The 18 cases reported today raises the total number of COVID-19 cases to 53,902 in Cameron County. There have also been an additional 36 individuals who have recovered, raising the total number of recovered individuals to 50,821.

Cameron County Public Health has received notification of one (1) additional COVID-19 related death of a Cameron County resident. The reported death was unvaccinated. This raises the total of number of COVID-19 deaths in Cameron County to 2,007.
