



**Cleveland City Council's new public comment period** allows for 10 pre-registered people to speak at council's regular meetings at 7 p.m. on Mondays. ### HOW TO SIGN UP

Public commenters can register **online**, by **email** or by using a **paper form** starting on Wednesday at noon and ending on Monday at 2 p.m.

The first 10 people properly registered will get a 3-minute slot to speak. Public commenters who need special physical or language accommodations should request assistance three business days before the meeting.

### WHAT TO KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

**Parking** is available in the Willard Garage connected to City Hall on Lakeside Avenue. Cost is \$3.50 for the first hour. Each additional half hour is \$1.50, with a maximum cost of \$10.



To find a **Greater Cleveland RTA Bus Route**, use GCRTA's "Plan a Trip" feature found at <http://www.riderta.com/routes>. There are also two bike racks located in front of City Hall.

To get into City Hall, you will need a **driver's license or other current identification card**.

At the security desk, tell the officer you are going to City Council chambers, which are located on the second floor.

### COUNCIL'S RULES FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

Council's new procedures for public comment place limitations on speakers.

- Three minutes for each comment.
- Speakers can only address the topic they included on the registration form.
- Speakers can't address individual council members, only the council as a whole.
- Promoting products, services, or political campaigns is not allowed.
- Signs and banners are not permitted in council chambers.
