MEMORANDUM FOR THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

In connection with this Bureau's investigation of the Comintern Apparatus which includes espionage agents, it has been determined that Arthur Adams, Room 1103 Peter Cooper Hotel, 130 East 39th Street, New York City, is a contact of Comintern and Soviet Secret Intelligence Service (NKVD) suspects in New York City. On September 25, 1944, in Chicago, Illinois, he held a clandestine meeting at night in a public park with an individual having access to most secret experimental data concerning the most highly guarded secret weapon of the United States Army. Documents of an unknown nature were exchanged between Adams and that individual.

I recommend authorization of a technical surveillance on the telephone of Arthur Adams, Caledonia 5-2670, for the purpose of determining the extent of his activities on behalf of Comintern Apparatus and for the additional purpose of determining the identities of espionage agents.

During the conversations between [Redacted] and representatives of this Bureau in [Redacted] September 25 and 26, 1944 mentioned was made that [Redacted]

was in charge of investigative activity in [Redacted] relating to persons connected with the [Redacted] of the experimental project being handled by the United States Army Engineers at Oakridge, Tennessee. At that time it was indicated by the Bureau's representatives that members of the Communist Political Association and representative of the Soviet Government had attempted to obtain secrets regarding this project.

On Monday, September 25, 1944, an individual named Arthur Adams, who has numerous Soviet and Communist contacts in New York City, met a professor attached to a laboratory in Chicago, Illinois, connected with this project, and exchanged certain information the nature of which we are attempting to determine.

Arthur Adams claims to be a Canadian citizen, born May 4, 1890, in Toronto, Canada. His father's name was Alexander Adams and his mother was Regina Ranto. According to information furnished by him to the United States Immigration Service and to Local Draft Board Number 15, New York City, he entered the United States by train through Buffalo, New York, on May 17, 1938, and had resided prior to that time at 223 King Street, West Toronto, Ontario. Adams claims to be a toolmaker with an eighth grade education and a member of the Royal Canadian Institute, 198 College Street, Toronto, Canada.

I would appreciate all information regarding Adams' background and activities which you might be able to develop. Please tell me whether, in your opinion, the individual known to us as Arthur Adams is in reality the person he claims to be. You will recall that in various instances in the past Soviet agents have obtained and used fraudulent Canadian birth certificates and passports.

Adams is now staying at the Peter Cooper Hotel in New York City and we are following his activities most closely. You will appreciate the urgency of my request.

Assuring you of my desire to cooperate with you in all matters of mutual interest.

**DETAILS:**

At Chicago, Illinois:

This is a joint investigation of Special Agents SPENCER H. ROBB, JOHN F. CLEVELLE, LEWIS D. HALLA, PETER P. MAXSON, JAMES E. MCARDLE, DAVID A. SILVER and the writer.

Referenced teletype from New York on September 21, 1944, advised that ARTHUR ADAMS was expected to arrive in Chicago on September

22, 1944, from New York City, and it was requested by the New York Office that the Chicago Field Division conduct a spot surveillance during the stay of ADAMS in this city. U

In accordance with the above teletype, a surveillance of ADAMS was taken up when he arrived in Chicago at 6:45 a.m., September 22, 1944. ADAMS immediately proceeded to the Stevens Hotel where he checked into Room 2348-A, which room he continued to occupy during his entire stay in Chicago. U

ADAMS met a woman, later identified as Dr. DEBORAH F. DAUBER, at the Hotel Stevens lobby at 11:45 a.m., September 22, 1944, three hours after his arrival in Chicago. In addition to this meeting, ADAMS was also observed to meet Dr. DEBORAH DAUBER for luncheon and other occasions when he spent considerable time with her on the following dates: Evening of September 22, 1944, at her office building, 3 S. Michigan; 9-25-44; 9-27-44 (twice). U

The woman who met ADAMS, referred to above, was identified as Dr. DEBORAH DAUBER through the license number of a tan Chevrolet automobile which she drove on several occasions when in company with ADAMS, and which license is an Illinois license, No. 426-342, listed to her; and also through the fact that after each meeting with ADAMS during the day, she was observed to enter the building at 3 S. Michigan Avenue and her name is listed on the building directory there. The Illinois Automobile Registration Records further reflected that Dr. DAUBER's home is at 5119 S. Kimbark Avenue, Chicago, Illinois. U

The detailed account of the surveillance maintained on ADAMS during his stay in Chicago is not being set out herein inasmuch as the only contacts made by ADAMS during his entire stay in Chicago, as noted by Agents of this office, were the numerous contacts with Dr. DAUBER enumerated above and a contact on the night of September 25, 1944, which will be described hereafter. U

During his stay in Chicago, ADAMS was not seen to make any contacts indicating that he was engaged in any commercial business in Chicago on this trip, but on the contrary, he spent most of his time in his room at the Stevens Hotel, sitting in the lobby of the Stevens, attending movies, window shopping and other similar casual occupations. U

The contact made by ADAMS on the night of Monday, September 25, 1944, took place as follows: U

Chicago File 100-11919

At 4:25 p.m. on this date, ADAMS was observed entering the building at 8 S. Michigan Avenue, where Dr. DABER has an office, as stated above. At 5:35 p.m., he emerged from this building and took a bus to the Stevens Hotel where he immediately went up to his room at 5:45 p.m. At 6:05 p.m. he came downstairs and ate in the Stevens' Drug Store. At 6:30 p.m., he caught a Drexel Boulevard bus proceeding south. At 6:50, he got off of this bus at 43rd Street and Drexel Boulevard and walked one block west. He then walked back to Drexel Boulevard and then one block south, and then crossed into the parkway in the center of Drexel Boulevard at 7:10 p.m. U

From 7:10 to 7:40 p.m. ADAMS sat on benches in this parkway and several times walked up and down the west side of the street in the 4300 Block of Drexel Boulevard. During this time, ADAMS twice entered the residence at 4330 S. Drexel Boulevard, but came out immediately each time, as if he had merely checked the names listed on the occupants' directory or had rang a bell and received no response. U

All of the above actions of ADAMS at this time were observed by Special Agents PETER F. MAXSON, BRUNGER E. ROBB and JOHN C. RILEY. U

At 7:40 p.m., the time of ADAMS' second entry into 4330 S. Drexel, he immediately emerged, as observed by Agents ROBB and RILEY, and thereafter he was observed by Special Agent ROBB to walk to the southwest corner of 43rd and Drexel where he met a tall, blond man, later identified as JOHN HITCHCOCK CHAPIN. ADAMS and CHAPIN then crossed Drexel Boulevard to the east side of the street and walked one-half a block south, then back to the southeast corner of 43rd and Drexel where something was observed by Special Agent ROBB to be passed between them. It appeared that this unidentified object was passed from ADAMS to CHAPIN, although Agent ROBB advises that due to the darkness, it is possible that this object was passed from CHAPIN to ADAMS, or that two objects might have been exchanged. U

Thereafter, ADAMS walked west on 43rd Street and entered the drug store on the southwest corner of 43rd and Drexel, and CHAPIN walked east to 927 S. 43rd, a grocery, where he made a purchase. U

As previously stated, the above meeting was observed only by Special Agent ROBB, but at this point ADAMS was observed by both Special Agents ROBB and RILEY to emerge from the drug store and to cross again to the southeast corner of 43rd and Drexel where he again met CHAPIN. ADAMS and CHAPIN then walked approximately a quarter of a block south on Drexel where they parted and CHAPIN crossed the street from there to 4330 S. Drexel where he entered and was not again observed. U

Thereafter, ADAMS returned to the southeast corner, stood there awhile, and then walked west one block to 43rd and Cottage Grove where he boarded a north bound street car at 8:00 p.m. and proceeded to the Chicago loop, alighting at Wabash and Balbo Drive from where he walked to the Playhouse World Theatre where he spent from approximately 8:20 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. U

JOHN HITCHCOCK CHAPIN was identified in the following manner. At the time he and ADAMS parted company and CHAPIN returned to 4330 S. Drexel. As described above, he was followed by Special Agents ROBB and RILEY. As CHAPIN entered this house, a woman was coming out, and she was asked if that was "HENRY", to which she replied that she did not know his name but that he does live at that address. On the following day, September 26, 1944, under pretext of looking for a Selective Service delinquent, Special Agents ROBB and RILEY talked to Mrs. BROSN, the landlady and owner of 4330 S. Drexel, who named and described all the men living at this residence. U

Referral/Consult

These included her husband and another elderly man, and also a tall, light-haired young man by the name of JOHN HITCHCOCK CHAPIN, who Mrs. BROSN stated is a Government employee working at the University of Chicago and who has traveled extensively in connection with this Government employment. U

In addition, Special Agents ROBB and RILEY had CHAPIN pointed out to them at the University of Chicago on September 29, 1944, by Confidential Informant F-2. At this latter time, it was apparent that CHAPIN was obviously the same man who had met ADAMS as stated.

Confidential Informant F-3 advised that ADAMS had no papers in his room indicating any subversive activity, showing any connections with Communist activities, or in any other way of interest to instant investigation, on the afternoon of September 23, 1944, the first day that he was in Chicago. U

Subsequently, on September 27, 1944, this informant stated that he had seen ADAMS' suitcase when it was open in the room but that all it contained was a money belt containing, in the informant's estimation, approximately four or five hundred dollars in bills of denominations of five, ten and twenty dollars. This same informant was requested to take handwriting specimens from subject's typewriter, which he did, and same are being forwarded to the Bureau. U

Confidential Informant F-4 advised that ADAMS had talked to one of the assistant managers at the Stevens Hotel regarding a room reservation there for approximately three weeks from the time that he left Chicago September 28, 1944. However, ADAMS did not confirm these reservations and consequently none were made for him at the hotel, so it is not known whether he will return to Chicago. U

On the afternoon of September 27, 1944, ADAMS attempted to change his reservation for a lower berth returning to New York September 28th to a bedroom or compartment. Mr. L. A. CHRISTENSEN, New York Central Ticket Agent at the City Ticket Office, 123 W. Jackson Boulevard, through whom ADAMS attempted to make this change, advised that ADAMS has been coming to Chicago approximately once every six months for the past eight to ten years, to his knowledge. Mr. CHRISTENSEN also stated that ADAMS had requested that his return reservations to New York be made in the name of the Electronic Corporation of America by whom he was employed and on whose business he was traveling, rather than in the name of ADAMS himself. U

On the morning of the day that he departed, ADAMS entered the building at 410 S. Michigan Avenue and emerged carrying two packages marked "honey". Subsequent investigation by Special Agents LEWIS D. F. LIA and JOHN F. CLENVILLE reflected that these packages did in fact contain honey which was purchased by ADAMS at Penland Weavers & Potters, Room 808, 410 S. Michigan Avenue. Three phones in this office are listed to the Penland Weavers and Potters, Raschel Sussey Ellsolving, Glean Drake and Estelle Lutz, Artists' Bureau, concerning all of whom the Chicago Office indices are negative. In view of the above, it is believed that this was an entirely innocent purchase on the part of ADAMS although it had been thought that in view of the fact that these packages of honey were sealed, they might contain information of value to this investigation. U

ADAMS departed from Chicago at 1:30 p.m., September 28, 1944, via the Advanced Commodore Vanderbilt, New York Central Train No. 66, occupying lower berth 13, car 661. He was surveilled on this trip by Special Agents CHARLES FRELSON and WILLIAM L. RYAN of the Chicago Office. U

Confidential Informant T-5 furnished to the Chicago Office a list of members of the Student Council of the Abraham Lincoln School, including \*JOHN H. CHAPIN, 4330 S. Drexel Boulevard; telephone, BOu. 9075; class attended, "China and the Peace".





DEBORAH V. DAUER

Confidential Informant [redacted], on May 15, 1943, advised that ~~ROBERT~~ ~~TARMON~~ of the Modern Book Store, had told LUCILLE ~~CHEARER~~ that he would be unable to attend a meeting on the following Wednesday night. ~~BOB~~ suggested that she get in touch with Dr. DEBORAH V. DAUER, BRITT ~~HARRIS~~ or ~~LESTER~~ ~~SHAE~~. U

A highly confidential source advised the Indianapolis Field Division that when ~~ROBERT~~ ~~TARMON~~ was in Indianapolis on October 29th and 30th, 1943, she had in her portfolio a package of cards on which appeared names and addresses, including "DR. DEBORAH V. DAUER, 5119 S. Kimbark, 5/42, 310." U

In May, 1944, Confidential Informant [redacted] made available copies of the speakers' booklet published by the Abraham Lincoln School. Dr. DAUER was included among these lecturers. U

According to the Fall, 1943, Abraham Lincoln School bulletin, DEBORAH V. DAUER was to be a guest lecturer for the fall term. This bulletin contained the following information regarding Dr. DAUER: "Guest lecturer, B.S. Massachusetts Institute of Technology; M.D., Boston University Medical School. Associate in Medicine at Cook County Hospital; Clinical Assistant in Medicine at Northwestern University; Cardiologist at Christopher School; doing research in cardiovascular department, Michael Reese Hospital; practicing internal medicine." U

WILLIAM L. ~~PATTERSON~~, Assistant Director of the Abraham Lincoln School, advised informant [redacted] on February 1, 1944, that he was to be the honored guest at the induction of officers to be held at 9:00 p.m., February 5, 1944, at the home of Dr. (Mrs.) DEBORAH DAUER, 5119 S. Kimbark Avenue. The informant was unable to ascertain the name of the organization with which these officers were connected. U

Chicago File 100-11919

An examination of the 1944 winter session catalogue of the Abraham Lincoln School disclosed that DEBORAH DAUER was not included in this issue. Confidential Informant [redacted] advised that Dr. DAUER held a meeting at her home on behalf of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee on Saturday night, September 23, 1944. ✓

At New York, New York:

Will ascertain through confidential informants and other sources whether ARTHUR ADAMS expects to visit Chicago within the next three weeks as has been indicated in the details of this report and if so, will immediately notify the Chicago Field Division in order that technical arrangements can be made to enable a more complete coverage on ADAMS during his next stop in Chicago.

THE CHICAGO FIELD DIVISION

At Chicago, Illinois:

Will maintain contact with Confidential Informant T-4 to ascertain whether ADAMS has made reservations at the Stevens Hotel for three weeks from the present time and to obtain notice if he should obtain such reservations in the future by letter. T-4 advised that such reservations could have been made prior to ADAMS' departure and not yet recorded by the hotel.

Will obtain photostatic copies of the registration card and credit information card of ADAMS at the Stevens Hotel and forward same to the Bureau for handwriting specimens.

Will report all information received from the investigation of EMBORAH V. DAUER under a separate Internal Security case bearing that title recently opened in the Chicago Field Division.

Referral/Consult

Will report any information obtained by Special Agents CHARLES PHILSNIE and WILLIAM L. RYAN as a result of their surveillance of ADAMS from Chicago to New York described in the details of this report.



\* Will through confidential informants and other investigative techniques closely follow the activities of the reported Communists in the employ of the William E. Pratt Company, Joliet, Illinois, which company is reportedly doing confidential work for the Manhattan Engineers.

Dear Sir:

There are being enclosed herewith three photographs of ARTHUR ADAMS. There is also being enclosed a photographic copy of the Selective Service Registration Card apparently filled out in the handwriting and signed by ARTHUR ADAMS at the time of his registration with Local Board 15, New York City.

There is also included a photographic copy of one page of the occupational questionnaire submitted by ARTHUR ADAMS which also includes a small amount of his handwriting and printing. No other Selective Service forms were filled out by ADAMS. Consequently, no other samples of his handwriting or printing could be obtained from this source.

There is also enclosed a photograph of a motor vehicle operator's license and a New York State fishing license, both of which bear the signature of ARTHUR ADAMS. It is believed that the membership card of the BERLITZ SCHOOL OF LANGUAGES, which is also included in this photograph, was probably not filled out by Adams.

A photographic copy of the letter addressed to ARTHUR ADAMS by Edward T. MANNING, D.S.M. employee, who has been in contact with ADAMS on several occasions, is also being included. This letter written by MANNING was received by ADAMS at the PETER COOPER HOTEL, 130 East 39th Street, New York City.

It is suggested that photographs of these various documents be transmitted to the F. B. I. Laboratory for appropriate comparison with other similar materials submitted in connection with the COMRAP and CINRAD investigations and other connected cases.

It is also requested that these photographs be retained by the F. B. I. Laboratory for inclusion with similar documents previously submitted in these cases for possible future use. Further efforts are being made to obtain additional specimens of the handwriting of ARTHUR ADAMS and of typewriting specimens made on ADAMS' typewriter.

Reference is made to your letter of October 11, 1944, your [Redacted] concerning inquiries regarding Arthur Adams. b7D

Attached is one copy of a photograph of Arthur Adams. The date on which this photograph was taken is unknown. According to the various public records available in the United States, Adams may be described as: Height, 5 feet 7 inches; weight, 160 pounds; hair, brown; eyes, brown; complexion, sallow. You will recall that he claims to have been born in Toronto, Canada, May 4, 1890.

Adams at the present time has in his possession Province of Ontario motor vehicle operator's license No. 198378 for the year 1939 issued to him at the address, 1223 King West, Toronto. This motor vehicle operator's license shows his 1938 license number to have been 6180.

According to documents filed by him under the Selective Training and Service Act, his marital status is single and he has never been married or divorced.

I trust that these additional data may assist you in your inquiries.

Attached are photostatic copies of a report made by [redacted]

You will note that the information developed to date [redacted] indicates strongly that Arthur Adams may not have been born in Canada, inasmuch as the declaration of birth upon which subsequent papers have been predicated was made before M. S. Millstone, Notary Public, who has been described [redacted] as a secret member of the Communist Party. It is further noted that the declaration of birth was executed October 2, 1936, which was only a short while prior to Adams' activity in this country. You will also note that no trace of Arthur Adams has been found [redacted]

There is attached also for the information of the New York and San Francisco Offices a small snapshot of Arthur Adams which was provided by [redacted]. The date upon which this photograph was taken is unknown.

ARTHUR ADAMS has contacted Dr. CLARENCE HISKEY and EDWARD T. MANNING, former D.S.M. employees, and JOHN H. CHAPIN and MIRIAM SHERWOOD, present D.S.M. employees, and MARCIA SANDS HISKEY, wife of Dr. CLARENCE HISKEY. ADAMS' principal associate in New York City is one VICTORIA STONE who operates a jewelry concern at 510 Madison Avenue, New York City. This business was incorporated in 1941 with JULIUS HEIMAN as Secretary-Treasurer. HEIMAN believed to be identical with the JULIUS HEIMAN described by BENJAMIN GITLOW as one of the earlier organizers of the Communist Party, particularly active in financing behind-the-scenes activity of the Party. ADAMS also contacted HEIMAN and on one occasion a meeting between ADAMS and HEIMAN was carried out in a surreptitious manner. ADAMS' first contact in New York City after returning from Chicago where he met CHAPIN was one JACOB B. ARONOFF, Russian born attorney, and former business partner of ADAMS. ADAMS purports to be a consulting engineer. He receives weekly checks from the KEYNOTE RECORDINGS, INC., which organization produces Communist and Russian recordings and he is connected with the ELECTRONIC CORPORATION OF AMERICA, which concern is known to be dominated by Communists and fellow travelers. On August 8, 1944; ADAMS issued a \$1,000. check to JAMES PERLOVIN, a draftsman formerly employed by the SPERRY GYROSCOPE COMPANY, now working on independent Government contracts. Additional

On ADAMS' return to New York on September 29, 1944, a continuous physical surveillance was instituted and has been in progress up to the present time. U

The activities of ADAMS while under surveillance which are believed pertinent to instant investigation will be set forth herein. Detailed logs reflecting the activity of ADAMS on each day he was under surveillance, are being kept in the files of the New York office for possible future reference. U

AUGUST 25, 1944

At 1:45 P.M. ADAMS left the Peter Cooper Hotel, 130 East 39th Street, New York City, where he resides in Room 1103, and, after making three telephone calls in a pay booth at the hotel drug store, proceeded to the Bedford Hotel, 118 East 40th Street, where he had dinner. After dinner he returned for a short period to the Peter Cooper Hotel and then left this hotel and proceeded by bus to the Pennsylvania Railroad Station where he boarded a Long Island train to Far Rockaway. He left the train at Far Rockaway at 2:45 P.M. and walked to the summer cottage of Dr. LOUIS MILLER, located on the corner of Seagirt Avenue and Beach 26th Street. At this point the surveillance was discontinued because of the nature of the neighborhood and the difficulty of conducting a discreet surveillance in this section. L

SEPTEMBER 5th

ADAMS left the Peter Cooper Hotel at 11:45 A.M. and proceeded by bus to the Pennsylvania Station where he stood at the entrance to the Savarin Cafe in Pennsylvania Station. At 12:30 P.M. he met an unidentified girl who handed him a package marked "Special Delivery" which package was approximately 4" x 8" x 5". This package was addressed to Dr. LOUIS MILLER. The unidentified girl then made a telephone call at a pay station and deposited a weekend bag in a locker in the station. ADAMS and the unidentified girl then left the station and, after making brief stops at a Schrafft's Restaurant and a Liggett's Drug Store, they walked to the corner of Macy's Department Store where they stood and talked for about twenty minutes. L

At 1:15 P.M. ADAMS kissed the unidentified girl and she was heard to advise ADAMS that she would call him on Saturday. The unidentified girl boarded a bus and proceeded on Broadway downtown to the AMERICAN LITHOGRAPH COMPANY, 1452 East 19th Street, where she entered. J

ADAMS, after leaving the girl, boarded a Madison Avenue bus and proceeded to the VICTORIA STONE JEWELRY COMPANY, 510 Madison Avenue. While in the jewelry store he was noted talking to a woman who was subsequently identified as VICTORIA STONE, and to another woman who was noted by surveilling agents to be bruised and scarred about the face and both of whose eyes were blackened. At 6:00 P.M., ADAMS and VICTORIA STONE left the store and walked

arm in arm to the New York Women's Exchange Building where they entered the New York Exchange restaurant. The surveillance was discontinued at this time. U

ADAMS walked to 42nd Street where he boarded a cross-town street car at Lexington Avenue and proceeded to 42nd Street and Fifth Avenue where he left the street car and walked to 113 West 42nd Street at which address he took an elevator to the 15th floor, where he entered room 1502, the office of JAMES PERLOTTIN. It was noted by surveilling agents that the building directory also lists All States Theatre Syndicate for the same room. U

At 12:35 P.M. ADAMS left this address without the package and walked to 522 5th Avenue where he proceeded to the KEYNOTE RECORDINGS, INC., which is located on the fourth floor of this building. U

At 1:12 P.M. he left this address and walked to 40th Street and Lexington Avenue where he purchased a "Readers' Digest" magazine and a "PM" newspaper. He then walked to the Hotel Bedford where he entered the restaurant. U

After he had dinner he returned to his room at the Peter Cooper Hotel at approximately 2:00 P.M. The surveillance was discontinued at 7:40 P.M., ADAMS not having been observed leaving the hotel up to that time. U

the hotel in company with a woman who was subsequently identified as MARCIA HISKEY. They walked together to the Hotel Bedford where they entered the restaurant. At 1:33 P.M. they left the restaurant and returned to the Peter Cooper Hotel. U

At 3:45 P.M. ADAMS left the hotel alone carrying a manila folder bearing the name KEYNOTE RECORDING COMPANY. He walked to 356 Madison Avenue where he left a roll of .35 mm film for development. This address was the Eastman Kodak store. It was subsequently ascertained that this film carried pictures of children and did not appear to be pertinent in instant investigation. He left this store and walked to 52 Fifth Avenue, which is the address of the KEYNOTE RECORDINGS, INC., still carrying the manila envelope. U

Island train. ADAMS then returned to the Peter Cooper Hotel and no further activity on his part was noted until 7:00 P.M. at which time the surveillance was discontinued. U

SEPTEMBER 13th

At 2:00 P.M., ADAMS, in the company of EDWARD T. MANNING, left the Peter Cooper Hotel and proceeded to Longchamps Restaurant, Lexington Avenue and 42nd Street, where they had lunch. U

At 3:00 P.M., they left the restaurant and returned to the Peter Cooper Hotel. Surveilling agents noted that MANNING left the hotel alone and caught a taxicab at 4:00 P.M. No further activity on the part of ADAMS was noted on this date. U

SEPTEMBER 15th

At 9:15 A.M. ADAMS left the Peter Cooper Hotel and proceeded by bus to the Beth David Hospital, 161 East 90th Street. It was noted he was carrying a weekend type bag when he entered the hospital. Surveilling agents noted ADAMS came out of the hospital for a few moments on two occasions but no other activity was noted and he was still in the hospital at 5:00 P.M. at which time the surveillance was discontinued, it having been ascertained that he was a patient at the hospital. SEPTEMBER 18th

At 2:30 P.M. ADAMS left the Peter Cooper Hotel and walked to the Eastman Kodak Store where he picked up the films previously referred to. He then walked to 521 Fifth Avenue entering the building at the 1 East 43rd Street entrance. U

At 3:10 P.M. ADAMS left this address accompanied by a man subsequently identified as JACOB BROCHES ARONOFF. They walked together to the Charles Cafe, 50 East 43rd Street, where they entered a booth. U

At 5:15 P.M. the two men left the cafe and walked to 34th Street and Madison Avenue where they parted. ARONOFF continued walking down Madison Avenue and ADAMS boarded a Madison Avenue bus riding to 53rd Street where he left the bus and walked to the Victoria Stone jewelry store at 510 Madison Avenue. U

At 6:45 P.M. ADAMS and VICTORIA STONE left the jewelry store and

walked to 39 West 55th Street where they entered at which time the surveillance was discontinued. U

SEPTEMBER 19th

Surveilling agents noted he was looking at various old books and at 2:05 P.M. he left the store carrying a package which appeared to contain two or three books. He returned by subway to the Peter Cooper Hotel. U

At 7:30 P.M. he left the hotel, proceeded by subway to Times Square where he caught the BMT Subway which he took to the Newkirk Avenue Station and walked to 618 Marlborough Road, Brooklyn, where he entered the apartment located on the ground floor. It was subsequently ascertained that this is the apartment of MARCIA SANDS HISKEY. U

At 10:40 P.M. the surveillance was discontinued, ADAMS still being at 618 Marlborough Road. U

SEPTEMBER 20th

At 1:37 P.M., ADAMS left the Peter Cooper Hotel and proceeded by bus to 400 Westend Avenue. It is known that this is the address of Dr. LOUIS MILLER who was previously contacted by ADAMS at Far Rockaway. U

At 3:33 P.M. ADAMS left 400 Westend Avenue and proceeded by bus to 510 Madison Avenue, the Victoria Stone jewelry store. U

At 3:57 P.M. he left the store and returned to the Peter Cooper Hotel. U

At 5:00 P.M. ADAMS left the Peter Cooper Hotel and returned by bus to 510 Madison Avenue. He was noted to have in his possession a manila envelope which had apparently been received by him from the GENERAL ELECTRIC CORPORATION and which seemed to contain papers and a book. U

At 5:40 P.M. he left 510 Madison Avenue and walked to the New York Exchange Restaurant where he met VICTORIA STONE and the two had dinner together. U

At 6:55 P.M. ADAMS and STONE left the restaurant and walked to her apartment at 39 West 55th Street. ADAMS was noted giving a book to VICTORIA STONE. U

At 7:40 P.M. ADAMS left 39 West 55th Street and walked to Fifth

Avenue where he boarded a bus and proceeded to Fifth Avenue and 12th Street. After making several purchases, he proceeded to 29 East 11th Street where he opened a door with a key which was in his possession. He was noted to still have the manila envelope in his possession when he entered this address. U

At 8:00 P.M. a young man approximately six feet tall and probably in his twenties, entered this same address. Because of the darkness, surveilling agents were unable to obtain a more accurate description. U

At 9:20 P.M. ADAMS and this unidentified young man left 29 East 11th Street each carrying a large cardboard box which appeared to be rather heavy and appeared to be the same two boxes which ADAMS had previously taken to this address. ADAMS was noted to no longer have the manila envelope with him. The two walked to University Place, then turned west at 11th Street and walked to a car parked on the south side of the street heading east between Fifth Avenue and University Place. The packages were placed in the rear compartment of the automobile which bore New York license # N 47-67. This automobile was subsequently ascertained to be registered to JACQUES BRAUNSTEIN, 521 5th Avenue, former address 176 Irwin Street, Brooklyn. Because of circumstances beyond the control of surveilling agents, the surveillance was discontinued at this point.

SEPTEMBER 21st

Upon his return to New York City on September 29th, a continuous surveillance of ADAMS was instituted in compliance with Bureau instructions. U

SEPTEMBER 29th

At 8:30 A.M. ADAMS arrived at New York City aboard the Advance Commodore, New York Central Railroad, under surveillance by Chicago agents. He proceeded immediately to the Peter Cooper Hotel. At 11:40 A.M. ADAMS left the hotel and proceeded to 521 Fifth Avenue where he met JACOB B. ARONOFF. They proceeded together to a restaurant at 5 East 45th Street. U

At 12:55 P.M., ADAMS and ARONOFF left this address and returned to 521 Fifth Avenue where ARONOFF entered but ADAMS proceeded to 522 Fifth Avenue to the KEYNOTE RECORDINGS, INC. U

At 1:35 P.M. he left this address and walked to 510 Madison Avenue, the jewelry store of VICTORIA STONE. U

He left this address at 3:20 P.M. and walked to the Grand Central Hardware Company at 158 East 42nd Street where he obtained three duplicate keys. U

At 3:45 P.M. ADAMS attended a movie at the Embassy News Reel Theatre on 42nd Street and Vanderbilt Avenue. He left this theatre at 5:05 P.M. and returned to the hardware store to pick up the keys, and then proceeded to 510 Madison Avenue where he met VICTORIA STONE. U

At 6:15 P.M. he left the jewelry store with VICTORIA STONE and they walked to the New York Exchange Restaurant at 539 Madison Avenue where they had dinner. They left the restaurant at 7:10 P.M. and returned to 510 Madison Avenue. U

At 9:30 P.M. ADAMS, VICTORIA STONE and her dog, and another woman believed to be an employe, left 510 Madison Avenue and walked to 39 West 55th Street. ADAMS was seen taking the dog for a walk at 11:25 P.M. at which time he bought a newspaper and then returned to 39 West 55th Street. U

At 6:45 P.M. ADAMS left the theatre and proceeded to the Peter Cooper Hotel after making a telephone call at Liggett's Drug Store on 34th Street and Broadway. U

At 7:20 P.M. he left the hotel and went to Schrafft's Restaurant at 42nd Street and Lexington Avenue where he had dinner. He left this restaurant at 8:00 P.M. proceeding by street car and subway to 618 Marlborough Road, Brooklyn, the residence of MARCIA HISKEY, where he entered at 9:30 P.M. U

At 11:50 P.M. he returned by subway to Manhattan to the Peter Cooper Hotel. U

OCTOBER 1st

At 12:25 P.M. ADAMS left the Peter Cooper Hotel and proceeded to 39 West 55th Street, the residence of VICTORIA STONE. ADAMS was not observed again on this date. U

OCTOBER 2nd

ADAMS left the Peter Cooper Hotel at 10:30 A.M., proceeded by street car to the Central Savings Bank, 73rd Street and Broadway, and it was noted that he had in his possession a black zipper briefcase which appeared to be filled. It was subsequently ascertained that he withdrew

\$1,000. in cash on this occasion which he placed in the briefcase together with his bank book. He left the bank and, after having lunch and making three telephone calls from pay booths, he proceeded to 510 Madison Avenue, where he was noted talking with VICTORIA STONE. While talking to her, he opened the briefcase and then went into the back of the store with her out of sight of the surveilling agents. U

At 12:45 P.M. he left 510 Madison Avenue and walked to 39 West 55th Street and the briefcase appeared to be empty at this time. U

At 1:15 P.M. he left this address and, in addition to the briefcase, he had in his possession an instrument which carried the name "Sound Scriber". He then proceeded to 29 East 11th Street where he stayed until 2:30 P.M. When he left this address it was noted that he no longer had the instrument referred to with him but he did have the briefcase. ADAMS then proceeded to the ELECTRONIC CORPORATION OF AMERICA, 45 West 18th Street. U

At 4:15 P.M. he left this company with an unknown man and they proceeded by cab to the corner of 39th Street and Park Avenue where ADAMS left the cab and the unknown individual continued in the cab. ADAMS then walked to his hotel making a telephone call in the pay station in the drug store of the hotel before proceeding to his room. Surveilling agents were able to ascertain that he talked in French during most of the conversation. U

At 6:50 P.M. ADAMS left the Peter Cooper Hotel and, after eating dinner at the Bedford Hotel restaurant, he proceeded by subway to 41-29 46th Street, Sunnyside, Queens, Long Island, N.Y. It was noted that he rang a buzzer for Apartment 4N at this address and the names listed for Apartment 4N were LUSUBEL and MALONE. U

(Subsequent investigation has developed that Apartment 4N is rented by NATHAN LUSUBEL who is employed by the GROWN PUBLISHING COMPANY, 419 4th Avenue, as an editor working under a Mr. FULLER. It was also ascertained that he formerly resided at 140-10 Franklin Avenue, N.Y., where his previous landlord was Dr. CHARLES LEVINE, 124 Veruliyá Ave., Washington Heights, N.Y. This information was obtained from HERGOLD RELAY CORPORATION, 10-40 46th Avenue, Long Island City. Information in the files of the New York office indicates that NATHAN LUSUBEL

was, in 1939, on the editorial council of the magazine called "Equality" published at 220 Fifth Avenue, New York City.) U

At 11:50 P.M. ADAMS left this address and returned by subway to the Peter Cooper Hotel. U

OCTOBER 3rd

At 2:10 P.M. ADAMS left the Peter Cooper Hotel and proceeded to 29 East 11th Street where he again entered using his own key. It was noted that he had in his possession a brown envelope which appeared to contain papers. U

At 7:35 P.M. ADAMS left 29 East 11th Street and returned by subway to the Peter Cooper Hotel. U

OCTOBER FOURTH

At 7:40 P.M. ADAMS left the Peter Cooper Hotel and walked to 40th Street and Park Avenue where he mailed a letter on the southwest corner of 40th Street and Park Avenue. This letter was subsequently ascertained to be addressed to the Museum of Natural History, New York City. After mailing the letter he proceeded by bus to 510 Madison Avenue, the VICTORIA STONE jewelry store. He left this address together with VICTORIA STONE and walked to Fifth Avenue and 53rd Street where he mailed a letter in the box on the northeast corner of this intersection. It was subsequently ascertained that this letter was addressed to Mrs. S.R. ARIAS, 13 Brookby Road, Scarsdale, New York. The letter bore the return address: VICTORIA STONE, 510 Madison Avenue, New York. After mailing the letter, ADAMS and VICTORIA STONE proceeded to 39 West 55th Street, the residence of VICTORIA STONE. U

At 11:30 P.M. ADAMS left VICTORIA STONE's residence, 39 West 55th Street, and mailed another letter at the northeast corner of Sixth Avenue and 55th Street. This letter was subsequently ascertained to be addressed to the U.S.S.R. Consulate General, 7 East 61st Street, New York 21, N.Y. The envelope was typed, bore no return address and appeared to be of a good grade paper. The envelope was of an ordinary social stationery type. After mailing, ADAMS returned to VICTORIA STONE's apartment, 39 W. 55th Street. U

At 1:00 A.M. on October 5th, ADAMS left 39 West 55th Street and walked to Madison Avenue where he caught a bus and returned to the

Peter Cooper Hotel. Surveilling agents noted that ADAMS threw away a number of pieces of paper on 55th Street before catching the bus. These pieces of paper were retrieved and when placed together, it was ascertained that they formed a copy of a Western Union telegram which had, apparently, been typed up for sending. It was addressed to J.E. HATCHELL, Ticket Agent, Boston and Main Railroad, North Station, Boston, Mass. It was dated October 3, 1944. The following message was typed on the telegram blank: U

"Would like one way ticket, Boston to Moncton and lower on either October 5, October 6, October 7; 9:30 P.M. train for my mother Mrs. Bolger, Algonquin 2849 in Boston. Am mailing you check today covering this and would like to have you notify her when to get them. Thank you. I

LEONARD BOLGER,  
University Club"

It was ascertained by the Boston office that Algonquin 2849 is listed to GATHA BOLGER who resides at 610 Cambridge Street, Alston, Massachusetts. She has been residing at this address since 1931. Her husband, DAVID, was employed as a blacksmith but worked at one time as a mechanic. Mrs. BOLGER has run a boarding house since 1937. J.E. HATCHELL of the Boston & Main Railroad, advised agents of the Boston office that he did not recall the telegram. However, a clerk, RAY BIRMINGHAM, recalled the telegram and its contents and recalled a letter arriving prior to the telegram. BIRMINGHAM issued a one way ticket for a lower berth on October 9th and left it at the call window. LILLIAN Bissett, the ticket seller, recalled a woman about sixty years of age calling for the ticket on October 4th and changing the ticket for Upper 3 or 6 leaving the same night for Moncton, New Brunswick, Canada. The letter and telegram were placed in an envelope with the ticket and turned over to Mrs. BOLGER. The ticket was paid for by Postal Money Order #660102 issued at New York City. U

Investigation by the New York office reflects that LEONARD BOLGER, who apparently sent the telegram in question, resides at 34-50 29th Street, Astoria, Long Island, Apartment 4D. He formerly resided at 68-09 Burns Street, Forest Hills. BOLGER is 40 years of age and has been employed at the University Club since 1936 where he works as Chief Clerk. He was born in Brookline, Massachusetts, on October 20, 1904. He is registered for Selective Service with Local



Draft Board #240, New York City. He is married, his wife's name being CATHERINE. U

A check of the indices of the New York office failed to reveal any pertinent information concerning LEONARD BOLGER. The connection between BOLGER and ADAMS is not known. U

In connection with the letter ADAMS mailed to Mrs. S. R. \*ARIAS, 13 Brookby Road, Scarsdale, New York, Special Agent THOMAS J. \*LYNCH ascertained that a SALVO ROBERT \*ARIAS resides at this address. He was born July 4, 1900 at Smyrna, Turkey. He is employed in the brokerage business with the firm of NEWMAN BROTHERS & WORMS, 25 Broad Street. He has been employed in this type of business for about 16 years and is also a director of the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railroad. ARIAS was ascertained to have been married in New York City on August 1, 1929 and has one child, a son, ROBERT. ARIAS maintains a banking account at the Bowery Savings Bank, New York City, and is a member of the New York Produce Exchange. He was naturalized in New York City in March or May, 1925 and has Social Security No. 064-01-8173. U

\* Records of the New York City Department of Health indicated that a SALVO ROBERT ARIAS was married on August 1, 1929 to HILDA M. BENNETT of 290 Westend Avenue, New York City. These records indicated that ARIAS was residing at the Hotel Boulevard, 83rd Street and Central Park West, at the time. He was born in Smyrna, Turkey. His father, ROBINO, and mother, SULTANA, were also born in Turkey. His wife, HILDA M. BENNETT, was born in New York City. Her father, HARRIS BENNETT, was also American born. Her mother, MILIE LEIM, was born in Poland. The couple were married by NATHAN KRASS, a rabbi, witnesses being SUZANNE GOLPING and AUG. LUIDO, both of 2370 Broadway. U

At 10:20 A.M. ADAMS left the Peter Cooper Hotel and proceeded to the offices of M. L. CHERTOK and ARNOLD SILBERG, dentists, located on the 15th floor of the Empire State Building. He left that address at 10:50 A.M. and walked to 522 Fifth Avenue, the offices of the KEYNOTE RECORDING COMPANY. U

At 1:00 P.M. he left this address together with an unidentified man and proceeded to 104 West 40th Street - the Farm Food Dairy Restaurant - where they entered. U

At 1:50 P.M. the two men left the restaurant and walked to 1440 Broadway entering the 40th Street entrance, taking an elevator to the 18th floor where they entered Room 1870 which is occupied by the WOR Recording Studio. U

At 6:20 PM, ADAMS left 1440 Broadway alone and, after making a telephone call at a pay station, he walked to 510 Madison Avenue, the jewelry store of VICTORIA STONE. He left this address with VICTORIA STONE and they went directly to the New York Exchange Restaurant, 539 Madison Avenue, where they had dinner. U

At 7:50 P.M. they left the restaurant and proceeded by street car to the World Theatre on 42nd Street. They left the theatre at 10:05 p.m. and walked to 39 West 55th Street. U

At 10:30 P.M. ADAMS and VICTORIA STONE left 39 West 55th Street. ADAMS, after walking a short distance with her, proceeded to Madison Avenue where he caught a bus and returned to the Peter Cooper Hotel. U

OCTOBER 6th

At 3:40 P.M. ADAMS left the Peter Cooper Hotel and proceeded to 580 Fifth Avenue where he took an elevator to the eighth floor and entered Room 810 occupied by MARVIN WATCH COMPANY. At 4:00 P.M. he left this address and walked to VICTORIA STONE's jewelry store, 510 Madison Avenue. U

At 4:35 P.M. ADAMS left the VICTORIA STONE jewelry store and returned by bus to the Peter Cooper Hotel. U

At 7:00 P.M. he left the Peter Cooper Hotel and proceeded by bus to 29 East 11th Street. He was noted to be carrying a large brown envelope approximately 9" x 12" when he entered the apartment. U

At 9:55 P.M. he left 29 East 11th Street and walked to Union Square where he boarded a Lexington Avenue bus and proceeded to the Peter Cooper Hotel where he made a telephone call in the drug store. U

At 10:20 he proceeded to the Manchester Cafe located between 39th and 40th Streets and Lexington Avenue. At 10:40 he returned to the drug store and made another telephone call from a pay booth. After making his call he returned to his room at the Peter Cooper Hotel. U

OCTOBER 7th

ADAMS left the Peter Cooper Hotel at 10:55 A.M. and proceeded to the dental office of M. ~~A.~~ CHERTOK, Room 1525, Empire State Building. U

At 11:45 he left this office and walked to 20 West 31st Street where he entered the American-Hungarian Restaurant. He seated himself at a small table and in a few minutes was joined by an unidentified man. This man was about 42 years of age, 5' 5" tall, 160 pounds, with short black hair and dark eyes, having a dark Latin type complexion, square jaw, dressed in a dark blue coat and light tan gabardine trousers and an extremely loud tie. U

At 12:20 P.M. ADAMS and the man left the restaurant and returned to the Peter Cooper Hotel. Surveilling agents ascertained that the unidentified man proceeded to 302 Fifth Avenue where he proceeded to the sixth floor of this building. Surveilling agents ascertained that the following companies maintained offices at this floor: COLUMBIA UMBRELLA COMPANY, O.L. KAHN & COMPANY, and the KANTRUST UMBRELLA COMPANY. U

At 2:45 P.M. ADAMS left the Peter Cooper Hotel together with a woman identified as MARCIA HISKEY. They proceeded together to Macy's Department Store where they purchased clothing for a small boy. At 3:30 P.M. they left the department store and walked to Schrafft's Restaurant on 5th Avenue between 35th and 36th Streets. While standing outside of the restaurant talking, ADAMS opened a small black address book and pointed out something therein to MARCIA HISKEY. ADAMS and HISKEY separated at this point and ADAMS walked back to the Peter Cooper Hotel. U

At 6:45 P.M. ADAMS left the Peter Cooper Hotel and, after making a telephone call from a pay station, he walked to 510 Madison Avenue, the VICTORIA STONE jewelry store. U

At 7:15 P.M. ADAMS and VICTORIA STONE left the store and walked to her residence, 39 West 55th Street. U

At 12:15 A.M., October 8th, ADAMS left 39 West 55th Street and returned to the Peter Cooper Hotel. U

OCTOBER 8th

ADAMS left the Peter Cooper Hotel at 11:00 A.M. and proceeded to 39 West 55th Street. It was noted that he was carrying several packages with him which were wrapped in gray and brown paper. ↓

ADAMS did not leave this address other than to take VICTORIA STONE's dog out for short walks on two occasions until 10:00 P.M., at which time he left the residence together with VICTORIA STONE and walked to Madison Avenue and 56th Street where he took a taxicab alone and returned to the Peter Cooper Hotel. ↓

At 10:25 P.M. he left the hotel and walked to Grand Central Station where he met a New York Central train arriving from Bedford Hills, New York, at 10:45 P.M. ADAMS met a woman who left this train. The woman was subsequently ascertained to be ZELMA BAKER MILLER of Bethesda, Maryland. Further details concerning this individual will be set out in another portion of this report. ↓

ADAMS and Mrs. MILLER left the station, crossed 42nd Street to the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad office where she checked her bag; and then went to the Commodore Hotel Bar where they stayed from 11:10 P.M. to 12 midnight, at which time they returned to the Baltimore & Ohio Station to obtain Mrs. MILLER's baggage. Mrs. MILLER boarded the B. & O. Bus which would connect with a Washington, D.C. train. ↓

After Mrs. MILLER left, ADAMS returned to the Peter Cooper Hotel. ↓

OCTOBER 9th

ADAMS left the Peter Cooper Hotel at 11:55 A.M. and walked to the Grand Central Station and from there to 1 West 42nd Street, Corn Exchange Bank, where he deposited several checks. He then walked to 522 5th Avenue to the offices of the KEYNOTE RECORDINGS, INC. ↓

At 12:25 P.M. ADAMS left this address and walked to the Hotel McAlpin, Broadway and 34th Street, where he stood in the lobby and read papers. He left the McAlpin at 12:55 P.M. and proceeded to the Pennsylvania Cafe Rogue where he met an unidentified woman who was subsequently identified as IRENE MILLER. ↓

At 2:05 P.M. ADAMS and IRENE MILLER left the restaurant and walked to Macy's Department store where she is employed. ↓

ADAMS left IRENE MILLER at the department store and proceeded to

the Empire State Building where he boarded an elevator in the 8-17 bank. He left the Empire State Building at 3:15 P.M. and proceeded by bus to the Esplanade Hotel, 305 Westend Avenue. It was impossible for surveilling agents to ascertain who was contacted by ADAMS at this address but it is known that JULIUS HEIMAN, who has been contacted by the subject previously, resides at this address. U

At 6:15 P.M. ADAMS left the Esplanade Hotel and, after having dinner, returned to the Peter Cooper Hotel. U

He left the hotel at 7:50 P.M. and proceeded to the Central High School for Needle Trades on West 24th Street where he met MARCIA HISKEY. He then proceeded by subway to 235 West 4th Street entering this building at 8:45 P.M. At 9:00 P.M., ADAMS, MARCIA HISKEY and another girl proceeded by automobile bearing New York license No. 9 N 24-25, to 591 Ocean Avenue, Brooklyn. The two girls entered this address, which is an apartment house, while ADAMS remained in the car. After a few moments they returned to the automobile and all three proceeded to the home of MARCIA HISKEY, 618 Marlborough Road, Brooklyn. U

At 11:45 ADAMS and the unidentified girl, returned by automobile to New York City, ADAMS proceeding to the Hotel Peter Cooper. U

The records of the New York Motor Vehicle Registration Bureau reflected License 9 N 24-25 as registered to CARMINE D. ANGELO, 312 Humbolt Street, Brooklyn. It was indicated to be a 1939 Oldsmobile Car. U

OCTOBER 11th

At 1:30 P.M. ADAMS left the Peter Cooper Hotel and proceeded to the Empire State Building. He left this address at 2:00 P.M., and after having lunch alone, proceeded to VICTORIA STONE's jewelry store at 510 Madison Avenue. U

At 3:15 P.M. he left the store and attended a movie at a theatre located on 34th Street and Third Avenue. U

At 7:00 P.M. ADAMS left the theatre and returned to the Peter Cooper Hotel. U

At 7:50 he left the hotel and proceeded to VICTORIA STONE's jewelry store at 510 Madison Avenue. He left the store with VICTORIA STONE

at 8:10 P.M. and they proceeded to the Servicemen's Center operated by the Salvation Army located at 14 West 56th Street where VICTORIA STONE registered for voting. ADAMS left this address at 8:35 P.M. and returned to 39 West 55th Street, VICTORIA's residence. At 11:55 P.M. ADAMS left 39 West 55th Street and returned to the Peter Cooper Hotel. U

OCTOBER 12th.

At 12:10 P.M. ADAMS left the Peter Cooper Hotel, made a telephone call at the drug store located in the hotel, and walked to the Hotel Bedford where he had lunch. He left this hotel at 12:40 PM and, after making another telephone call in the pay booth, proceeded to the Grand Central Station where he boarded an IRT train proceeding to the Borough Hall Station in Brooklyn. He left the subway at this point and boarded a street car and proceeded to Myrtle Avenue and Sucuben Street, from where he walked to 130 Steuben Street, entering the offices of the SUNRAY BAKING COMPANY, entering at 1:35 P.M. U

At 2:25 P.M. ADAMS left this address together with a man later identified as JULIUS HEIMAN. They walked to a nearby tavern, 493 Myrtle Avenue, where they sat and talked while eating. U

At 3:45 P.M. ADAMS and HEIMAN left the tavern and returned to the offices of the SUNRAY BAKING COMPANY. U

At 4:05 P.M. ADAMS and HEIMAN left the bakery and, after walking for several blocks, obtained a taxicab and drove to New York Post Graduate Medical School and Hospital, 2nd Avenue and 20th Street. U

At 5:20 P.M. surveilling agents noted VICTORIA STONE leaving the hospital and catch a taxicab. She was not seen previously on this date. U

At 5:30 P.M. ADAMS left the hospital alone and proceeded by bus to VICTORIA STONE's jewelry store, 510 Madison Avenue. After a few minutes here he left this address and proceeded by bus to the Pennsylvania Station where he met VICTORIA STONE in the Savarin Cafe in the Pennsylvania Station. U

At 7:00 P.M., after eating together, ADAMS and STONE left the cafe and walked about the station for a few minutes. U

At 7:25 P.M. VICTORIA STONE boarded the Mt. Vernon train which

left Penn Station at 7:50 en route to Washington, D.C. It is noted that VICTORIA STONE had no baggage in her possession at the time of her departure. U

ADAMS, after leaving STONE at the station, proceeded to Macy's Department Store where he contacted IRENE MILLER, previously mentioned. Because of conditions existing in the store, surveilling agents were unable to continue the surveillance at this point. U

At 11:30 P.M. ADAMS was observed taking VICTORIA STONE's dog out at her apartment, 39 West 55th Street. No further activity on the part of ADAMS was noted on this date. U

PRINCIPAL CONTACTS OF ARTHUR ADAMS

VICTORIA STONE

ADAMS was first noted contacting VICTORIA STONE at her apartment 9E, 39 West 55th Street, New York City, on September 5, 1944. Since that time physical surveillance has revealed that ADAMS contacts VICTORIA STONE regularly both at her apartment and at her place of business, the VICTORIA STONE JEWELRY CORPORATION, 510 Madison Avenue. It has been noted that in these contacts ADAMS frequently brings papers,

small packages, and, occasionally, a briefcase to VICTORIA's store and that they frequently examine these papers at the store usually going to the back part of the store where it is impossible to observe their action. U

VICTORIA STONE usually leaves her apartment between ten and eleven thirty P.M. to go to her jewelry store where she spends the entire day. It was ascertained that she keeps a colored maid at her apartment the maid staying until approximately 3:30 P.M. She is also ascertained to have a German spitz dog which she keeps in her apartment. She maintains an unlisted telephone: Circle 6-2479 in her apartment, and a listed telephone at the jewelry store, 510 Madison Avenue, Plaza 3-9850. U

Mr. HERMAN HENSCHEL, Superintendent, at 39 West 55th Street, advised Special Agent HERMAN W. MADDOX that VICTORIA STONE lives alone in the apartment No. 9B at this address; that she seldom has any visitors other than one older man whom she identified as her brother. The description of this man, as given by the superintendent, indicated that he undoubtedly referred to ADAMS. HENSCHEL stated that STONE has resided at this apartment for about four years and she operates a jewelry store. He also advised that she receives first class mail from the Soviet Embassy in Washington, D.C. about twice a week. HENSCHEL stated that about three months ago STONE placed a special lock on her apartment door in addition to the regular lock built into the door, and provided by the apartment house. He stated he did not have a key to this lock. U

~~X~~ Confidential Informant NYC-77, whose identity is known to the Bureau, advised Agent MADDOX that the VICTORIA STONE JEWELRY CORPORATION, located at 510 Madison Avenue, New York City, was incorporated September 5, 1941 with \$10,000. capital. The officers of the company were indicated as VICTORIA STONE, President, and JULIUS HEIMAN, Secretary-Treasurer. This informant further advised that VICTORIA STONE is a native born American, about 35 years of age. U

On September 19, 1941, VICTORIA STONE and MIRIAM ~~X~~ SOMERS registered the name CHICO GEMS at 562 Fifth Avenue. However, the business was conducted by VICTORIA STONE individually. It consisted of the stringing of pearls and repair work. U

JULIUS HEIMAN was described by informant as being 60 years of age, married, and a retired businessman. It was indicated that VICTORIA STONE handles her banking at the National City Bank, 42nd Street and Madison Avenue. This informant indicated that HEIMAN resides at 69 Landscape Avenue, Yonkers, New York and is also Vice



President of the CONCORD STEEL CORPORATION, 19 Rector Street, New York City. U

On October 7, 1944, Special Agent J.G. JOHNSON noted a man believed to be 38 to 40 years of age, in consultation with VICTORIA STONE at her jewelry store, 510 Madison Avenue. This man spent several hours with VICTORIA STONE and finally left the store at 5:25 P.M. and proceeded to 257 Kingsland Terrace, South Orange, New Jersey. U

It was subsequently ascertained that this individual was identical with PHILIP LEVY. Information in the files of the New York office reflects that PHILIP LEVY was born in Latvia, Russia, March 15, 1893. He entered the United States the same year and was educated in the United States; received a B.A. degree at Harvard. He was engaged in a textile business in partnership with his brother, JACOB LEVY. His brother was stationed for a time in Manila and the business was devoted to Far Eastern trade. The files also revealed that PHILIP LEVY is an associate of LEON JOSEPHSON who presently operates night club Cafe Society in New York City. It was further indicated that PHILIP LEVY at one time inquired of JOSEPHSON concerning the whereabouts of GEORGE MINK. U

A mail cover has been placed on the residence of VICTORIA STONE, 39 West 55th Street, and at her place of business, 510 Madison Avenue. On October 12, 1944, VICTORIA STONE received a letter bearing the return address: 1823 67th Avenue, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, but it did not carry the name of the sender. DAVID SYDNEY WEINER, another son, enlisted in the U.S. Army in September, 1942. All of those persons previously lived at 2124 North 16th Street, until July 1, 1941. The indices of the Philadelphia office

Reference report indicates that one JACOB B. ARONOFF one time acted as attorney for ADAMS when he was conducting a business known as TECHNOLOGICAL LABORATORIES, INC., which first maintained offices at 165 Broadway and then was listed at 1775 Broadway. L

As previously indicated in the account of the physical surveillances, ADAMS has frequently visited 29 East 11th Street at which address JACOB B. ARONOFF resides. L

The records of Local Draft Board #17, New York City, reflected that ARONOFF is registered with this board having serial number 1284. It is further indicated that he was born March 26, 1896 at Lodz, Russian Poland. He indicated that he was self-employed as a lawyer at 80 Broad Street. The individual who would always know his whereabouts is one ISAAC ARONOFF at 1101 Carroll Place, Bronx, N.Y. L

The following description of JACOB ARONOFF was obtained from these records: L

In an occupational questionnaire filed March 9, 1942, ARONOFF indicated that he has a college education and that he is divorced. He indicated that he has been engaged in general legal practice doing corporation work, administration and legal matters connected with the buying and selling of plants, equipment, etc. U

At the offices of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, it was indicated that ARONOFF had made application for citizenship and that he had made frequent trips to Toronto, Canada, from 1932 to 1936. U

At the Bronx County Supreme Court, the following information concerning ARONOFF's citizenship status was obtained by Special Agent HERMAN W. MADDOX: U

ARONOFF filed petition for naturalization #29396 dated January 28, 1922 in the Supreme Court of New York, Bronx County. At that time he gave as his residence 654 Castor St., New York, occupation - law clerk, and indicated that he was born March 14, 1896 at Lodz, Poland (Russia). He immigrated to the United States from Bremen, Germany, on May 24, 1905 arriving at the Port of New York on June 6, 1905, on the SS FREDERICK WILHELM. U

On June 28, 1917 ARONOFF declared his intention to become a citizen of the United States in the Supreme Court, Bronx, N.Y. His petition reveals that he renounced his allegiance to the Republic of Poland and on the declaration of intention filed by him renounced his allegiance to the "present government of Russia". Witnesses to his petition were listed as ARON ARONOFF, a salesman, 654 Castor Street, and ISAAC ARONOFF, manufacturer, of the same address. An oath of allegiance was noted dated May 15, 1922 and an Order admitting petitioner on May 5, 1922. It was also indicated that ARONOFF's certificate of naturalization bore No. 1671987. U

Inquiry at the New York County Clerk's Office, New York Supreme Court Building, revealed that business certificate No. 11174 was filed on September 24, 1940 by JACOB BROCHES ARONOFF of 80 Broad Street, New York City, which certificate indicated that ADAMS is conducting business under the name of TECHNOLOGICAL LABORATORIES. Reference to the Martindale-Hubbel Law Directory for 1944

reveals that JACOB BROCHES ARONOFF, born in 1896, is a graduate of Columbia University and received his law degree from Fordham University, New York City. L

Confidential Informant T-2 advised that ADAMS frequently telephonically contacted JULIUS HEIMAN at the Esplanade Hotel and has previously indicated ADAMS has personally contacted him on at least one occasion. L

Confidential Informant T-3 has advised that JULIUS HEIMAN resides with his wife in a two-room apartment at the Hotel Esplanade, 305 Westend Avenue. He came to this apartment September 14, 1942, having previously lived at 175 West 73rd Street. At the time he first took up residence at this hotel he listed as his references MILTON MANS-  
BLICH, 12 East 86th Street, and HENRY HOFHEIMER, 61 Broadway, and the following bank accounts: The Lawyers Trust Company, 1352 Broadway, and the Manufacturers Trust Company in the Empire State Building where he is indicated to have had an account since 1923. L

This informant further advised that HEIMAN was reported to have been engaged in some sort of a jewelry business previously but that there were indications there was something "crooked" about this. He also advised that he has numerous visitors most of whom are extremely rough looking characters often badly dressed. This informant also indicated that HEIMAN has two daughters one of whom resides in Washington, D.C. He is unable to furnish the names of these daughters. L

It was ascertained that JULIUS HEIMAN was registered for Selective Service with Local Draft Board #735, Yonkers, N.Y. Inquiry made at this local board by Special Agent ARTHUR MILLER reveals that JULIUS HEIMAN was born August 12, 1881 at Vilno, Russia. He is a United States citizen with an eighth grade education. At the time of his registration he gave his address as 69 Landscape Avenue, Yonkers, New York. It was indicated he presently resides at 305 Westend Avenue, New York City. These records also indicated that HEIMAN is married, his wife's name being NELLIE, and he is employed as sales manager of the SUNRAY BAKING CORPORATION, Brooklyn. L

HEIMAN was the Vice President and Secretary of this company being elected in 1933. The name of this company was changed to the CONCORD STEEL COMPANY, 19 Rector Street, New York City. HEIMAN's wife, NELLIE, acted as Vice President of the company. The tangible net worth of the company was stated in 1940 to be \$225,543. HEIMAN was also indicated to be an officer of the J.B. KENDALL COMPANY, Washington, D.C., and Secretary-Treasurer of the EMONS HARDWARE COMPANY, wholesalers, at 99 Hudson Street, New York City. U

MANSBACH was indicated as being 41 years of age and married. He resided at 187 East Bay Boulevard, Atlantic Beach. He is a graduate of Fordham Law School and admitted to the Bar in 1924. He has been connected with the firm of LACHMAN & GOLDSMITH as partner since January 1, 1928. U

HEIMAN was also indicated to have been connected with the LANDSCAPE REALTY COMPANY, owning two apartment houses at 315 West 21st Street and 421 West 21st Street, mortgages on these buildings being held by JOHN HANCOCK MUTUAL INSURANCE COMPANY. U

On September 11, 1939 BENJAMIN GITLOW, one time a prominent official in the Communist Party of the U.S., in an interview before the Dies Committee, was questioned as to whether he was acquainted with a man named JULIUS HEIMAN. Mr. GITLOW stated: "I know JULIUS HEIMAN very well. I know him from the beginning of the left wing in the Socialist Party up to the present time." U

"JULIUS HEIMAN is a businessman holding down a very important position in a commercial corporation and during the early stages of the left wing organization of the Communist Party JULIUS HEIMAN supported the organization with funds, contributions of his own and

"helped to maintain a monthly journal of the organization, known as the Class Struggle. When the left wing organized the Communist Party JULIUS HEIMAN was attached to that wing of the Communist Party which was organized by the Russian Federation of the Socialist Party. During the years 1920 and 1921 when the Party received diamonds and jewelry which had to be converted into cash, JULIUS HEIMAN is the man who made the business arrangements for the conversion of the diamonds and jewelry into cash for the Party. JULIUS HEIMAN was never known to the Party membership as a member of the Party. His membership was always kept secret and was known only to the top leaders of the Party. Nevertheless, he met with the top leaders of the Party on the most confidential matters concerning the Party organizations. Later when it became necessary to organize a system for receiving moneys by cable and cashing the cable for large amounts and converting the money in such a way that the Party would not be jeopardized and the source of the money hidden, JULIUS HEIMAN played a very important role in that respect and up to the present time JULIUS HEIMAN is in a very confidential position as far as the Party organization is concerned. His daughter BEATRICE HEIMAN is at the present time one of the most confidential and important secretaries of the Russian Embassy and acts as Secretary to the Ambassador himself. BEATRICE HEIMAN is a member of the Communist Party and today serves as a link between the Russian Embassy in Washington and the Communist Party in America."

The above information is recorded in the Dies Reports on Page 4687 and Page 4688. U

Information in the New York Field office files reflects that BEATRICE HEIMAN, 2841 Adams Road, Washington, D.C., was an employee of the Tass News Agency, Washington, D.C. U

Confidential Informant T-5 advised Special Agent EDWARD F. HUMMER that JULIUS HEIMAN, contact of ADAMS, is undoubtedly identical with the JULIUS HEIMAN referred to by BENJAMIN GITLOF in his comments before the Dies Committee in 1939. U

Photographic copies of the handwriting and handprinting of JULIUS HEIMAN are being obtained and will be sent under separate letter to the FBI Laboratory for inclusion in its files and for appropriate comparison with other similar specimens previously submitted in connection with this and similar related cases. U

JAMES PERLOVIN

On September 6, 1944, ADAMS contacted JAMES PERLOVIN at his place of business, 113 West 42nd Street, New York City. A highly confidential source of information also indicated that on August 8, 1944, ADAMS issued a \$1,000. check to JAMES PERLOVIN. U

A check of the indices of the New York office reveals that one PAULA PERLOVIN, with aliases, the wife of JAMES PERLOVIN, is the subject of a Security Matter C investigation in this office. It was ascertained, in connection with this investigation, that JAMES PERLOVIN and his wife PAULA, reside at 877 East 24th Street, Brooklyn, N.Y. U

JAMES PERLOVIN was born February 12, 1913 in Brooklyn, and his parents were both born in Russia. In 1941 and 1942 he was employed by the War Department, U.S. Government, at Wright Field, Dayton, Ohio. After that he was employed by LAUCKS & NOSLING, New York City, from April, 1942, to August, 1942. He was employed as an artist and technical animator making training films for the U.S. Government with this concern. U

On August 24, 1942, he began working for the SPERRY GYROSCOPE COMPANY, Brooklyn, and continued with them until April 6, 1944, at which time he voluntarily left to begin his own business. His work at the SPERRY GYROSCOPE COMPANY was described as making of "exploded screw drawings" of all their instruments to be included in the parts lists used by the armed forces in the field for servicing, repairing and maintaining instruments in actual service. PERLOVIN is now operating his own business doing somewhat similar work preparing training manuals for the armed forces. His business consists of government defense contracts and he employs eleven people. U

Investigation of PAULA PERLOVIN and her husband, JAMES PERLOVIN, was initiated because of information obtained from a confidential informant that PAULA PERLOVIN, who was employed as an advance agent of the "PA art project in New York City previous to 1941, was a notorious Communist in that group. U

KEYNOTE RECORDINGS, INC.

As previously reported under physical surveillance of ADAMS, it has been noted that he frequently contacts KEYNOTE RECORDINGS, INC. That appears to be the principal office of this organization is located on the fourth floor at 522 Fifth Avenue. The door of this office bears the following inscriptions: U

\* Information in the files of this office reveals that ERIC IRVIN BERNAY, also known as IRVIN ERIC BERNSTEIN, is the subject of a Security Matter C investigation in this office. In this investigation it was learned that a certificate of incorporation of KEYNOTE RECORDINGS, INC. was filed on October 7, 1940, with the New York County Clerk's Office, New York County Courthouse, New York City. The purpose of this corporation was given as carrying on the business of manufacturing and dealing in sound records, music books, sheet music, etc. The corporation was to have a capital stock of \$20,000. The directors of the corporation were given as ERIC BERNAY, 133 West 44th Street, DAVID ZIMAND, of the same address, and ARTHUR MARCUS, also of the same address. MAURICE JOSEPHBERG, 152 West 42nd Street, was listed as an attorney for the concern.

It was ascertained that DAVID ZIMAND was born on March 1, 1909 at Sokol, Poland; was a citizen of Poland. He entered the United States on September 20, 1927. He lived in Canada from 1910 to 1927.

He attended elementary and high school in Montreal, Canada, and attended McGill University, Montreal, for one year and two months. He also attended the New York City College business school for one year. On September 13, 1943, DAVID ZIMAND was inducted into the U.S. Army. U

ERIC IRVIN BERNAY, also known as IRVIN ERIC BERNSTEIN, residing at 160 Bonnett Avenue, New York City, indicated on his Selective Service records, that he was born March 25, 1906 at New York City. His father, JULIAN BERNSTEIN, and mother, LENA, reside at 128 St. Marks Place, New York City. BERNAY indicated himself to be self-employed as manager and recording director of KEYNOTE RECORDINGS, INC., 522 Fifth Avenue, New York City. U

Mr. HAROLD BACKENHEIM, Vice President of DAZIAN FABRICS, INC., advised that he had known ERIC BERNAY over a considerable period of time and stated that BERNAY was a Communist interested in Communist activities generally. He added that he was formerly employed as an advertising manager of publications known as "The Nation" and the "New Masses". U

It was ascertained that KEYNOTE RECORDINGS, INC. maintains a bank account in the uptown branch of the Title Guarantee & Trust Company, 6 East 45th Street, New York City. The account is also kept here under the name of ERIC BERNAY.

KEYNOTE RECORDINGS, INC. was ascertained to produce recordings of a Communistic nature and also recordings concerning Russia. This company also handles recordings made by entertainers at Cafe Society, night club operated by LEON and BARNEY JOSEPHSON. U

Confidential Informant T-6 advised that he had been able to ascertain from persons in the recording business that ERIC BERNAY of the KEYNOTE RECORDINGS, INC. is not as active in the business as he formerly was; that ADAMS is now working for this company and handles the recordings for them. He stated he was unable to ascertain anything concerning the background of ADAMS or how he happened to become connected with the KEYNOTE RECORDINGS, INC. U

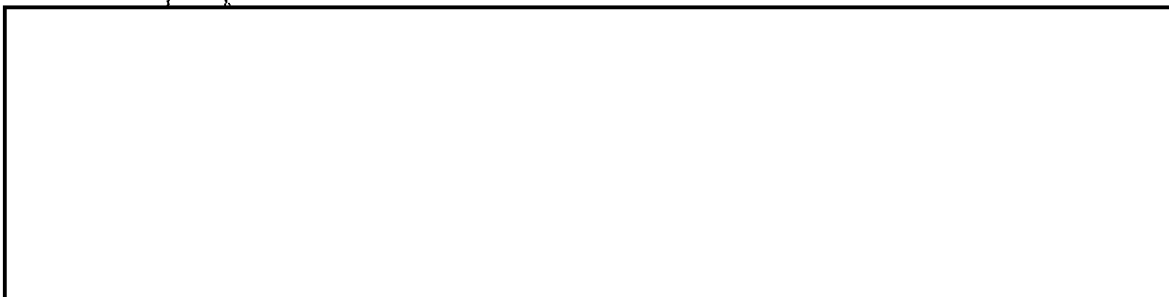

Information in the files of the New York office reflects that BRISTEL was born November 8, 1913 in Chicago, the son of HYMAN BECKER, a native of Russia, and ROSE (BUTTMAN) a native of Austria. U

In 1939, BRISTEL was business manager of the Communist weekly "New Masses" and later he became President of this magazine. It was ascertained on July 17, 1944, that BRISTEL is employed by the ELECTRONIC CORPORATION OF AMERICA, 45 West 18th Street, New York City. U Referral/Consult



It was also noted that when ADAMS traveled to Westport, Connecticut under surveillance by agents of this office, he was met at the train by MOLLIE NOVICK, 91 Central Park West, New York City. U

The records of Local Board #24, New York City, indicated that SAMUEL JOHN NOVICK, 91 Central Park West, New York City, is married to MOLLIE NOVICK of the same address. These records also reflected that SAMUEL NOVICK was born January 25, 1897 at Vitebsk, Russia, and that he is employed as President of the TRANSFORMER CORPORATION OF AMERICA, which is known to be the former name of what is now known as the ELECTRONIC CORPORATION OF AMERICA. NOVICK also indicated himself to be manager of the Lafayette Radio Corporation of Illinois and Georgia, which company he indicated was engaged in supplying radio equipment to government agencies. NOVICK indicated that he had been a radio operator since 1920. U

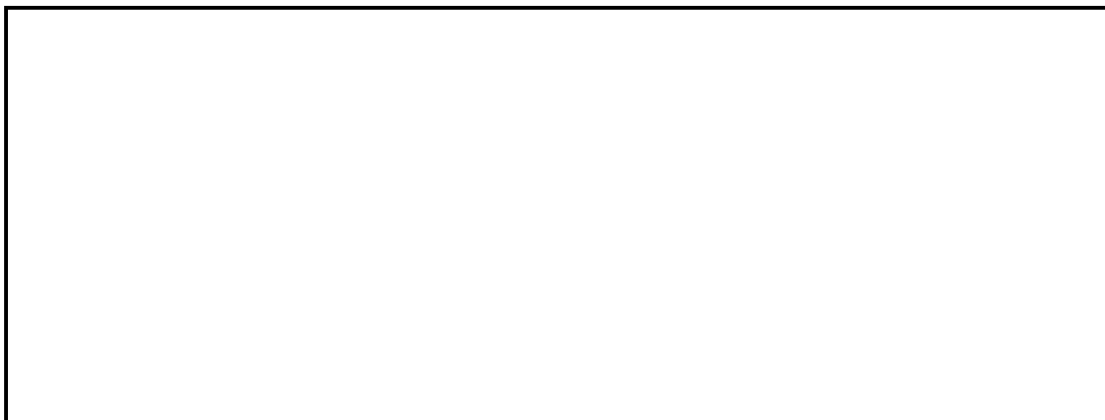

Confidential Informant T-4, who is familiar with the organization of the ELECTRONIC CORPORATION OF AMERICA, advised that at the present time, SAMUEL NOVICK is the President and main owner of the concern. S. M. BURKE, also known as BURKOWITZ, is manager of the Atlanta branch; LARRY BRAUN is in charge of purchases; FRANK LESTER is chief engineer; M. DANIELS is plant manager, and a Miss LIEBERMAN is in charge of bookkeeping. He stated that an individual, whose last name is BRISTEL, and whose first name he did not know, is handling publicity and advertising for the concern. He added that this man shares offices with a PAUL TRAUGOTT. PAUL TRAUGOTT, he explained, is an engineer who has been working on various electrical experiments and who has been particularly successful with the new type of electrical medical instrument used to measure heart ailments and the like. He described TRAUGOTT as being avidly pro-Russian although he believed he was of American birth. This informant stated that he considers SAMUEL NOVICK, the President of the concern, to be thoroughly pro-Russian and recalled that he had made a trip to Europe yearly previous to the war. He also stated that on one occasion JOHANNES STEELS, who handles a news broadcast for the company, addressed a meeting of the workers in the ELECTRONIC CORPORATION OF AMERICA on occasion. Δ

This informant stated that the V.E.R.M.W.A. and the F.A.E.C.T. are the active unions in the organizations. He stated that in any situation the union was able to get whatever was requested from NOVICK. He stated that this concern was attempting to develop a South American trade before they became 100% a war industry. He stated that he believes the company has a good contact in Washington who has been able to get them their large defense contracts. He had no information as to who this individual might be and also was unable to furnish any information concerning contacts of SAMUEL NOVICK outside of the ELECTRONIC CORPORATION. Δ





Confidential Informant T-2 has advised that ADAMS has received considerable correspondence from a publication entitled "PLANNING".

Confidential Informant NYC-77 advised that GLENN GRISWOLD began publishing a weekly news letter entitled "PLANNING" in 1943 and in July, 1944, issued an additional confidential news letter entitled "Public Relations". This informant further advised that GLENN GRISWOLD has been a member of the staff of the Chicago Interocean since 1908 and employed by the Chicago Examiner in 1910. He was also connected with the Chicago Journal of Commerce, 1920 to 1931, and acted as Vice President of Fox Film Corporation, 1933. He was connected with "Business Week" as editor from 1933 to 1938. In 1938 he began a public relations office which is organized as the GLENN GRISWOLD ASSOCIATES, 330 West 42nd Street, with a branch located at 520 North Michigan Avenue, Chicago. This service acted as public relations counsel for the STUDEBAKER CORPORATION.

Miss H. BAIRD, Secretary to A.H. BRYSON, Personnel Manager of McGRATH-HILL PUBLISHING COMPANY, 330 West 42nd Street, stated that GRISWOLD had been employed as editor for "Business Week" from September 1933, to November, 1938 and that while in the employ of the company he married his Secretary, DENNY PRAGER. She stated that PRAGER claimed to be of German-American ancestry and indicated she was of the Unitarian faith although she believed she was possibly Jewish. At the time of her employment, she indicated she had been employed previously by FORBES Magazine, NBC BROADCASTING and the BROOKLYN EXPRESS, - a newspaper. She indicated that she was conversant in German, French and Italian and received her education at Columbia University.

Mr. EHRLICH, publisher of "Business Week" advised that GRISWOLD came to the "Business Week" as an editor from the Chicago Journal of Commerce. EHRLICH described GRISWOLD as a very good journalist but not capable as an economist. He indicated that as editor of

"BusinessWeek" he naturally had good contacts in the business world but doubted that he would be in a position to obtain extremely secret or confidential information concerning new manufacturing processes, or information of a restricted nature concerning manufacturing developments in connection with national defense. He suggested that Mr. J.J. BERLINER, who publishes a news letter service in New York City, might be able to give more current information concerning GRISTOLD's activities. U

The records of Local Draft Board 32 reflected that GRISTOLD registered with this board on April 25, 1942, Serial No. 2683. At the time of registration he resided at 785 Park Avenue, New York City. It was indicated that he was born June 19, 1886 at Benton Harbor, Michigan. He indicated his employer to be the Conference of Alcoholic Beverage Industries, 110 East 42nd Street, and his work to be that of a public relations director. U

It was ascertained from Mr. McNALLY, President of CHARLES E. NOYES, real estate management, 295 Madison Avenue, New York City, that GRISTOLD moved his publishing business from 299 Madison Avenue to his present address, 52 Vanderbilt Avenue, on May 1, 1944. U

It was ascertained from H.F. PURDY, 342 Madison Avenue, that GRISTOLD maintains a banking account at the Chase Bank, 42nd Street branch, and that his present home address is 815 Park Avenue. U

It was ascertained that "PLANNING" is a weekly business letter which allegedly advises its subscribers of the very latest developments in manufacturing and business; particularly sets forth new developments of various companies, new inventions and new products. It can be subscribed to by any businessman and sells for \$25. a year. U

DR. LOUIS MILLER

Information obtained through the physical surveillance of ADAMS, and from confidential sources, indicates he contacts a Dr. LOUIS MILLER, 400 Westend Avenue, New York City, frequently. There are indications that ADAMS is obtaining medical treatment from this individual who is known to be a medical doctor. U

Information in the files of the New York office indicates that Dr. LOUIS MILLER is a member of the National Executive Board, the National Emergency Conference to Save Spanish Refugees, and also a member of the

Executive Board of the United American Spanish Aid Committee, New York City, which board included Dr. EDWARD K. BARSKY and Dr. M.V. LEAF, well known Communists. U

On December 12, 1941, Mr. EDMUND SIGERSON, 9 Highland Terrace, Verona, New Jersey, who is employed by the Allied Medical Laboratories, 451 Westend Avenue, New York City, contacted this office in regard to Dr. LOUIS MILLER. He stated that Dr. MILLER, who resides at 400 Westend Avenue, is a very active Communist and that he has two daughters who are members of the Communist Party. He added that one of Dr. MILLER's daughters is married to a man named BURK who was a student at Columbia University, five years previously, and was expelled from that university because of his Communist activity. He stated that approximately a year and a half previously he had been in Dr. MILLER's office and overheard him telling a colored patient how bad conditions were in the United States, and that he, Dr. MILLER, advocated a complete change. He stated that it was common knowledge that Dr. MILLER was a Communist and that he admitted to this fact. U

IRENE MORRIS MILLER

Through a physical surveillance of ADAMS, it was ascertained that he has contacted a Miss MILLER who was ascertained to be employed as a buyer in Macy's Department Store, New York City. U

Confidential Informant T-7 advised that IRENE MORRIS MILLER, 400 Westend Avenue, New York City, is employed by the Macy Department Store as an assistant buyer. This informant further advised that she was born in January, 1905; that she speaks Polish, Russian and German. She graduated from Barnard College in 1928 and worked for the Gimbels Department Store 1929 through 1934 and for Lord & Taylor Department Store in 1928. She indicated as reference BASIL M. BASS, 22 East 40th Street, a lawyer, and DAN GOLENPAUL, 444 Madison Avenue. GOLENPAUL is connected with the "Information Please" broadcast. It was also indicated that IRENE MILLER was an American citizen and resided at 240 West 75th Street, New York City, previous to her present residence. U

The following description was obtained of this individual: U

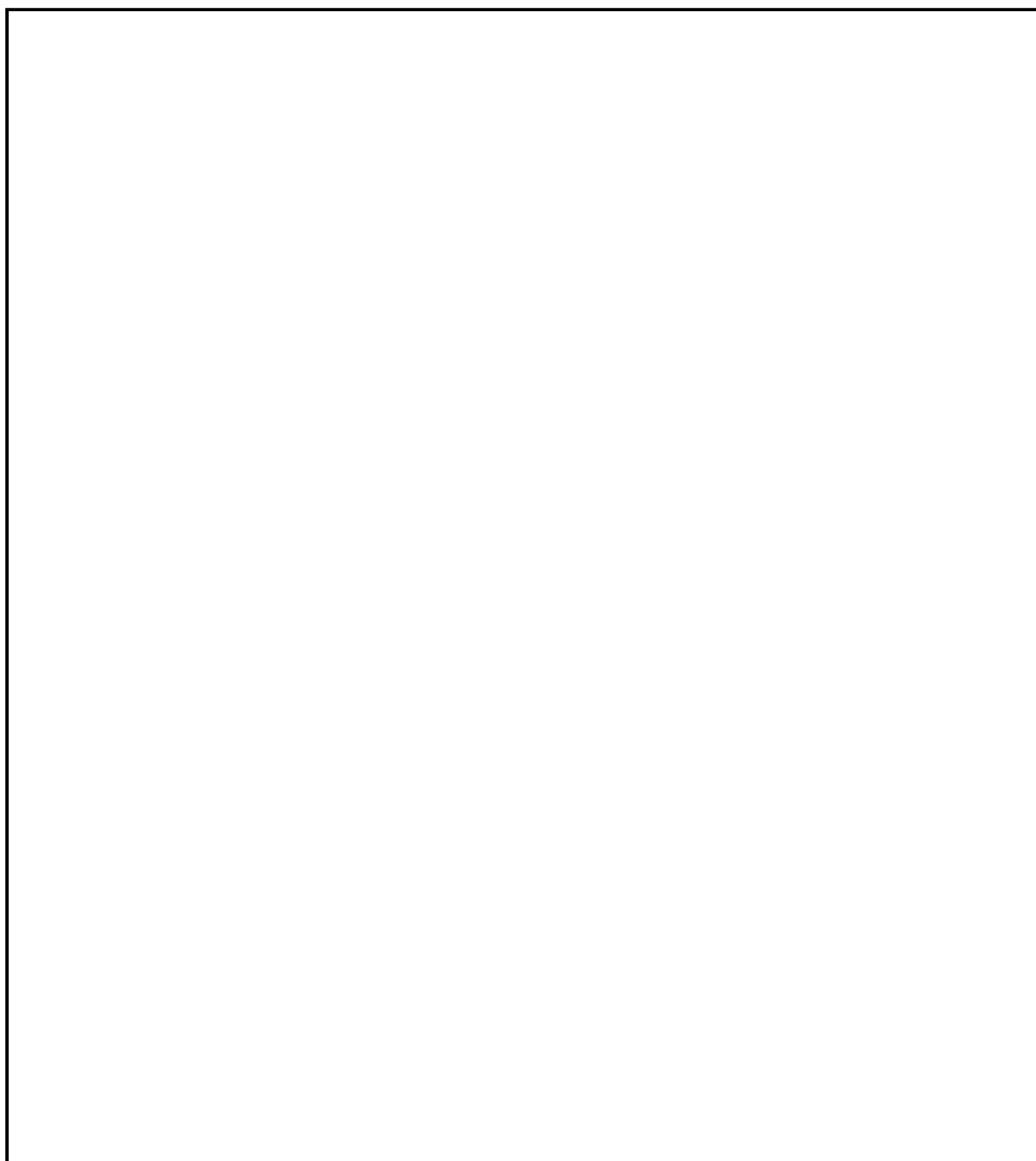

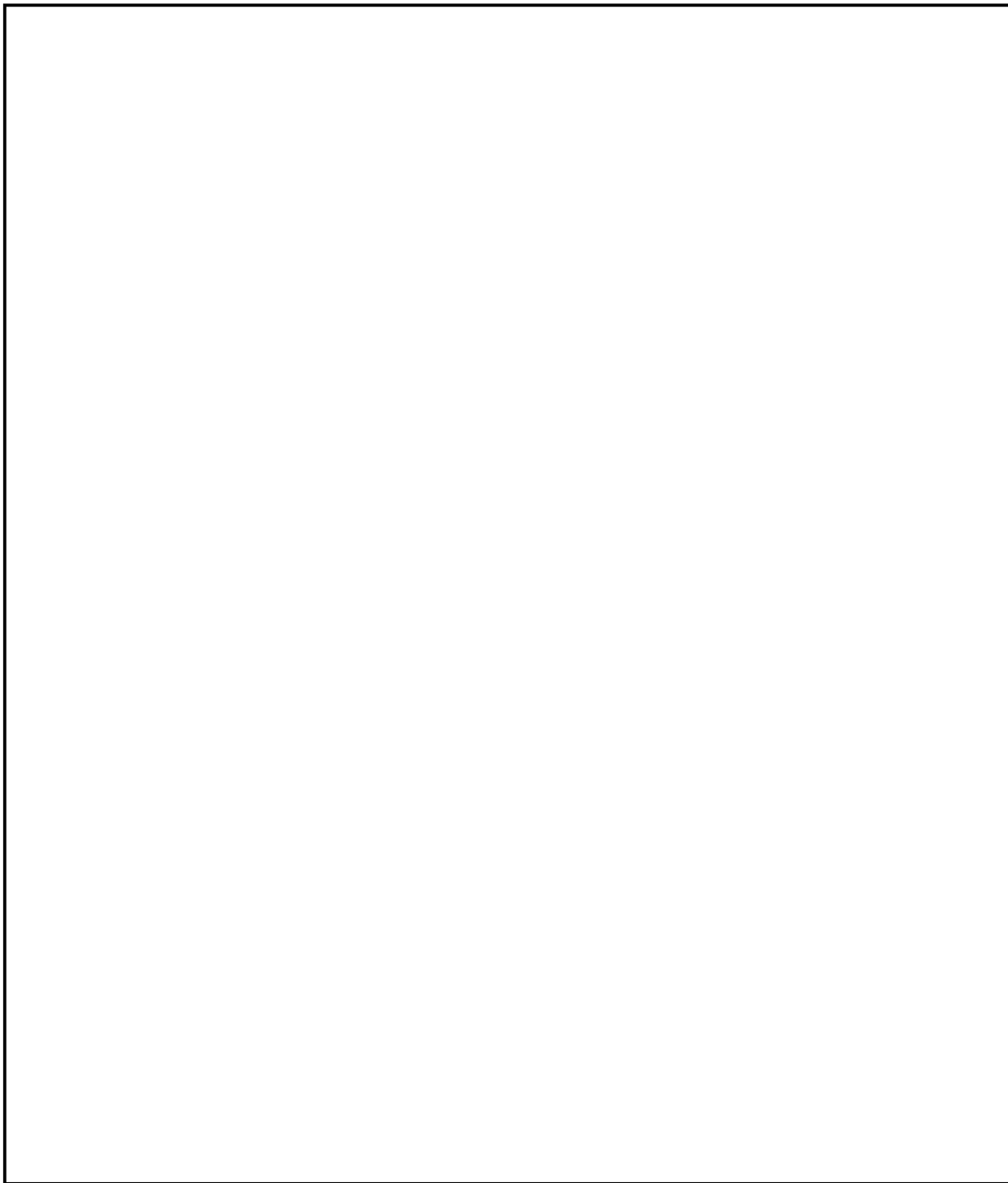
