

They have a form you can use (<a href="https://www.fema.gov/media-library/assets/documents/10592">https://www.fema.gov/media-library/assets/documents/10592</a>) or you can use your own existing documentation if it contains all of the information from the FEMA form.

**Stock cost documentation:** If you used existing stock, you need to document how much you paid for that existing stock or how much you paid for the stock to be replaced. Also, if you have documentation on how you arrived at the cost, it could go here.

Stock supporting documentation: They will be looking for things like purchasing policies, the name

of the vendor, description of the material, quantity, unit price, total price, date of purchase, date used and whether purchased or taken from stock

**Purchase invoices/receipts:** You need to show the invoices and proof of payment. They will be looking for the date paid and amount paid.

**Not Used Justifications:** If you purchased food but did not use all of the purchase, you will need to explain why you didn't.

**Acquisition Threshold Documentation:** Right now, we think this is a copy of your procurement policy. This is a new requirement for state entities.

The project creation guide on the share point site might also give you an idea if you can't log in.

See below on CDC guidance for laundry. Guests do not need to wear gloves to wash their own laundry- but should wash their hands after putting things into the washing machine (if a sink is not nearby, having hand sanitizer right there would be good). Does the hotel provide hampers/laundry bags? Or should we be ordering one per room on the supply list? I'm thinking the net bags that can be washed along with the clothes? Other ideas?

## Linens, clothing, and other items that go in the laundry

- Wear disposable gloves when handling dirty laundry from an ill person and then discard after each use. If using reusable gloves, those gloves should be dedicated for cleaning and disinfection of surfaces for COVID-19 and should not be used for other household purposes. <u>Clean hands</u> immediately after gloves are removed.
  - If no gloves are used when handling dirty laundry, be sure to wash hands afterwards.
  - If possible, do not shake dirty laundry. This will minimize the possibility of dispersing virus through the air.
