Participation logs will be due August 21 st , gathering further data. 75 virtual programs were offered for teens, with an overall attendance of 3651 viewers during Sound Off, July 6-August 15.

Prizes will also be distributed to teens in every district.

Also partnered with the Old Town School of Folk music for music workshops about protests songs and music creation. Grab and Go Kits were also distributed to 81 branches.
