the solar equivalent of midday sun on a sunny day in the mid-latitudes of the US.

Summary:

Simulated solar light rapidly inactivated the virus (outdoor)

Operational Relevance:

Outdoor surfaces exposed to sunlight are lower risk for virus transmission

Ongoing and planned work:

Repeat with a higher concentration of virus to better understand decay kinetics (rate)

What else needs to be known:

- How much virus does it take to infect?
- 2. How much virus is on the surface?
- 3. How much virus comes off when touched?

Summary:

0.26% hypochlorite (bleach) OR 70% isopropyl alcohol killed SARS-CoV-2 in both wet and dried saliva on stainless steel

Operational Relevance:

Commercially available & EPA recommended disinfectants (Bleach & IPA) used as recommended are effective at disinfecting both old (dried) and freshly (wet) contaminated saliva on a non-porous surface.

Ongoing and planned work:

- Test shorter contact times for effective cleaners;
- Test more commercial off-the-shelf products (Lysol spray, peracetic acid, Clorox hydrogen peroxide cleaner, etc)







Preliminary Data Summary:

- Virus suspended in saliva treated with full intensity simulated sunlight rapidly inactivated virus in aerosols
 - Half life: ~2-3 minutes at room temp, 20%RH
 - 90% decrease in virus in ~9-10 minutes
- Without simulated sunlight, no significant loss of virus was detected in 60 minutes (room temp, 20%RH)
- Sunlight increases inactivation of infectious virus in aerosols (coughs, sneezes)

Operational Relevance:

- Outdoor daytime environments are lower risk for transmission
- Importance of respiratory protection for staff who may be in close proximity to infected individuals indoors
- Increasing air exchange rates indoors may reduce risk

Ongoing and planned work:

Testing with additional solar and relative humidity levels

Project: PPE Decon & Reuse

- Verify vaporous hydrogen peroxide (VHP) techniques are effective against SARS-CoV-2 with a range of mask types
 - Evaluate both biological decay and physical degradation & fit
- Test additional small-scale, low-tech techniques that could be implemented in lower-resource settings
 - Looking at devices such as rice cookers, clothes steamers, electric pressure cookers

Project: Waste stream survivability

 Understand the survival of the virus in human waste streams to inform decontamination and remediation decisions

In addition the healthcare relevance, may impact DHS operations along the border, especially in low-resource or improvised settings (e.g., using port-a-johns)

GUIDANCE FOR CLEANING & DISINFECTING PUBLIC SPACES, WORKPLACES, BUSINESSES, SCHOOLS, AND HOMES

1 DEVELOP YOUR PLAN

DETERMINE WHAT NEEDS TO BE CLEANED.

Areas unoccupied for 7 or more days need only routine cleaning. Maintain existing cleaning practices for outdoor areas.

DETERMINE HOW AREAS WILL BE DISINFECTED. Consider the type of surface and how often the surface is touched. Prioritize disinfecting frequently touched surfaces.

CONSIDER THE RESOURCES AND EQUIPMENT NEEDED. Keep in mind the availability of cleaning products and personal protective equipment (PPE) appropriate for cleaners and disinfectants.

Follow guidance from state, tribal, local, and territorial authorities.

2 IMPLEMENT

CLEAN VISIBLY DIRTY SURFACES WITH SOAP AND WATER prior to disinfection.

USE THE APPROPRIATE CLEANING OR DISINFECTANT PRODUCT. Use an EPA-approved disinfectant against COVID-19, and read the label to make sure it meets your needs.

ALWAYS FOLLOW THE DIRECTIONS ON THE LABEL. The label will include safety information and application instructions. Keep disinfectants out of the reach of children.

3 MAINTAIN AND REVISE

CONTINUE ROUTINE CLEANING AND DISINFECTION.

Continue or revise your plan based upon appropriate disinfectant and PPE availability. Dirty surfaces should be cleaned with soap and water prior to disinfection. Routinely disinfect frequently touched surfaces at least daily.

MAINTAIN SAFE PRACTICES such as frequent handwashing, using cloth face coverings, and staying home if you are sick.

CONTINUE PRACTICES THAT REDUCE THE POTENTIAL FOR EXPOSURE. Maintain social distancing, staying six feet away from others. Reduce sharing of common spaces and frequently touched objects.

MAKING YOUR PLAN TO CLEAN AND DISINFECT

Cleaning with soap and water removes germs, dirt, and impurities from surfaces. It lowers the risk of spreading infection. **Disinfecting** kills germs on surfaces. By killing germs on a surface after cleaning, it can further lower the risk of spreading infection.



Is the area indoors?





Maintain existing cleaning practices.

Coronaviruses naturally die in hours to days in typical indoor and outdoor environments. Viruses are killed more quickly by warmer temperatures and sunlight.



Consult EPA's list of disinfectants for use against COVID-19, specifically for use on hard, non-porous surfaces and for your specific application need. More frequent cleaning and disinfection is necessary to reduce exposure.

Soft and porous materials like carpet, rugs, or material in seating areas.

Thoroughly clean or launder materials.

Consider removing soft and porous materials in high traffic areas. Disinfect materials if appropriate products are available.

GUIDANCE FOR CLEANING AND DISINFECTING PUBLIC SPACES, WORKPLACES, BUSINESSES, SCHOOLS, AND HOMES

This guidance is intended for all Americans, whether you own a business, run a school, or want to ensure the cleanliness and safety of your home. Reopening America requires all of us to move forward together by practicing social distancing and other <u>daily habits</u> to reduce our risk of exposure to the virus that causes COVID-19. Reopening the country also strongly relies on public health strategies, including increased testing of people for the virus, social distancing, isolation, and keeping track of how someone infected might have infected other people. This plan is part of the larger <u>United States Government plan</u> and focuses on cleaning and disinfecting public spaces, workplaces, businesses, schools, and can also be applied to your home.

Cleaning and disinfecting public spaces including your workplace, school, home, and business will require you to:

- · Develop your plan
- · Implement your plan
- · Maintain and revise your plan

Reducing the risk of exposure to COVID-19 by cleaning and disinfection is an important part of reopening public spaces that will require careful planning. Every American has been called upon to slow the spread of the virus through social distancing and prevention hygiene, such as frequently washing your hands and wearing face coverings. Everyone also has a role in making sure our communities are as safe as possible to reopen and remain open.

The virus that causes COVID-19 can be killed if you use the right products. EPA has compiled a list of disinfectant products that can be used against COVID-19, including ready-to-use sprays, concentrates, and wipes. Each product has been shown to be effective against viruses that are harder to kill than viruses like the one that causes COVID-19.







This document provides a general framework for cleaning and disinfection practices. The framework is based on doing the following:

- 1. Normal routine cleaning with soap and water will decrease how much of the virus is on surfaces and objects, which reduces the risk of exposure.
- 2. Disinfection using <u>EPA-approved disinfectants against COVID-19</u> can also help reduce the risk. Frequent disinfection of surfaces and objects touched by multiple people is important.
- 3. When <u>EPA-approved disinfectants</u> are not available, alternative disinfectants can be used (for example, 1/3 cup of bleach added to 1 gallon of water, or 70% alcohol solutions). Do not mix bleach or other cleaning and disinfection products together--this can cause fumes that may be very dangerous to breathe in. Keep all disinfectants out of the reach of children.

Links to specific recommendations for many public spaces that use this framework, can be found at the end of this document. *It's important to continue to follow federal, state, tribal, territorial, and local guidance for reopening America.*

A Few Important Reminders about Coronaviruses and Reducing the Risk of Exposure:

- Coronaviruses on surfaces and objects naturally die within hours to days. Warmer temperatures and exposure to sunlight will reduce the time the virus survives on surfaces and objects.
- Normal routine cleaning with soap and water removes germs and dirt from surfaces. It lowers the risk of spreading COVID-19 infection.
- Disinfectants kill germs on surfaces. By killing germs on a surface after cleaning, you can further lower the risk of spreading infection. <u>EPA-approved disinfectants</u> are an important part of reducing the risk of exposure to COVID-19. If disinfectants on this list are in short supply, alternative disinfectants can be used (for example, 1/3 cup of bleach added to 1 gallon of water, or 70% alcohol solutions).
- Store and use disinfectants in a responsible and appropriate manner according to the label. Do not mix bleach or other cleaning and disinfection products together--this can cause fumes that may be very dangerous to breathe in. Keep all disinfectants out of the reach of children.
- Do not overuse or stockpile disinfectants or other supplies. This can result in shortages of appropriate products for others to use
 in critical situations.
- Always wear gloves appropriate for the chemicals being used when you are cleaning and disinfecting. Additional personal
 protective equipment (PPE) may be needed based on setting and product. For more information, see CDC's website on Cleaning
 and Disinfection for Community Facilities.
- Practice social distancing, wear facial coverings, and follow proper prevention hygiene, such as washing your hands frequently and using alcohol-based (at least 60% alcohol) hand sanitizer when soap and water are not available.

If you oversee staff in a workplace, your plan should include considerations about the safety of custodial staff and other people who are carrying out the cleaning or disinfecting. These people are at increased risk of being exposed to the virus and to any toxic effects of the cleaning chemicals. These staff should wear appropriate PPE for cleaning and disinfecting. To protect your staff and to ensure that the products are used effectively, staff should be instructed on how to apply the disinfectants according to the label. For more information on concerns related to cleaning staff, visit the Occupational Safety and Health Administration's website on Control and Prevention.

DEVELOP YOUR PLAN

Evaluate your workplace, school, home, or business to determine what kinds of surfaces and materials make up that area. Most surfaces and objects will just need normal routine cleaning. Frequently touched surfaces and objects like light switches and doorknobs will need to be cleaned and then disinfected to further reduce the risk of germs on surfaces and objects.

- · First, clean the surface or object with soap and water.
- · Then, disinfect using an EPA-approved disinfectant.
- If an EPA-approved disinfectant is unavailable, you can use 1/3 cup of bleach added to 1 gallon of water, or 70% alcohol solutions to disinfect. Do not mix bleach or other cleaning and disinfection products together. Find additional information at CDC's website on Cleaning and Disinfecting Your Facility.

You should also consider what items can be moved or removed completely to reduce frequent handling or contact from multiple people. Soft and porous materials, such as area rugs and seating, may be removed or stored to reduce the challenges with cleaning and disinfecting them. Find additional guidance on making a plan on CDC's website on <u>PLACEHOLDER</u>.

It is critical that your plan includes how to maintain a cleaning and disinfecting strategy after reopening. Develop a flexible plan with your staff or family, adjusting the plan as federal, state, tribal, territorial, or local guidance is updated and if your specific circumstances change.

Determine what needs to be cleaned

Some surfaces only need to be cleaned with soap and water. For example, surfaces and objects that are not frequently touched should be cleaned and do not require additional disinfection. Additionally, disinfectants should typically not be applied on items used by children, especially any items that children might put in their mouths. Many disinfectants are toxic when swallowed. In a household setting, cleaning toys and other items used by children with soap and water is usually sufficient. Find more information on cleaning and disinfection toys and other surfaces in the childcare program setting at CDC's Guidance for Childcare Programs that Remain Open.

These questions will help you decide which surfaces and objects will need normal routine cleaning.

Is the area outdoors?

Outdoor areas generally require normal routine cleaning and do not require disinfection. Spraying disinfectant on sidewalks and in parks is not an efficient use of disinfectant supplies and has not been proven to reduce the risk of COVID-19 to the public. You should maintain existing cleaning and hygiene practices for outdoor areas.

The targeted use of disinfectants can be done effectively, efficiently and safely on outdoor hard surfaces and objects frequently touched by multiple people. Certain outdoor areas and facilities, such as bars and restaurants, may have additional requirements. More information can be found on CDC's website on <u>Food Safety and the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)</u>.

There is no evidence that the virus that causes COVID-19 can spread directly to humans from water in pools, hot tubs or spas, or water play areas. Proper operation, maintenance, and disinfection (for example, with chlorine or bromine) of pools, hot tubs or spas, and water playgrounds should kill the virus that causes COVID-19. However, there are additional concerns with outdoor areas that may be maintained less frequently, including playgrounds, or other facilities located within local, state, or national parks. For more information, visit CDC's website on <u>Visiting Parks & Recreational Facilities</u>.

Has the area been unoccupied for the last 7 days?

If your workplace, school, or business has been unoccupied for 7 days or more, it will only need your normal routine cleaning to reopen the area. This is because the virus that causes COVID-19 has not been shown to survive on surfaces longer than this time.

There are many public health considerations, not just COVID-19 related, when reopening public buildings and spaces that have been closed for extended periods. For example, take measures to ensure the <u>safety of your building water system</u>. It is not necessary to clean ventilation systems, other than routine maintenance, as part of reducing risk of coronaviruses. For healthcare facilities, additional guidance is provided on <u>CDC's Guidelines for Environmental Infection Control in Health-Care Facilities</u>.

Determine what needs to be disinfected

Following your normal routine cleaning, you can disinfect frequently touched surfaces and objects using a product from <u>EPA's list of approved products that are effective against COVID-19</u>.

These questions will help you choose appropriate disinfectants.

Are you cleaning or disinfecting a hard and non-porous material or item like glass, metal, or plastic?

Consult EPA's list of approved products for use against COVID-19. This list will help you determine the most appropriate disinfectant for the surface or object. You can use diluted household bleach solutions if appropriate for the surface. Pay special attention to the personal protective equipment (PPE) that may be needed to safely apply the disinfectant and the manufacturer's recommendations concerning any additional hazards. Keep all disinfectants out of the reach of children. Please visit CDC's website on How to Clean and Disinfect for additional details and warnings.

Examples of frequently touched surfaces and objects that will need routine disinfection following reopening are:

- · tables,
- doorknobs,
- · light switches,
- · countertops,
- · handles,
- · desks,
- phones,

- · keyboards,
- · toilets,
- · faucets and sinks,
- · gas pump handles,
- · touch screens, and
- · ATM machines.

Each business or facility will have different surfaces and objects that are frequently touched by multiple people. Appropriately disinfect these surfaces and objects. For example, transit stations have <u>specific guidance</u> for application of cleaning and disinfection.

Are you cleaning or disinfecting a soft and porous material or items like carpet, rugs, or seating in areas?

Soft and porous materials are generally not as easy to disinfect as hard and non-porous surfaces. <u>EPA has listed a limited number of products approved for disinfection for use on soft and porous materials</u>. Soft and porous materials that are not frequently touched should only be cleaned or laundered, following the directions on the item's label, using the warmest appropriate water setting. Find more information on <u>CDC's website on Cleaning and Disinfecting Your Facility</u> for developing strategies for dealing with soft and porous materials.

Consider the resources and equipment needed

Keep in mind the availability of cleaning and disinfection products and appropriate PPE. Always wear gloves appropriate for the chemicals being used for routine cleaning and disinfecting. Follow the directions on the disinfectant label for additional PPE needs. In specific instances, personnel with specialized training and equipment may be required to apply certain disinfectants such as fumigants or fogs. For more information on appropriate PPE for cleaning and disinfection, see CDC">CDC's website on Cleaning and Disinfection for Community Facilities.

IMPLEMENT YOUR PLAN

Once you have a plan, it's time to take action. Read all manufacturer's instructions for the cleaning and disinfection products you will use. Put on your gloves and other required personal protective equipment (PPE) to begin the process of cleaning and disinfecting.

Clean visibly dirty surfaces with soap and water

Clean surfaces and objects using soap and water prior to disinfection. Always wear gloves appropriate for the chemicals being used for routine cleaning and disinfecting. Follow the directions on the disinfectant label for additional PPE needs. When you finish cleaning, remember to wash hands thoroughly with soap and water.

Clean or launder soft and porous materials like seating in an office or coffee shop, area rugs, and carpets. Launder items according to the manufacturer's instructions, using the warmest temperature setting possible and dry items completely.

Use the appropriate cleaning or disinfectant product

<u>EPA approved disinfectants</u>, when applied according to the manufacturer's label, are effective for use against COVID-19. Follow the instructions on the label for all cleaning and disinfection products for concentration, dilution, application method, contact time and any other special considerations when applying.

Always follow the directions on the label

Follow the instructions on the label to ensure safe and effective use of the product. Many product labels recommend keeping the surface wet for a specific amount of time. The label will also list precautions such as wearing gloves and making sure you have good ventilation during use of the product. Keep all disinfectants out of the reach of children.

MAINTAIN AND REVISE YOUR PLAN

Take steps to reduce your risk of exposure to the virus that causes COVID-19 during daily activities. <u>CDC provides tips</u> to reduce your exposure and risk of acquiring COVID-19. Reducing exposure to yourself and others is a shared responsibility. Continue to update your plan based on updated guidance and your current circumstances.

Continue routine cleaning and disinfecting

Routine cleaning and disinfecting are an important part of reducing the risk of exposure to COVID-19. Normal routine cleaning with soap and water alone can reduce risk of exposure and is a necessary step before you disinfect dirty surfaces.

Surfaces frequently touched by multiple people, such as door handles, desks, phones, light switches, and faucets, should be cleaned and disinfected at least daily. More frequent cleaning and disinfection may be required based on level of use. For example, certain surfaces and objects in public spaces, such as shopping carts and point of sale keypads, should be cleaned and disinfected before each use.

Consider choosing a different disinfectant if your first choice is in short supply. Make sure there is enough supply of gloves and appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE) based on the label, the amount of product you will need to apply, and the size of the surface you are treating.

Maintain safe behavioral practices

We have all had to make significant behavioral changes to reduce the spread of COVID-19. To reopen America, we will need to continue these practices:

- · social distancing (specifically, staying 6 feet away from others when you must go into a shared space)
- · frequently washing hands or use alcohol-based (at least 60% alcohol) hand sanitizer when soap and water are not available
- · wearing cloth face coverings
- · avoiding touching eyes, nose, and mouth
- · staying home when sick
- · cleaning and disinfecting frequently touched objects and surfaces

It's important to continue to follow federal, state, tribal, territorial, and local guidance for reopening America. Check this resource for <u>updates on COVID-19</u>. This will help you change your plan when situations are updated.

Consider practices that reduce the potential for exposure

It is also essential to change the ways we use public spaces to work, live, and play. We should continue thinking about our safety and the safety of others.

To reduce your exposure to or the risk of spreading COVID-19 after reopening your business or facility, consider whether you need to touch certain surfaces or materials. Consider wiping public surfaces before and after you touch them. These types of behavioral adjustments can help reduce the spread of COVID-19. There are other resources for more information on COVID-19 and how to Prevent Getting Sick.

Another way to reduce the risk of exposure is to make long-term changes to practices and procedures. These could include reducing the use of porous materials used for seating, leaving some doors open to reduce touching by multiple people, opening windows to improve ventilation, or removing objects in your common areas, like coffee creamer containers. There are many other steps that businesses and institutions can put into place to help reduce the spread of COVID-19 and protect their staff and the public. More information can be found at CDC's Implementation of Mitigation Strategies for Communities with Local COVID-19 Transmission.

CONCLUSION

Reopening America requires all of us to move forward together using recommended best practices and maintaining safe daily habits in order to reduce our risk of exposure to COVID-19. Remember: We're all in this together!





CBP Officers Seize Fake COVID-19 Test Kits at LAX

Suspected Counterfeit Test Kits Mislabeled as "Purified Water Vials"

LOS ANGELES - U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) officers assigned to Los Angeles International Airport (LAX), International Mail Facility (IMF), intercepted a package containing suspected counterfeit COVID-19 test kits arriving from the United Kingdom.

On March 12, 2020, CBP officers discovered six plastic bags containing various vials, while conducting an enforcement examination of a parcel manifested as "Purified Water Vials" with a declared value of \$196.81. A complete examination of the shipment, led to the finding of vials filled with a white liquid and labeled "Corona Virus 2019nconv (COVID-19)" and "Virus1 Test Kit". The shipment was turned over to the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for analysis.

"Protecting the health and safety of the American people is a top priority for CBP," said Carlos C. Martel, CBP Director of Field Operations in Los Angeles. "This significant interception, at a time when the U.S. is in the midst of a National Emergency, demonstrates our CBP officers' vigilance and commitment to ensure dangerous goods are intercepted and not a threat to our communities and our people."

Authorized diagnostic testing for COVID-19 is conducted in verified state and local public health laboratories across the United States. The American public should be aware of bogus home testing kits for sale either online or in informal direct to consumer settings.

"CBP commits substantial resources to detect, intercept and seize illicit goods arriving in the air package environment," said LaFonda Sutton-Burke, CBP Port Director at LAX. "Smugglers are constantly attempting to take advantage of consumers by disguising their illicit goods as legitimate shipments."

GUATEMALA CITY (AP) — Guatemala's president questioned his country's relationship with the United States, revealing frustration over the U.S. continuing to send deportees infected with COVID-19 to a country struggling to manage the crisis.

"This of allies with the United States isn't true," President Alejandro Giammattei said Thursday. "Guatemala is an ally of the United States, but the United States is not Guatemala's ally. They don't treat us like an ally."

Giammattei is the first of the region's leaders to speak out against the U.S. policy that has sent thousands of deportees back to their countries since the pandemic began.

Guatemala has confirmed 119 deportees arrived with COVID-19 from the United States. The country has suspended the deportation flights on several occasions after infected passengers were detected, but resumed them after assurances from U.S. authorities.

The last flight with deportees who tested positive in Guatemala arrived May 13 from Alexandria, Louisiana. Officials have said 16 of them have tested positive.

A U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement spokesperson confirmed this week that all 65 migrants aboard that flight had been tested prior to departure. Fifteen more Guatemalans scheduled to be on that flight tested positive and were returned to detention facilities where they were isolated from other detainees.

Guatemala has identified cases from previous flights where it appeared some had been tested and certified as negative a week before their departure.

Giammattei said the infected deportees were creating "serious problems" in his country's already overloaded health system.

"The United States has helped other countries including with ventilators and to us nothing has come, not even chopped corn," he said during an online appearance with the Atlantic Council's Adrienne Arsht Latin America Center. "We don't feel very grateful for the way we have been treated."

Giammattei appeared to be referring to medical aid sent to Mexico, El Salvador and Honduras, all governments receiving deportees without complaint. Last month, Giammattei was notably absent from a list of phone calls U.S. President Donald Trump made to the presidents of El Salvador and Honduras offering aid and encouragement.

"We understand the United States wants to deport people, but what we don't understand is that they send the flights all contaminated," he said.


Guatemala has not accepted a flight yet this week.

Political analyst Renzo Rosal said the issue was raising tensions between the two countries "because the United States has shamelessly continued sending infected migrants and has not complied with what it offered."

When it unveiled <u>an unprecedented order</u> last month to swiftly expel virtually all unauthorized migrants from the U.S. southern border, the Trump administration said potentially infected foreigners could spread the coronavirus in the U.S., prompt outbreaks in immigration jails and strain public health resources along border communities.

But in a paradoxical twist, Guatemala, the largest source of migration to the U.S.-Mexico border in recent years, fears the U.S. is exporting the virus there through deportation flights.

At least 99 migrants recently deported to Guatemala by the U.S. have tested positive for coronavirus as of Sunday, according to the nation's public health ministry. Deportees from the U.S. make up nearly 20% of the 500 coronavirus cases in Guatemala, which has had 15 pandemic-related deaths.

"I do believe that the U.S. is exporting the virus," California Representative Norma Torres, the sole Central American in Congress and an immigrant from Guatemala, told CBS News.

The cases among deported migrants have alarmed the public in Guatemala and its U.S.-aligned government, which indefinitely suspended deportation flights from the U.S. earlier this month. Guatemala's government, which has allowed two "humanitarian" flights in the past two weeks to receive repatriated children and families, has said it will only permit the resumption of regular deportation flights once the U.S. improves its screening protocols.

Experts and advocates warn that continued deportations from the U.S., the global epicenter of the pandemic, would pose a major threat to Guatemala, a developing country with rampant economic and public health inequities that has relatively few coronavirus cases. As of Sunday, the U.S. reported nearly 1 million confirmed cases and almost 55,000 coronavirus-related deaths — by far the most of any country in both instances.

"It could be a huge, almost insurmountable problem," Anthony Fontes, a professor at American University who specializes in Central America and migration from the region, told CBS News. "Guatemala is one of the poorest countries in the hemisphere. It has an

extremely unequal society in which most of the wealth is concentrated in the top one percent, even more than in the U.S."

Torres, the California congresswoman, said the countries in Central America's "Northern Triangle," where the bulk of U.S.-bound migration originates, don't have the health care systems to combat large outbreaks inside their borders. "They don't have the number of the test kits available to even understand what has already been brought and exported to their countries," she added.

Fontes, who is in central Guatemala conducting research on the pandemic's impact on migration patterns in the region, said another concern for the country is deportations by land from Mexico, which have continued despite the freeze on repatriation flights. In addition to rapidly deporting migrants to their home countries under the public health order, U.S. officials at the southern border have been expelling Guatemalans and other Central Americans to Mexico. As of last week, 9,745 Guatemalan migrants have been deported through Mexico this year, including 780 this month, according to Guatemala's migration agency.

Fontes said the continued influx of buses from Mexico carrying Guatemalan migrants who journeyed to the U.S. could hinder the country's sweeping measures to contain the pandemic. "Efforts to suppress movement and the spread of the virus just won't work when you have literally deportees coming through like a leaking ship," he observed.

Guatemala isn't the only country that has reported coronavirus cases among people deported by the U.S. At least three deportees in Haiti, the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere, have tested positive, <u>according to Reuters</u>.

In response to those concerns, U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement, or ICE, the agency in charge of repatriating people, announced earlier this month the deployment of a team from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, or CDC, to Guatemala to "review" and "validate" coronavirus tests conducted by Guatemalan health officials on deportees.

Coronavirus cases among the more than 30,000 immigrants in ICE custody surged last week, reaching 317 on Friday. At least 35 ICE employees at detention centers have also tested positive for the virus, according to the agency's latest tally. As of early last week, officials had tested 425 detainees.

On Friday, ICE pledged to use 2,000 test kits the agency said it will be receiving from the Department of Health and Human Services every month to screen some migrants for the virus before deporting them. An ICE spokesperson said the logistics on testing are being worked out. Citing nationwide shortages, the spokesperson acknowledged the agency likely won't have enough test kits to screen all detainees slated to be deported, but said officials will prioritize based on "evolving operational considerations."

"The health and safety of migrants in our care and custody is of the highest priority," the ICE spokesperson said in a statement, adding that the U.S. Department of Homeland Security "is committed to working with State Department partners and foreign governments to ensure that their citizens can return home in a safe manner that takes into account the unique challenges the COVID-19 pandemic presents to public health."

In January and February, ICE deported more than 4,000 migrants to Guatemala each month, according to figures provided by the Guatemalan migration agency. In March, when U.S. officials started rapidly expelling unauthorized border-crossers under the public health order, the agency deported more than 2,900 people to Guatemala. In the first two weeks of April, before deportation flights were suspended, ICE deported more than 600 migrants.

The agency typically makes thousands of additional deportations monthly to other countries, like Honduras and El Salvador, which haven't suspended ICE flights. A spokesman for Honduras' migration agency said deportees are being quarantined and monitored by health officials.

Fontes, the immigration expert, said the 2,000 monthly test kits will be insufficient to ensure U.S. deportation flights aren't exporting the coronavirus, likening the measure to "putting lipstick on a pig." The announcement to test some would-be deportees, however, could serve as domestic "political cover" for the Guatemalan government to stop its freeze on deportation flights, Fontes added.

"The height of hypocrisy"

How long the Guatemalan government will be able to maintain its halt on deportation flights from the U.S. hinges on Washington's willingness to use the economic and political leverage it has over the Central American country, Fontes said. President Trump has already directed the State Department to deny visas to nationals of countries that deny or "unreasonably" delay the repatriation of their citizens during the pandemic.

Earlier this month, the State Department announced it would resume foreign aid to El Salvador, Honduras and Guatemala, which Mr. Trump suspended last spring, when he faulted the governments there for what he said were insufficient measures to curb an unprecedented migration wave of families from the region. The aid was restored, the State Department said, because the countries agreed to tighten their borders and sign agreements that let the U.S. re-route asylum-seekers to the region. Guatemala was the first to sign this accord last summer after being threatened with tariffs, a tax on remittances and a travel ban.

Last week, the U.S. announced it would be sending ventilators to El Salvador and Honduras. Asked if Guatemala was left out because of its freeze on deportations flights, Assistant Secretary of State Michael Kozak said he didn't know if the Guatemalan president had asked for them. "It's not that we haven't had a cooperative relationship with them, it's just they've run into some snags and we're working through that with

them," Kozak said, according to <u>a transcript of a briefing</u> with reporters. "But anyway, I think, as you've seen, there isn't some hard linkage here between cooperation on removals and ventilators."

"Guatemala is certainly in its rights to do this, but it's really about the pressure that Trump is willing to put on the Guatemalan government," Fontes said. "Will it come down to a choice of accepting aid or accepting deportees?"

Fontes said a pressure campaign by the U.S. to persuade Guatemala to accept deportation flights would be the latest episode in a decades-long pattern of uneven, heavy-handed American foreign policy tactics in the region that date back to the early 20th century and the Cold War. "U.S. intervention in this area of this type — efforts to contain communism, contain immigration, whatever it is — inevitably makes the problem worse," he said. "This place really is a tinderbox because of the severe inequality."

Instead of continuing the strategy, the U.S. should implement a temporary moratorium on deportations to Guatemala so the country can keep the pandemic at bay, Fontes said.

Instituting strict border restrictions due to the pandemic while continuing deportation flights carrying potentially infected migrants is "the height of hypocrisy," he remarked.

6 months, create a scale-down of the workforce and cause fiscal hardship. We understand the department may have some hesitancy regarding the award.

ASK: Given the factor ruling the day (COVID-19) and your request from the Shipbuilders Council to develop a needs plan; it seems counterintuitive to restrict and impair the working ability of this yard by limiting Eastern's capacity to support the supply chain, delay a program deemed critical to National Security and force potential layoffs. This program is fully funded and being executed exactly as stated in the federal contract.

If you have the opportunity to discuss the Offshore Patrol Cutter with DHS Secretary or USM, we would appreciate a reminder of this programs national significance and the critical path associated with timely departmental awards.
